RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924 WITHIN THE KILMORE URBAN DISTRICT.

THE Commissioners of the Kilmore Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rate for one year from the 1st January, 1924, payable in two moieties, on the 1st January, 1924, and the 1st July, 1924. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, within the Urban District of Kilmore, as such district was proclaimed and defined on the 30th January, 1894:—

On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and under, the sum of Twenty-five shillings.

On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds, One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the municipal valuation.

On every house which has been unoccupied for twelve months or more, the owner, by making a written application to the Trust, may have the rate reduced by one-half.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land supplied with water, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and under, the sum of Fifteen shillings.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land supplied with water, above the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds, One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the municipal valuation.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land containing one acre or under not supplied with water, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land of a greater area than one acre not supplied with water, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence.

The owner of every piece of vacant or unoccupied land supplied with water must provide a trough with approved self-acting ball-tap to prevent overflow.

The charges for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1924, from the works of the Trust shall be as follows:—

1. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such boiler.
2. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (a) The quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The following rates are those which all occupiers or owners of land or tenements situated in reticulated/streets within the Urban District of the above Trust shall pay in respect of the year 1924:—

1. (a) For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds (£13) annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings.
- (b) For every house or tenement of more than Thirteen pounds (£13) annual municipal valuation, a rate of Two shillings and fourpence in the pound sterling on the amount of such municipal valuation.
2. For each vacant allotment or piece of land facing a street wherein a water main is laid (rated for the ordinary municipal rates separately from any building), a rate of Two shillings and fourpence in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of same.
3. Such rates shall be for the period commencing on the first of January and ending on the thirty-first of December, 1924, and shall be due and payable in two equal instalments, and each half of such instalment shall be due respectively on the 1st of January and the 1st of July in the year 1924.
4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby duly authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rate.

MORTLAKE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1924.

THE Commissioners of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust do hereby, under the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law to deal with the rateable property within the Mortlake Waterworks District of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust, and with the minimum charges, and the charges for the sale of water from the works of the Trust:—

- (1) For every house, including not more than $\frac{1}{4}$ acre of land, and of annual municipal value of £20 and under, the maximum charge shall be Thirty shillings.

- (2) For every house, &c., of annual municipal value of £21 to £60 inclusive, a rate of Two shillings in the £ shall be paid, and any such properties exceeding £60 annual municipal value, shall pay a rate of One shilling in the £ for every £ over and above £60 annual valuation.

- (3) All shops and places of business, with an annual municipal value below £20, shall be rated at Two shillings in the £.

- (4) Land adjoining house properties of value not exceeding £20, shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for each $\frac{1}{4}$ acre over and above the $\frac{1}{4}$ acre allowed with the house, up to a maximum of Ten shillings.

- (5) Detached allotments shall be charged for as follows:—Not exceeding $\frac{1}{4}$ acre, Five shillings; not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ acre, Seven shillings and sixpence; not exceeding 1 acre, Ten shillings; not exceeding $1\frac{1}{2}$ acres, Twelve shillings and sixpence; not exceeding 2 acres, Fifteen shillings; and if more than 2 acres, Twenty shillings.

- (6) The charge for water supplied by the Trust, by measurement, except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust, shall be One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

- (7) For water supplied to public buildings, and other similar properties, the charge shall be as follows:—Police Station, State School, Post Office, Railway Station, and Stationmaster's Residence, £2. Mechanics' Institute and Recreation Reserve, £1 10s. Masonic Hall and Temperance Hall, £1 per annum. The water for church and Sunday school grounds shall not be charged for.

- (8) For every public water trough, with or without stand-pipe, the charge shall be £4 per annum.

- (9) The Trust may, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier, using water for domestic or other purposes, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide and fix a meter within 21 days after the sending of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, and at his own expense, provide and fix an approved meter, failing which the property shall be disconnected until such meter is installed.

- (10) Provided that where any person desires to have the service pipe of the Trust extended to his property, and is willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have the power to make a special arrangement with him regarding the payment of the water supplied.

- (11) In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

- (12) In the event of any dispute which may arise regarding the charge made by the Trust, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special charge.

- (13) The beforementioned rates and charges shall be payable in advance on the first day of February, 1924, except in the cases of water supplied by measure, the charges for which shall be annual and payable on the first day of December in each year.

- (14) For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge of 1s. for every 200 gallons or under.

- (15) Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

In the construction of this By-law, the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word Trust shall mean the Mortlake Waterworks Trust.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE AMHERST PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act* 1915, the Trustees of the Amherst Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

8. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the officer of health of the district, or by a police magistrate, or justice of the peace that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day, and on payment of the special fee as provided.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to con-

struct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

11. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purpose therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof; doth by this Order revoke paragraph 7 of sub-clause (f) (Stairs and Landings) of clause 7 of Chapter 1 of the Regulations made on the twentieth day of February, 1923, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

(1) A width of stairway, not less than 2 ft. 8 in., where not more than 25 persons are employed; 3 ft. 4 in. where more than 25 persons and not more than 100 persons are employed. Where more than 100 persons are employed the width of stairs shall be increased 20 inches for every extra 100 or fraction of 100 persons.

The number of employees allowed by the administrators for any factory shall not be more than can be accommodated by either the primary or the alternative escape taken separately, but for a factory with two or more external or fire-isolated stairways the number of employees allowed may be equal to the number that can be accommodated by such stairways taken together.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Deposits must be in bank notes, or bank drafts payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application; such deposit will be forfeited in the event of the tenderer, after the time fixed for the closing of tenders, withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender, or of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

8. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

3. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall if required by the Government bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

4. Except where otherwise stated in the schedules, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

5. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

6. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office.

If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Clause 8.

13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of Clauses 15 and 16 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor upon report from the Tender Board to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

14. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned, on a legibly written business label.

15. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Commonwealth departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 16. BY-LAW No. 32.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Braybrook, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the River and Railway Ridings of the Shire of Braybrook.

4. The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the River and Railway Ridings of the Shire of Braybrook shall provide and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of non-absorbent material, and shall cause all house refuse, rubbish, or garbage produced or accumulated in and about such house, building, or premises to be from time to time deposited in such receptacle or receptacles.

5. Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.

6. Once a week, on such day in each week as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building, or premises, such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed close to the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the Council.

7. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.

8. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than five pounds.
