2. No persons shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fres be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut ames on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or uny missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No porson shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person sha 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to

expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Conamittee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management. Management.

13. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

than one hook attached thereto, and no fish of a less weight than eight (8) ounces, other than native fish, shall be taken or removed from the said lake.

4. No person shall light or maintain any fire within the National Park without the permission of the Committee of Management. or duly authorized officer, and then only in such places as may be directed.

5. No person shall camp in the National Park, or erect therein any dwelling hut or other structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, or duly authorized officer.

6. No person shall bring to the National Park, or allow to wander therein, any horse, cattle. sheep, goats, or pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, and the owners of any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals found trespassing will be liable to prosecution for a breach of these regulations. regulations.

7. No person shall bathe in the National Park, except in

7. No person shall bathe in the Manional Park, except in the places set apart for the purpose; and every person bathing therein shall be decently clad from neck to knees.

8. No dog shall be allowed in the National Park, and all dogs found therein shall be liable to be destroyed, and the

9. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the National Park shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shruls.

10. No person shall cut in the National Park or remove therefrom any live or dead timber without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

11. Except as hereinafter provided no motor, delivery cart, lorry, waggon, truck, van, or other vehicle, carrying a load exceeding one (1) ton, shall be allowed within the National Park without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

12. No person, unless duly, authorized, in writing, by the Board of Land and Works, shall ply for hire or carry passengers for reward within the boundaries of the National Park.

13. Motor cars and motor cycles may travel on the main road in the National Park to Mount Buffalo (hereinafter called the Main-road) only at such times and in such direction as are set forth in clause 18 of these regulations.

14. Horses or vehicles, drawn by horses or other animals, may travel on the main road only at such times and in such directions are set forth in clause 18 of these regulations.

tion as are set forth in clause 18 of these regulations.

15. Motor cars and motor cycles shall not travel on the main road at a greater speed than ten (10) miles an hour, and drivers shall slow down and sound the bell or horn at all turns in the main road.

'16. The Bailiff of Crown lands, or other officer controlling traffic on the main road, shall have full authority to close it against all motor traffic whenever, in his opinion, the said main road is unfit for such traffic, or whenever, for any other reason, the closing thereof is considered necessary. A notice "Closed against motor traffic" and placed on the entrance gate shall be sufficient evidence that the main road is closed against such traffic. against such traffic.

17. The Bailiss of Crown lands, or other officer controlling traffic on the main road, shall have full authority to stop the passage of any type of motor which is considered to be unsafe, or which, in his opinion, would cause undue damage to the road. the road.

18. The time-table for the regulation of motor and other vehicular traffic on the Government-road to Mount Buffalo shall be as set forth in the Schedule hereto, or as altered from time to time at the direction of the Chairman of the Committee of Management.

3. No person shall remove the soil under or about any tree earth shrub fern or other plant or interfere with cut destroy damage or remove any earth tree shrub plant flower fern or other property of the Council.

4. No person who shall offend against decency as regards dress language or conduct shall remain in the Reserve,

No person shall kill pursue worry ill-treat or take any bird or animal in any part of the Reserve or wiffully displace disturb injure or take any bird's nest or eggs nor shall any person enter the Reserve with or use spread or set therein any snare net engine instrument or other means for taking or destroying any hird or animal.

11. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall lead or drive any horse or any carriage cart or other vehicle through the Reserve without the permission of the Council and no person shall ride any bievele in the Reserve except on the track set apart for cycling.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless securely held by a chain or cord and effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from pursuing worrying or disturbing any animal therein and all dogs found in the Reserve not so held and restrained may be destroyed.

13. No person shall without the consent of the Council earry use or discharge any firearm in the Reserve.

14. No person shall sell offer or expose for sale any article or thing within the Reserve, without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

23. No person shall smoke tobacco or any like substance in any building within the Reserve where by notice or notices fixed or set up in some conspicuous position the Council

24. No assemblage for the purpose of public worship preaching or public speaking of any kind or meetings of a like character shall take place in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

25. No booth or tent or other structure shall be erected within the Reserve without the consent of the Council.

No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for cricket or football matches shows sports fêtes reapart for cricket or toothall matches shows sports letes regatts or holiday amusements except on production of a ticket issued by the Council or any club association or person authorised by the Council to issue such ticket for admission—or by any club association or person renting the keserve or any part thereof for the time being—duly authorising the admission of such person but no such ticket for admission shall be of any avail except on the date or dates printed thereon nor shall it authorise, the holder thereof to enter any building crection enclosure or cultivated alot enter any building crection enclosure or cultivated plot within the Reserve and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorised to collect same.
