Marine Act 1915.

AMENDMENT OF SCALE OF PILOTAGE RATES.

THE Marine Board of Victoria, under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by section 79 of the Marine Act 1915, to increase or reduce, with the approval of the Governor in Council, the rates of pilotage on ships arriving at or departing from any of the ports of Victoria, hereby ordains as follows:—

1. That in the Schedule to the scale of pilotage rates fixed and passed at a meeting of the Board, held on the twenty-sixth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-second day of May of the same year for the figures "2½" set out in the first column to such Schedule under the heading "(A) Port of Port Phillip", sub-heading "Steamships", item "3" following the words "Up to 5,000 tons" there shall be substituted the figures "2¼", and that from the date of the coming into force of these presents the reduced amount of Twopence and one-third of a penny (2¼) is hereby fixed as the rate per ton payable as pilotage from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay or vice versa in respect of steamships up to 5,000 tons burden, calculated upon the vessel's net registered tonnage subject nevertheless to the payment of a minimum amount of £2 10s., as by the said cited Schedule provided.

2. That the maximum and minimum pilotage charges respectively now payable under the scale of pilotage rates in the last preceding clause referred to for the ports of Portland, Port Fairy and Warrnambool are hereby revoked and in lieu thereof the amounts following are hereby fixed as the maximum and minimum charges for pilotage respectively which shall be payable on vessels arriving at or departing from the ports named, that is to say:—

- (a) On ships propelled by sails only—  
Maximum, the sum of Fourteen pounds (£14).  
Minimum, the sum of Three pounds (£3).
- (b) On steamships and ships towed by steam—  
Maximum, the sum of Ten pounds (£10).  
Minimum, the sum of Two pounds (£2).

3. These presents when approved by the Governor in Council shall come into force on and from the first day of the next succeeding calendar month following the date of the *Government Gazette* wherein they are published if such day be not less than fourteen days from the date of the said *Gazette*; but if such day be less than fourteen days distant from the said *Gazette* date then on and from but not before the first day of the calendar month next but one after the month in which these presents are gazetted.

The foregoing increases and reductions of rates were fixed and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this fourth day of May, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

## SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1922.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound (£1) sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Ten pounds and upwards situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1922.

2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Ten pounds (£10) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District beforementioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds (£5) sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to what the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge shall be Ninepence (9d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the municipal charge shall be not less than equal to Two shillings (2s.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Shepparton for the year 1922 of the property so supplied.

6. For every steam boiler or engine using water the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, public gardens, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show grounds, cattle yards, sheep dips, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the laying down of any new works, or the erection of new buildings, or repairs, or additions, the charge shall be by meter measurement at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, which shall include supply of meter. The meter, with box enclosed, shall be supplied by the Trust, and shall be fixed by the Trust's officer or officers. The applicant for the temporary supply shall have all pipes and connexions to the main ready before the meter is so fixed. All persons requiring a supply of water under this clause shall first notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purpose until authorized, in writing, so to do. The Trust's officer or officers shall be entitled at any time to go upon the premises to inspect and supervise the meter and the supply and use of the water.

10. Such rates are hereby payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1922. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Chairman and the Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust under and by virtue of the powers contained in the Water Acts on the evening of Tuesday, the eleventh day of April, 1922.

## BY-LAW No. 11.

THE Commissioners of the Glenrowan Waterworks Trust, constituted under the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the By-law following:—

The following are the rates for 1922 which the occupiers or owners of lands tenements or vacant allotments within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect to every such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation a rate of Two shillings and sixpence on municipal valuation shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land fronting a street in which a main shall have been laid shall be Ten shillings.

4. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water and being within a quarter of a mile of a main, one half of the beforementioned rate, and where tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a main one quarter the beforementioned rate to be paid.

5. Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and shall be paid for at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1922.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CRICKET AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE VILLAGE OF NEERIM.

WE, Y. B. Hamono, Chas. G. Barr, John Riddell, W. Geo. Young, J. H. Callow, John Patrick Halvy, Claude Neerim English, and W. W. Herbert, the majority of the duly appointed committee of management of the Reserve for cricket and other purposes of public recreation in the village of Neerim, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:-

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days—not exceeding twenty (20) in any one year—as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure or erection in the Reserve.
10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the committee of management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the committee of management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Samples of the articles specified to samples required for the Hospitals for the Insane—Sunbury, Ararat, Ballarat, and Beechworth respectively—may be seen at the Asylums at the places named; samples required for the Gaols at Geelong, Ballarat, Bendigo, Castlemaine, and Sale, may be seen at the Gaols; for Aborigines, at the following police stations:—For Coranderrk, at Healesville; and Lake Tyers, at Bairnsdale and Cunninghame; for Lara, at the Inebriates Retreat, and from the Receiver and Paymaster, Geelong; for Greenvale, at the Sanatorium; for Rutherglen, at the College; for Wahgunyah, at the Vine Nursery; for School of Forestry, Creswick, at the School; for McLeod Settlement, at the Public Office, Lang Lang; and for institutions in the Melbourne District, at the office of the Secretary, Tender Board. Samples of the whole of the above-mentioned articles, where indicated in the schedules as to sample, can be seen at the offices of the Secretary to the Tender Board.

Printed forms of tender and the conditions of contract may, in all cases, be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Gisborne-street, Melbourne; and for the respective districts from the Receivers and Paymasters at Geelong, Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, and Sale; for Sunbury, from the Medical Superintendent, Hospital for Insane; for Lara, from the Superintendent, Hospital for Insane; for Geelong, from the Receiver and Paymaster at Geelong; for Greenvale, from the Superintendent at the Sanatorium; for Aborigines, from the police stations as follow:—Coranderrk, at Healesville; and Lake Tyers, at Bairnsdale and Cunninghame; for Rutherglen, from the Superintendent, Viticultural College; for Wahgunyah, from the manager, at the Vine Nursery; for the School of Forestry, from the senior master, Creswick; and for the McLeod Settlement, from the Officer in charge of Police, Lang Lang, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit Receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the tenderer withdrawing the tender before notification of acceptance, or, in the event of being successful, failing to complete by lodging the security and contract form, duly signed, within the prescribed period. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers withdrawing their tenders before notification of acceptance or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period when notified of acceptance, may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth, provided the quality of such articles is satisfactory and the prices are considered reasonable.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in an envelope, and having the words "Tender for at" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, which office they must reach by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and in conformity with the Pure Food Act, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. As the exact quantity of any article which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

3. Supplies for country districts for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

4. The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office, with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; supplies for ss. Rip are to be delivered to the Dredging Depot, Footscray-road, Victoria Dock, or River Yarra wharfs, as ordered; the Ararat, Beechworth and Ballarat Districts will include the Hospitals for the Insane, Gaols, and Police Gaols at these places; and the Geelong District embraces a radius of 2 miles from the Post Office; Lara, the Inebriates Retreat; Greenvale, the Sanatorium; Rutherglen, the Viticultural College; Wahgunyah, the Vine Nursery; and Creswick, the School of Forestry. The lock-ups at City Watch House, Bourke-street West, Brunswick, Carlton, Coburg, Collingwood, Fitzroy, Fitzroy North, Hotham Hill, Little Bourke-street, North Melbourne, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, and South Yarra are included in the contracts for the Melbourne District. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the schedules.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogs-heads, butter firkins or boxes, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under proper authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by-rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the

cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations or stores are due or to the contractor in waiting for a Board to survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.

17. In the case of supplies for Hospitals for the Insane, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government. *If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer may determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.*

20. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. If any alteration of the price of any item included in any Schedule be made by the Commonwealth or State Government between the date fixed for receiving tenders and the termination of the contract period, a corresponding allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the article affected will be made by the Tender Board. The contractor shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Tender Board before an increase in price is allowed.

22. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat, or on account of the Commonwealth Government; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

23. For the purpose of the contracts entered into under these conditions, it is hereby expressly provided that in the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government or the contractor (as the case may be) may give two months' notice, through the Secretary to the Tender Board, of the termination of the contract for the particular item or items so affected to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items to remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter at his last-known place of business or abode.

24. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 23 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

25. For the purposes of these contracts the word Government shall mean Government of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Government of the State as regards supplies for the State; and the word Treasurer shall mean Treasurer of the Commonwealth as regards supplies for the Commonwealth, and Treasurer of the State as regards supplies for the State.

26. Where specially indicated in the schedules no sub-letting will be allowed, and no delivery shall be made on Sundays; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the preparation or manufacture of the articles tendered for in the schedules, or engaged in the delivery of or in any way engaged in connexion with the supply of the articles tendered for in the schedules under this contract, are not to exceed forty-eight per week (unless otherwise stated), and every such person shall be paid such wages and shall be employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by any Wages Board under the Factories and Shops Act to which such persons are subject as employees, and a copy of the labour condition, as indorsed on the schedules affected, shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, in the factory, shop, or dairy (and in each part of the factory, shop, or dairy where several rooms are in use) in which goods are prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50 (Fifty pounds), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money; and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

#### RULES AND BY-LAWS.

##### Objects.

1. The hospital shall be for the purpose of affording medical aid and surgical relief in accident or disease under such conditions as the Committee shall from time to time determine.

##### Privileges of Contributors.

2. Benefactors of £5 shall have the privilege of recommending one indoor patient annually, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

3. Benefactors of £10, or contributors of £1, shall be called annual subscribers, and shall have the privilege of recommending two indoor patients annually; they shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

4. Benefactors of £25, or contributors of £10, shall be called life subscribers, and shall have for life the same privileges as annual subscribers.

5. Benefactors of £20, or annual contributors of £2, shall be called annual governors, and shall be entitled to recommend three indoor patients annually; they shall also have one vote at all general meetings.

6. Benefactors of £50, or contributors of £20, shall be called life governors, and shall have for life the same privileges as annual governors.

7. Any additional benefaction or contribution shall entitle to additional privileges in accordance with the above scale, in respect to recommending patients only.

8. The current year shall, with respect to each benefaction or contribution, be reckoned from the day of payment.

9. The word "benefaction" shall mean a sum of money raised from the public by collectors or otherwise, and the word "contribution" a personal gift.

10. Every firm or partnership contributing shall exercise the privileges through some one of the firm only.

11. No person shall hold or be eligible for any honorary office (except that of Honorary Medical Officer), nor have any vote nor exercise any privilege connected with the institution unless his subscription shall have been paid at least seven clear days previously.

*General Meetings.*

12. The annual meeting of contributors to the hospital shall be held on the last Thursday of the month of January in every year for the following purposes, viz.:—

- To receive the Annual Reports and Balance-sheet.
- To fill vacancies in the Committee of Management.
- To fill vacancies in the Medical Staff.
- To elect two Honorary Dentists.
- To elect one Auditor.
- To transact any other business of which notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting in connexion with the institution.

13. No candidate shall be nominated as Member of Committee unless his consent has been obtained in writing and lodged with the Secretary three clear days before the date of annual meeting.

14. All votes at the annual and other meetings of contributors shall be taken by a show of hands, unless a ballot shall have been previously demanded by three contributors present, in which case the vote or votes referred to shall be by ballot.

15. At all meetings of contributors ten shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present the chair shall be taken, but if no quorum be present within half-an-hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned to the following week at the same day and hour.

16. At all meetings of the contributors or of the Committee, the President, or in his absence one of the Vice-Presidents, shall take the chair, but in the absence of these officers the meeting shall choose its own chairman.

17. At all meetings of the contributors or of the Committee, the chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and also a casting vote whenever the voting is equal.

18. It shall be competent for a majority of the Committee of Management, or for ten or more contributors by writing under their hands, to require the Secretary to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting to be specified in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting but that specified, and every such meeting shall be convened by the Secretary by advertisement in one or more local papers at least one week before the day of meeting, with intelligible reference to its object.

*Management.*

19. The institution shall be governed by a Committee of Management, consisting of 12, all of whom shall be contributors of not less than £1. or benefactors.

20. The Committee shall be elected and retire in accordance with the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915*.

20A. Any member of the Committee absenting himself from four consecutive meetings without reasonable excuse shall forfeit his membership. Country members excepted.

21. The Committee shall at the first meeting after such special meeting and each annual election, elect from among themselves, the President, two Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer.

22. Any extraordinary vacancies occurring in the Committee, shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915*.

23. The Committee of Management shall direct the general business of the hospital, enter into all contracts connected therewith, and direct payment of the same; they shall appoint and discharge all paid officers, and servants of the institution.

24. They shall meet on the first Tuesday in every month, at Eight o'clock p.m., and at such other times as may be necessary. Five members to constitute a quorum.

25. The President shall be empowered to convene a meeting of the Committee at any time he may consider necessary; and the Secretary shall, on receiving a requisition from three Members of Committee, convene a special meeting thereof; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting but that specified.

26. No member of the Committee shall vote on any question in which he shall have any pecuniary interest.

27. The Committee of Management shall, at the first Committee meeting subsequent to the Annual Meeting of Subscribers in each year, elect from among themselves a House Committee of two, who shall retire from office quarterly, but shall be eligible for re-election. The duties of the House Committee shall be to visit the hospital at least once a week to examine buildings, inspect the wards, make inquiries respecting the quality and quantity of the rations, enforce rules, investigate accounts, and report upon the same and all matters connected with the management of the institution at the next monthly meeting of the General Committee. The office of any member of the House Committee shall cease by his ceasing to be a member of the General Committee.

28. The President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer shall be Members of the House Committee, and shall hold office for one year. Should, however, any of these officers be absent

without the consent and approval from three consecutive meetings of the House Committee, such officer shall cease to be a Member of the House Committee, and shall also forfeit his office as such President, Vice-President, and Treasurer.

29. The House Committee as above constituted, shall also be a Finance Committee (two to form a quorum) for the purpose of examining all accounts for disbursement, and certifying to their correctness.

30. The General Committee shall present a report of the affairs of the hospital at each annual meeting, which report shall be presented at a special meeting of the Committee for revision and approval at least one week before the annual meeting.

31. The Committee shall be empowered to frame such regulations as they may deem necessary for the proper internal government of the institution or its different departments, provided such regulations are not *ultra vires* to the laws of the institution or the Legislature.

*Treasurer.*

32. All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the Treasurer (or his account at the bank) and appropriated by him to the purposes of the institution on the authority of the Committee of Management.

33. All moneys received by the Treasurer on account of the hospital shall be paid to the credit of the institution at the bank within forty-eight hours after such moneys shall amount to Five pounds (£5), and receipt of same made known to the Secretary as early as possible. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the President or one of the Vice-Presidents (or in the event of these being absent by the chairman of the meeting) and the Treasurer, and be countersigned by the Secretary.

34. The Treasurer shall close his accounts on the 31st December in every year.

*Secretary.*

35. The Secretary shall attend all meetings, take minutes of the same, conduct all correspondence, and carry out the directions of such meetings incidental to his office.

35A. The Secretary shall submit a balance-sheet at every ordinary meeting of the Committee of Management, showing the receipts and expenditure since the previous meeting, and keep any books of accounts connected with the institution the Committee may direct.

36. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the bank of the institution. The common seal shall not be fixed to any deed, or other instrument except by order of the general committee, at a meeting at which five members at least shall be present.

*Auditor.*

37. The Auditor shall, in the second week in January in every year, or as soon as conveniently may be prior to the annual meeting of contributors, examine the Treasurer's, Secretary's, and Collector's books, cash book, and balance-sheet, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the General Committee at the Special Meeting called as per Rule 30. In the event of the office of Auditor becoming vacant between the annual meeting of subscribers, the Committee of Management shall be empowered to fill any such vacancy.

*Honorary Medical Staff.*

38. There shall be two Honorary Medical Officers resident in the town of Mortlake, who shall be appointed for the first time at a Special General Meeting of the Subscribers, and thereafter annually in the manner hereinafter determined.

39. The two shall be elected by ballot at the Special General Meeting referred to above. Nominations must be in writing, signed by a subscriber to the hospital, and also signed by the candidate, and must be lodged with the Secretary fourteen days at least prior to such meeting. The medical gentleman who is the highest on the poll shall be appointed until the Annual General Meeting in 1924. He who is second on the poll shall be appointed until the Annual Meeting in 1923.

40. After the first appointment of the Honorary Medical Staff under these regulations one honorary medical officer shall retire at each Annual Meeting, and his successor shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting by the subscribers by ballot for a term of two years. Nominations to fill each annual vacancy shall be received fourteen days at least prior to such Annual Meeting.

41. Casual vacancies on the medical staff shall be filled by the Committee until the next Annual Meeting, when the subscribers shall fill the position for the unexpired portion of the term of the medical officer whose retirement shall first have caused such vacancy.

42. The medical staff shall be under the control of the Committee of the Hospital, which may, however, delegate from time to time such of its powers as it thinks fit to the House Committee.

43. The general internal superintendence of the hospital shall be given to each honorary medical officer in turn for a week at a time.

- (a) During the week succeeding that for which any honorary medical officer is the superintending officer he shall administer anaesthetics for the honorary medical officer who succeeds him as the superintending officer in all cases which have to be so treated that week.
- (b) Permission to transfer duties will be allowed to any or either of the medical officers amongst themselves, but the Committee reserve the right of veto.
- (c) It shall be within the power of the Committee to suspend any medical officer, but such suspension shall only remain in force until a Special General Meeting of Subscribers shall be called to deal with the cause of suspension.
- (d) Each of the honorary medical officers shall give lectures to the nurses under such conditions as to time and curriculum as the Committee shall require, in keeping with the rules of the Royal Victorian Trained Nurses' Association.

44. In no case shall any patient in charge of any member of the medical staff have any major surgical operation performed without a consultation of the honorary medical officers.

45. In all serious cases of illness or accident a consultation shall be immediately held of the whole medical staff or as many of them as may be available.

46. In all medical cases where the illness is protracted for a period of one month the medical officer in charge of the case shall request an immediate consultation of the honorary medical officers.

47. No major operation shall be performed without due notice being given to all the honorary medical officers.

48. No patient having been admitted for medical treatment shall be discharged as incurable without a consultation by the honorary medical officer in charge of the case with one or more of the honorary medical officers.

49. The results of all consultations and operations shall be recorded in a book kept for that purpose. The record of such to be signed by the medical officers.

49A. Should a majority of the medical men of Mortlake not become candidates for the position of Honorary Medical Officers or should the number of candidates for such positions not equal the number of vacancies, it shall be within the power of the Committee to suspend either wholly or in part the By-laws relating to honorary medical officers, and it shall further be in their power to make such arrangements as are necessary to the effectual conduct of the work of the hospital, including the power to appoint a paid medical officer or officers until the next annual meeting of subscribers.

50. The honorary medical officers shall sign their acceptance of these rules.

#### Matron.

51. The Matron shall reside on the premises, and have the charge, control, and management of the institution and the inmates thereof subject to the regulations and orders of the General and House Committee. The Matron shall not be absent between the hours of Ten p.m. and Eight a.m., nor more than two hours at a time without permission from the House Committee (except on Sundays for three hours). The Matron is never to be absent from the institution at any time without leaving some responsible and qualified substitute in charge, who shall be approved of by the superintending officer for the time being.

52. The Matron shall have the immediate superintendence of the wardsmen, nurses, and servants, and shall see that they do their duty, and she shall enforce order, sobriety, personal cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to orders. In case of any misbehaviour, disobedience, or neglect of duty by them, she shall have power to suspend the offender and report to the House Committee.

53. She shall regularly visit every part of the institution, and see that the wards and other parts of the house and grounds are kept in a proper state, and cleanliness and order; and that all inmates whom the doctor shall certify as able, shall be employed in the grounds or otherwise.

54. She shall have charge of, and be accountable for, the surgical instruments, furniture, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, cooking and kitchen utensils, medicines, and stores, and all other property of the institution; and she shall make an exact inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which she shall regularly enter the receipt, loss, or breakage of any article; and she shall, on the last days of June and December in each year, and at such other times as the General Committee may require, prepare and submit such inventory to the Committee.

55. She shall receive the stores and supplies furnished by the contractors and others, and she shall see that they correspond in description, quality, and quantity, with the tenders

and samples; and in case they do not, she shall report accordingly to the House Committee at the next meeting. She shall enter the receipt and issue of such stores and supplies in the books provided for that purpose.

56. She shall keep an exact account of the admission and discharge of the inmates, with their ages and religious denominations; the nature of the disease, and relief given, and its period of continuance in the register book; also a discharge book, in which each patient leaving may make any remark.

57. She shall superintend the cooking of all food for the inmates, and shall generally discharge the duties of Matron as shall be directed by the Committee.

#### Patients.

58. All applicants for admission must be provided with a recommendation ticket, except in cases of accident and decided emergency. The medical fitness of the applicant shall be determined by the medical officer superintending for the week.

59. All patients shall be required to pay the actual expenses of their maintenance as far as circumstances may enable them. Patients to have choice of medical attendant, subject to House Committee's consent.

60. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no child under two years of age, no person insane or suffering from delirium tremens, or subject to epilepsy, or any who in the opinion of the examining physician or medical officer might receive equal benefit as an outdoor patient, shall be admitted into the hospital.

61. Patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner, and shall strictly observe all the directions of the medical officers, matron, and nurses.

62. No one shall leave his or her ward to go into another ward or department, nor leave the house, nor remain out for a longer time than is granted, nor shall introduce visitors, nor receive medicines, victuals, liquor or tobacco, or anything, without the express leave of the medical officer in charge of the case.

63. They shall not gamble, nor smoke, nor spit on the floor, nor deface or injure any part of the ward, nor any furniture; bedding or clothing therein; nor sing, blaspheme, nor use rude or indecent language on pain of dismissal.

64. No patient shall give reward or gratuity to the matron, wardsmen, nurses, or any other servants.

65. Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the same known to the superintending medical officer, whose duty it shall be to enter such complaint immediately in a book kept for the purpose, which book shall be laid before the House Committee at each meeting.

66. A patient considered by the medical officer in charge of the case sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the institution, may be so employed.

67. Patients shall not sit up after 8 o'clock p.m. in the winter, nor after 9 p.m. in the summer, and shall rise as directed by the medical officer in charge of the case or by the Matron.

68. Ministers of religion shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations at such time as shall be appointed by the House Committee. Any minister may attend any patient at any time when requested by such patient; and in case of death notice will be forwarded to a relative and to the clergyman of the denomination to which the deceased patient belongs, stating the hour of burial.

#### Visitors.

69. Visitors will be admitted on Sunday and Wednesday in each week, between the hours of two and five o'clock in the afternoon.

70. Visitors shall not be allowed to go into any ward without the leave of the Matron, and must retire when requested by her.

71. Visitors will not be permitted to give or leave with any patient medicine, food, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing without the express sanction of the medical officer in charge of the case.

72. Visitors shall not give to any servant of the institution any money or gratuity of any kind.

#### Voluntary Departure.

73. Patients quitting the hospital at their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

#### Impostors.

74. In the event of any person in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such person, if an in-patient, shall be liable to be prosecuted, and shall be charged at a rate not exceeding Ten shillings (10s.) per day for each day from the date of admission; and the Committee may order the removal of any such person from the hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.

Endowment Fund.

75. (1) An Endowment Fund may be established, consisting of (a) all bequests not specially directed to be otherwise applied; (b) sums of money set aside from time to time from the proceeds of fêtes or other revenue locally raised; (c) special contributions; (d) interest accruing on the investment of the funds.

(2) All moneys to the credit of the fund from time to time shall be invested by the Committee at their discretion in Government or Municipal securities, fixed deposits in Banks, in the purchase of freehold property or upon first mortgage, in the name of the corporation, and the Treasurer shall receive the income therefrom, and appropriate the same for the purposes of the institution, on the authority of the Committee of Management.

(3) The principal moneys of the Endowment Fund shall not be transferred or applied to any purpose whatever without the sanction of a majority of the subscribers and governors at a special meeting to be called for the purpose.

(4) Contributors to this fund shall be entitled to all the privileges in respect of their contributions as if the same had been made to the ordinary annual revenue of the institution.

Meetings.

76. All meetings in connexion with the hospital shall be open to subscribers and the representatives of the press, but no person present at committee meetings, who is not a Member of Committee, shall be permitted to interfere or take part in the proceedings.

Alteration or Amendment of By-laws.

77. No new By-law shall be made, nor any of the existing By-laws rescinded, altered, or amended, except with the concurrence of a majority of the subscribers present at the Annual General Meeting; or a majority of subscribers present at a Special Meeting convened for the purpose; one month's notice of intention to move such rescission, alteration, or amendment, shall be given to the Committee, except such rescission, alteration, or amendment shall be proposed by the Committee, and the Committee shall give fourteen days' notice by advertisement to the subscribers.

The above rules and By-laws were adopted at a Public Meeting of Subscribers held on 24th April, 1922.
