#### DETERMINATION OF THE BOOT BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 15th September, 1923, applied to the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warmambool; the town of Geelong West; the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing either inside or outside a factory, boots, shoes, and slippers of every description," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 15th September, 1923, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
