## DETERMINATION OF THE SEWER BUILDERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 3rd October, 1923, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed as Labourers in connexion with the construction of sewers" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 3rd October, 1923, the last previous Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (3) Allowances —The following extra rates shall be paid to any persons wheresoever employed:—
  - (a) On all work distant from the centre over two miles and up to five miles, 6d. per day or portion of a day.
     (b) On all work distant from the centre over five miles and up to twelve miles, 9d. per day or portion of a day.
     (c) On all work distant from the centre over twelve miles and up to twenty miles, 1s. per day or portion of a day.
- "Centre" shall be taken to mean the Melbourne General Post Office for the metropolitan district, or the employee's residence, whichever is nearer to the work, and shall in all other cases mean the chief post office of the city, town, borough, or shire.
  - - (a) The hour of beginning and the hour of ending each shift shall be as follows:-

(b) The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by any employee before or after his shift shall be time and a half for the first two hours, and thereafter double time.

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
