State Electricity Commission Acts.—Victoria.

STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor in Council has by Order dated the 30th day of January, 1923, approved of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria undertaking the supply of electricity in bulk or otherwise, in accordance with the provisions of the State Electricity Commission Acts, to persons and bodies of persons (including, if the case so requires, undertakers and public statutory corporations) in Gippsland: And whereas, pursuant to the *State Electricity Commission Act 1922* (No. 3265), application has been made to the Commission by the Municipal Council of the Shire of Maffra for the supply of electricity by the Commission to persons or bodies of persons, corporate or unincorporate, other than undertakers or public statutory corporations, within that shire: And whereas the Commission having as required by that Act inquired into the subject-matter thereof and determined a scale of charges to be made for electricity supplied in accordance with the application, is satisfied that the probable demand for electricity within the area will be such that the annual revenue obtainable from the supply of electricity according to the scale of charges so determined will be sufficient to pay the total annual cost to the Commission of or incidental to the supply, and has reported to the Minister the result of such inquiry and determination, and has recommended that the necessary works be provided and constructed by the Commission in connexion with the undertaking above referred to for the supply of electricity by the Commission in the Shire of Maffra, it is recommended for the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council that the necessary works be provided and constructed by the Commission for and in respect of the supply of electricity by the Commission in accordance with the application above recited.

STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

## No. 77.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as "the Commissioners," in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the *Railways Act 1915*, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications, selection, and examination of candidates for employment, and do hereby repeal all previous regulations relating thereto.

1. Every person desiring to become a candidate for employment in any position specified in the public notice relating to the particular examination must prepare, in his own handwriting, an application on the form prescribed, for appointment to one of the vacancies specified in such public notice.

2. Every candidate shall be restricted to one application for employment; but, if so prescribed in the public notice, will be allowed to specify two of the positions; or, in the case of an apprentice, two of the trades named therein as his first and second preference respectively, and shall enclose such application in an envelope, which must be properly addressed, duly stamped and posted so that it will reach the Secretary for Railways (hereinafter referred to as the "Secretary"), Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.

3. The age of each candidate shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioners for the opening of the applications, and shall be not less than the minimum, nor more than the maximum, age specified in the public notice for the particular grade.

4. Every candidate shall furnish with his application evidence of his age in accordance with the conditions specified in the public notice.

5. The height of every candidate shall not be less than the minimum height prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade.

6. The salary or wage of every successful candidate on appointment and thereafter shall be subject to the conditions specified in the public notice relating to the particular examination.

7. Every successful candidate for employment in a junior grade who, owing to the requirements of the Department, may be obliged to reside away from his home, shall, in addition to his salary or wage, be granted an allowance towards his board and lodging expenses, if so entitled, subject to the conditions specified in the public notice relating to the particular examination and class of employment.

8. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in any capacity in the Railway Department or in the Public Service, whether as a permanent or supernumerary employee, shall furnish with his application particulars as to the period of such employment.

9. Any person who has been dismissed from the Railway Department, or the Public Service, or whose employment has been terminated for disciplinary causes under the provisions of the Railways or Public Service Acts, or who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanour, whether before or after selection or examination, shall not be eligible for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

10. The Secretary shall on the day and at the hour named in the public notice proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that

purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.

11. In accordance with the provisions of the *Railways Amending Act 1915*, No. 2814, every person who enlisted (during the then existing War) with any Expeditionary Force raised in Victoria for Naval or Military service with His Majesty's Navy or Army, and left Victoria on duty with such Force, is entitled, without selection by the Board of Selectors, to be appointed to any vacancy in any permanent office of the Railway Service publicly advertised by the Commissioners, in priority to all other persons if competent to fulfil the duties of such office and the requirements as to examination for persons entering the Railway Service, subject to the production of evidence of satisfactory conduct whilst on duty with such Expeditionary Force.

12. The order of priority for examination and appointment of candidates for employment in adult grades shall therefore be—

- First: Returned Sailors or Soldiers eligible under the provisions of Act No. 2814; and  
Second: All other candidates.

13. The candidates in any grade, if not more than twice the number to be employed, shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 20 to 29 inclusive of this Regulation.

14. If the eligible Returned Sailor or Soldier candidates in any grade equal or exceed twice this number to be employed in such grade, they shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in clauses 20 to 29 of the Regulation, and the applications of all other candidates shall be rejected as being in excess of the requirements of the Commissioners.

15. If the number of eligible Returned Sailor or Soldier candidates in any grade is less than twice the number to be employed in such grade, and the combined number of all candidates in the same grade is more than twice the number to be employed, the eligible Returned Sailor or Soldier candidates shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 20 to 29 of this Regulation, and a sufficient number (not exceeding the difference between the number of Returned Sailors or Soldiers and twice the number of vacancies specified in the public notice for the particular grade) shall be selected by a Board of Selectors which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection.

16. The candidates in any grade for which no eligible Returned Sailors or Soldiers are candidates, if more than twice the number to be employed, shall be reduced by the Board of Selectors to a number not exceeding twice the number to be employed.

17. The members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them; and any candidate who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself, or in favour of or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

18. Every candidate, other than an eligible Returned Sailor or Soldier, shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.

19. Every such candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.

20. Every candidate selected by the Board of Selectors; every candidate for employment in any grade for which the number of applicants is not more than twice the number to be employed; and every eligible Returned Sailor or Soldier candidate shall be required to undergo an examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and for such examination shall pay a fee of 5s.

21. Every such candidate, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of height, vision, colour-sense, and hearing, shall, if required so to do, present himself for an examination by the Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

22. Every such candidate who has been so notified shall be required by the Examiners appointed for that purpose to pass the educational examination prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade.

23. Every such candidate and every candidate for employment in a position for which no educational test is prescribed by the public notice, who has passed the prescribed physical and vision and hearing examinations, shall produce to the Educational Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, as well as certificates, indentures, or other satisfactory evidence that he possesses the requisite qualifications prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade, and shall furnish satisfactory testimony of his employment with any persons or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years. In addition, every such candidate who has had previous employment in the Public Service or in the service of the Commissioners shall produce a statement of such service and a certificate of competency and good conduct; and every Returned Sailor or Soldier candidate shall produce a satisfactory Naval or Military Certificate of Discharge.

24. The Educational Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate so examined, indorsed with their certificate as to the fitness or otherwise of the candidate for the position applied for, and shall also certify whether the candidates for employment in a position for which no educational test is prescribed in the public notice possess the qualifications specified in such public notice for the particular position, and have also complied with all other conditions relating thereto.

25. After examination by the Educational Examiners the successful candidates in any grade, if not in excess of the number required, will be employed forthwith, and their relative seniority for future promotion, &c. (all other things being equal, and subject to the order of priority prescribed by Clause 12 of this Regulation for candidates in adult grades) shall be determined by a ballot conducted by the Secretary.

26. The successful candidates in any grade, if in excess of the number required, shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots to determine the order of precedence in which their names shall be recorded

for appointment; and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall (all other things being equal, and subject to the order of priority prescribed by Clause 12 of this Regulation for candidates in adult grades) determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.

27. Every successful candidate in any grade, if in excess of the number required by the Commissioners, shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment to any vacancy in the particular grade for which he is a candidate during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of the ballot without further or other examination.

28. Every appointment shall be on probation for a period of six months, during which the probationer shall be required to attend such instructional classes as may be prescribed by the Commissioners for the particular grade; and at the expiration of that period the appointment may be confirmed by the Commissioners, provided that the probationer whilst in the service of the Commissioners has demonstrated his fitness for permanent appointment by good conduct, industry, and capacity as ascertained by the results of such examinations and practical tests that may be imposed. No probationer, however, shall have his appointment confirmed until he has (unless otherwise exempted by the Commissioners) effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Commissioners.

29. Every appointment shall be made on the distinct understanding that the services of the employee shall without previous notice be liable to be dispensed with either during or after the period of probation, or, in the case of an Engineering or Architectural Pupil undergoing a course of study at the Melbourne University, or of an Apprentice, either during or after the period of pupillage or apprenticeship, as the case may be, and without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

30. Every Apprentice, unless specifically excepted, shall, immediately after appointment, attend such Departmental or other instructional classes as the Commissioners may direct at such hours of the day and night as may be prescribed during the complete course of training, which shall extend over the period prescribed in Clauses 33 and 34.

31. Every Apprentice shall provide the books, drawing instruments, &c., required at the classes of instruction at his own expense, but the Commissioners will either provide instruction free of charge or pay any necessary fees, as well as the wages of the Apprentice for such portion of the ordinary hours of duty as he may be required to be in attendance at the classes of instruction.

32. Every Apprentice shall present himself for such examinations as may be prescribed for the particular trade, and shall pass in proper sequence the examinations for each year of such course, and, in addition, shall do satisfactory work and be of good conduct in the service of the Commissioners.

33. Every such Apprentice will be allowed a maximum period of three years in which to complete the course of instruction prescribed for the first and second years of apprenticeship; but no Apprentice will be eligible to undergo the third-year course unless he has satisfactorily completed the first and second year courses within the period covered by the first three years of his apprenticeship.

34. Any Apprentice who, after having undergone the third-year course of instruction, fails to pass the prescribed qualifying examination for that year will not be allowed to repeat such course either at the expense of the Department or in his ordinary hours of duty, nor will he be eligible to compete for the Scholarship referred to in Clause 38.

35. Any Apprentice who fails to make satisfactory progress at the classes of instruction may be called upon to attend, at his own expense and in his own time, such additional night classes as may be deemed necessary by the Commissioners.

36. Any Apprentice who is adjudged guilty of frequent or repeated misconduct at the classes of instruction or to have neglected to have made a proper effort to qualify in his work as an Apprentice will render himself liable to the immediate determination of his service, and shall not have any claim if at any time his service be so determined.

37. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal, and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the Apprentices who each year of the period of tuition may be adjudged highest in order of merit and as possessing the highest qualifications amongst all Apprentices who are pursuing for the first time the course applicable to the particular year, shall be awarded the prizes applicable to their particular trades if so entitled, as specified in the public notice, provided that they obtain not less than 75 per cent. of the possible marks.

38. The three Apprentices who, at the end of the third year of tuition, are adjudged highest in order of merit amongst all Apprentices eligible under the conditions specified in the public notice, shall be nominated as students in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering (as may be determined by the Commissioners), and afforded facilities to attend for three years the full day course at either the Working Men's College or other such Institution as may be determined by the Commissioners, and any such Apprentice who passes the prescribed examination and gains a diploma of the College or other such Institution, as the case may be, in respect thereof, shall thereafter be employed by the Commissioners as an Engineering Assistant. During such course of three years the fees of the College or other

such Institution will be paid by the Commissioners, and in lieu of wages the Apprentice shall be paid an annual salary in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being; and every such Apprentice who is appointed as an Engineering Assistant will be required to agree in writing to remain thereafter in the service of the Commissioners (provided his services are required) for a period of at least three years, or alternatively, in the event of his earlier resignation to refund all fees paid and expense incurred by the Commissioners for the purpose of his tuition.

39. The term of apprenticeship shall extend over the period of years specified in the public notice for the particular trade, and each year thereof shall be deemed to mean three hundred and thirteen (313) working days, and shall be inclusive of any proclaimed holidays on which the Workshops may be closed, and any annual recreation leave of absence, as well as any other leave of absence which may be allowed for any cause whatsoever, provided that such other leave of absence does not during the prescribed term of apprenticeship, exceed the aggregate of thirteen (13) working days per annum for each year of such prescribed term of apprenticeship.

In the event, however, of such other leave of absence to any apprentice exceeding such aggregate of 13 days per annum for each year of the prescribed term of apprenticeship, the term of his apprenticeship shall be extended for a period equivalent to the period of such excess leave of absence.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF EILDON WEIR PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1915*, the Trustees of Eildon Weir Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees thereof who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

8. The hours for burial shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate, or a Justice of the Peace, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day, and on payment of the special fee as provided.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

11. No private grave shall be reopened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Nunawading doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

*The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.*COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.  
(Part V.—Division 14.)*How Votes to be Marked by Voter.*

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

*Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.*

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

*Invalid Ballot-papers.*

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

*Ballot-papers Not Invalid.*

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to accord to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

*Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.*

295. The returning officer (for the Riding) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

*Procedure where only Two Candidates.*

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Procedure where more than Two Candidates.*

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each Riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
  - (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
  - (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
  - (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
  - (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.
- (2) Each deputy returning officer shall—
- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.
- (3) The returning officer shall—
- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole Riding the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.
- (5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

*Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.*

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

*Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.*

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

*Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.*

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

*Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.*

- (12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—
- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
  - (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.*

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

*Deposit Moneys.*

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

*Voting by Post.*

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

**REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.**

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the Shire of Nunawading of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Trades (Occupational Illnesses Notification) Regulations 1923 and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Every medical practitioner who becomes aware that any person visited or professionally attended by him is suffering from any of the illnesses specified in the 1st Schedule hereto shall forthwith send notification of the fact in the form in the 2nd Schedule hereto to the Chief Health Officer.

Every person guilty of any offence against these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £20.

And the Honorable Stanley Seymour Argyle, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATION AMENDED.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Education Act 1915*, doth hereby amend clauses 31, 32, 33, 34, 36, 40, 41, 42, and 43 of Regulation XXI. to read as follow:—

## FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

31. There shall be awarded annually 75 free places, or any less number, at the University of Melbourne, of which—

- (a) Twenty shall be open to applicants in attendance at district high schools, technical schools, or registered secondary schools, and shall be tenable for the full length of a course for a degree, diploma, or licence in agriculture, metallurgy, mining, or veterinary science;
- (b) fifty shall be open to applicants in attendance at district high schools, technical schools, or registered secondary schools, and shall be tenable for the full length of a course for any degree, diploma, or licence;
- (c) five shall be open to persons (other than teachers in the Education Department) in the employment of the Government of Victoria, and shall be tenable for the full length of a course for any degree, diploma, or licence.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Regulation, ten of the free places to be awarded under sub-clause (b) of this clause from the beginning of 1924 may be awarded to students attending the University of Melbourne who have been in attendance thereat for not more than two years, and such awards shall be determined in the manner prescribed in clause 33 (d) below.

32. (a) Holders of free places shall be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the subjects of their course.

(b) The free places shall be tenable under the conditions prescribed in clause 10 above.

(c) On the recommendation of the Professional Board, the Director may grant permission to the holder of a free place under clause 31 (b) or (c) above to change the course on which he has entered at the University of Melbourne, but the period for which the free place is tenable under the course originally selected shall not be thereby extended.

(d) Every person awarded a free place under clause 31 (a) above will require to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety that he will not transfer to any other course at the University of Melbourne without the approval of the Minister, and also that, in the event of such approval being granted, he will repay to the Minister all allowances which he has received, and will pay to the University of Melbourne all fees the benefits of which he has received as a result of the award of such free place.

(e) Every person awarded a free place under clause 31 (c) above will be required to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety that he will continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the four years next after the termination of his free place.

33. (a) Applications for free places must be made on a prescribed form before the first day of December in each year, provided, however, that applications for the free places to be awarded from the beginning of 1924 shall be receivable up to the 20th January, 1924.

(b) Each applicant must be qualified for matriculation and for admission to the course upon which he desires to enter at the University of Melbourne.

(c) The free places shall be awarded on the recommendation of a Board appointed for the purpose by the Minister, and those under clause 31 (a) and (b) above shall be divided amongst applicants in attendance at district high schools, technical schools, and registered secondary schools in such proportions as the Director, with the approval of the Minister, shall from time to time determine.

(d) The awards of the free places under clause 31 (a) and (b) above to applicants in attendance at district high schools and registered secondary schools and of those under clause 31 (c) above shall be based on the age and suitability of the applicants and on their school records as determined by the following:—

(i) For each subject passed at the School Intermediate Certificate examination—1 point.

(ii) For each subject passed at the School Leaving examination—2 points.

(iii) For each subject in which honours are obtained at the School Leaving certificate examination—

3rd-class honours—3 points;  
2nd-class honours—4 points;  
1st-class honours—6 points;

one point extra being allotted in each case where the exhibition in the subject is gained.

(iv) Points will be allotted for other examinations passed on a basis of equivalence to be determined by the Board.

(e) The awards of the free places to applicants in attendance at technical schools shall be based on the age and suitability of the applicants and on their school records in such manner as the Board may determine.

(f) Applicants for free places under clause 31 (c) above must be recommended by the permanent head of the Department in which they are employed.

34. The Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it in any special case, grant an allowance for maintenance up to £26 per annum to holders of free places under clause 31 (a) above and up to £50 per annum to holders of free places under clause 31 (b) above.

36. Except as provided in clause 31 above, no scholarship under clause 1, 7, 12, or 17 above and no free place under clause 31 (a) and (b) above shall be awarded to any candidate or applicant who, during the two years immediately preceding the first day of January in the year in which the scholarship or free place is awarded, has not been in continuous and regular attendance at a school in Victoria; but candidates or applicants who have not resided in Victoria for a period of two years may be granted permission to compete in the division or subdivision in which the school they have attended is placed.

40. (a) Payments of allowances will be made quarterly with the exception of those mentioned in clauses 21 and 38 (a) above, which will be made to the head teacher at the beginning of the school year. All payments and all awards of scholarships and free places by the Minister will be conditional on moneys being placed at his disposal by the Legislature.

(b) Applications for the Minister's approval of the allowance mentioned in clause 34 or 39 above must be made on a prescribed form and must be forwarded early in each year.

41. The Minister may at any time cancel any scholarship or free place if he is satisfied—

(a) That the prescribed conditions of tenure are not complied with; or

(b) that the conduct of any holder has been idle, unbecoming, disorderly, or immoral; or

(c) that the parents of any holder are not natural-born or naturalized British subjects;

and, thereupon, all advantages and allowances connected with such scholarship or free place shall cease and determine.

42. On the production of satisfactory evidence, any holder of a scholarship or of a free place may, on the certificate of the Director, have his scholarship or free place suspended by the Minister for a period up to one year, and, if necessary, for a further period.

43. (a) The holder of a scholarship cannot at the same time hold and enjoy any other scholarship or a free place granted under this Regulation.

(b) The holder of a free place cannot at the same time hold and enjoy any other free place or a scholarship granted under this Regulation.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the application of the Colac Waterworks Trust for the proclamation of a sewerage district and for the constitution of a Sewerage Authority to carry out works for the sewerage of the Township of Colac for the purposes of the said Acts, and doth order and appoint as follows:—

(a) That the amount of money to be borrowed by such Sewerage Authority shall be Two thousand pounds (£2,000), for detail survey, revised estimates, and report on scheme.

(b) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Sewerage Authority shall consist of reticulation and branch sewers, main sewers, pumping plant and rising main, works for treatment and for the discharge of the purified effluent into Lake Colac.

(c) That the limits of the land within which the said Sewerage Authority shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at a point being the intersection of the western boundary of the Township of Colac with the southern shore of Lake Colac; thence southerly along the said western boundary of the Township of Colac to the south-western angle of the said township; thence easterly along the southern boundary of the said township to its south-eastern angle; thence northerly, westerly, and northerly along the eastern boundary of the said township to the north-western angle of allotment 1, section XXX., Parish of Irrewarra; thence easterly along the northern boundary of the said allotment 1 to the western boundary of the railway reserve along the Geelong-Colac railway line; thence north-easterly along the said western boundary of the railway reserve to the northern boundary of allotment 4, section XXX., Parish of Irrewarra; thence westerly along the said northern boundary of the said allotment 4 to the shore of Lake Colac; thence westerly along the southern shore of Lake Colac to the point of commencement—all of which boundaries are as shown on an Order in Council plan approved by the Governor in Council and deposited in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne.

(d) That the members of the Colac Waterworks Trust for the time being shall be the Sewerage Authority.

(e) That the name of the authority shall be the Colac Sewerage Authority.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in accordance with the provisions of section 37 (1) (e) of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Act 1918* (No. 2995), as amended by section 7 of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Act 1920* (No. 3074), doth hereby approve of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board constructing a Tramway Turnout and Siding in Mount Alexander-road, Ascot Vale, for providing

a permanent entrance for rolling-stock entering the proposed new depôt, and also for providing temporary storage siding for extra cars engaged on Royal Show and Cup race traffic, and for the more efficient operation of the tramway undertakings of the Board.

## ROUTE.

That the route of the said tramway turnout and siding in Mount Alexander-road shall be as shown on plan referred to in this Order.

## GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway turnout and siding shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plan and specifications numbered from 1 to 2 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plan and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plan and specifications so deposited as the plan and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plan and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

## NECESSARY PRECAUTION FOR SAFETY OF PASSENGERS AND PUBLIC TO BE OBSERVED.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Board. **CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.**

1. As the exact quantity of firewood or charcoal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must, with the exception of box blocks, be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. Box blocks must be the best of their kind, dry, and perfectly sound. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department. Charcoal must be of the very best description for the purpose for which it is required, and subject to approval of the officer ordering.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood or charcoal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood or charcoal at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office.

5. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width of the length of the firewood specified in the various schedules, with space between stacks for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. Firewood for the Yarra Bend need not be stacked, but must be weighed on the Asylum weighbridge.

6. The acceptance of the firewood or charcoal shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named by him. If after the delivery of the firewood or charcoal has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood or charcoal may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the article so rejected or returned.

7. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood or charcoal as to the quality, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

9. If the board shall decide that the firewood or charcoal is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 3.

10. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such firewood or charcoal as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood or charcoal, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. ## SHIRE OF DONCASTER.

## WATER RATE.

THE Council, by virtue of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* thereto enabling it, doth by special order make and levy a Water Rate as follows:—

1. For all water supplied by measure within the said Shire of Doncaster, a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons; and a similar charge per thousand gallons for all water supplied to any and all rateable property, lands, and tenements in excess of the minimum quantity to be charged as hereinafter mentioned. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement in respect of any property, lands, and tenements within the Shire of Doncaster shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per thousand gallons, will produce an amount equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. Such rate shall in the first year be made upon the persons who would be liable to be rated in respect of the properties, lands, and tenements included therein if such rate was a general rate.

5. Every such rate shall continue to be payable in every subsequent year, without any further order, and the rate for each successive year shall be deemed to be made on the persons who on the first day of each of such successive periods of one year would be liable to be rated in respect of such properties, lands, or tenements if such rate was a general rate.

6. Every such rate shall in each year be levied upon, and recoverable from, the same persons as if such rate was a series of general rates made for successive periods of one year, commencing from the day on which such rate was made.

7. Save when it is herein or in any law, regulation, or condition aforesaid otherwise expressly provided, or there is something in the context repugnant thereto, all the provisions of the *Local Government Acts* relating to rates shall apply to every such water rate.

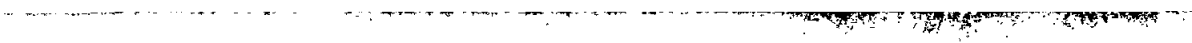
