Marine Act 1915.

AMENDMENT OF "THE PASSENGER (SAILING AND MOTOR) BOAT REGULATIONS, 1915."

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Marine Act 1915, to make and amend Regulations for the licensing of all boats plying for hire or let out for hire or valuable consideration in any port in Victoria, the Marine Board of Victoria with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of the said State in Council, doth make the amending Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations, 1922," and shall take effect from the 1st day of October, 1922, except clause seven hereof which shall come into operation on the 1st day of December, 1922.
2. In these Regulations the expression "Principal Regulations" shall mean "The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations, 1915," made and passed by the Marine Board of Victoria on the 27th day of August, 1915, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 31st day of the same month.
3. For clause eleven of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following clause:—

"11. A licence issued in respect of any boat (other than a motor boat) whether a sailing boat or a motor sailing boat shall unless sooner suspended or cancelled by the Marine Board continue in force from the date of issue of the same until the 30th day of September then next and no longer.

In the case of a motor boat a licence issued in respect of the same shall unless sooner suspended or cancelled by the Marine Board continue in force from the date of issue—

- (a) If it be that during any period of twelve months between the thirtieth day of September and the first day of October following a Mandate is promulgated whether by a Regulation made by the Marine Board or by the command of any other authority to take effect on some day within twelve months from its issue but later than the first day of October following such issue by which Mandate provision of some kind whether as regards structure or other matter (not at the date of the Mandate essential as a condition precedent to a motor boat at such date being licensed) is made whereby a motor boat is forbidden to be licensed after the date when the Mandate is to take effect unless the requirements prescribed by the Mandate exist or are satisfied and the condition of the motor boat in relation to which the licence is granted does not satisfy such requirements whether as regards structure engines furniture fittings lay-out or other matter

until the day when the provisions of such Mandate are appointed to take effect and no longer, or

- (b) If it be that no such Mandate exists or if the licence sought is in respect of a motor boat which satisfies the requirements of such Mandate

until the 30th day of September then next and no longer."

4. To clause 13 of the Principal Regulations there shall be added at the end thereof the following words, namely:—

"but such officer or person shall not give the prescribed certificate in respect of a boat the dimensions of which are less than 20 feet length by 6 feet breadth amidships by 2 ft. 6 in. depth amidships, unless he is satisfied that such boat has sufficient stability and freeboard when loaded to carry such number of

passengers as he may determine as safe, which number shall be set out on the face of the certificate and represent the maximum number of passengers which may lawfully be carried on such boat notwithstanding any provision to the contrary contained in clause 15 (1) of these Regulations."

5. To sub-clause (1) of clause 15 of the Principal Regulations there shall be added at the end thereof the following words, namely:—

"and shall not be in closer proximity to the motor in any boat than in the opinion of the Inspecting Officer or person may be safe and proper."

6. After clause 16 of the Principal Regulations there shall be inserted the following additional clause, namely:—

16A. *Prohibition of Smoking.*—On each motor boat and motor sailing boat licensed under these Regulations there shall be exhibited in a conspicuous position a notice containing the following words painted in letters not less than one-half inch in height, namely:—"No smoking allowed near engine or petrol tank."

7. After clause 22 of the Principal Regulations there shall be inserted the following additional clause, namely:—

22A. *Buoyancy.*—No motor boat shall be licensed under these Regulations unless such boat is provided with internal buoyancy fittings equal to 25 per cent. in excess of the weight of the propelling machinery, ballast and all equipments of a non-buoyant nature, either in the form of muntz metal or copper casings, or enclosed watertight air spaces. Sealed oil drums secured in position to the boat will according to their capacity nevertheless be accepted as portion or the

whole of the buoyancy fittings required, provided they are painted or otherwise prevented from rusting and are readily removable for periodical inspection and testing.

8. The fifteenth schedule to the Principal Regulations shall be read as if the date 30th of September were omitted and when a licence is issued there shall be inserted the proper date, that is to say if there be no Mandate or if there be a Mandate but the motor boat in respect of which the licence is sought satisfies the requirements of the same, the "30th of September" and in all other cases the day and month fixed for the Mandate to take effect.

9. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause four of the Principal Regulations in the case of a licence for a motor boat issued in accordance with the requirements of these present Regulations terminating at a date when the provisions of a Mandate are appointed to take effect and no longer if the holder of such licence subsequently to its issue carries out the requirements of such Mandate with respect to such motor boat and applies for a licence in respect of the period between the date when his limited licence is appointed to expire no fee shall be payable in respect of such new licence to be issued as available until the 30th of September following.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this twenty-seventh day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

RESTRICTIONS ON FISHING IN WATERS ON MOUNT BUFFALO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamation published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the 22nd January, 1913, re Fishing at Mount Buffalo and in lieu thereof prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the under-mentioned waters during the respective periods set opposite thereto:—

The Upper Eurobin or Long Plain Creek, which flows into Lake Catani	During the whole of each year.
Lake Catani, and the Crystal Brook	From 1st May to 30th September in each year.
The New Reservoir at the head of Crystal Brook	From the date of this Proclamation until the 30th day of September, 1925, and thereafter from 1st May to 30th September in each year.

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which must be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood are not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at _____," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender: neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.
3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 5 feet for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may desire.
9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.
10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
12. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor. Every person engaged in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of the firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of the firewood tendered for in this schedule shall be paid such wages and employed subject to such conditions as are or may be determined by the Fuel and Fodder Board or the Country Fuel and Fodder Board, as the case may be, under the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.

Every licence granted under section 121 of the *Land Act 1915* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

CONDITIONS.

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the *Land Acts*, except under the 121st section of the *Land Act 1915*, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council.
2. In case the said land, or any part thereof, should be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than that which the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Land Acts* may think fit.
3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.
4. Subject to these conditions the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without the authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the *Land Act 1915* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

11. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act 1890* in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

16. The licensee shall keep the land free from vermin, and, should he fail to do so, the licence shall be liable to forfeiture.

17. This licence is issued subject to the right of a willers to graze on this area such horses and bullocks as are actually used in connexion with their licensed operations on this land.
