CONSTITUTION OF COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS TO DECIDE AN APPEAL AGAINST THE DETERMINATION OF THE BOARDING HOUSES BOARD.

TO DECIDE AN APPEAL AGAINST THE DETERMINATION OF THE BOARDING HOUSES BOARD.

WHEREAS the Wages Board (herein referred to as the Boarding Houses Board) appointed under the Factories and Shops Acts to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in a boarding house, with accommodation for seven or more boarders, did by a certain Determination made on the thirteenth day of December, 1921, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on the seventeenth day of December, 1921, following, determine the lowest prices or rates to be so paid: And whereas a majority of the representatives of the employees on the said Board have in the prescribed manner appealed against the said Determination to the Court of Industrial Appeals under the Factories and Shops Acts: Now therefore it is hereby ordered by His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf vested in him by the said Acts, that a Court of Industrial Appeals, consisting of the President His Honour Mr. Justice McArthur and Eliza Isabella Campbell McAuley, of Healesville, a person who has been bona fide and actually engaged in the trade concerned for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination duly nominated by a majority of the representatives of the employers on the Boarding Houses Board to represent the employers, and Arthur Bruce, of 53 Palmerstreet, Fitzroy, a person who has been bona fide and actually engaged in such trade for at least six honths during the three years immediately preceding nomination duly nominated by a majority of the representatives of the employees on the said Board to represent the employees be and the same is hereby constituted to consider and deal with the appeal aforesaid against the Determination of the Boarding Houses Board, and to revise or alter the said Court's own Determination from time to time in form and manner as provided by law.

RE-DEFINITION OF AREA OR LOCALITY WITHIN WHICH THE DETERMINATION OF THE POTTERY TRADE BOARD SHALL BE OPERATIVE.

A COUNTRY POTTERY TRADE BOARD TO BE APPOINTED.

Whereas the Governor in Council by Order dated the eighth day of October, 1900, appointed a Special Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of pottery making, including the making of tiles, and of drain and glazed pipes, and the clay digging in connexion therewith, and directed that such Board may be described for all purposes by the short title of the Pottery Trade Board: And whereas His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts and by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of pottery making, including the making of tiles and of drain and glazed pipes, and the clay digging in connexion therewith: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor doth hereby, order that a Wages Board consisting of ten members and a chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and five as representatives of employers and the clay digging in connexion therewith: Also, that such Wages Board may in any Regulation, Determination, Order, or instrument, or leg

BOROUGH OF INGLEWOOD.

BY-LAW No. 42.

A By-law of the Borough of Inglewood made under Parts 7 and 31 of the Local Government Act 1915 and numbered 42, for imposing, receiving and collecting charges or entrance *fees for clubs, associations or persons using or entering in or upon the Recreation Reserve and also for regulating the conduct of persons whilst using or being upon such Reserve.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Inglewood order as follows:—

(1) In the construction and for the purpose of this By-law, to "Recreation Reserve" shall mean:

All that piece of land situate at the corner of Healesstreet and Storm-lane and comprising allotments 15, 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20, Section 14, Town of Inglewood.

(2) "Council" shall mean the council of the municipality of the Borough of Inglewood.

(3) The Reserve shall be divided as follows:—
1st Division—The Tennis Courts.
2nd Division—The playing ground, which shall mean the ground enclosed by the post and wire rope fence.
3rd Division—The remainder of the Reserve.

(4) All persons shall be admitted to the Third Division of the Reserve (but not to any stand or building erected thereon) from sunrise to sunset free of charge except as hereafter provided.

provided.

(5) No sport or practising for sport will be permitted in the Reserve on any Sunday.

(6) No person shall enter at any time into the Second Division of the Reserve without the permission of the Council.

(7) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decemey as regards dress, language or conduct.

(8) No person shall damage in any way the trees or buildings in the Reserve, or jump or elimb over any of the fences surrounding the Reserve, and no fires shall be lighted therein without the permission of the Council.

(9) No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall ride or drive any horse or any carriage, eart or other vehicle through the Reserve without the permission of the Council.

(10) No person shall place in the Reserve any cattle, horses,

(10) No person shall place in the Reserve any cattle, horses,

(10) No person shall place in the Reserve any cattle, norses, sheep or other animals.

(11) The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Third Division of the Reserve on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches or other sports or amusements shall be for every adult such sum as the Council may determine not exceeding Two shillings, plas tax.

(12) Every person paying for admission to the Third Division of the Reserve shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which he shall upon demand produce, and if required, surrender, to any gatekeeper or other person having

authority to collect tickets, and every such ticket shall be available for the day only for which it is issued unless ex-

pressly stated thereon.

(13) Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner or creating or taking part in any disturbance or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or other sport or during practice at cricket or football or other sport or refusing to obey those authorized by the Council or by the club, association or person renting the ground for the time being to keep order shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto and shall also be liable for a prosecution for an offence against

this By-law.
(14) On any day when the Council shall have granted per-(14) On any day when the Council shall have granted permission to any club to make a charge for admission to the Third Division, the Tennis Club may be required to lock the gates leading from the First Division to the Second and Third Divisions during the progress of any football match, cricket match, or other sport, and bona fide members only of the Tennis Club shall gain access to the First Division during such period by way of the gate in Morrow-street.

(15) Upon application to the Council any club, association, conider a person may be granted the evolutive use of the

(15) Upon application to the Council any club, association, society or person may be granted the exclusive use of the Reserve or any well-defined part thereof for the holding of cricket or football matches or other sports or amusements and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of this By-law and shall pay to the Council or its authorized officer such charges as the Council may from time to time fix. The Council, however, reserves itself the right to refuse any such application.

(16) No person shall creet any dwelling in the Reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission in writing of the Council.

Council. (17) Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the Officers of the council shall at all times be at liberty to enter the said Reserve and all parts thereof.

Every person who shall by any wifful act or default offend against any of the provisions of this By-law, for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

A By-law of the Shire of Bairnsdale, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the Local Government Act 1915, and also as Rules and Regulations under section 6 of the Police Offences Act 1915, and numbered for the regulation of street traffic.

N, pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:—

Whereas it is desirable to make special regulations as to the traffic in that part of Main-street, Bairnsdale, within the township and shire of Bairnsdale and within limits measured from the east and of the gazetted tree reserve nearly opposite to the police station, and where the constructed roads on north and south of the said street intersect, along to the intersection of Main-street with Pyke and Sharpe streets.

In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, "driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle or motor car or traction engine; "footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within that part of the township of Bairnsdale affected by this By-law habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicular traffic. "Motor cur" "neans any conveyance propelled by mechanical power and includes a motor cycle.

"Rider" means any person in charge of a horse.

"Street" includes every highway, road, (arriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the township of Bairnsdale other than a footway.

"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal power.


