All those pieces of land in the Parish of Maramingo, the boundaries of which are as follow:—

REGULATIONS FOR STORAGE OF PETROLEUM, ETC.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the ninth day of October, 1923.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the *Local Government Act 1921 (No. 3167)* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations applicable to the whole of Victoria, or to such municipal districts (including the City of Melbourne and the City of Geelong) as are specified therein for or with respect to regulating the keeping and storage of petroleum, or any product of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable liquids, and carbide or other combustible substances: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section of the said Act and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations, and doth provide that the said Regulations shall apply and have application throughout the whole of the municipal districts of the Borough of Echuca and the Shire of Colac; and furthermore that such Regulations shall be deemed to be in substitution of any By-law or By-laws made by either of the said Councils of the said municipalities for the purpose for which these Regulations are now made, and shall take effect from the first day of November, 1923:—

REGULATIONS.

Storage of More than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or More than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

1. Every person who shall keep store or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises more than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all buildings shall be first approved of by the Council.
- (2) The buildings shall be constructed with walls of brick, concrete, iron or other non-inflammable material except that in the case of a galvanized-iron structure the lower portion of the walls must be in brick.
- (3) The floor of such buildings shall be made of earth, concrete or brick. The roof of such buildings shall be constructed of incombustible material.
- (4) To prevent outflow the lower portion of all walls to be without break or opening, the capacity of such enclosed space to be at least 25 per cent. of the total volume of volatile fluids kept, stored or retained in any such buildings.

Storage of Less than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or Less than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

2. Every person who shall keep store or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises less than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or less than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) In quantities not exceeding 50 gallons in the aggregate of any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto if such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of metal or other approved material including winchesters, so securely closed that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom, and if all due precautions are taken to prevent accident by fire or explosion and to prevent the escape of any such volatile fluids into a sewer or drain, and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits stairways or adjoining premises except that a reasonable quantity not exceeding 12 gallons in the aggregate of the said volatile fluids may be kept in separate glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint so securely closed or stopped that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits or stairways.
- (2) In quantities not exceeding 250 gallons of petroleum or any product of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test provided such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of glass earthenware or metal and are suitably closed or stopped, and the position of storage will not menace exits, stairways or adjoining premises.

Precaution to be Taken when Volatile Fluids are Stored in Bulk Containers.

3. Every tank or other container used for the purpose of the storage or keeping of any volatile fluids shall when not in use be kept tightly closed to prevent the escape of such fluids or any vapour or gas emitted therefrom.

Precautions to be Observed in Buildings.

4. Whenever any person shall have in or upon or about any building or premises more than 50 gallons (or more than 12 gallons if kept in glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint) of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test he shall observe the following precautions against fire:—

- (1) One 2-gallon carbon tetra-chloride or other approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be kept in such a position as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire and to be under the supervision of the Country Fire Brigade where practicable.
- (2) At least two iron buckets or other suitable containers each having a capacity of not less than a quarter of a cubic foot, filled with dry sand shall be kept in position in different parts of the building so as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.
- (3) Dry sand shall be used for absorbing all volatile fluids spilt or thrown upon the floor and shall after being so used be forthwith removed from the premises.
- (4) The use of sawdust for absorbing the said volatile fluids is prohibited.

Containers to be Labelled for Retail Sale.

5. Any person who for retail sale fills into small containers on premises any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall have the fire fighting appliances as mentioned in the preceding section and shall clearly label such small containers with the name of the contents and with the following words:—"Highly inflammable. Beware of the vapours. Keep fire away."

Regulations not to Apply to Storage of Alcoholic Spirits.

6. Nothing herein contained shall apply to the storing of alcoholic (other than methylated) spirits.

Conditions to be Observed in the Construction of Tanks.

7. Every person who shall erect or construct any storage tank for the storage of more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine or other volatile fluids shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all storage tanks other than underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be first approved by the Council for that purpose.
- (2) Underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be constructed of galvanized steel plate not less than 14 gauge, and be placed not less than 2 feet below the surface of the ground or the lowest floor of any building. Sand shall be filled in over the tank to the level of the ground or floor as the case may require. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices to the satisfaction of the engineer. Filling pipes may be placed where the engineer approves, but so as not to cause any obstruction to the traffic when the tanks are being filled.
- (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete, or an earthen dam of approved construction; such wall or dam shall be in no case of less height than 2 feet higher than the level to which the oil would rise should it escape from the tanks. An opening may be made in the enclosing wall to permit access to the tank but such opening shall contain a liquid tight door either sliding or opening inward, made of incombustible material, and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear on such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall.

Power to Enter and Inspect.

8. Any officer authorized by the Council may for the purpose of securing the due observance of and compliance with the provisions of these Regulations enter and inspect any building or erection at all reasonable times and do therein all such acts and things as are reasonably necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and any persons who shall in any manner interfere with such officer in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence.

Offence.

9. Every person who shall contravene or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty.

10. Every person guilty of an offence under these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each succeeding day after a written notice of the offence from the Council.

Definitions.

11. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context, "approved" means approved in writing by the engineer for the time being of the said Borough of Echuca and the said Shire of Colac or any deputy appointed by either of the said Councils of the said municipalities to act for him. "Council" means the Council of either of the said municipalities. "Person" includes firm, corporation, or company; and "volatile fluid" includes any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and also includes petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids mentioned in these Regulations that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test if such are stored in immediate contiguity with the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

Methylated spirits, benzine, petrol, naphtha, or any other products of petroleum or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour below a temperature of 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test.

BY-LAW No. 93.

Residential Areas.

A By-law of the City of Port Melbourne, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as amended by section 10 of Act 3167, for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting or regulating therein the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Port Melbourne, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation and have legal effect on its approval by the Governor in Council and after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

2. The areas within the municipal district hereinafter specified shall be residential areas, that is to say, all land and buildings situate in or having frontages to the following streets, viz.:—Clark-street, Evans-street, Derham-street, Station-street, Esplanade East, Liardet-street, Bridge-street, Heath-street, Nott-street (from Graham-street to Ingles-street), Princes-street (from Rouse-street to Raglan-street), Stokes-street (from Rouse-street to Farrell-street), Swallow-street, Poolman-street, Garton-street, Bay-street (from Ingles-street to Boundary-street), Cruickshank-street (from Bridge-street to Liardet-street), McCormack-street.

3. No person or corporation shall in any such areas build, construct, erect, adapt for use, or use any building for the purpose of a shop, factory, workroom, warehouse, stable, business, or public amusement; but this By-law shall not apply to any stable attached to or in future added to such residence provided such stable is erected in accordance with the Council's By-law.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to a solicitor, doctor, or dentist, nor to a dressmaker, milliner, teacher employing not more than three persons, or to a single worker who carries on any business in a private dwelling and whose plate, card, sign, or advertisement is restricted to that approved by the Council.

5. This By-law shall not affect or prohibit or preclude the continuance for use of any building, trade, industry, manufacture, business, shop, or place of public amusement at present in existence, or already built or constructed prior to the coming into operation of the By-law within the area hereinbefore specified, and shall not affect any enlargement, rebuilding or extension thereof for any purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law was in the same ownership and for such other purposes as the Council thinks reasonable in the circumstances.

Resolution for passing the above By-law agreed to by the Council on the thirty-first day of July, 1923, and confirmed the 4th day of September, 1923.

CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

BY-LAW No. 66.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham, made under Part VII, Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, to regulate the heavy motor vehicles used in the said city and for other purposes.

PREAMBLE.—Whereas by the *Local Government Act 1915*, George V. No. 2686, it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the City of Sandringham to make By-laws for suppressing nuisances and for regulating street traffic. Now therefore the Council of the City of Sandringham doth hereby, in pursuance of its powers conferred by 6 George V. No. 2686, and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, make the By-law and order as follows:—

1. *Definitions*.—In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—

“City” means the City of Sandringham.

“Council” means the Council of the City of Sandringham.

“Heavy Motor Vehicle” means a self-propelled vehicle weighing over two tons and five hundredweights and under five tons unladen and not used for the purpose of drawing more than one trailer (such trailer and its locomotive together, not exceeding six and a-half tons in weight unladen) but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails or a traction engine as defined by the *Local Government Act 1915*.

“Trailer” means a vehicle drawn by a heavy motor vehicle.

“Weight” in relation to a heavy motor vehicle when unladen means the weight of such heavy motor vehicle or trailer exclusive of the weight of any water fuel or accumulators special body or fittings which are not essential for the running of the vehicle.

“Axle Weight” means in relation to the axle of a heavy motor vehicle or of a trailer the aggregate weight transmitted to the surface of the road or other base whereon the heavy motor vehicle or trailer moves or rests by the several wheels attached to that axle when the heavy motor vehicle or the trailer is loaded.

“Width” means in relation to the tire of a vehicle the distance measured horizontally and in a straight line across the circumference of the wheel and between the two points in the outer surface of the tire which are farthest apart.

“Diameter” means in relation to a wheel the distance measured between the two opposite points in the outer surface of the tire which are farthest apart.

2. *Markings to be Made on Heavy Motor Vehicles*.—The owner of every heavy motor vehicle shall cause—

1. The weight of such heavy motor vehicle unladen.

2. The weight of each axle thereof.

3. The highest rate of speed at which in conformity with the provisions of this By-law such heavy motor vehicle may be driven without a trailer—to be painted or otherwise plainly marked—

(a) in some permanent manner in the first and second cases upon some conspicuous part of the right or off side of the heavy motor vehicle and in the third case, in some conspicuous part of the left or near side of the heavy motor vehicle; and

(b) in letters or figures of not less than one inch in height and of such shape and colour as to be clearly legible and easily distinguishable from the colour of the ground whereon the letters and figures are marked out.

4. From time to time all the paint and markings to be repaired and renewed so as to at all times keep the letters and figures clearly legible and easily distinguishable.

3. *Tires*.—The axle weight of any axle of a heavy motor vehicle shall not exceed eight tons and the sum of the axle weights of all axles shall not exceed twelve tons.

4. *Axle weights*.—(1) The tire of each wheel of a heavy motor vehicle shall be smooth and shall where the tire touches the surface of the road or other base whereon the heavy motor vehicle moves or rests be flat provided however—(a) that the edges of the tires may be bevelled or rounded to an extent in the case of each edge of not more than half-an-inch, or (b) that if the tire is constructed of separate plates the plates may be separated by parallel spaces which shall be disposed throughout the outer surface of the tire so that nowhere shall the aggregate extent of the space or spaces in the course of a straight line drawn horizontally across the circumference of the wheel exceed one-eighth part of the width of the tire.

(2) The width of the tire of each wheel of a heavy motor vehicle shall be determined by such of the following conditions as may apply to the circumstances of the case, that is to say:—

(a) the width shall in every case not be less than six inches;

(b) the width shall not be less than that number of half inches which is equal to the number of units of axle weight of the axle to which the wheel is attached.

(3) The unit of axle weight shall vary according to the diameter of the wheel and the rules set forth in the subjoined scale, that is to say—

- (a) if the wheel is three feet in diameter the unit of registered axle weight shall be seven and a-half hundredweights;
- (b) if the wheel exceeds three feet in diameter the unit of axle weight shall be seven and a-half hundredweights with an addition in the proportion of one hundredweight for every twelve inches by which the diameter is increased beyond three feet and in the same proportion for any increase greater or less than twelve inches; and
- (c) if the wheel is less than three feet in diameter the unit of axle weight shall be seven and a-half hundredweights with a deduction of weight in the proportion of one hundredweight for every six inches by which the diameter is reduced below three feet and in the same proportion for a reduction which is greater or less than six inches.

This section shall not apply to any tire which is pneumatic or which is made of a soft or elastic material.

5. *Smoke*.—A heavy motor vehicle propelled by steam shall not emit therefrom any smoke or visible vapour except from any temporary or accidental cause.

6. *Speed*.—The speed at which any heavy vehicle is driven on any street shall not (except as herein provided) exceed ten miles an hour provided that—

- (a) if the weight of the heavy motor vehicle unladen exceeds three tons; or
- (b) if the axle weight of any axle thereof exceeds six tons; or
- (c) if the heavy motor vehicle draws a trailer,

its speed shall not exceed six miles per hour provided also that—If the heavy motor vehicle has all its wheels fitted with pneumatic tires or with tires made of soft and elastic material the speed at which the same may be driven on any street shall not exceed—

- (a) fifteen miles an hour where the axle weight of any axle does not exceed six tons; and
- (b) ten miles an hour where the axle weight of any axle exceeds six tons.

7. *Width of Vehicle and Trailer*.—A heavy motor vehicle if its weight unladen is three tons or exceeds three tons and any trailer drawn by any such heavy motor vehicle may when measured between its extreme projecting points be of any width not exceeding seven feet six inches.

8. *Size of Wheels*.—The diameter of a wheel of a heavy motor vehicle unless the same be fitted with a tire which is pneumatic or made of a soft elastic material shall not be less than two feet.

9. *Springs*.—Every heavy motor vehicle shall be constructed with suitable and sufficient springs between each axle and the frame of the heavy motor vehicle.

10. *Brakes*.—Every heavy motor vehicle shall be provided with two independent brakes the reversing gear of such vehicle being counted as one brake.

11. *Trailers*.—(1) The owner of a trailer shall—

- (a) cause to be painted or otherwise plainly marked upon some conspicuous part of the right or off side of the trailer in letters and figures not less than one inch in height and of such shape and colour as to be clearly legible and easily distinguishable from the colour of the ground whereon the letters and figures are painted or marked.
 - (i) the weight of the trailer unladen, and if the weight of the trailer exceeds one ton;
 - (ii) the axle weight of each axle of the trailer; and

(b) cause the paint or marking to be from time to time repaired or renewed as often as may be necessary to keep the said letters and figures clearly legible and easily distinguishable.

(2) The provisions of this By-law relating to the width of the tires and the sizes of the wheels of a heavy motor vehicle which are not pneumatic or are not made of a soft and elastic material shall with the necessary modification apply and have effect with respect to a trailer exceeding one ton in weight unladen with the substitution therein of three inches for six inches as the minimum width of the tires and of references to the axle weight painted or marked on the trailer in pursuance of this section as aforesaid respectively.

(3) Every trailer shall be constructed with suitable and sufficient springs between each axle and the frame of the trailer.

(4) Every trailer shall be provided with a brake in such a manner that such brake may be operated either from the driver's footplate or by a competent person carried on the trailer. Provided however that this provision shall not apply when the trailer is connected to the heavy motor vehicle by a rigid coupling.

(5) A heavy motor vehicle which is used as a stage carriage or otherwise for the conveyance of passengers for gain or hire shall not be used to draw a trailer.

(6) Not more than one trailer shall be drawn by a heavy motor vehicle and any such trailer shall be properly and securely fixed to the heavy motor vehicle in such manner that the distance between the front of the trailer and the rear of the heavy motor vehicle shall not exceed seven feet.

12. No person shall cause or permit to be used on any street or stand on any street drive or have charge of a heavy motor vehicle whether as defined by this By-law or otherwise or a trailer which is not in every respect in accordance with the provisions of this By-law or shall so use or drive the same respectively as to contravene any of the provisions of this By-law.

13. If any officer of the Council or of the police have reason to suspect that any of the provisions of this By-law have not been complied with or are then not being complied with by any person in respect of any heavy motor vehicle he may require the same to be submitted for examination and the owner or driver of such heavy motor vehicle shall for the purposes of this section cause the same to be drawn or brought to such place and at such time as such officer shall appoint.

14. *Offence*.—Any wilful contravention of the provisions of the foregoing section by Act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

15. *Penalty*.—Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

16. *Application*.—This By-law shall have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Sandringham.

TOWN OF PRESTON.

BY-LAW No. 24.

A By-law of the Town of Preston, made under the 283rd section of the *Health Act 1919*, for fixing the fees for examining and branding carcases of animals or meat reared and slaughtered by any person on his own premises which premises are situated outside the meat area, and also carcases of animals or meat slaughtered at any abattoir situated within the limits of the meat area as at present constituted, and as may be constituted from time to time within the Town of Preston.

IN view of the powers conferred by section 283 of the *Health Act 1919* the Council of the Town of Preston being a Municipal Council for the Municipal District of Preston doth hereby make the following regulations:—

1. Paragraph four of Regulation number one of the Shire of Preston made and passed on the twenty-eighth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and two, and confirmed on the first day of September One thousand nine hundred and two shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. The fees payable for examining and branding carcases parts of carcases or meat by or under the direction of the Meat Inspector shall be as follows:—

For the carcass part of carcass or meat of every ox, cow, bull, heifer, or steer—One shilling.

For every calf—Sixpence.

For every sheep, lamb, or goat—Threepence.

For every swine—Sixpence.

and such fees shall be paid to the Town Collector at the Town Office once at least in every week and the amount of such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the Meat Inspector.

The owner or occupier of any vacant land within the area defined in clause two of this By-law shall enclose the same with a substantial fence constructed of such material and in such manner as is prescribed and specified in clause twenty-five of Part II. of By-law number 17 of the Borough of Queenscliffe.

4. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Two pounds nor more than Twenty pounds for each offence.

A By-law of the Shire of Glenelg, made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered sixteen, for abolishing cesspits and the single-pan system for nightsoil, and providing that every closet in the prescribed area hereinafter defined be furnished with a double-pan service or other service approved by the Commission of Public Health (hereinafter called the Commission).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Glenelg make the following By-law which shall have operation in the prescribed area and shall extend and apply to every occupier of a tenement therein (hereinafter referred to as "the occupier").

1. The words "prescribed area," wherever used herein shall be deemed to mean and include the portion of the said shire within the boundary lines of the Townships of Casterton Merino and Sandford and of allotments 6 and 7 of section 18 Parish of Casterton County of Follett respectively and such additional portion or portions of the said shire as the Council may by By-law or By-laws made from time to time declare to be included therein.

2. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

3. The ordinary cesspits and single-pan system for nightsoil shall be abolished and instead thereof every closet in such prescribed area shall be furnished with a double-pan service to be supplied by the Council of the said shire (hereinafter called "the Council") or other service approved by the Commission.

4. Instead of a double-pan service supplied by the Council the occupier may install in his tenement a septic-tank system after compliance with the provisions of Division 2 Part IV. of Act number 3041 or may install therein any other system for disposing of nightsoil approved by the Commission and installed and maintained in a manner satisfactory to the Council but in the case of each tenement so long only as such installation in the sole opinion and judgment of the Council shall be an efficient and proper means of disposing of nightsoil.

5. In every case where the Council's double-pan service is in operation the following regulations shall apply:—

(a) At least once a week the Council's contractor or employee shall properly place in position in each such closet a pan cleaned by water and suitably disinfected and deodorized and after closing the used pan with a tight-fitting lid remove same in a suitable vehicle provided by the Council to such place or places within its district as the Council shall from time to time provide and there the contents shall be trenched into the soil as directed by the Council;

(b) The occupier shall build and at all times maintain his closet or closets so that while a convenient trap-door for changing the pan and a removable cover for the seat are provided the recess for the pan is otherwise fly-proof and shall keep such trap-door and seat cover lightly closed when not necessarily open and shall provide and keep in use therein a suitable disinfectant and deodorant;

(c) To provide for the proper removal and disposal of nightsoil the occupier shall pay to the Council in respect of each pan in use in his tenement such annual charge as may from time to time be fixed by ordinary resolution of the Council and such charge shall be payable by the occupier in four equal instalments due and payable on the first day of January April July and October in each year to the person appointed by the Council to demand and recover the same.

5. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in case of a continuing offence, to a further daily penalty of not more than Two pounds.

SHIRE OF MAFFRA.

BY-LAW No. 23.

A By-law of the Shire of Maffra, and numbered 23, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, for prohibiting and regulating the depasturing of cattle and horses within certain boundaries in the Shire of Maffra, for the suppression of nuisances and for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* the President and Councillors and Rate-payers of the Shire of Maffra order as follows:—

That By-law No. 10 of the Shire of Maffra for regulating the depasturing of cattle and stock on certain streets and roads in the Shire of Maffra be hereby repealed.

That the provisions regarding impounding contained in section 497 of the *Local Government Act 1915* be enforced, and that all cattle or horses found depasturing or wandering at large in any of the streets of Maffra, or upon any of the following roads, be impounded, viz:—

- (a) The main Boisdale-road from the N.E. angle of the Township of Maffra to the boundary of the Central Riding at Clark's Crossing, Avon River.
- (b) The 3-chain road from Maffra to the Avon River.
- (c) The boundary road between the Central and East Ridings.
- (d) The Newry lower and middle roads to their termination.
- (e) The Sale-road and lower Bundalagah-road, the Maffra-Stratford road, and the Nuntin-Boisdale road.
- (f) The Maffra and Mewburn Park roads to Tinamba Store; the road from Mansons Bridge to Gibson and Knox's Bridge, and the Heyfield back road to Davis' Bridge.
- (g) All cross roads to and connecting these lines of traffic, and lying between these terminal points.

That the above order be carried out under the following rules and regulations, that is to say:—

That all householders of the Township of Maffra shall be exempt from such impounding up to a limit of two head of cows or heifers over the age of 12 months, and two horses which are in use for saddle or draught purposes.

That all occupiers of land fronting either of the above mentioned roads outside the Township of Maffra, shall be exempt from such impounding up to a limit of six head of large cattle and four horses respectively, and that in the case of public carriers or road contractors the number of horses so exempted to be a team of horses in actual use.

That a condition precedent to such exemption be a payment to the Council half-yearly in advance, at the rate of 6s. per annum for every head of such cattle and 20s. for each head of horses so exempted, such payment to be as a remuneration to the herdsman or officer appointed by the Council, as a person in charge of such cattle or horses and hereinafter called the herdsman.

Also that in the case of cattle depasturing on the streets of Maffra such exemption only extends to such cattle as are removed from the streets between the hours of sunset and sunrise, and further, that all horses or cattle so exempted shall be the *bona fide* property of the person registering same, who shall be required in every case to subscribe to a declaration to this effect.

When the above fee is paid to the herdsman he shall register such each head of cattle or horses in a book to be kept for the purpose, as exempt from the operation of this By-law, and shall fix a chain around the neck of each, upon which is attached a tag with the number corresponding to the number on the register in token of such exemption, the chain to be paid for by the owner of the animal. The herdsman shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money paid, which shall also be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose for the information and use of the Council.

No calves, foals or bulls shall be exempted without the special consent in writing of the Council.

A muster of stock so registered and exempted shall take place on a day of which notice shall be given by advertisement at the close of every half-yearly period, and owners requiring exemption for the ensuing half-year are required to present their stock at the mustering yards on these occasions and complete their registration.

The herdsman shall keep an entry of all cattle impounded by him and present a return of same to the Council every six months on a day preceding the half-yearly muster and registration together with the books in which such entries are made.

The Council or the herdsman will not be responsible for any horses or cattle so exempted, but it will be the herdsman's duty to see all stock exempted once in 14 days and in the event of any of such stock straying outside the above described limits, to give notice of same immediately to the owners thereof.

The Council or the herdsman will not be answerable for any damage arising from the impounding of exempted stock by any person owning lands abutting on or adjacent to the above described roads or streets or owning lands in any situation whatever.

No pigs, goats, or sheep are allowed to wander or depasture on such streets or roads and all travelling must move toward their destination at the rate of two miles in each hour.

No person will be allowed to remove from the herdsman's charge any stock registered and exempted as above without due notice of same beforehand, upon receipt of which the owner so removing will be entitled without further charge to substitute for each head so removed one other head of stock for the unexpired period of registration.

The Council shall have the exclusive right to cause all stock suspected of contagious disease to be removed from such streets or roads, and in the event of any registered or diseased horses or cattle dying, the owner thereof shall cause the same to be destroyed immediately on receiving notice (proof of postage of such notice shall be considered sufficient) failing which the herdsman or the Inspector of Nuisances shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owners' risk and cost. The Council shall also have the right to refuse to exempt or register any horse cow or heifer which may be deemed to be a nuisance or for any other reason whatever.

Cattle are only exempted from impounding conditionally that they be not allowed to wander on the streets of Maffra between the hours of sunset and sunrise; therefore if such cattle are allowed to wander, the owner thereof shall be deemed guilty of an offence and punishable under this By-law.

Violation of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATION.

A Regulation of the Shire of Alberton, numbered one, made under section 4 of Part One of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force in the said shire by virtue of a By-law of the above-mentioned shire, numbered seventeen, for regulating the height from the ground of porticoes in the Township of Yarram Yarram, and for appointing the shape, figure, dimensions, and materials for such porticoes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the Shire of Alberton make the following Regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part of the municipal district, that is to say, the Township of Yarram Yarram.

1. *Porticoes to be Cantilever.*—No person shall erect, construct, or place upon, or in connexion with, any building any portico other than of the cantilever type, not less than ten feet in height or more than twelve feet from the footway to the underside of the ceiling lining at the building line.

2. *Dimensions and Height.*—The fascia of every portico shall finish flush with the kerb line in all cases. The cantilevers and fascia girders shall not exceed eight inches nor be less than seven in depth for porticoes twelve feet or under in width. The face girder shall be carried along the several frontages on true horizontal line, the lowest point at a minimum height of ten feet above the kerbing, and carried along in that manner until the height of twelve feet above the kerbing shall have been attained, when the line shall be discontinued, and shall recommence at the minimum.

3. *Roof.*—The roof shall have a pitch of at least one-half of an inch per foot towards the roadway, and shall be covered with number 24 gauge galvanized corrugated iron seamed to purlins with galvanized iron bolts or clips and washers at the top of the corrugations. The iron shall be lapped two corrugations at the sides and not less than nine inches at the ends of the sheets, and shall be riveted every twelve inches at the sides and at every third corrugation at the ends.

4. *Gutters and Spouting.*—Galvanized iron spouting shall be provided and securely fastened to fascia channel, and shall be not less than four and a half inches and of number 24 gauge galvanized iron, well lapped and riveted and soldered at the ends and supported on metal straps.

5. *Down Pipes.*—Down pipes shall be of sufficient capacity to efficiently discharge all rain water falling on the roof. Such pipes shall be of wrought or cast iron chased into walls or piers or set back so as not to project beyond the face of the building, and shall discharge under the footway into the street channel.

6. *Sky-lights.*—Sky-lights may be provided in porticoes glazed with wire-rolled plate glass in single lengths set in approved glazing bars.

7. *Ceilings.*—Metal ceilings may be fixed to jarrah, red-gum, or yellow stringy-bark joists.

8. *Supervision.*—The whole of the work shall be executed in accordance with such instructions as may from time to time be given by the engineer for the time being of the said shire, and in case such work or any part thereof be done, erected, or made contrary to such instructions, the said engineer shall have power to order the same to be removed or dismantled, and any default in carrying out any such instructions shall be deemed a breach of this Regulation, and be punishable accordingly. The said engineer or the said shire or the council thereof shall not be in any way chargeable or answerable or responsible for any fault or default in any such work, or in the material used in the construction thereof, notwithstanding that the said engineer may have passed such work.

9. *Plans.*—Porticoes shall be constructed or erected in accordance with the plan deposited with this Regulation at the offices of the said shire at Yarram Yarram, subject to such variations as may be from time to time sanctioned by the said engineer.
