Factories and Shops Acts.

SHOPS BOARD No. 9 (DRAPERS AND MEN'S DETERMINATION OF THE CLOTHING).

Note.--1. On the 9th March, 1921, this Board was appointed in lieu of the Drapers Board and the Men's Clothing Board.

2. This Determination applied on the 19th June, 1922, to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Sandringham and Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the business of a seller of—

(a) any article of men's or boys' clothing, mercery, or wearing appearel, including underclothing, hats, and caps;
(b) goods usually sold by drapers or haberdashers, including mantles, costumes, millinery, gloves, stockings, and underclothings," has made the following Determination, namely:-

(1) That this Determination shall come into force and be operative on and after the 19th June, 1922.
