CONSTITUTION OF COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS
TO DECIDE AN APPEAL AGAINST THE DETERMINA-
TION OF THE BOARDING HOUSES BOARD.

WHEREAS the Wages Board (herein referred to as the Boarding Houses Board) appointed under the Factories and Shops Acts to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in a boarding house, with accommodation for seven or more boarders, did by a certain Determination made on the thirteenth day of December, 1921, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the seventeenth day of December, 1921, following, determine the lowest prices or rates to be so paid: And whereas a majority of the representatives of the employees on the said Board have in the prescribed manner appealed against the said Determination to the Court of Industrial Appeals under the Factories and Shops Acts: Now therefore it is hereby ordered by His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf vested in him by the said Acts, that a Court of Industrial Appeals, consisting of the President His Honour Mr. Justice McArthur and Eliza Isabella Campbell McAuley, of Healesville, a person who has been *bonâ fide* and actually engaged in the trade concerned for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination duly nominated by a majority of the representatives of the employers on the Boarding Houses Board to represent the employers, and Arthur Bruce, of 53 Palmerstreet, Fitzroy, a person who has been *bonâ fide* and actually engaged in such trade for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination duly nominated by a majority of the representatives of the employees on the said Board to represent the employees be and the same is hereby constituted to consider and deal with the appeal aforesaid against the Determination of the Boarding Houses Board, and to revise or alter the said Court's own Determination from time to time in form and manner as provided by law.

RE-DEFINITION OF AREA OR LOCALITY WITHIN
WHICH THE DETERMINATION OF THE POTTERY
TRADE BOARD SHALL BE OPERATIVE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council

thereof, doth hereby make the following Order, that is to say:—

The area or locality within which the Determination of the Factory Trade Board shall be operative shall be the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool, the towns of Geelong West and Sandringham, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

A COUNTRY POTTERY TRADE BOARD TO BE
APPOINTED.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council by Order dated the eighth day of October, 1900, appointed a Special Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of pottery making, including the making of tiles, and of drain and glazed pipes, and the clay digging in connexion therewith, and directed that such Board may be described for all purposes by the short title of the Pottery Trade Board: And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts and by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of pottery making, including the making of tiles and of drain and glazed pipes, and the clay digging in connexion therewith: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor doth hereby order that a Wages Board consisting of ten members and a chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and five as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of pottery making, including the making of tiles and of drain and glazed pipes and the clay digging in connexion therewith: Also, that such Wages Board may in any Regulation, Determination, Order, or instrument, or legal proceedings be described for all purposes as the Country Pottery Trade Board; and that the area or locality within which the Determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria, outside and excepting the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool, the towns of Geelong West and Sandringham, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

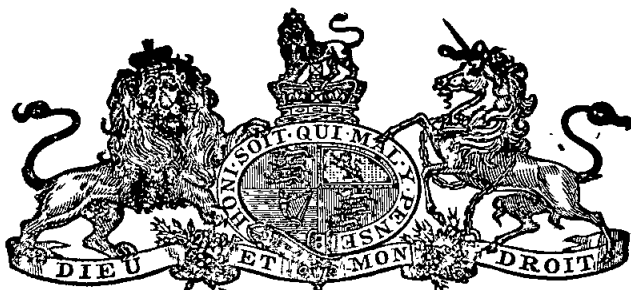

REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, No. 72.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf do hereby alter Regulation 64 (made by them on the seventeenth day of August, in the year One thousand nine hundred and eighteen' and confirmed by the Governor in Council on the twentieth day of August in that said year) in the following manner, that is to say for the present clause 315 of Division 25 of the said Regulation there shall be substituted the following clause, namely:—

(315) 1. In the case of any officer or employee who entered the service on or after the first day of July One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, or who may hereafter enter the service the amount of assurance shall, except as specially provided in sub-clauses 2 and 3 hereof, be in accordance with the following scale, namely:—

Salary per annum of officer, or equivalent wage per annum of employee.	Amount of Assurance.
Minimum rate of salary or wage on appointment	£100 or £200 if the officer or employee concerned so elects
Adult rate of salary or wage ...	£200
£300 ...	£300
£400 ...	£400
£500 ...	£500
£600 ...	£600

and so on, the amount of assurance to be increased by £100 upon the salary or wage being increased to the lowest rates respectively above specified as requiring such additional assurance, or to any higher multiple of One hundred.

2. Any officer of employee who is now in receipt of the adult rate of salary or wage and is assured for £150 shall not be required to increase the amount of his assurance to £200 until he receives a salary of or a wage equivalent to £250 per annum.

3. Any officer or employee who, if called upon to assure in accordance with the scale set out in sub-clause 1 hereof, would be required to pay in respect of the assurance on his life an annual premium of more than one-twentieth of his annual salary or wage, shall be bound to increase the amount of the assurance on his life only by such an amount as will be necessary to make the total amount of such assurance equal to the amount of the assurance which such officer or employee can obtain by payment of a premium equal to one-twentieth of his annual salary or wage.

4. In the interpretation of this clause the expression "adult rate of salary or wage" shall be deemed to mean the salary or wage payable by the Commissioners to the officer or employee in respect of whom the question arises on his attaining the age of 21 years.

AVENEL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1922.

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1922 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Trust District:—

I. For each vacant allotment of land of an area not exceeding one acre in extent, and on which no service-pipe has been laid, but which abuts on a street or road on which a main is laid, a rate of Five shillings shall be paid for the year; and for each such allotment of land of an area exceeding one acre in extent, a rate of Three pence for each additional acre shall be paid. Vacant allotments on which a service-pipe is laid shall be charged double the above rate.

II. For all lands and tenements within the Trust District of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

III. For all lands and tenements of more than Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount equal to One shilling and three pence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the shire of Seymour.

IV. For every steam-boiler supplied with water, a charge of Five pounds will be made for the year 1922.

V. Water troughs will be supplied at charges as follows:— For each trough or tub in an allotment of five acres or under, a charge of Fifteen shillings shall be made for the year; and for each acre above five acres, a charge of One shilling per acre shall be made in addition to the payment of Fifteen shillings for the first five acres. But this charge shall not be enforced on tubs or receptacles of any kind in a house yard unless used to water stock. The maximum amount to be paid for a supply of water to any trough shall be Five pounds per annum. For the supply of water to each hotel trough, a charge of One pound ten shillings shall be paid for the year.

VI. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum amount so charged for the year 1922 shall be 10,000 gallons.

VII. Gardens or orchards using water will be supplied by meter at the following charges:—Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; the minimum amount, to be charged for the year 1922 shall be 15,000 gallons.

VIII. The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1922, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1922, and such rate shall be payable on the first day of July, 1922.

The charge for water shall be payable quarterly or at such time as payment may be demanded by the Trust. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

BOROUGH OF INGLEWOOD.

By-LAW No. 42.

A By-law of the Borough of Inglewood made under Parts 7 and 31 of the Local Government Act 1915 and numbered 42, for imposing, receiving and collecting charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations or persons using or entering in or upon the Recreation Reserve and also for regulating the conduct of persons whilst using or being upon such Reserve.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Inglewood order as follows:—

(1) In the construction and for the purpose of this By-law, the "Recreation Reserve" shall mean:—

All that piece of land situate at the corner of Heales-street and Storm-lane and comprising allotments 15, 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20, Section 14, Town of Inglewood.

(2) "Council" shall mean the council of the municipality of the Borough of Inglewood.

(3) The Reserve shall be divided as follows:—
1st Division—The Tennis Courts.
2nd Division—The playing ground, which shall mean the ground enclosed by the post and wire rope fence.
3rd Division—The remainder of the Reserve.

(4) All persons shall be admitted to the Third Division of the Reserve (but not to any stand or building erected thereon) from sunrise to sunset free of charge except as hereafter provided.

(5) No sport or practising for sport will be permitted in the Reserve on any Sunday.

(6) No person shall enter at any time into the Second Division of the Reserve without the permission of the Council.

(7) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

(8) No person shall damage in any way the trees or buildings in the Reserve, or jump or climb over any of the fences surrounding the Reserve, and no fires shall be lighted therein without the permission of the Council.

(9) No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall ride or drive any horse or any carriage, cart or other vehicle through the Reserve without the permission of the Council.

(10) No person shall place in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep or other animals.

(11) The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Third Division of the Reserve on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches or other sports or amusements shall be for every adult such sum as the Council may determine not exceeding Two shillings, plus tax.

(12) Every person paying for admission to the Third Division of the Reserve shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which he shall upon demand produce, and if required, surrender, to any gatekeeper or other person having

authority to collect tickets, and every such ticket shall be available for the day only for which it is issued unless expressly stated thereon.

(13) Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner or creating or taking part in any disturbance or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or other sport or during practice at cricket or football or other sport or refusing to obey those authorized by the Council or by the club, association or person renting the ground for the time being to keep order shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto and shall also be liable for a prosecution for an offence against this By-law.

(14) On any day when the Council shall have granted permission to any club to make a charge for admission to the Third Division, the Tennis Club may be required to lock the gates leading from the First Division to the Second and Third Divisions during the progress of any football match, cricket match, or other sport, and *bona fide* members only of the Tennis Club shall gain access to the First Division during such period by way of the gate in Morrow-street.

(15) Upon application to the Council any club, association, society or person may be granted the exclusive use of the Reserve or any well-defined part thereof for the holding of cricket or football matches or other sports or amusements and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of this By-law and shall pay to the Council or its authorized officer such charges as the Council may from time to time fix. The Council, however, reserves itself the right to refuse any such application.

(16) No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission in writing of the Council.

(17) Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the Officers of the council shall at all times be at liberty to enter the said Reserve and all parts thereof.

Every person who shall by any wilful act or default offend against any of the provisions of this By-law, for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

CLASS 7.—FIREWORK.

Division 2.

Chinese crackers exceeding four inches in length, or other manufactured fireworks which are liable to explode violently, or which contain their own means of ignition.

By firework containing its own means of ignition is meant firework having an arrangement, whether attached to it or forming part of it, which is adapted to explode or fire the same by friction or percussion.

BY-LAW No. 44.

A By-law of the Shire of Bairnsdale, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and also as Rules and Regulations under section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, and numbered for the regulation of street traffic.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:—

That By-law No. 43 be repealed, and in lieu thereof the following be adopted as a By-law:—

Whereas it is desirable to make special regulations as to the traffic in that part of Main-street, Bairnsdale, within the township and shire of Bairnsdale and within limits measured from the east end of the gazetted tree reserve nearly opposite to the police station, and where the constructed roads on north and south of the said street intersect, along to the intersection of Main-street with Pyke and Sharpe streets.

In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, "driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle or motor car or traction engine; "footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within that part of the township of Bairnsdale affected by this By-law habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicular traffic.

"Motor car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power and includes a motor cycle.

"Rider" means any person in charge of a horse.

"Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the township of Bairnsdale other than a footway.

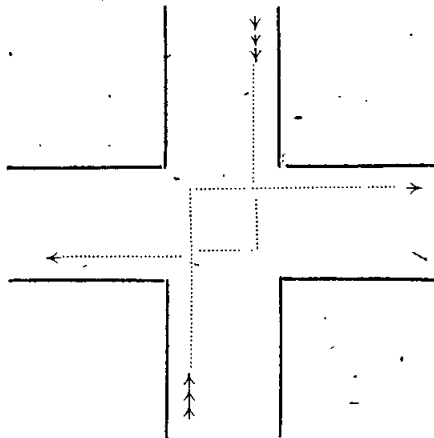
"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal power.

The driver of a vehicle or motor car or a traction engine upon that part of Main-street, Bairnsdale, measured as hereinbefore stated, and upon any other streets leading into Main-street within the limits hereinbefore stated, and the rider of a horse or other animal upon that part of Main-street as hereinbefore stated, and upon any other streets leading into Main-street within the said limits shall, except as shall be necessary for the purpose of avoiding a collision or for other justifiable cause—

1. Before stopping or turning round in any street or turning from one street into another or turning into or from any passage through the gazetted tree reserves give notice of his intention so to do by holding up his whip or his hand so that the same may be seen by any person immediately following and (in the case of a driver of a vehicle or a motor car) upon stopping so place his vehicle or motor car as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic, and if his stopping prevents the passing of any other vehicle or motor car he shall, upon being required so to do by the driver of such other vehicle or motor car or by any member of the police force or officer of the Council, remove his vehicle or motor car so as to permit such other vehicle or motor car to pass, and if his stopping interrupts or delays traffic, remove his vehicle or motor car so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

2. Before turning to the right or off side from one street into another or from or into any passage through the gazetted tree reserves into any street, drive, or ride parallel to the footway upon the left or near side of the street which he is leaving until he is as near as practicable to the left-hand side of the street which he is entering as shown on the subjoined diagram, or in the case of any such passage as aforesaid drive or ride parallel to the left or near side of the street or passage (as the case may be) which he is leaving until he is as near as

practicable to the left-hand side of the street or passage (as the case may be) which he is entering as shown on the subjoined diagram.



3. While driving or riding along that part of Main-street measured as hereinbefore stated (excluding the passages between the gazetted tree reserves) and while driving or riding from east to west keep as near as practicable to his left or near side and on that part of Main-street which lies to the south of the said gazetted tree reserves in Main-street aforesaid of that part of Main-street measured as hereinbefore stated, and drive no vehicle, motor car, or traction engine, nor ride any horse in a westerly direction on that part of Main-street which lies to the north of the said gazetted tree reserves.

4. While driving or riding along that part of Main-street measured as hereinbefore stated (excluding the said passages) and while driving or riding from west to east, keep as near as practicable to his left or near side and on that part of Main-street which lies to the north of the said gazetted reserves in Main-street aforesaid of that part of Main-street measured as hereinbefore stated, and drive no vehicle, motor car, or traction engine, nor ride any horse in an easterly direction on that part of Main-street which lies to the south of the said gazetted tree reserves.
