REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THAT PORTION OF THE QUEEN'S PARK IN THE TOWN OF COLERAINE, KNOWN AS THE "OVAL."

THE Council of the municipality of the shire of Wannon, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of the ninth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and the fifteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, as a site for a Public Park in the town of Coleraine, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of that portion of the said land known as the "Oval," and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein and thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

In the construction and for the purposes of these Regulations the term "Oval" shall mean and include: All that piece of land commencing at a point 17 chains 59 links due south of the extreme north-west corner of Queen's Park and bounded by lines bearing respectively due east 5 chains 47 links north 72 degs. 26 mins. east 11 chains 38 links south 79 degs. 54 mins. east for 10 chains 37 links south for 10 chains 77 links; from thence the area is within the southern boundaries of Queen's Park as reserved as aforesaid which boundaries are as follows: south 60 degs. 14 mins. west 4 chains 2 links north 65 degs. 44 mins. west 7 chains 33 links south 44 degs. 29 mins. west 4 chains 34 links and seven-tenths of a link north 45 degs. 42 mins. west 7 chains 27 links south 43 degs. 32 mins. west 3 chains 76 links; thence by Gage-street to the point of commencement.

2. The Regulations made by such Board on the twelfth day of November One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven are hereby rescinded so far as they apply to the Oval.

3. The Oval is parcelled out into the following divisions:—

1st Division.—The grandstand buildings and enclosures contiguous thereto and also the tennis courts and buildings connected therewith.

2nd Division.—The playing or sports ring which is fenced in and surrounded by a fence.

3rd Division.—The remainder of the Oval together with the buildings thereon.

4. The Oval shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset during the months of April May June July August September and October and from sunrise to 8.30 p.m. during the months of November December January February and March except as hereinafter provided.

5. No person shall enter or remain in the Oval which may offend against decency as regards dress language or conduct and no society club picnic party or other combined body shall be allowed to use the Oval without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained and any society club picnic party or other combined body of persons shall abide by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the Oval and the buildings and erection for the time being thereon.

6. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates stick bills thereon cut names on the fences trees or seats or in any way damage any of the buildings gates fences chattels or other property in and around the Oval, or pollute any water in the Oval or remove therefrom any soil sand or manure.

7. No person shall interfere with or injure the trees shrubs flowers or other property in the Oval or roll or throw any stones or other missiles therein or commit any nuisance therein or leave any bottles orange peel paper cast-off clothing rubbish or any litter in the Oval.

8. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Oval or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description without permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained and no person shall light any fires in the Oval without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management.

9. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Oval shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees shrubs or flowers.

10. No person shall bring into the Oval any dog and all dogs brought into the Oval and all goats and poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

11. Public betting in any part of the Oval (including all buildings and enclosures) shall not be permitted and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the buildings or enclosures and the Oval.

12. Any person committing in the Oval or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be forthwith removed from

the Oval notwithstanding such person may have paid for or be in possession of a ticket of admission to the Oval or any part thereof:—

- (a) Being drunk or using any profane indecent or abusive language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive threatening or insulting expressions or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- (c) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket or football match or other outdoor game or sports or amusements or when crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground would be injurious to it.
- (d) Being found in any part of the first or third division of the Oval and not producing on demand or surrendering if required to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand the production or surrender of tickets a ticket duly authorizing the admission of such person to the places wherein he or she may be found.
- (e) Obtaining admission to any part of the first, second, or third division of the Oval when not entitled to such admission under these Regulations.

13. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Oval on such days (not exceeding fifty in one year) as the Oval may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports entertainments fêtes or holiday amusements shall be as follows:—

For admission of every person to the first division such sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

For admission of every person to the third division such sum as the Committee of Management may determine not exceeding One shilling.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* on conviction before any Justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

By-law of the city of Brighton, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 80, for the purpose of regulating traffic.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of Brighton order as follows:—
