Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE LAW CLERKS BOARD.

Note.---This Determination on the 12th November, 1923, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria. N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed, in his practice, by a barrister and solicitor, but not including—
