ORDER APPROVING OF A NEW DEVELOPMENTAL ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF KERANG.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the new developmental road hereinafter referred to in the Shire of Kerang should be made by the said Board: And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said new road is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said new road: And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said new road: Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

MURRAHIT-ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF KERANG.

All that piece of land in allotment 39, section B, parish of Kerang, the boundaries of which are as follow:—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of the said allotment; thence by lines bearing respectively 244 deg. 56 min. 300 links, 32 deg. 28 min. 506.3 links, and 180 deg. 0 min. 300 links to the point of commencement, which said piece of land is particularly delineated and shown coloured red on survey plan No. 1282 lodged in the office of the Country Roads Board.

Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635).

DECLARATION OF A DEVIATION FROM THE TYNONG-TONIMBUK ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF BERWICK.

WHEREAS by section 58 of the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) (as amended by section 16 of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*, No. 2944) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the *Country Roads Acts* has (whether before or after the commencement of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*) by Resolution declared a deviation to be a developmental road the said Board may also declare that such deviation shall be in lieu of any existing road or part thereof named in such Resolution and that on publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Order confirming such Resolution the existing road or part thereof shall cease to be a developmental road or be discontinued as provided in the Resolution: And whereas the said Board has by Resolution declared the deviation on the land described in the First Schedule to such Resolution to be a developmental road and has also declared that such deviation shall be in lieu of the part of the existing road being the land described in the Second Schedule to the said Resolution and that such part of the existing road as is described in the Third Schedule to such

Resolution shall be closed. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Resolution of the Country Roads Board declaring Road on Site taken for Deviation of a Developmental Road fit for use.

Whereas the land the site of the road the course of which is below set out was taken by the Board under the provisions of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* for the purpose of constructing such a road deviation which road deviation has now been laid out and formed on the same. And whereas the said Board (being the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1915*) thinks that the road aforesaid is fit to be used as a public highway such Board at a meeting now holden acting under the authority conferred upon it by section 58 of the said last cited Act doth by this present Resolution hereby declare the said road deviation, the course of which is described in the First Schedule hereto, with the commencing and terminating points thereof respectively specified, to be part of a developmental road within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*. 3. *Tynong-Tonimbuk Road* (1953).—All that piece of land in the parish of Bunyip and being a roadway generally one chain wide, the north-western boundary of which commences at a point on the southern boundary of allotment 50 of the said parish, distant 3 865 links from the south-eastern angle of the said allotment; thence north-easterly through that allotment, north-easterly across a one-chain road, and north-easterly through allotment 76d of the said parish to a point on the north-eastern boundary thereof, distant 133 deg. 0 min. 1,223.7 links from the north-western angle of the said allotment 76d.

DECLARATION OF A DEVIATION FROM THE SHADY CREEK ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF NARRACAN.

WHEREAS by section 58 of the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) (as amended by section 16 of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*, No. 2944) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Acts has (whether before or after the commencement of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*) by Resolution declared a deviation to be a developmental road the said Board may also declare that such deviation shall be in lieu of any existing road or part thereof named in such Resolution and that on publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Order confirming such Resolution the existing road or part thereof shall cease to be a developmental road or be discontinued as provided in the Resolution. And whereas the said Board has by Resolution declared the deviation on the land described in the First Schedule to such Resolution to be a developmental road and has also declared that such deviation shall be in lieu of the part of the existing road being the land described in the Second Schedule to the said Resolution and that such part of the existing road as is described in the Third Schedule to such Resolution shall be discontinued. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Resolution of the Country Roads Board declaring Road on Site taken for Deviation of a Developmental Road fit for use.

Whereas the land the site of the road the course of which is below set out was taken by the Board under the provisions of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918* for the purpose of constructing such a road deviation which road deviation has now been laid out and formed on the same. REGULATIONS FOR CONVENING MEETINGS OF THE TRUST, AND GENERALLY FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE TRUST.

WHEREAS by section 32 of the Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2715) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations relating to any Railway Construction Trust appointed and created under the said Act for the purposes following:—

- (a) Prescribing the mode in which meetings of the members of Trusts under this Act are to be convened;
- (b) prescribing the form of any notice or order which may be required to be given by any Trustees under this Act;
- (c) regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of every such Trust and the numbers of members to form a quorum thereof, and the appointment of the chairman of each Trust; and
- (d) generally for carrying into effect the provisions of this Act.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of section 32 of the above-recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts, and known as the Won Wron to Woodside Railway Construction Trust, make the Regulations following, viz.:—

1. *First Meeting.*—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.
2. *Time and Place of Meeting.*—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.
3. *Quorums of Meetings.*—There shall be present at least three members at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of two members, exclusive of the Chairman.
4. *Chairman.*—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually, by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal Council of his district, and may be willing to act.
5. *Vacancy of Chairman, how Filled.*—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting.
6. *Appointment by Minister.*—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal Council of his district, and be willing to act.
7. *Vice-Chairman.*—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.
8. *Special Meetings.*—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any three members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof at least be given.
9. *General Conduct of Business.*—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.
10. *Meetings, Notice of.*—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.
11. *Minutes of Meeting to be Read at Subsequent Meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall

be the reading and putting of a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.

12. *Order of Business of Meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (I.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- (II.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (IV.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (V.) Payments.
- (VI.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
- (VII.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (VIII.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
- (IX.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (X.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

13. *Addresses to the Governor in Council.*—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

14. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, seven clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each Trustee, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting, may be dealt with at the next meeting.

15. *Notice of Motion to be Given.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

16. *Petitions.*—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

17. *Motions to be Moved in Order.*—Except by leave of a majority of the Trustees present, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

18. *Motion to be Moved by Member giving Notice.*—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

19. *Mover of Motion Appointing Committee to be a Member.*—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

20. *Draft of Address or Petition to be Submitted at Previous Meeting.*—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

21. *Order, &c., of Debate.*—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair may proceed with his subject.

22. *Nature of Motion to be Stated.*—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

23. *No Motion to be Withdrawn without Leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the Trustees present.

24. *Motion to be Seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

25. *Mover of Motion.*—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

26. *Motions, &c., how Decided.*—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.

27. *Resolutions, how Revoked or Altered.*—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.

28. *Priority of Members.*—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.

29. *Members to Stand while Addressing the Trust.*—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

30. *Points of Order.*—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussion or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.

31. *Members not to Digress.*—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

32. *Members to Apologize for Disorderly or Offensive Expressions.*—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

33. *Members Called to Order to Sit Down.*—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.

34. *Members Twice Offending to be Liable to a Penalty.*—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

35. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

36. *Members may Demand Documents.*—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

37. *No Second Amendment until Previous One Disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

38. *Mover of Motion to have Right of Reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.

39. *No Discussion on Motion for Adjournment of Trust.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained, but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.

40. *Protests.*—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

41. *Lapsed Questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. *Lapsed Order of the Day may be Restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

43. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committee shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust.

44. *Meetings of Committees.*—The Secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the committee.

45. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

46. *No Debate shall take place upon Petitions.*—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

47. *Secretary.*—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.

48. *Treasurer.*—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.

49. *Collector.*—The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay the Treasurer or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the Secretary, and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.

50. *Appointment, &c., of Officers.*—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Construction District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required, the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.

51. *Salaries of Officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

52. *Expense of Preparing Security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

53. *Common Seal.*—The Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman, a member, and Secretary.

54. *Suspension of Rules.*—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this Regulation may be suspended *pro tem*, in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

55. *Penalty.*—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

REGULATION No. 2.

FORMS OF NOTICES TO TREAT AND ACCOMPANYING SCHEDULE OF CLAIM TO BE USED IN ACQUIRING LAND FOR RAILWAY PURPOSES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the township of Ouyen within the municipal district of the shire of Walpeup of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the thirtieth day of November, 1915, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the township of Ouyen within the municipal district of the shire of Walpeup shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

ESSENDON RECREATION RESERVE.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Essendon (now called the City of Essendon) in respect of the Essendon Recreation Reserve, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be maintained and used for the recreation and amusement of the people, and offices and conveniences connected therewith under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the State of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Council for the time being of the City of Essendon. And whereas by section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*, it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind any regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said section. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Essendon do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Essendon Recreation Reserve:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be parcelled out in the following divisions:—

First.—The grand stand, the cricket and football pavilion, the press box and enclosures.

Second.—The bowling greens, club house and dwelling, the tennis courts and club room, the croquet lawns and club room, and enclosures.

Third.—The remainder of the Reserve.

2. The third division of the Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding fifty-two in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, entertainments, performances, sports or holiday amusements.

3. The Council shall have power to hold entertainments or performances in the Reserve and to make charges for admission thereto.

4. The Council shall have power to use the Reserve or any part thereof, and to let same or any part thereof to any club, association or person for the purposes of holding cricket or football matches and for the purposes of bowling, tennis and croquet, fêtes, entertainments, performances, sports or holiday amusements and to make charges for admission thereto or any part thereof, and to authorize such club association or person to make charges for admission thereto or any part thereof.

5. No charge or fee for admission to the Reserve shall exceed Two shillings and sixpence for each adult person and One shilling for each child under the age of twelve years and over four years old.

6. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve or any part thereof on the occasions of any fêtes, entertainments, sports, performances, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Council may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of the Reserve and all stands, buildings, erections and improvements thereon and therein and the Council in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by the Reserve and such stands, buildings, erections, improvements or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Council.

7. No person except the Mayor, Councillors and Officers of the Council shall enter any portion of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged unless otherwise authorized by the Council.

8. No person shall interfere with, injure, break or damage the Reserve or the stands, buildings, erections, improvements, trees, plants or shrubs thereon or therein or pluck any flowers or walk on the beds in or upon the Reserve or climb, jump or get upon or over any of the fences or gates or cut or in any way damage any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures in or around the Reserve or post bills or advertisements on any of such fences, gates, seats or other structures or roll or throw stones or other missiles or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange or banana peel or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever in or upon the Reserve.

9. No person shall ride any bicycle or tricycle in or through the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

10. No person shall engage in training or in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse or any like games in the Reserve without the authority of the Council.

11. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve.

12. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

13. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

14. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

15. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

16. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

17. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

18. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work any of the Council's employees engaged in the Reserve by conversation or otherwise.

19. No person shall sell or offer for sale within the Reserve any articles of food or drink or any other commodity or operate any money making amusement without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

20. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or use indecent or abusive language or commit any nuisance or in any way offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct in the Reserve.

21. No person shall remain in such Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Council to leave the same.

22. No person shall spit or expectorate on any structure or erection in such Reserve.

23. Any person committing in any part of the Reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission or have a ticket for admission thereto:—

- (1) Assaulting any other person.
- (2) Being drunk.
- (3) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground or the tennis court, bowling green or croquet lawn enclosures (as the case may be) during any cricket match, football match, tennis match, bowling match or croquet match, cycling race, or other sports, or during practice at cricket, football, tennis, bowling, croquet, or cycling or when crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground, or the tennis court, bowling green or croquet lawn enclosures, or cycling track, would be injurious to any of them as a cricket ground, football ground, tennis court, bowling green, croquet lawn or cycling track respectively.
- (4) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (5) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (6) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (7) Improperly interfering with or interrupting any cricket match, football match, tennis match, bowling match, croquet match, cycling race, or practice, or any athletic or other sports or holiday amusements.
- (8) Obtaining admission to any part of the first, second, or third division when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.
- (9) Offering to the public any wager or bet.
- (10) Calling the odds upon any race or event, or any competitors therein.

24. *Definitions.*—"Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Essendon. "Reserve" shall mean Essendon Recreation Reserve.

Penalty.—Every person offending against these Regulations shall in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act 1915* for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5) and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of the Trustees or by any member of the police force does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or officer or servant or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Premises (whether a licensed victualler's premises or not) on which are manufactured or prepared for sale ice cream, ginger beer, hop beer, or any other similar beer, lemonade, cordials, soda water, lithia water, or other mineral water, or any artificially aerated water—Five shillings.

For any transfer of registration—Two shillings and sixpence.

SHIRE OF POOWONG AND JEETHO.

BY-LAW No. 16.

Building Regulations.

IT is hereby notified that the Council of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho, at a meeting held on the twenty-third day of May, 1922, passed a resolution adopting a By-law, No. 16, regulating and restraining the erection of buildings within certain parts of the municipality of Poowong and Jeetho, and that such resolution was confirmed at a meeting of the said Council held on the twenty-first day of June, 1922, and that such By-law was approved by the Governor in Council on the fourth day of July, 1922. And it is hereby notified further that a copy of the By-law is deposited at the office of the said Council, and is there open for inspection free of charge.

The By-law will operate within the boundaries of the Korumburra Riding, the township of Nyora, and the township and environs of Poowong, within a radius of 20 chains from the Poowong War Memorial Monument, and the following is a summary of the provisions it contains, viz.:—

Part I. provides—

That the plans of every new building must be first submitted to the Council for approval and how such plans are to be submitted and the requirements respecting the same, and that fees are payable.

That the site upon which a building is to be erected must be in a healthy condition, graded and properly drained.

That buildings removed to the area defined or from one place to another within the area must be re-erected to comply with the By-law.

That all buildings with certain exceptions must be erected a defined distance from the building line and back line of the allotment intended to be built upon.

That wooden buildings shall be erected a defined distance from side streets or from other wooden buildings.

That roofs of buildings must be of incombustible coverings. That the interior of all buildings must be constructed of approved fire-resisting materials.

That only brick, stone or concrete buildings shall be erected within the area defined in Schedule 2 of the By-law.

For the minimum area to be covered by buildings.

That the allotment upon which a dwelling is to be erected shall have a superficial area of at least 6,000 feet, and a frontage to a street or road of not less than 40 lineal feet, except in the case of existing subdivisions having a frontage of not less than 33 feet and a depth of 165 feet, and that the dwelling house and other buildings to be erected on each such allotment shall cover not more than a certain area of the land.

That the By-law shall apply to alterations and additions to existing buildings.

For the height of the habitable rooms, the ventilation and lighting of buildings and the thickness of walls and the construction of staircases of buildings.

That petroleum and other oils must be stored in properly constructed buildings.

That bath-heaters and stoves must be properly constructed and set.

Part II. provides—

For the height of buildings.

Part III. provides—

SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.

BY-LAW No. 41.

A By-law of the Shire of Yarrawonga made under section 75 (sub-sections (j) and (k)) of the *Health Act 1919* and numbered 41 (forty-one).

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919* and of every other power enabling it in that behalf and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Yarrawonga order as follows:—

1. No person shall within 15 feet of a dwelling-house keep or yard any animal (including birds) or within such distance permit any land or premises to be used for such purpose.
2. No person shall keep any place or on any premises keep any animal (including birds) or store anything in the opinion of the Council offensive injurious to health or dangerous.
3. If in the opinion of the Council the removal of stable poultry yard or any other place or building or place in which any animal (including birds) is kept or housed any part of which is within 25 feet of a dwelling-house is possible and is necessary for the health or safety of any of the residents in its vicinity the Council may order the owner or occupier of it or of the premises of which it forms a part to remove or alter it so that no part of it shall be within 25 feet of any dwelling house.
4. No person shall within 25 feet of a dwelling house establish or construct a stable poultry yard or any other place in which any animal (including birds) is housed or kept or cause any such to be constructed or established or within such distance permit any land or premises or any other place to be used afresh or for the first time as a stable poultry yard premises or other place aforesaid.
5. Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof is liable to a penalty of not more than £20 and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than £5.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the town of Yarrawonga.
