### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to make further and better provision with respect to Main Drains and Main Drainage Works and certain Rivers Creeks and Water-courses within the Metropolis and for other purposes.”

“An Act relating to the University of Melbourne.”

“An Act to facilitate the Enforcement in Victoria of Judgments and Awards in the Superior Courts of England Scotland and Ireland and for other purposes.”

1. That on and after the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, the pilotage rate from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay, or vice versa, for steam-ships or ships propelled by electricity or other mechanical power up to 5,000 tons of the vessel's burthen shall be One penny and half a penny (1½d.) per ton, calculated on the vessel's net registered tonnage, and for every additional ton, One penny (1d.), subject in any case to a minimum charge of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.).

2. The provisions of these presents shall take effect on and from the first day of January, 1924.

“Between the intersection of Hawthorn and Glenhuntly roads, and the intersection of North and Hawthorn roads, via Hawthorn-road.”

Under the heading—

“EAST KEW AND MONT ALBERT ROUTES,”

the following shall be added as the first section:—

“Between Hawthorn-bridge and Post Office, Kew, via Church and High streets.”

Under the heading—

“ESSENDON TRAMWAYS, MARIBYRNONG, AND MOUNT ALEXANDER ROADS ROUTES,”

“Between the intersection of Mount Alexander-road and Fletcher-street and Keilor-road terminus,”

there shall be added after the word “terminus” the words—

“at Gillies-street.”

After the words “at Gillies-street” there shall be added the following section:—

“Between the intersection of Mount Alexander-road and Puckle-street and the intersection of Napier and Raleigh streets.”

For the sections—

“Between Newmarket Railway Station and the junction of Union and Epsom roads,” and

“Between the junction of Union and Epsom roads and Maribyrnong River-bridge terminus,”

That the Tyrrell Waterworks District be extended by adding to the same—

- (a) Those portions of the Walpeup East Waterworks District excised therefrom by Order in Council bearing date the 17th day of October, 1923, which portions are set out and described in the First Schedule hereto.
- (b) That portion of the Karkarooc Waterworks District excised therefrom by Order in Council bearing date the 9th day of October, 1923, which portion is set out and described in the Second Schedule to the said Order, and which portion is also set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (c) The lands set out and described in the Third Schedule hereto.

And as on and from the first day of July, 1923, the said Tyrrell Waterworks District shall be deemed to be so extended.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING FORMS.

WHEREAS by section 46 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922* (6 Geo. V. No. 3195), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, as to the whole or any part of Victoria, make Regulations for or with respect to certain matters therein referred to: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Destruction (Forms) Regulations 1923*, and shall come into force upon the date of their publication in the *Government Gazette*.

## INTERPRETATION.

2. In the construction of these forms the terms hereunder shall have the respective meanings assigned to them:—

"The Act" shall mean the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922* (No. 3195).

"Minister" shall mean the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey.

"Superintendent" shall mean the Superintendent of vermin and noxious weeds destruction appointed under the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922*.

"Corporation" shall mean the Board of Land and Works, the Victorian Railways Commissioners, the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, the Country Roads Board, the Closer Settlement Board, the Forest Commission, and the State Electricity Commission of Victoria.

"Municipality" shall include the City of Melbourne and the City of Geelong.

"Owner" shall include—

(a) any person holding or occupying any land under any lease or licence from the Crown or deriving title from, under, or through such person; and  
(b) a mortgagee of land in possession thereof.

"Owner" and "Occupier" shall respectively include any joint owner, or joint occupier, or the agent of any owner or occupier.

"Noxious weed" shall mean any plant which the Governor in Council by Proclamation declares to be a noxious weed for the purposes of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922*.

"Vermin" shall mean any animal or bird which the Governor in Council by Proclamation declares to be vermin for the purposes of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922*.

3. The forms hereunder set forth lettered A to Z or others to the like effect are hereby prescribed as the "Forms" to be used for the whole of Victoria under the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922* in respect of the several matters which they purport to cover.

4. If any lessee or occupier of any land of the Crown held or occupied under lease or licence has expended in any one year an amount in excess of One hundred pounds in the destruction of noxious weeds on such land under the supervision of an inspector, and desires to claim to be recouped the excess, he may apply to the Minister by forwarding through the Superintendent a statement supported by statutory declaration showing particulars of the total amount so expended as provided for in Form T of these Regulations, accompanied by an L2 claim for the difference between the amount so expended and the sum of One hundred pounds.

Such claim shall, before being passed for payment, be duly certified to by the Superintendent and be approved by the Minister.

*Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922.*

Notice by the Superintendent requiring a Corporation to Effectually Destroy and Suppress all Noxious Weeds on Land vested in, or occupied, controlled, or managed by such Corporation.

I, the undersigned, being the Superintendent under the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922*, and authorized for this

purpose, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, give you notice that I require you—

(a) forthwith to effectually destroy and suppress all noxious weeds specified hereunder growing or being upon the land vested in, or occupied, controlled, or managed by you (other than so much of such land as is held or occupied by any other person under lease or licence granted by you) in the [state municipal district and division thereof in which the land is, or allotment, section, and parish, or any other particulars by which the land can be located], containing about \_\_\_\_\_ acres; and

(b) to keep such land clear and free of all such noxious weeds for six months after the service of this notice.
