HENLEY-ON-YARRA.

Notice to Boatmen, Etc.

[No. 1 of 1923.]

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that permission has been granted to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association, in connexion with the Annual Regatta, to row races on the Henley Course on the Upper Yarra on the 27th October, 1923, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day must observe the following Regulations, viz. :—

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, and carry a bucket for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme.

No boats (except racing boats) are allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagings (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers.

No boat deemed by the Port Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No boat will be permitted to show any advertisement or objectionable device.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boat, except such as have permission of the Port Officer or his Deputy.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the Port Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

No motor or other boats will be allowed to ply for hire between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road Bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and midnight on Henley Day.

All motor boats shall be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m., and shall remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

Applicant for permit must apply at the office of the Port Officer, Electricity Commissioners' Building, corner of Flinders-lane and William-street, Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required;

also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is un-named, some identification number must be affixed to each bow of the boat.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 35 feet from stem to stern, or with a beam exceeding 9 feet overall, unless the Port Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats shall be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the bank.

No permit shall be given for boats burning other than liquid fuel.

Permit shall not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Acceptance of permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the regulations, whether general or special.

A limited number of moorings will be available along Henley Reserve, and early application to the Port Officer for same is invited. Applicant must give name and dimensions of boat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Motor boats not moored along the Henley Reserve must use the mooring pegs provided on the north or south side of the river, and must moor at post bearing same number as shown on permit.

Mooring or holding on to the booms or buoys is strictly forbidden.

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light, and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 8 feet.

The use of paddles as a means of propulsion for rowing boats is preferred.

Boats over 25 feet in length or boats with jibbooms or other objectionable projections, will not be permitted on the Yarra between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

Rowing boats and canoes shall exhibit a white light after sunset on Henley Day.

All boats must give way to racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.

REGULATIONS FOR STORAGE OF PETROLEUM, ETC.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the *Local Government Act* 1921 (No. 3167) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations applicable to the whole of Victoria, or to such municipal districts (including the city of Melbourne and the city of Geelong) as are specified therein for or with respect to regulating the keeping and storage of petroleum, or any product of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable fluids, and carbide or other combustible substances: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section of the said Act and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations, and doth provide that the said Regulations shall apply and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the borough of Castlemaine; and furthermore that such Regulations shall be deemed to be in substitution of any By-law or By-laws made by the said Council of the said municipality for the purpose for which these Regulations are now made, and shall take effect from the 1st day of October, 1923:—

REGULATIONS.

Storage of More than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or More than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

1. Every person who shall keep store or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises more than 50 gallons in

the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all buildings shall be first approved of by the Council.
- (2) The buildings shall be constructed with walls of brick, concrete, iron or other non-inflammable material except that in the case of a galvanized-iron structure the lower portion of the walls must be in brick.
- (3) The floor of such buildings shall be made of earth, concrete or brick. The roof of such buildings shall be constructed of incombustible material.
- (4) To prevent outflow the lower portion of all walls to be without break or opening, the capacity of such enclosed space to be at least 25 per cent. of the total volume of volatile fluids kept, stored or retained in any such buildings.

Storage of Less than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or Less than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

2. Every person who shall keep store or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises less than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or less than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) In quantities not exceeding 50 gallons in the aggregate of any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto if such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of metal or other approved material including winchesters, so securely closed that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom, and if all due precautions are taken to prevent accident by fire or explosion and to prevent the escape of any such volatile fluids into a sewer or drain, and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits stairways or adjoining premises except that a reasonable quantity not exceeding 12 gallons in the aggregate of the said volatile fluids may be kept in separate glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint so securely closed or stopped that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits or stairways.
- (2) In quantities not exceeding 250 gallons of petroleum or any product of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test provided such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of glass earthenware or metal and are suitably closed or stopped, and the position of storage will not menace exits, stairways or adjoining premises.

Precaution to be Taken when Volatile Fluids are Stored in Bulk Containers.

3. Every tank or other container used for the purpose of the storage or keeping of any volatile fluids shall when not in use be kept tightly closed to prevent the escape of such fluids or any vapour or gas emitted therefrom.

Precautions to be Observed in Buildings.

4. Whenever any person shall have in or upon or about any building or premises more than 50 gallons (or more than 12 gallons if kept in glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint) of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test he shall observe the following precautions against fire:—

- (1) One 2-gallon carbon tetra-chloride or other approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be kept in such a position as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire and to be under the supervision of the Country Fire Brigade where practicable.
- (2) At least two iron buckets or other suitable containers each having a capacity of not less than a quarter of a cubic foot, filled with dry sand shall be kept in position in different parts of the building so as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.
- (3) Dry sand shall be used for absorbing all volatile fluids spilt or thrown upon the floor and shall after being so used be forthwith removed from the premises.
- (4) The use of sawdust for absorbing the said volatile fluids is prohibited.

Containers to be Labelled for Retail Sale.

5. Any person who for retail sale fills into small containers or premises any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall have the fire fighting appliances as mentioned in the preceding section and shall clearly label such small containers with the name of the contents and with the following words:—“Highly inflammable. Beware of the vapours. Keep fire away.”

Regulations not to Apply to Storage of Alcoholic Spirits.

6. Nothing herein contained shall apply to the storing of alcoholic (other than methylated) spirits.

Conditions to be Observed in the Construction of Tanks.

7. Every person who shall erect or construct any storage tank for the storage of more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine or other volatile fluids shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all storage tanks other than underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be first approved by the Council for that purpose.
- (2) Underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be constructed of galvanized steel plate not less than 14 gauge, and be placed not less than 2 feet below the surface of the ground or the lowest floor of any building. Sand shall be filled in over the tank to the level of the ground or floor as the case may require. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices to the satisfaction of the engineer. Filling pipes may be placed where the engineer approves, but so as not to cause any obstruction to the traffic when the tanks are being filled.
- (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete, or an earthen dam of approved construction; such wall or dam shall be in no case of less height than 2 feet higher than the level to which the oil would rise should it escape from the tanks. An opening may be made in the enclosing wall to permit access to the tank but such opening shall contain a liquid tight door either sliding or opening inward, made of incombustible material, and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear on such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall.

Power to Enter and Inspect.

8. Any officer authorized by the Council may for the purpose of securing the due observance of and compliance with the provisions of these Regulations enter and inspect any building or erection at all reasonable times and do therein all such acts and things as are reasonably necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and any persons who shall in any manner interfere with such officer in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence.

Offence.

9. Every person who shall contravene or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty.

10. Every person guilty of an offence under these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each succeeding day after a written notice of the offence from the Council.

Definitions.

11. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context, “approved” means approved in writing by the engineer for the time being of the said borough of Castlemaine or any deputy appointed by the said Council of the said municipality to act for him. “Council” means the Council of the said municipality. “Person” includes firm, corporation, or company; and “volatile fluid” includes any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and also includes petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids mentioned in these Regulations that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test if such are stored in immediate contiguity with the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

Methylated spirits, benzine, petrol, naphtha, or any other products of petroleum or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour below a temperature of 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test.

And the Honorable George Louis Goudie, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BY-LAW No. 62.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham made under the Health Act 1919, for regulating the keeping of animals (including birds) within the said municipal district.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1919 and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. No owner or occupier of any building or land shall keep any animal (including birds) in the yard or premises of such house or on such land in a manner considered to be offensive or injurious to health by the Council of the said city.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the city of Sandringham.

3. Any person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20.

SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.

BY-LAW No. 33.

A By-law of the Shire of Braybrook made under sections 197 and 198 of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 33, for carrying out the purposes provided for in the Thirteenth Schedule to the Act aforesaid relating to the breaking, displacing, or removing the surface of soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the Council and the laying of temporary crossings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Braybrook order as follows:—

1. An authority or a permit may be issued by the proper officer of the Council to plumbers, builders, or other persons or firms requiring to break, displace or remove the surface or soil of any street, road or footway belonging to or under the control or management of the Council subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) All new or replaced pipes for water, gas, and other services shall be laid at least eighteen inches below the surface level of the road or footway.
- (2) The person requiring a permit shall deposit with the proper officer a sum of Twenty shillings, which shall be retained for a period of at least fourteen days.
- (3) After a permit has been issued to break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any road or footway, the work shall be proceeded with and completed without any unnecessary delay.

2. The licensee shall complete to the satisfaction of the proper officer the following work:—

- (1) The earth used for filling excavations or trenches shall in all cases be thoroughly wetted and filled in 6-inch layers and thoroughly rammed with a heavy rammer.
- (2) In relaying pitches they are to be set on at least three inches of good sand with close joints, properly flushed up with sand and well rammed and back rammed with a fifty-six pounds weight pavior's rammer.
- (3) All holes required in kerb are to be neatly cut to the size of the pipe or shoot to come through at the joints, one half of the opening being in each stone.
- (4) Whenever a metalled roadway is disturbed the trench or excavation shall be filled as described in sub-clause (1) of clause 2 of this By-law and afterwards covered with six inches of good clean metal, properly spread and left clear of all obstruction.

3. A minimum fee of 2s. 6d. shall be made and deducted out of the deposit (even when no repairs have been found necessary) to cover the cost of inspection.

4. The following minimum charges for repairs when a trench or excavation has been left in good order to the satisfaction of the proper officer shall be made and deducted out of the deposit lodged, viz:—

- 6d. per square foot on metalled roads,
- 8d. per square foot on tar-paved footpaths,

such charges to be in addition to the fee of 2s. 6d. mentioned in clause 3 hereof.

In all cases where the cost of repairs exceeds the said minimum charge, a charge to be fixed by the proper officer shall be deducted out of the deposit lodged.

5. In the event of the charges for repairs being in excess of the deposit of Twenty shillings lodged the licensee shall pay such charges within seven (7) days from the date of demand for payment, and if not so paid the same shall be recoverable as a debt due to the Council.

6. An authority or a permit for a period not exceeding 30 days may be issued by the proper officer to any person desiring to cart across a footway subject to the following conditions:—

The licensee shall form a temporary crossing by placing a bridge over the channel and covering the footway with boards not less than one inch thick backed up

with feather-edged pieces, lying close on the footpath and securely bound with wire or hoop-iron so as not to present any obstruction to traffic, and the licensee shall not cart along the footpath.

7. At the expiration of the said period of 30 days the licensee shall pay for any necessary repairs to the footpath and the cost and expense of such repair shall be recoverable from the licensee as debt due to the Council.

8. "Proper officer" for the purpose of this By-law shall mean the engineer for the time being of the Council of the Shire of Braybrook.

"Licensee" shall mean any person or firm to whom a permit or authority has been granted.

SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.

BY-LAW No. 35.

A By-law of the Shire of Braybrook made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 35, for preserving good order and decency in any building belonging to the municipality or under the control and management of the Council or preventing damage to such building or to the furniture or fittings thereof, or regulating any meeting or gathering held therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers order as follows:—

1. No person shall in any building belonging to the municipality or under the control and management of the Council, and whether at any meeting or gathering held therein or not,

- (a) behave in an improper, disorderly, or indecent manner, or
- (b) deface the walls by writing thereon or otherwise injure or damage the said building or any of the furniture or fittings thereof.

Preserving Order at Meetings.

No person shall at any meeting or gathering held in any such building—

- (a) stand upon any chair or seat, or sit upon any window sill, dado cornice, balcony, railings, or staircase railway; or
- (b) disturb or interrupt any such meeting or gathering.
- (c) curse or swear or use any gross, indecent, or abusive language,
- (d) conduct himself in an insulting or riotous manner, or
- (e) be drunk, or
- (f) take part in any disturbance or disorder, or
- (g) cause any obstruction by standing or otherwise in the approaches to the external doors of such building or in the corridors, aisles, or passages within the same, or spit or expectorate,
- (h) bring or use in the building any intoxicating liquor without the consent in writing of the Council.

Penalty: Every person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

The owner of every hackney carriage, municipal stage, carriage, or other carriage used in plying for hire or passengers, and of every private vehicle and velocipede travelling or being driven after sunset and before sunrise shall cause the same to be provided with proper carriage lights, and the driver or conductor of such carriage shall keep the same properly lighted while such carriage is so used, and every owner or driver offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

2. Any person committing any wilful breach of this By-law is guilty of an offence against the *Police Offences Act 1915*, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the shire of Braybrook.

REGULATION No. 41.

Drains Across Footpaths.

A Regulation of the Shire of Braybrook, numbered 41, made under section 14 of subdivision 3 of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*, by virtue of a By-law of the above-named shire, and numbered 27, for regulating the construction, material, and size of drains or trunks.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Braybrook do hereby order and direct as follows:—

All drains or trunks to be laid or constructed under any footway shall have a fall towards the channel not less than 1 in 24, and shall be constructed of metal pipes at least 1 inch thick, or earthenware pipes not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches diameter, according to the direction of the shire engineer.

A By-law of the Shire of Braybrook made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 43, for regulating the use of merry-go-rounds, swing-boats, and shooting galleries, and such like.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Braybrook order as follows:—

1. Any person being the owner or having the care, custody, control, or management of any merry-go-round, swing-boat, or shooting gallery within the shire of Braybrook shall not allow the same to be used until he shall have satisfied the surveyor or other officer appointed by the Council that in his opinion such merry-go-round, swing-boat, or shooting gallery has been constructed, erected, set up, or put up of such materials and in such manner and position as to be unlikely to cause injury to any person.

2. This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the shire of Braybrook.

3. Any person who by wilful act or default commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.

BY-LAW NUMBER 44.

A By-law of the Shire of Braybrook made under Part 7, Division 1, section 197, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 44, for regulating traffic and to regulate the heavy motor vehicles used in the shire, and for other purposes.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1915* (George V. No. 2636) it is amongst other things enacted that By-laws may be made for any municipality for suppressing nuisances and for regulating traffic, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Braybrook order as follows:—

1. *Definitions.*—In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Shire” means the Shire of Braybrook.

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Braybrook.

“Heavy motor vehicle” means a self-propelled vehicle weighing over two tons and five hundredweights and under five tons unladen and not used for the purpose of drawing more than one trailer (such trailer and its locomotive together not exceeding six and a half tons in weight), but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails or a traction engine as defined by the *Local Government Act 1915*.

“Trailer” means a vehicle drawn by a heavy motor vehicle.

“Weight” in relation to a heavy motor vehicle when unladen means the weight of such heavy motor vehicle or trailer exclusive of the weight of any water, fuel, or accumulators special body or fittings which are not essential for the running of the vehicle.

“Axle weight” means in relation to the axle of a heavy motor vehicle or of a trailer the aggregate weight transmitted to the surface of the road or other base whereon the heavy motor vehicle or trailer moves or rests by the several wheels attached to that axle when the heavy motor vehicle or the trailer is loaded.

“Width” means in relation to the tyre of a vehicle the distance measured horizontally and in a straight line across the circumference of the wheel and between the two points in the outer surface of the tyre which are farthest apart.

“Diameter” means in relation to a wheel the distance measured between the two opposite points in the outer surface of the tyre which are farthest apart.

2. *Markings to be Made on Heavy Vehicle.*—The owner of every heavy motor vehicle shall cause—

- (1) the weight of such heavy motor vehicle unladen,
- (2) the weight of each axle thereof,
- (3) the highest rate of speed at which in conformity with the provisions of this By-law such heavy motor vehicle may be driven without a trailer—to be painted or otherwise plainly marked—

(a) in some permanent manner in the first and second cases upon some conspicuous part of the right or off side of the heavy motor vehicle, and in the third case in some conspicuous part of the left or near side of the heavy motor vehicle; and

(b) in letters or figures of not less than one inch in height and of such shape and colour as to be clearly legible and easily distinguishable from the colour of the ground whereon the letters and figures are marked out.

(4) From time to time all the paint markings to be repaired and renewed so as to at all times keep the letters and figures clearly legible and easily distinguishable.

3. *Axle Weights.*—The axle weight of an axle of a heavy motor vehicle shall not exceed eight tons, and the sum of the axle weights of all axles of a heavy motor vehicle shall not exceed twelve tons.

4. *Tyres.*—(1) The tyre of each wheel of a heavy motor vehicle shall be smooth and shall, where the tyre touches the surface of the road or other base whereon the heavy motor vehicle moves or rests, be flat. Provided, however—

(a) that the edges of the tyres may be bevelled or rounded to the extent in the case of each edge of not more than half an inch; or

(b) that if the tyre is constructed of separate plates the plates may be separated by parallel spaces which shall be disposed throughout the outer surface of the tyre, so that nowhere shall the aggregate extent of the space or spaces in the course of a straight line drawn horizontally across the circumference of the wheel exceed one-eighth part of the width of the tyre.

(2) The width of the tyre of each wheel of a heavy motor vehicle shall be determined by such of the following conditions as may apply to the circumstances of the case, that is to say:—

(a) The width shall in every case be not less than six inches.

(b) The width shall not be less than that number of half inches which is equal to the number of units of axle weight of the axle to which the wheel is attached.

(3) The unit of axle weight shall vary according to the diameter of the wheel and the rules set forth in the subjoined scale, that is to say—

(a) If the wheel is three feet in diameter the unit of registered axle weight shall be seven and a half hundredweights;

(b) if the wheel exceeds three feet in diameter the unit of axle weight shall be seven and a half hundredweights, with an addition of weight in the proportion of one hundredweight for every twelve inches by which the diameter is increased beyond three feet and in the same proportion for any increase greater or less than twelve inches; and

(c) if the wheel is less than three feet in diameter the unit of axle weight shall be seven and a half hundredweights with a deduction of weight in the proportion of one hundredweight for every six inches by which the diameter is reduced below three feet and in the same proportion for a reduction which is greater or less than six inches. This clause shall not apply to any tyre which is pneumatic or which is made of a soft or elastic material.

5. *Smoke.*—A heavy motor vehicle propelled by steam shall not emit therefrom any smoke or visible vapour except from any temporary or accidental cause.

6. *Speed.*—The speed at which any heavy vehicle is driven on any street shall not (except as herein provided) exceed ten miles an hour provided that—

(a) if the weight of the heavy motor vehicle unladen exceeds three tons; or

(b) if the axle weight of any axle thereof exceeds six tons; or

(c) if the heavy motor vehicle draws a trailer;

its speed shall not exceed six miles per hour. Provided also that if the heavy motor vehicle has all its wheels fitted with pneumatic tyres or with tyres made of soft and elastic material the speed at which the same may be driven on any street shall not exceed—

(a) Fourteen miles an hour where the axle weight of any axle does not exceed six tons; and

(b) eleven miles an hour where the axle weight of any axle exceeds six tons.

7. *Width of Vehicle and Trailer.*—A heavy motor vehicle if its weight unladen is three tons or exceeds three tons and any trailer drawn by any such heavy motor vehicle may when measured between its extreme projecting points be of any width not exceeding seven feet six inches.

8. *Size of Wheels.*—The diameter of a wheel of a heavy motor vehicle unless the same is fitted with a tyre which is pneumatic or made of a soft elastic material shall not be less than two feet.

9. *Springs.*—Every heavy motor vehicle shall be constructed with suitable and sufficient springs between each axle and the frame of the heavy motor vehicle.

10. *Brakes.*—Every heavy motor vehicle shall be provided with two independent brakes, the reversing gear of such vehicle being counted as one brake.

11. *Trailers.*—(1) The owner of a trailer shall—

(a) Cause to be painted or otherwise plainly marked upon some conspicuous part of the right or off side of the trailer in letters and figures not less than one inch in height and of such shape and colour as to be

clearly legible and easily distinguishable from the colour of the ground whereon the letters and figures are painted or marked—

- (1) the weight of the trailer unladen, and, if the weight of the trailer exceeds one ton;
- (2) the axle weight of each axle of the trailer; and
- (b) Cause the paint or markings to be from time to time repaired or renewed as often as may be necessary to keep the said letters and figures clearly legible and easily distinguishable.

(2) The provisions of this By-law relating to the width of the tyres and the sizes of the wheels of the heavy motor vehicle which are not pneumatic or are not made of a soft or elastic material shall, with the necessary modifications, apply and have effect with respect to a trailer exceeding one ton in weight unladen with the substitution herein of three inches for six inches as the minimum width of the tyres and of references to the axle weight painted or marked on the trailer in pursuance of this section for reference to axle weights contained in such provisions as aforesaid respectively.

(3) Every trailer shall be constructed with suitable and sufficient springs between each axle and the frame of the trailer.

(4) Every trailer drawn by a heavy motor vehicle shall be provided with a brake in such a manner that such brake may be operated either from the driver's footplate or by a competent person carried on the trailer. Provided, however, that this provision shall not apply when the trailer is connected to the heavy motor vehicle by a rigid coupling.

(5) A heavy motor vehicle which is used as a stage carriage or otherwise for the conveyance of passengers for gain or hire shall not be used to draw a trailer.

(6) Not more than one trailer shall be drawn by a heavy motor vehicle, and any such trailer shall be properly and securely fixed to the heavy motor vehicle in such a manner that the distance between the front of the trailer and the rear of the heavy motor vehicle shall not exceed seven feet.

12. No person shall cause or permit to be used on any street or stand on any street, drive, or have charge of a heavy motor vehicle whether as defined by this By-law or otherwise, or a trailer which is not in every respect in accordance with the provisions of this By-law, or shall so use or drive the same respectively as to contravene any of the provisions of this By-law.

13. If any officer of the Council or of the police have reason to suspect that any of the provisions of this By-law have not been complied with, or are then not being complied with by any person in respect of any heavy motor vehicle, he may require the same to be submitted for examination, and the owner or driver of such heavy motor vehicle shall for the purposes of this clause cause the same to be drawn or brought to such place and at such time as such officer shall appoint.

14. *Offence.*—Any wilful contravention of the provisions of the foregoing clause by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

15. *Penalty.*—Any person or company who shall by wilful act or default contrary hereto be guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

16. *Application.*—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the shire of Braybrook.

BY-LAW No. 95.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and every other power thereto enabling in that behalf, do hereby make the following By-law, number 95, of the said shire for regulating the construction of crossings over footways and channels and for amending By-law number 59:—

1. By-law number 59 of the shire of Colac so far as the same is inconsistent herewith is hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the boundaries of the Colac Riding and of the townships of Beane and Cressy.

3. In lieu of section 7 of said By-law number 59 the following is substituted:—The crossing over the footway shall at the option of the shire engineer be pitched, concreted or bricked for the full width of the footpath, following the slope of and being flush on top with the proper surface of the footpath. The width of the crossing measured longitudinally with the

street shall not be less than ten feet and shall be the full width of any gateway to which it may form an approach. All such crossings shall be constructed in accordance with the specifications contained in the Schedule to this By-law and to be so made good and maintained by the owner of the land to which the crossing leads that the traffic of animals or vehicles over the same may not cause any damage thereto, but that such crossings may be perfectly sound for the passage of persons using the footway.

SCHEDULE HEREBEFORE REFERRED TO.

Pitch Crossings.—The pitches shall be 12 inches x 6 inches x 4 inches and set with cement mortar. They are to be laid on a bed of consolidated sand or gravel.

Concrete Crossings.—The concrete to be of a 1.2.4 mixture, that is 1 part cement, 2 parts sand, and 4 parts broken stone, and laid at least 6 inches in depth.

Brick Crossings.—The bricks shall be 9 inches x 4½ inches by 3 inches set with cement mortar and be laid on a bed of consolidated sand or gravel.

BY-LAW No. 44, FOR PROHIBITING CATTLE IN CONGESTED AREAS.

A By-law of the Shire of Moorabbin made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, for prohibiting the keeping of cattle in congested areas.

WHEREAS in the opinion of the Council of the Shire of Moorabbin it is offensive that cattle should be herded on small blocks of ground in congested areas, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. No person shall keep more than one cow on any land of a less area than one (1) acre unless there shall be no dwelling-house within a distance of 200 yards from the boundary of such land nearest to such dwelling-house.

2. No person shall keep any bull, on any land of a less area than five (5) acres unless there shall be no dwelling-house within a distance of 200 yards from the boundary of such land nearest to such dwelling-house.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

BY-LAWS OF THE AUSTIN HOSPITAL FOR INCURABLES.

PURSUANT to section 65 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1922*, made by the Committee, and confirmed by a general meeting of contributors, specially convened for that purpose on the 31st day of August, 1923.

Introductory.

1. *Repeal of Former By-laws.*—All by-laws made prior to the date of making these by-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed, saving all existing rights.

Name.

2. *Name.*—The name of the institution shall be "The Austin Hospital for Incurables."

Object.

3. *Object of the Institution.*—The institution is an establishment for the treatment of persons suffering from chronic or incurable disease.

The scope of the institution is defined as to serve patients who suffer from chronic and incurable disease, and who require, above all things, skilled nursing, with more or less frequent medical aid for the relief of symptoms. It is not intended for cases of acute disease. On the other hand, it is not intended for cases of senility, permanent disablement, &c., for which a home is the first requirement, with a minimum of attendance or nursing.

Common Seal.

4. *Custody of Seal.*—The common seal of the Corporation shall be kept at the office of the institution, in a box having two different locks; one key shall be kept by the President and the other by the Secretary.

5. *Affixing of Seal.*—The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument, or writing, except by order of the Committee, and shall be verified by the signature of the President, or Vice-President, or the Chairman for the time being, and the Treasurer or Secretary.

Contributors and Their Privileges.

6. *Contributors.*—Any person who shall contribute the sum of £1 per annum, or not less than £20 in one donation, shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings. Any person who shall contribute the sum of £2 per annum, or not less than £50 in one donation, shall be entitled to two votes at all general meetings; and any person who shall contribute the sum of £5 per annum, or not less than £100 in one donation, shall be entitled to three votes at all general meetings.

7. *Life Governors and Governors on Collections.*—Any person contributing in one donation not less than £20 shall be elected a Life Governor of the Hospital, or any person who shall pay to the Hospital in one year in one sum collections, from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum, not less than £20, shall be a Life Governor of the Hospital, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings; not less than £50, shall be a Life Governor of the Hospital, and shall be entitled to two votes at all general meetings; not less than £100, shall be a Life Governor of the Hospital, and shall be entitled to three votes at all general meetings.

8. *Contributions by Employees of Corporations, &c.*—Any person nominated as a contributor by the employees of any corporation, company, firm, or employer, who, at any time have contributed at least £20 to the institution in one donation, shall be a Life Governor, and entitled to vote at all general meetings, or the nominee of any such employees who have contributed at least £1 per annum, whether in one sum or in sundry donations of a less amount, shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

9. *Life Governors under Bequests.*—Any person nominated as a contributor by the executor or trustees under any will, who have allocated at least £20 to the institution in one donation out of any moneys of the testator not specifically directed to be paid to the institution under the will, shall be a Life Governor of the Hospital under by-law 7.

10. *Contributors not to have More than Three Votes.*—No contributor shall be entitled to more than three votes at any general meeting.

11. *Absent Contributors may Act by Attorney.*—The attorney under power of any contributor may exercise all the privileges to which the contributor would be entitled if personally present, but the power of attorney shall be produced to the Secretary for examination and record at least three clear days before the same can be used in exercise of such privileges.

12. *Contributions by Firms.*—Every firm or partnership subscribing to the funds of the Hospital shall exercise their privilege through some person nominated by the firm or partnership to act as representative on their behalf, all such nominations to be in writing, and lodged with the Secretary under by-law 11.

13. *Payment of Subscriptions.*—Every first yearly payment of subscription shall be calculated from the date of such payment, but no such first yearly payment shall entitle to a vote at a general meeting within two months from the date of such payment.

14. *Honorary Life Governors.*—Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the Hospital, irrespective of subscriptions, may be elected Honorary Life Governors at any general meeting, on the recommendation of the Committee, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings.

Committee of Management.

15. *Consistence of Committee.*—The Committee of Management shall consist of not more than fifteen contributors (of whom six, at most, shall be ladies). Five shall form a quorum.

16. *Officers of the Corporation and Their Tenure.*—A President, Vice-President, Treasurer (who shall be *ex-officio* members of Committee), and two Auditors, shall be elected at the annual general meeting. The President shall be *ex-officio* a member of all Sub-Committees.

17. *Time and Filling up Vacancies.*—At the annual general meeting of contributors, to be held in the months of July or August in each year, one-third part of the Committee (being the longest in office without re-election) shall retire, but be eligible for re-election. Any casual vacancies may be filled by the Committee, until the next annual general meeting.

18. *Powers of Committee.*—The Committee shall direct all business of the Hospital, shall provide all requisites for its use, shall appoint, hire, and discharge or dismiss all paid officers and servants, and fix and pay all salaries and wages; may from time to time enter into contracts, and may make rules, not inconsistent with these by-laws, for the regulation of the Hospital, and of such paid officers and servants; shall have power to order the discharge of any patient; and generally act as it may decide in all matters whatsoever affecting the management of the institution.

19. *Rotation of Business by Committee.*—The Committee shall meet once a fortnight, or more often, if necessary, at such times and places as they may appoint. The business shall be as follows:—

- (1) To confirm the minutes of previous meeting.
- (2) To consider correspondence since last meeting.
- (3) To deal with the reports of Sub-Committees, of officers, and of visitors.
- (4) Business, of which notice has been given, and general business.

20. *Member of Committee not to Hold Office of Profit.*—No member of the Committee, nor any firm of which he is a member, may contract with or hold any office of profit with the Hospital.

21. *Absent Members of Committee.*—If any member of the Committee ceases to be a contributor to the Hospital, or is absent without the permission of the Committee from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Committee, his office shall thereupon become vacant. (See clause 62, Act No. 3260.)

Meetings in General.

22. *Presidency at Meetings of Committee.*—At all meetings of the Committee, the President, or, in his absence, the Vice-President, shall take the chair, but in the absence of both officers the meeting shall choose its own chairman. Each Sub-Committee shall elect its own chairman.

23. *Chairman to have a Double Vote.*—At all meetings of the Committee, the chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and also a casting vote whenever the numbers are equal; but at any meeting of contributors he shall, in the event of there being an equality of votes on any question, have a casting vote only.

24. *As to Calling of Special Meetings of Contributors.*—The Committee may convene a special general meeting of contributors at any time, upon giving notice at least fourteen days previously in two or more of the Melbourne newspapers; and shall specify the time and place of meeting, and the particular business to be brought before such general meeting, and none other shall be discussed thereat. Any twelve contributors may require the Committee to call a special meeting at any time, and should the Committee, after receiving such requisition, signed by twelve or more contributors, neglect to call such meeting within fourteen days after the next ordinary meeting of the Committee, then any twelve contributors shall have power to convene such meeting, upon giving notice as directed above, to deal with any business of which notice has been given to the Committee, and no other.

25. *Decision of Questions.*—All questions at general meetings shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a ballot is demanded by five contributors.

Elections.

26. *Election of Members of Committee.*—All nominations, signed by two contributors (together with written acceptances by the nominees), for election as members of Committee and office bearers, shall be furnished to the Secretary at least seven clear days before the annual meeting. If less than the number to be elected be nominated, the meeting shall have power to nominate contributors; and if more than those required to fill the vacancies be nominated, the election shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a ballot be demanded by five contributors on behalf of any candidate, to be taken on such day and at such place as may be appointed by the chairman, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m., such ballot to

be conducted by a member of the Committee, to be appointed by the chairman, and two scrutineers appointed by the meeting. In all cases of equal voting, the member of Committee conducting the ballot shall have the casting vote. Voting may be by post on a form provided for the purpose, but not by proxy.

Religious Instruction.

27. *Religious Instruction.*—The inmates of the institution shall be at liberty to receive religious ministrations from the ministers, or authorized religious instructors of the denomination to which they respectively belong, who shall (unless their services are specially requested by any inmate belonging to any other communion) confine their ministrations to the members of their own denomination, and shall not speak or read loudly, but perform the duties of their office in such a way as to be as little overheard as possible by the other inmates. No person shall conduct any public religious service except in a place set apart for the purpose by the Committee, and for extra religious services the permission of the matron must be obtained beforehand. Unless in cases of urgency, the visits of authorized religious instructors, excepting ministers, shall be paid between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Meetings of Contributors.

28. *Annual Meeting of Contributors.*—At the annual general meeting the business shall be to confirm the minutes of previous general meeting, to receive a report from the Committee, to receive and adopt the balance-sheet of the institution, to elect office bearers, auditors, and members of Committee, and to transact any other business of which due notice shall have been given. The Chairman shall have a casting vote only.

29. *Quorum of Contributors.*—At all general meetings of the contributors, ten shall constitute a quorum; but if no quorum be present within an hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day and hour in the following week, when the quorum shall be seven.

Altering By-laws.

30. At any special general meeting of contributors, these by-laws may be repealed, altered or added to, provided that the provisions of Act No. 3260 for the making of by-laws shall be deemed to apply to any repeal, alteration or addition.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE ELECTRO-PLATERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applied on 22nd day of September, 1923, to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) Electro-plating ; .
- (b) Metal polishing ;
- (c) Enamelling or japanning metals :

other than persons subject to the Determination of any one of the following Boards :—

- Bedstead Makers Board,
- Brassworkers Board,
- Jewellers Board,
- Ovenmakers Board,
- Tinsmiths Board."

(3) DEFINITION OF JUVENILE WORKERS.—Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) employed at slinging and unslinging, hanging, cleaning, scouring, scratch-brushing, drying-out, or cleaning old enamel off cycle wheels or frames or other old iron or tinware, filling up, rubbing down and firing in connexion with glass enamels for badges or medallions; or polishing legging clips, clips and plugs for rugs, nuts, screws, bolts, washers, or caps, all builders' brass and ironware, up to 1½" in diameter.

(4) TIME OF BEGINNING { 7.30 a.m.	5.30 p.m. on each of the five days in the week.
AND ENDING WORK { 7.30 a.m.	12.30 p.m. on the day on which the half-holiday is usually observed.

(5) OVERTIME.—All work done outside the hours specified as the times of beginning and ending work, or any work done within such hours in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work in any week, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(6) TIME WAGES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three per centum.

(7) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
