HENLEY ON THE MARIBYRNONG.

Notice to Boatmen, &c.

No. 1 of 1923.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that Henley on the Maribyrnong will be held on Saturday, 10th February, 1923, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day shall observe the following regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, and carry a bucket for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme, and the direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers, and no boat deemed by the Port Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boats except such as have permission of the Port Officer or his Deputy.

After sunset motor boats shall exhibit a red light, and go slow.

Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

Rowing boats shall exhibit a white light after sunset.

All boats must give way to racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 475 and 479 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Council of the shire of Swan Hill do hereby order:—That the land next hereinafter described which has been acquired by them shall be a Public Highway from and after the date of publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette*, viz.:—

Firstly—County of Tatchera, parish of Boga: Commencing at the south-eastern corner or angle of allotment fifteen A, section one; thence by a line bearing due north a distance of thirty-six chains twenty-nine links; thence by a line bearing north 69 degrees east a distance of one hundred and seven links; thence by a line bearing due south a distance of thirty-six chains sixty-seven links and four-tenths of a link; and thence by a line bearing due west a distance of one hundred links to the commencing point containing by admeasurement 3 acres 2 roods and 24 perches or thereabouts.

MAFFRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 10.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Maffra Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1923 in respect of water supplied within the Urban District of the Trust:—

2. For every house or tenement of an annual value of £14 or over, at the rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound of such value.

3. For every house or tenement of a less annual value than £14, a minimum charge of £1 5s.

4. For every vacant allotment of land of an annual value of £5 or under, a charge of 5s. For each additional allotment of land rated together with the first allotment, One shilling. Where the annual value of an allotment is over £5, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound of the annual value thereof.

5. For every water trough supplied with water, £1. On vacant lands the rate of payment shall be considered a part payment of this charge of £1. In cases where a large quantity of water is consumed by the use of a trough, as in a paddock where a number of stock are kept, the Trust in its discretion may insist on a meter being installed.

6. For water supplied by measure, Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons: provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount of the assessed rate, except in cases where the Trust has made special arrangement. In cases where the occupier quits without paying for the excess water, the owner will be held liable for same.

7. For using a hose for stable watering during the year, Twenty shillings.

8. For water supplied to new buildings being erected, £1 per centum on the contract price of all brick, stone, cement, or other work where water is used. In every case where a new building is erected a minimum charge of Ten shillings shall be paid by the owner, but if such payment is stipulated in any specification to be paid by the contractor, the Trust will hold the owner responsible for payment.

9. Water supplied to manufactories, railways, livery stables, or other than domestic purposes, may be charged for at a special rate, or by measurement or at the discretion of the Trust.

10. The Trust may by notice in writing, require any owner or occupier using water by means of a hose or otherwise, other than for domestic purposes, to provide a meter, and if such meter is not installed within the time specified in such notice, the Trust may cause the water to be cut off from such premises, and the expense so incurred shall be recoverable from the owner or occupier. Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by the owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the water from any premises, where it has been allowed to run to waste or has been used in an unauthorised manner, and such premises will not be re-connected with the main until the expense so incurred has been paid.

11. Water must not be used for watering gardens between the hours of 8 o'clock p.m. and 6 o'clock a.m. For the purpose of conserving water in dry weather, or when making repairs or extensions, the Trust may cut off the supply of water during certain hours of the day.

12. For water supplied through any stand-pipe or hydrant, a charge of One shilling for each 200 gallons.

13. For all lands or tenements in the said district situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid, and in which tenements are not supplied with water from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe or hydrant for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rates, and where such lands or tenements are more than a quarter of a mile and less than half a mile from such stand pipe or hydrant, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

14. For every plumber's licence One pound, for the year ending 31st December, 1923.

15. The foregoing charges are payable in two moieties, in advance, on the 1st February, 1923, and the 1st July, 1923. Interest at the rate of £6 per cent. per annum will be charged on amounts six months overdue. Sums under £2 are to be paid in one sum. Such person as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint shall be authorised to collect the said rates and charges.

Every person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Ten shillings, and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Ten shillings for every day such breach is committed or continued.

PYRAMID HILL WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law determining the rate payable for the year 1923 for Water supplied within the boundaries of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of Three shillings (3s.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property situated within the Waterworks District of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1923.

2. The minimum rate on any tenement used as a domicile shall be Two pounds five shillings (£2 5s.).

3. On all unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged.

4. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains lucerne, sorghum, or other fodder crop without a permit from the Secretary of the Trust who shall, subject to the approval of the Trust, issue the same; the fee for such permit shall be Fifty shillings (£2 10s.) for each one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) or part of one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) of an acre to be irrigated. The service-pipe for the supplying of such water shall not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ inch in diameter. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

5. A minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) and a maximum rate of Two pounds (£2) sterling shall be charged any person, as the Commissioners may determine, for using water for garden watering during the year in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such water is used.

6. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply, nor will allow any water to be taken under clauses 5 and 6, until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

7. Any person supplied with water by this Trust, who shall permit, or suffer the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds (£2) for each day after notice of offence from the Trust.

8. No person will be allowed to water lawns or gardens after eight o'clock p.m. on any day during the months of November, December, January, February, and March. Any person found infringing, or permitting taps to run, will be prosecuted in accordance with clause 7.

9. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable on the first day of March, 1923.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

WINCHELSEA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1923.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law, viz:—

By-law No. 10.

The following are the rates and charges which occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1923 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District thereof:—

1. For every house and tenement up to £16 annual municipal value and under, the sum of £2 16s. (Two pounds sixteen shillings) per annum.

2. For every house and tenement of £17 annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Three shillings and sixpence to the £1 upon the municipal value of such property.

3. Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months commencing on the first day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied or supplied with water from the works of the Trust of Six pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound one shilling sterling per annum.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied or supplied with water from the works of the Trust of Seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Three shillings and sixpence in the £1 upon the municipal value of such property.

6. Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs, and to Government grounds and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement at 2s. (Two shillings) per 1,000 gallons.

7. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge for every 200 gallons or under, the sum of ninepence.

8. For a supply during the erection of new buildings, there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

9. Except hereinbefore otherwise provided the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of assessed rates which would be payable for the premises so supplied, and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and for water in excess of such minimum, there shall be a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

10. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be £1, renewals 5s.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable yearly in advance, or in other cases as directed by the Secretary, and shall be payable in one moiety. The payment shall be due on the first day of January, 1923, for year ending 31st December, 1923, and after the 30th day of September, 1923, all rates not paid shall bear interest at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorised to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole and the word "Trust" shall mean the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF RESERVES FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISHES OF ORBOST, ORBOST EAST, BETE BOLONG SOUTH, WAYGARA, AND NEW-MERELLA.

THE Council of the Shire of Orbost, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the lands reserved for Public purposes in the parishes of Orbost, Orbost East, Bete Bolong South, Newmerella, and Waygara, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or

thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 3. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserves, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserves; nor leave or deposit and glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
 4. No person shall put in the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserves, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
 5. No person shall camp in the Reserves nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or any other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 6. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 7. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserves.
 8. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserves, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserves.
 9. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of management.
 10. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
