I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to authorize the Applications of Payments made in respect of Leases of certain Lands in the Township of Newmerella to or towards the Purchase by the Council of the Shire of Orbst of certain Land as a Site for a Public Park and Recreation Reserve."

"An Act to revoke the Permanent Reservation of Portion of certain Land in the Parish of Narre Worran as a Site for Police Purposes."

"An Act to revoke the Permanent Reservation of Portion of certain Land in the Parish of Smeaton in the County of Talbot reserved from Sale permanently pursuant to the *Smeaton Land Act 1921* as a Site for a Public Park."

"An Act to revoke the Permanent Reservation of certain Crown Land at Toonallook in the Parish of Bairnsdale as a Site for a State School."

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million one hundred and fifteen thousand six hundred and forty-seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four."

"An Act relating to Parliamentary Witnesses."

BY-LAW NO. 1292.—GENERAL RATE.—WALPEUP EAST WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

**T**HE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following General Rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Walpeup East Waterworks District, except within any Urban District thereof:—

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate the value of the lands set out in the valuation made, in accordance with the provisions of the *Water Act 1915*, by Alfred Stephen Kenyon, valuer, returned on the 16th day of September, 1918, and adopted by the said Commission on the 16th day of September, 1918, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands, unless altered or amended as provided by the *Water Act 1915*, and if so altered or amended, then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 1293.—GENERAL RATE.—WALPEUP WEST WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

**T**HE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following General Rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Walpeup West Waterworks District, except within any Urban District thereof:—

For the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling upon such lands, and for watering cattle or other stock:—

- (1) Of all lands in the First Division, comprising all lands in the aforesaid district, excepting and excluding all lands set out and described hereunder comprised within the Second Division—a rate of Sevenpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands, with

a minimum amount of rate in respect of such lands of Three pounds six shillings and eightpence for each holding of six hundred and forty acres in extent, with a proportionate sum as a minimum for any holding of a greater or less area.

## DECLARATION OF DEVELOPMENTAL ROADS UNDER THE DEVELOPMENTAL ROADS ACT IN THE SHIRE OF DEAKIN.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the tenth day of September One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635)* being of opinion that the roads set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance and will serve to develop areas of land (whether alienated from the Crown or not) by providing access to a railway station or to a main road leading to a railway station and acting under the powers conferred upon it by the *Developmental Roads Act 1918 (No. 2944)* declared such roads to be developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road or part thereof mentioned in such Resolution shall be a developmental road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board developmental roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Developmental Roads Act 1918*.

## BY-LAW No. 49.

A By-law of the City of Essendon made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and numbered 49, for—

(a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, and hoardings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon order as follows:—

1. In shops which have no residence attached to them or upon the same area of occupation there shall be provided:—

(a) A retiring room at least 100 square feet in area, which may either be a separate room or a space separated from the shop by a partition at least 7 feet in height and constructed of approved material and provided with lighting and ventilation in the same manner as prescribed under the Building By-law.

(b) A lavatory basin, which shall be connected to the sewerage system in a sewered area, or to an enclosed earthenware drain discharging into the street channel in an unserved area.

(c) Separate sanitary accommodation for each shop, such accommodation to be placed in position approved by the City Surveyor, and connected to the sewerage system in a sewered area; but if approved by the Council it shall be permissible to provide closets for each sex in a block of shops, the number of such closets to be determined by the said Council.

2. No shop with the accommodation provided under the terms of this By-law will be permitted to be used for residential purposes.

3. The penalties for any offence under this By-law shall be as provided under clause 3, Part XIV., Building By-law No. 38.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

## CITY OF RICHMOND.

## BY-LAW No. 87.

A By-Law of the City of Richmond, made under sections 198 and 228 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and numbered 87, for amending By-law No. 81.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Richmond order as follows:—

1. *Minimum Size of Allotments—Minimum Size of Dwellings—Limitations of Buildings.*—That the following be and is hereby substituted for clause 132 of By-law No. 81:—

No dwelling-house shall be built on any allotment of land unless the following conditions and requirements in addition to the conditions and requirements set out in By-law No. 81 be and are complied with:—

(1) Such allotment have a superficial area of at least One thousand six hundred and fifty square feet.

(2) Such dwelling-house shall contain at least three rooms. (For the purpose of this clause bath-rooms, pantries, and sculleries shall not be deemed to be rooms.)

(3) Such dwelling-house shall have at least a width of sixteen feet of the frontage of the allotment, no matter of what material it be built, but if it be of brick, stone, concrete, or reinforced concrete, the dwelling may be built on the whole of the frontage provided that in all cases the open space required be not curtailed or lessened, and without passing through the house there is reasonable access to the back premises and offices for the removal of refuse to a street or lane.

(4) Such dwelling-house shall not cover a superficial area of greater extent than three-fifths of the total superficial area of the allotment.

(5) Such allotment shall be of a frontage or width of at least 22 feet.

2. *Houses in Pairs.*—That clause 137 of By-law No. 81 be and is hereby altered by substituting "44 feet" for "38 feet" and omitting or striking out the following words:—

"But an allotment of land on which such dwelling-house may be built may have a frontage of 35 feet instead of 38 feet where a street or public way not less than six feet in width adjoins one of the pairs of such dwelling-houses."

3. *Frontage of Shops.*—That clause 138 of By-law No. 81 be and is hereby altered by omitting or striking out the words:— "if such street or road is one comprised in the list of streets forming for the time being Schedule A of this By-law then"

and also the words:— "and if such land does not abut on any of the before-mentioned streets such shop shall have a frontage of at least 12 feet."

4. *Open Space, &c.*—That clause 123 be and is hereby altered by substituting for the words "five hundred square feet" the words "two-fifths of the total superficial area of the allotment."

5. *Open Space Required for Shop and Dwelling.*—That clause 138 be and is hereby altered by substituting for the figures and words "450 square feet" the words "two-fifths of the total superficial area of the allotment."

6. *Lock-up Shops.*—No lock-up shop, i.e., a shop without dwelling room, shall be built on any allotment of land unless such allotment have a frontage of at least sixteen feet. In all cases when lock-up shops are to be built lavatory and sanitary conveniences to the satisfaction of the Council shall be provided and built therein.

7. *Shop and Dwelling.*—No shop with dwelling rooms attached shall be built on any allotment of land of less frontage than twenty-two feet.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Richmond, but shall not apply to any Government or railway buildings.

9. This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

Such money shall be repayable by thirty half-yearly instalments of interest and fifteen annual instalments of principal, which amounts to fifteen annual instalments of £1,134 8s. 5d., including principal and interest, by providing out of the Municipal Fund the above amounts on the first day of June and the first day of December in each respective year during the currency of the loan, the first of such instalments to be paid on the first day of June, 1924. Such money shall be repayable at the Commercial Bank of Australia Limited, Sandringham, or the Council's bankers for the time being.

#### BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

##### BUILDING REGULATIONS.

###### BY-LAW NO. 55.

A By-law of the Borough of Hamilton (hereinafter referred to as the municipality) made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, sections 8-20 of the *Local Government Act 1918*, and Part V. of the 13th schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915* with the approval of the Governor in Council and numbered 55 for the carrying out of certain of the purposes provided for in the said sections and part, viz.:—

- Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings erections or hoardings or of fences abutting on or within ten feet of any street or road.
- Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings erections or hoardings or of fences abutting on or within ten feet of any street or road.
- Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings erections or hoardings or fences erected or constructed contrary to this By-law or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings erections hoardings or fences and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council of the municipality for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

- Prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction alteration repair or renewal of buildings roofs or chimneys flues smoke vents or stove pipes.
- Regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.
- Regulating the height thickness construction or materials of the party walls or buildings adjoining each other and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys and the materials for and the mode of enclosing the same.
- Regulating the erection of tents.
- Appointing referees as provided by and exercising all the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1918*.
- Exercising all any and every of the powers of the said Council under the *Local Government Act* and the 13th schedule thereto or otherwise it enabling in connexion with the foregoing.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and the 13th schedule thereto and the *Local Government Act 1918* the Mayor Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Hamilton order as follows:—

#### PART I.

##### Definitions.

- In this By-law and the schedule thereto save where the context is inconsistent therewith—
  - "Alteration" means any change in the construction or plan of a building or erection or any change in the purpose for which any building or erection or any part thereof shall be used.
  - "Approved" shall mean approved by the Council in writing (or in cases where the surveyor is authorized by the Council so to do) approved by the surveyor.
  - "Building" shall mean and include erection hoarding and every structure of whatever kind and every part of such structure and any addition or alteration thereto.
  - "Building line" shall be the line which the surveyor shall certify to be the true boundary line between a street or road and private land abutting thereon.
  - "Council" means the Council of the municipality.
  - "Dwelling house" means a building used or adapted to be used or in the opinion of the Council or the surveyor intended or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.
  - "Lane" and "right-of-way" mean a street or road less than 33 feet wide.
  - "Main rooms" shall be deemed to mean and include all rooms used or which in the opinion of the Council or the surveyor shall be intended or adapted to be used as bedrooms, diningrooms or ordinary living-rooms including kitchens.
  - "New building" includes—
    - Any building erected or commenced to be erected after the date of this By-law coming into force.
    - Any building which for more than half its cubical contents has been taken down or has been destroyed by fire tempest or otherwise and is re-erected or commenced to be re-erected.
    - Any space between walls and/or buildings which is roofed or commenced to be roofed.
  - "Person" includes corporation.
  - "Public buildings" includes theatres churches chapels assembly halls museums libraries schools hospitals lecture rooms and other like buildings and all buildings adapted or intended in the opinion of the Council or its surveyor to accommodate an assemblage of persons.
  - "Surveyor" means the building surveyor or acting building surveyor for the time being of the municipality or other officer having for the time being the administration of this By-law.
  - "Shop" means a building in which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payment and also includes the saloons or shops of barbers and hairdressers and offices of agents and auctioneers and other businesses or trades. A *bona fide* private boardinghouse shall not be included in this definition by reason only of the fact that meals or refreshments are occasionally supplied for payment to persons other than boarders.
  - "Square" applied to the measurements for any area means the space of 100 square feet.
  - "Street or road" means and includes "street" and "road" and "private street" and "private road" as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1915* section 3.

#### PART II.

##### Area, Frontages, &c.

2. *Position of Dwellings in Relation to Allotment.*—No building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house and no addition to any such building shall be built constructed or erected within a distance of fifteen feet measured horizontally from the building line of the street or road the building is intended to or shall front.

3. *Space to be Provided at Sides of Wooden Buildings.*—Except as hereinafter provided no building with an external wall of wood which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house and no addition with an external wall of wood to any building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house shall be built constructed or erected—

- (a) within a distance of four feet measured horizontally of any street road lane or right-of-way at the side of any such building; or
- (b) within a distance of four feet measured horizontally of land not in the same possession or occupation: or
- (c) within a distance of eight feet measured horizontally of another building or erection with an external wall of wood.

Provided always that any such building or addition may abut on the building line of any street road lane or right-of-way at the side of such building or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom or from land not in the same possession or occupation or from a building or erection with an external wall of wood provided that the wall or walls which abut on or face within the prescribed distance such street road lane or right-of-way or land or building or erection as the case may be shall be of concrete at least  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inches in thickness or of brick or stone at least  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches in thickness projecting in all cases at least one inch beyond the woodwork front and back and at least one foot through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same.

4. *Stables, &c.*—Stables coachhouses garages and out-buildings shall be subject to the like conditions as are imposed in regard to dwelling-houses by the last two preceding clauses except that clause 3 shall not apply to them as far as it relates to distance from any lane or right-of-way.

5. *Minimum Area for Building Site.*—(a) Save where the Council expressly consents no person shall erect build construct or cause to be erected built or constructed any building or erection which shall or may in the opinion of the Council or the surveyor be intended to be used as a dwelling-house unless the site or curtilage of such building has a superficial area of at least 5,280 square feet and has a frontage to a street or road of not less than 44 lineal feet and has a depth of not less than 120 feet.

(b) Where a dwelling-house in existence at the time of this By-law coming into operation is wholly or partly destroyed by fire or where the owner desires to replace such dwelling-house or part thereof existing at the time of this By-law coming into operation a dwelling-house may be erected or such dwelling-house may be replaced or restored notwithstanding that the land has not the frontage depth or the area referred to in clause 5 (a) of this By-law.

(c) Where an allotment of land does not comply with the provisions of clause 5 (a) of this By-law the Council may notwithstanding on the application of the owner of such land grant permission for the erection of a dwelling-house of such kind and material and structure as may be approved by the Council or its surveyor.

(d) Save as in this By-law otherwise provided the dwelling-house and other buildings to be erected built or constructed upon any site or curtilage shall cover not more than one-third of the superficial area of such site or curtilage.

6. *Shops and Public Buildings.*—(a) No building or erection which shall or may in the opinion of the Council be intended for use as a shop or public building shall be built or erected unless the external walls thereof and of all dwelling rooms attached thereto are constructed of concrete brick or stone of approved thickness.

(b) No person shall erect build construct or cause to be erected built or constructed any building or erection which shall be or be intended in the opinion of the Council or surveyor to be used as a shop or shop and dwelling unless the site or curtilage of such building has a superficial area of not less than 1,584 square feet and has a frontage to a street or road of not less than 16 lineal feet and has a depth of not less than 99 feet.

(c) Every building or erection which shall be or in the opinion of the Council or surveyor may be intended to be used as a shop or shop and dwelling shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof an area of open land of not less than 600 square feet.

7. *Street Frontage Preserved.*—No building shall be erected in such a position that it shall lie between another building or any part thereof and a street unless such other building has a direct and unobstructed access to some other street at least 33 feet wide.

8. *Attached Buildings.*—Two but not more buildings or houses may be erected together in one block provided they shall be separated from each other by a wall of concrete or of brick or stone at least  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches in thickness projecting in the case of wooden houses at least one inch through the woodwork front and back and in all cases projecting 2 ft. 6 in. at least through the roof covering or gutter adjoining the same whether belonging to the same owner or not. Each building or dwelling-house in a block shall be subject to the provisions of

this By-law applicable to its class save that the site or curtilage of each of such buildings shall have a superficial area of at least 4,000 square feet and a frontage of at least 35 lineal feet to a street or road and a depth of at least 120 lineal feet.

9. *Minimum Number of Rooms.*—No dwelling-house shall consist of less than three main rooms of a total area of not less than 400 square feet and no building or rooms thereof shall be occupied for living purposes until at least three main rooms shall have been completed according to the plans and specifications submitted to and approved by the Council.

10. *Fowlhouses.*—No fowlhouses or building used or designed for the use of poultry shall be erected at a less distance than 25 feet from any building used as a dwelling whether on the same allotment or otherwise. No building of the description referred to in this clause shall be erected except to the rear of any dwelling-house on the same allotment.

11. *Privies, Closets, &c.*—No privy closet or urinal shall be erected at a less distance than 9 feet from any door or window of any dwelling-house and no such privy closet or urinal shall be erected at a less distance than 9 feet from any street provided that in case of a right-of-way abutting on such allotment the privy closet or urinal may be erected on the boundary between such allotment and the right-of-way. Every closet privy or urinal shall be effectively screened from public view.

12. *Distances.*—For the purpose of computing distances from any building the furthest outside edge of the verandah spouting or any other projection shall be taken as the point from which measurements are to be taken.

### PART III.

#### Notice of Intention to Build, &c.

13. *Fees to be Paid.*—(a) No person shall commence or cause to be commenced any building or erection or remove or cause to be removed any building or erection without having paid to the Council the necessary fees in accordance with the scale set out in the first schedule hereto. No person shall erect or cause to be erected any tent without having paid to the Council the necessary fees in accordance with the schedule to Regulation number 39 of the Borough of Hamilton and/or any other Regulation or By-law for the time being in force in the municipality.

(b) The decision of the surveyor as to the area of a new building or the value of an addition shall be final and conclusive.

14. *Permit to be Obtained.*—No person shall erect build construct remove or make any alteration or addition to or cause to be erected built or constructed or removed or made any alteration or addition to any building or erection or tent without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do.

15. *Plans and Specifications to be Submitted.*—No person shall erect build construct remove or make any alteration or addition to or cause to be erected built constructed or removed or make any alteration or addition to any building or erection or tent without first submitting to the Council or its surveyor—

- (a) the plans and specifications of the proposed building or erection alteration or addition or tent and
- (b) a statement in writing of the purpose for which it is intended to be used and
- (c) such further particulars in writing regarding the same as shall be necessary to enable the Council or its surveyor to determine if all the provisions of this By-law applicable thereto are being complied with.
- (d) a plan showing ground plan of building boundaries of land and position of buildings thereon and
- (e) a copy of tracing of such last-mentioned plan which shall be left with the Council permanently for its own use.

16. *Kept at Building During Erection.*—All plans and specifications approved by the Council shall be kept at the building or erection or tent therein referred to and shall be available for inspection by the surveyor or the accredited officer of the Council at all reasonable times on demand during the construction or erection or alteration or addition as the case may be and for fourteen days after the completion thereof.

17. *Permit to Lapse in Six Months.*—A permit obtained pursuant to this By-law shall lapse and be deemed of no effect at the expiration of six months from its grant unless extended by resolution of the Council or unless the works covered by such permission shall have been duly completed.

18. *Inspecting Buildings.*—The surveyor at all reasonable times during the progress and after the completion of any building or addition or alteration to any building affected by this By-law may and he is hereby authorized to enter and inspect such building or addition or alteration.

19. *Withdrawal of Permit.*—The surveyor may at all times stop the progress of any building and withdraw or suspend any permission given by the Council under this By-law in the event of his not being satisfied that all the provisions of this



By-law are being complied with and any person who continues or builds or erects or works on the site after notice from the surveyor to desist shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

20. The surveyor shall have power to condemn and to order the removal of or to remove at the expense of the owner any material which in his opinion is not suitable for use for the purpose for which he may consider it is intended to use same and no person shall use any material so condemned for any building erection tent alteration or addition.

#### PART IV.

##### Materials and Construction.

21. *Bricks.*—Bricks used in any building shall be good hard and well burnt and if old or secondhand shall be thoroughly cleaned and approved of by the Council in writing before being so used.

22. *Timbers.*—All timbers used in any buildings shall be of good sound material free from rot free from large and loose knots and free from shakes and free from any imperfections whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired.

The following conditions shall apply as to spacings and scantlings of timber:—

- (a) Stumps shall be not less than 4 inches by 4 inches redgum jarrah or other approved timber spaced to 4-ft. centres and fixed on 6-in. by 6-in. by 1½-in. sole plates.
- (b) Studs and ceiling joists shall be not less than 4 inches by 1½ inches spaced not more than 18 inches apart centre to centre and properly secured.
- (c) Rafters shall not be less than 4 inches by 1½ inches spaced 3 feet centre to centre in the case of iron roofs and 18 inches centre to centre in the case of slate tile or other similar roofs securely braced with purlins and collar ties.
- (d) Floor joists shall be not less than 4 inches by 2 inches spaced 18 inches apart centre to centre on 4-inch x 3-inch bearers spaced 6 feet apart.

23. *Materials, &c., Interior of Walls.*—The interiors of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used or shall or may be used as a dwelling house shall be constructed of lath and plaster or of approved wood or fire-resisting materials.

24. *Foundations.*—The foundation or footings of buildings other than wood shall not be less in width than 8 inches wider than the wall standing thereon and shall not be less in depth than an average of 18 inches below the natural surface of the ground.

25. *Vermis Plates.*—Vermis plates shall be provided to all walls, other than brick stone or concrete.

26. *Damp Courses.*—Every wall of brick or stone shall have an approved damp-proof course or courses of asphalt or other approved impervious material above the surface of the ground below the lowest floor and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level then the said damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the end by a vertical course of the same materials.

27. *Materials for Roofs.*—The roof of every building shall be covered on the outside with incombustible coverings or with some other material approved in writing by the Council.

#### PART V.

##### VENTILATION, LIGHTING, AND DRAINAGE.

28. *Rooms. Heights of Walls.*—(a) All main rooms in every building hereafter built or rebuilt shall be in every part not less than 10 feet from floor to ceiling.

(b) Provided that in the case of buildings of more than one storey hereafter built or rebuilt living rooms wholly or partially in the roof may be less than 10 feet in height from floor to ceiling throughout not more than two-thirds of the area with a minimum height of 8 feet.

##### Area.

(c) No main room shall have less floor area than 100 square feet.

##### Windows.

(d) Every main room and kitchen in a building intended to be used or which shall or may be used as a dwelling house shall have one or more windows opening directly into the external air with a total superficies of glass clear of sash frames free from obstruction to light equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room and so constructed that a substantial part of the windows equal to at least one-twentieth of the floor area can be opened for ventilation. The requirements of this sub-clause may under special circumstances be dispensed with or modified by the Council but in such cases other approved provision for lighting or ventilation must be made.

(e) The provisions of this clause in reference to the height lighting and ventilation of main rooms in dwellings shall as far as applicable be extended and apply to all shops save that the windows need not be constructed so as to open if other approved provision for ventilation be made.

29. *Floors.*—Floors shall be fixed level and in all dwellings shall be in no part less than 9 inches above the surface of the ground.

30. *Space Under Floor.*—The space under the ground floor of every building shall have a sufficiency of openings through all walls under the floor to thoroughly ventilate the same.

31. *Drainage.*—No person shall build or erect or cause or permit to be built or erected any building erection or tent or addition to any building erection or tent on any land unless such building erection tent or addition and the site and curtilage thereof can be properly drained and the Council may refuse permission to build or erect any building erection or tent or addition unless and until it is satisfied that the proposed building erection or tent or addition and the site and curtilage thereof can be properly drained.

32. *Drains.*—Proper provisions shall be made and maintained for effectively removing water and sanitary and other drainage away from every building. The materials and construction of such drains shall be such as shall be approved by the Council or its surveyor.

#### PART VI.

##### Removed Buildings.

33. *Erection of Removed Buildings.*—No building or erection shall be removed from any one part of the municipality to and erected or re-erected in another part thereof unless the owner or person carrying out the removal first obtain written permission from the Council to do so. Before such permission shall be granted not less than ten (10) clear days' notice in writing shall be given to the Council or the surveyor of the desire to remove and erect or re-erect such building or erection. Such notice shall contain or be accompanied by the following:—

- (a) Particulars of the situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.
- (b) Particulars of the situation of and a plan of the land upon which it is proposed to erect or re-erect or place such building showing the proposed position thereon and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.
- (c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building and any proposed alterations or additions thereto and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.
- (d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of the existing building and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is erected or re-erected.
- (e) Evidence satisfactory to the Council that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated insanitary or unfit for human habitation and a certificate from the health officer of the municipality that within a reasonable time prior to date of removal no case of disease of an infectious or contagious nature has occurred therein.
- (f) Such further particulars in writing regarding the same as shall be sufficient to enable the Council or its surveyor to determine if all the provisions of any Act of Parliament By-law or Regulation applicable thereto are or will be complied with.
- (g) No written permission shall be given unless such removed building when erected or re-erected shall comply with the provisions of this By-law as applicable to new buildings.

34. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated insanitary or unfit for human habitation shall be removed or re-erected within the municipality.

35. No building or erection in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding six months shall be removed or re-erected within the municipality.

36. No removed building shall be occupied until the surveyor shall have certified in writing that all the provisions of this By-law have been observed and complied with in respect of such building.

37. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands, provided that in its altered position it shall comply in all respects with this By-law and that in the progress of such removal the building be not taken on to any street road or public place.

#### PART VII.

##### Verandahs.

38. (a) *Porticoes and Verandahs.*—No person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected any portico or verandah over the footway of any street in the municipality without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing and such portico or verandah shall be of the shape figure dimensions and materials as set forth on the plan and specifications for the time being adopted by resolution of the Council but the lowest part of such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less height than 9 feet above the level of the outer edge of the footway.

(b) *Openings in Verandah Roofs.*—No openings shall be made in the roof of such verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such openings be properly framed and glazed with approved glass protected underneath with a fine mesh wire netting or armoured glass to the satisfaction of the Council.

## PART VIII.

*Exempted Buildings.*

39. *Ferneries, &c., Exempted.*—This By-law shall not apply to any fence greenhouse fernery aviary or to out-buildings which outbuildings are on an area of not less than 6 acres used for agricultural or similar purposes only or to temporary and removable offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any buildings at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding six months.

40. *Government Buildings.*—This By-law shall not apply to any building of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia the State of Victoria or of the municipality.

## PART IX.

*Special Areas.*

41. *Special Buildings in Defined Areas.*—No person shall erect build construct or cause to be erected built or constructed any building or erection to be used as a dwelling house only or as a combined shop and dwelling upon or within the area or land or any part thereof mentioned in the second schedule hereto or added to such schedule by resolution of the Council unless the whole of the said building or erection shall cover an area of not less than 1,000 square feet.

## PART X.

*Referees.*

42. *Referees.*—The Council shall appoint a referee as provided by the *Local Government Act 1918*, to act with a referee appointed by the Governor in Council and exercise the powers as provided in the said Act.

43. If any doubt difference or dissatisfaction in respect of any matter as to which provision is made by or under this By-law arises between any parties concerned or between any party and the surveyor for the municipality as to—

- (a) Any act done or to be done in pursuance of this By-law.
- (b) The effect of the provisions of this By-law in any case.
- (c) The mode in which the provisions and directions of this By-law are or ought to be carried into effect.
- (d) Whether the requirements implied in terms of qualification applied to sites to soils to materials or to workmanship or otherwise and denoting good sound fireproof fit proper or sufficient are fulfilled in certain cases.
- (e) The expenses to be borne by the respective owners of premises parted by the same party walls of the proportions thereof.
- (f) The proportions of the expense to be borne by the occupier or by the owner of premises in respect of any works executed or
- (g) Any other matter whatever.

Any party concerned may require the referees on appeal to determine such matter upon a requisition by notice in writing to the Town Clerk setting forth either generally or otherwise the matters in respect of which the determination of the referees is required and the referees shall subject to the *Local Government Act 1918* hear and determine the same.

## PART XI.

*Enforcement of By-laws and Penalties.*

44. *By-law to be Observed.*—No person (whether as owner builder contractor agent or otherwise) shall erect build construct remove or make any alteration or addition to or cause to be erected built or constructed removed or made any alteration or addition to any building or erection or tent contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

45. *Application of By-law.*—Except where a different intention is expressed herein or by resolution of the Council this By-law shall apply to and have operation in and throughout the whole of the municipality.

46. *Council May Vary Provisions in Certain Cases.*—Any matter or thing arising under this By-law may be from time to time determined applied dispensed with or regulated by the Council by special resolution either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case.

47. *Re-erection of Buildings.*—Save as in this By-law otherwise provided any building which shall be re-erected or commenced to be re-erected wholly or partially shall be subject to this By-law to the same extent as if it were a new building.

48. *Repeal of Previous By-laws.*—From and after the coming into operation of this By-law Regulation Number 30 under By-law Number 15 and By-laws 44 and 45 shall be and the same are and each of them is hereby repealed.

49. *Penalties.*—Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law or shall fail to duly comply with any notice thereunder shall (notwithstanding any requisition under Part X.) be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than One pound and not exceeding Twenty pounds. And if such offence is a continuing one to a further penalty not exceeding One pound per day for each day such offence is continued.

50. *Removed Buildings; Failing to Comply with By-law.*—If the surveyor shall certify in writing to the Council that any building or erection has been removed or erected or re-erected within the municipality or occupied contrary to any of

the provisions of this By-law or that any removed building erection or structure is in such a dilapidated ruinous or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety the Council or any officer thereof or other authorized agent may give to the owner occupier or builder or leave upon the site of such building or erection a notice in writing requiring the alteration or repair or removal or pulling down of such building erection or structure within such time as is limited by such notice and such owner occupier or builder shall comply with such notice within the time therein limited.

51. *New Buildings Offending Against By-law.*—If any building erection or tent shall be wholly or partly built or erected added to or altered contrary to or not in conformity with the provisions of this By-law the Council or any officer thereof or other authorized agent may give to the owner occupier or builder or leave upon the site of such building erection or tent notice in writing to bring such building erection or tent into conformity with the said provisions or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building erection or tent within such time as is limited in such notice and such owner occupier or builder shall comply with such notice within the time therein limited.

52. *Failure to Comply with Notices.*—If default shall be made in complying with any notice mentioned in the last two preceding clauses then notwithstanding the imposition or recovering of any penalty it shall be lawful for the said Council by its surveyor officer or other authorized agent or agents to enter upon any building erection or tent and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen and for that purpose to break down any fence surrounding the land on which such building erection or tent is situate and to demolish and pull down the said building erection or tent or any part or parts thereof and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit to sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit and all expenses incurred by the Council its surveyor officer or other authorized agent or agents in demolishing and pulling down the said building erection or tent or any part thereof or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same and in doing other acts as aforesaid and all fees and penalties due by the owner occupier or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale and the Council shall restore the surplus (if any) arising from such sale to such owner occupier or builder or other person legally entitled thereto on demand and any deficiency shall be made good and paid by the owner occupier or builder to the Council on demand.

## SHIRE OF METCALFE.

BY-LAW NO. 26.

A By-law of the Shire of Metcalfe made under section 635 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 26, for regulating the market places and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein; and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto; and for fixing the days and hours during each day on which the market will be held; and for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the shire, and for fixing the dues to be paid for such licences.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Metcalfe order as follows:—

1. The Metcalfe Shire Cattle Market shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purpose of such market situated at Redesdale, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle and other live stock and articles.

2. The said market shall be open daily for the reception and delivery and sale of cattle and other live stock and articles on every lawful day from the hour of sunrise to sunset, subject to the provisions hereunder. After the market is open for public use every person who shall personally, or by any agent or auctioneer, sell, offer, or expose for sale in any place within the municipal district, except in his own dwelling place, shop, place of business, or private property, or except in the market or in yards or premises licensed by the Council under a market By-law, any articles or any cattle in respect of which tolls are by this Act authorized to be taken in the market, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

3. The Council may, on the application in writing by the owner or occupier of any yard or premises within the shire which shall in the opinion of the Council be suitable and efficient as a place for the sale of cattle, license such yards or premises for such time and upon such terms as the Council may think fit as a place for the sale of cattle, provided that the inspector shall have the same powers with regard to any such yard or premises as are hereby vested in him with regard to the market.

The fee to be paid for the licence of any such yard or premises shall be 2s. 6d. per annum, and shall be paid by the person applying for such licence before the same is granted.

4. The word "Inspector" shall mean the collector or persons appointed to collect the stallages, rents, or tolls, authorized by the *Local Government Act 1915*, and shall include the assistants of the inspector.

5. There shall be appointed for such cattle market an inspector thereof, whose duties shall be as follows:—

- (a) To see that this By-law and the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915* relating to markets are duly observed.
- (b) To demand and receive all market tolls and dues.
- (c) To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of parties bringing stock to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be the most convenient, and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle from being roped within the market before Five o'clock p.m.
- (d) To preserve order and cleanliness within such market, and to remove or cause to be removed therefrom any person creating a riot or disturbances, or cursing or swearing or using any gross or indecent language, or being guilty of any gross or indecent conduct therein, and, if directed, to take legal proceedings against such person.
- (e) Notwithstanding anything herein contained as to hours during which the market shall be open, the Market Inspector shall at all times give such facilities for the reception and delivery of stock and articles as may in any case be actually necessary.

6. No cattle or articles shall be received at the said market after the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, and no person shall sell or offer for sale any cattle or articles in the said market before the opening or after the closing of the said market.

7. The first of sales of cattle shall be commenced not later than Ten o'clock a.m., and the sales shall be conducted in the following order:—

1. Sheep.
2. Fat cattle.
3. Store cattle.
4. Horses.
5. Pigs.
6. Articles.

Horses, pigs, and articles may, at the discretion of the inspector, and under his direction, be sold during the sales of sheep and cattle, or at such times during the day as the inspector may appoint.

8. All auctioneers or salesmen shall draw lots for priority of selling, and they shall in the order of such drawing at once submit for sale first the whole of the fat pigs at their disposal in the said market, and then all the store pigs shall be similarly offered.

9. That no person shall release any stock or articles from the market, or shall remove the same from one part of the market to another without the authority of the inspector.

10. Every person placing stock or articles in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls, dues, and charges accruing thereon, and in no case shall any stock or articles be taken out of the market until all tolls, dues, and charges payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied.

11. All cattle brought to the market for sale shall be placed in such pens as the inspector shall appoint, and no person shall be permitted to remove cattle from one pen to another except with the consent of the inspector. In case of any dispute arising as to the number of cattle, sheep, or pigs to be placed in each pen, or to overcrowding of pens, or as to priority of occupancy, the inspector alone shall be competent to decide, and the disputants shall be bound by his decision. The inspector shall have power to remove, or order to be removed, cattle from one pen to another, and any person refusing or neglecting to obey any orders given by the inspector in that respect shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

12. No auctioneer shall be allowed to occupy more than the time following in offering or selling any of the following cattle, sheep, horses, pigs, or articles for sale:—

Horned cattle, per pen ...	4 minutes
Sheep, per pen ...	1½ minutes
Sheep, per yard ...	3 minutes
Pigs, per pen (fats) ...	3 minutes
Pigs, per pen (stores) ...	4 minutes
Springers, per head ...	1 minute
Horses ...	2 minutes each
Articles ...	1 minute each

At the quarterly or special horse sales the sales shall commence at Eleven o'clock a.m. or such time as the inspector shall appoint, and on the day of such quarterly or special horse sales no animals other than horses shall be offered or sold in the said market.

13. All auctioneers having horses to dispose of by auction shall offer the stock placed in their hands in turn, and no auctioneer shall be permitted to occupy more than two minutes in offering any horse by auction. In case of any auctioneers wilfully infringing or attempting to infringe this rule he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

14. On every day when sales are to be held in the said market all auctioneers or salesmen shall draw lots for priority of order of selling cattle, sheep, horses, and pigs, and the auctioneer or salesman first in such drawing shall offer for sale, sell or otherwise dispose of any cattle, sheep, horses, or pigs for a period of not longer than one hour, the time to be indicated by a clock placed in the said market, or till the sooner conclusion of his sales or other disposals of such cattle, sheep, horses, or pigs, when the auctioneer or salesman next in such order of drawing shall offer for sale, sell or otherwise dispose of any cattle, sheep, horses, and pigs in a like manner, and so on until all the auctioneers shall have offered for sale, sold, or otherwise disposed of any cattle, sheep, horses, or pigs, and should all the cattle, sheep, horses, or pigs in the said market be not then offered, sold, or disposed of, the sale shall be continued in the order of drawing and in like manner as aforesaid. Provided always that should any auctioneer or salesman have offered, sold, or otherwise disposed of any particular class of cattle, sheep, or pigs before the expiration of the one hour as aforesaid, he shall cease to sell or offer for sale or otherwise dispose of any cattle, sheep, or pigs till all the said cattle, sheep, or pigs of such class shall be sold, offered for sale, or otherwise disposed of in the order of sales as set forth in clause seven (7) of this By-law.

15. Each auctioneer or salesman shall commence to sell according to his order of drawing as aforesaid at the time the bell is rung by the inspector to commence such sale. Any auctioneer or salesman neglecting or refusing to do so shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

16. In case of any dispute arising as to priority of right to offer by auction any horses, pigs, sheep, or cattle entered for sale in the said market, or as to the time when any auctioneer shall begin to offer or sell, or to cease offering or selling, the decision of the inspector shall be final, and any auctioneer or other person refusing or neglecting to obey the orders of the inspector in this respect shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

17. In case any sheep, cattle, horses, or pigs shall remain unoffered after the expiration of such one hour, then the auctioneer who has the same in his hands for sale or disposal shall wait his next regular turn for selling before he shall again offer for sale or disposal any such sheep, cattle, pigs, or horses remaining unoffered in his hands.

No auctioneer shall have the right to sell or offer for sale in the market for more than one hour at any one time, and then only in his regular turn. And no auctioneer shall be allowed to re-offer for sale any cattle in his hands until the whole of the stock entered for sale in the said market shall have been once offered for sale. Any person guilty of an infringement of this rule shall be liable to penalty of £2.

18. On every day when sales are to be held in the said market all auctioneers or salesmen or other persons shall conduct such sales strictly in accordance with such directions, either verbal or written, as may be given by the Council or inspector of the market, both as regards time, order of selling, and drawing of lots for priority in order of selling.

19. All cattle or articles not removed from the said market by the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on the day next after any sale shall have been held in the said market may be removed by the inspector at the expense and risk of the owner of any such cattle or articles.

20. No cattle, sheep, or horses which have been placed in any auctioneer's hands for sale shall be permitted to leave the market without the production of a pass from the auctioneer in whose hands they were placed for sale.

21. The sales by auction on fair days in the said market shall commence not later than the time hereinafter mentioned:—

Of sheep and lambs—Ten o'clock a.m.  
Of horned cattle—On conclusion of sheep sales.  
Of horses—Not later than Three o'clock p.m.

## SHIRE OF ROCHESTER.

## BY-LAW No. 12.

A By-law of the Shire of Rochester made under the *Health Act* 1919, and numbered 12, for instituting the double-pan sanitary system in the Shire of Rochester.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1919, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Rochester, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Central Riding of the Shire of Rochester, and allotments 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 69, 85, 84, 86, and 87, Parish of Rochester West.
4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of such closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.
5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.
6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.
7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time, and the other pan to be left in its place.
8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar painted inside or by some equally efficient means.
9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.
10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.
11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
