 (5) Detached allotments shall be charged for as follows:—Not exceeding 1 acre, Five shillings; not exceeding 2 acre, Seven shillings and sixpence; not exceeding 1 acre, Ten shillings; not exceeding 1 acres, Twelve shillings and sixpence; not exceeding 2 acres, Fifteen shillings; and if more than 2 acres, Twenty shillings.

 (6) The charge for water supplied by the Trust, by measurement, except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust, shall be One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

 (7) For water supplied to public buildings, and other
- (7) For water supplied to public buildings, and other similar properties, the charge shall be as follows:—Police Station, State School, Post Office, Railway Station, and Stationmaster's Residence, £2. Mechanics' Institute and Recreation Reserve, £1 10s. Masonic Hall and Temperance Hall, £1 per annum. The water for church and Sunday school grounds shall not be charged for.
- (8) For every public water trough, with or without stand-pipe, the charge shall be £4 per annum.
- pipe, the charge shall be £4 per annum.

 (9) The Trust may, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier, using water for domestic or other purposes, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide and fix a meter within 21 days after the sending of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, and at his own expense, provide and fix an approved meter, failing which the property shall be disconnected until such meter is installed.
- such meter is installed.

 (10) Provided that where any person desires to have the service pipe of the Trust extended to his property, and is willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have the power to make a special arrangement with him regarding the payment of the water supplied.

 (11) In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.
- (12) In the event of any dispute which may arise regarding the charge made by the Trust, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (13) The beforementioned rates and charges shall be payable in advance on the first day of February, 1924, except in the cases of water supplied by measure, the charges for which shall be annual and payable on the first day of December in each year.
- (14) For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge of 1s. for every 200 gallons or under.
- (15) Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

In the construction of this By-law, the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word Trust shall mean the Mortlake gate or sole, and Waterworks Trust.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE AMHERST PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1915, the Trustees of the Amherst Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

- 1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
- 2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- made or orders are given.

 3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

 4. Any person desiring to construct a vault. grave. tomb-
- 4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.
- 5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

- to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

 6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

 7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

 8. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the officer of health of the district, or by a police magistrate, or justice of the peace that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day, and on payment of the special fee as provided.

 9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.
- 10. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to con-

struct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or, iron, securely cemented.

- 11. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.
- 12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cometery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.
- 13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.
- 14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the Government Gazette, from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purpose therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order revoke paragraph 7 of sub-clause (f) (Stairs and Landings) of clause 7 of Chapter 1 of the Regulations made on the twentieth day of February, 1923, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

(1) A width of stairway, not less than 2 ft. 8 in., where not more than 25 persons are employed; 3 ft. 4 in. where more than 25 persons and not more than 100 persons are employed. Where more than 100 persons are employed the width of stairs shall be increased 20 inches for every extra 100 or fraction of 100 persons.

The number of employees allowed by the administrators for any factory shall not be more than can be accommodated by either the primary or the alternative escape taken separately, but for a factory with two or more external or fire-isolated stairways the number of employees allowed may be equal to the number that can be accommodated by such stairways taken together.

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station tendered for, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for. Deposits must be in bank notes, or bank drafts payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application; such deposit will be forfeited in the event of the tenderer, after the time-fixed for the cloving of tenders, withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender, or of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.
- 2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new statione be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.

Once a week, on such day in each week as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building, or premises, such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacies to be placed close to the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacies may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the Council. in that behalf by the Council.
