ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to provide for the Performance and Execution of the Powers Authorities and Duties of the Master-in-Lunacy by the Master-in-Equity and for other purposes."

"An Act relating to the Surplus Revenue of the Financial Year ended on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three."

"An Act relating to Municipal Endowment."

"An Act to amend the *Treasury Bills and Advances Act 1922*."

"An Act to authorize the Raising of Money for Railways."

"An Act to sanction the Issue and Application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts for Railways and for other purposes."

"An Act to sanction the Issue and Application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts for Irrigation Works Water Supply Works Drainage and Flood Protection Works in Country Districts and for Works under the River Murray Waters Acts and for other purposes."

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million two hundred and ninety-four thousand three hundred and sixty-four pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four."

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924.

Fixed by the Commissioners in accordance with the powers conferred on them under the Water Acts.

THE following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1924 in respect of water supplied to them by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. Upon all rateable property except vacant allotments of the annual municipal value of £15 and under, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).
2. Upon all rateable property except vacant allotments of the annual municipal value of £16 and upwards, Two shillings (2s.) in the £1 shall be paid.
3. The rate to be paid in respect to vacant lands shall be 2s. in the £1, according to municipal valuation, provided that in no case the rate shall be less than One pound (£1) per annum.
4. For water supplied to public troughs, a charge of £2 per annum shall be paid.
5. The water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid for by meter or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and persons requiring such supply may agree to adopt.
6. For water supplied by meter a charge of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made; provided that no person shall pay an amount other than that based upon 2s. in the £1 on the municipal valuation, or less than the minimum rate; any quantity over the foregoing amounts to be charged in excess.
7. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1924.
8. Water must not be used for other than strictly household purposes during the hours of 12 noon and 8 p.m. on Sundays during the months of January, February, March, October, November, and December.

For the purpose of conserving the water supply during dry weather the Trust in its discretion may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

Such persons as the Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges, and enforce regulations.

GISBORNE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924.

The Commissioners of the Gisborne Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an urban district, do hereby and in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by Water Acts make the following By-law:—

THE following rates are those which occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1924 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust District:—

A rate of One shilling and fourpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable properties in the District according to the municipal valuations of such properties, and shall be paid in equal moieties on the 1st day of January, 1924, and the 1st day of July, 1924.

A minimum rate of Twenty shillings shall be paid on all properties valued at £4 sterling and over, and a minimum rate of Ten shillings shall be paid on all allotments of land on which there is no building, and valued at £3 sterling and under.

All water supplied by the Trust for domestic use and for other than domestic use shall be charged for by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust).

Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon.

The minimum quantity to be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons shall be the quantity which would be equal to the amount of assessed rate payable for such premises so supplied. Water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Hamilton Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:—

BY-LAW No. 21.

THE following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated or other persons shall pay for the year 1924 in respect of water supplied by the Trust in the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or other tenement fronting any street wherein the water-pipes of the Trust have been laid, and not being occupied land, a rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such house or other tenement, and the land (if any) valued therewith shall be paid; the minimum amount to be so paid to be Twenty shillings. In cases where water is supplied to land upon which there is no building, the rate shall be Two shillings in the pound, according to the municipal valuation of such land. In no case, however, shall a rate of less than Ten shillings (10s.) be paid.
2. For land upon which there is no building, and to which water is not laid on, but which land fronts any street wherein water-pipes of the Trust have been laid, the rate shall be Two shillings (2s.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation thereof. In no case, however, shall a rate of less than Ten shillings be paid.
3. For houses proved to the satisfaction of the Trust to have remained unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, the rate per house shall be two-thirds of the amount which would be payable (half-yearly in advance) if such house had not been so unoccupied, but in no case shall the rate be less than Thirteen shillings.
4. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety on the 1st January, 1924, and one moiety on the 1st July, 1924.
5. For water supplied for domestic or other than domestic purposes by the Trust by measure, the charge shall (except where otherwise agreed by the Trust, and save as hereinafter provided in the By-law), be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons up to such quantity as would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable in respect of the premises so supplied; and for all water consumed in excess of such quantity a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made.
6. The charge for private water troughs shall be Twenty shillings per annum (to include water rate payable when the value of the property on which such trough is situated does not exceed Ten pounds). When such rate exceeds Ten pounds there shall be no charge additional to the rate assessed on the property except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter is necessary or advisable, in which case the consumer will be charged and must pay at the rate charged for water supplied by measure. The minimum charge will be Twenty shillings.
7. Water supplied to public gardens and parks shall be charged for by measurement at Sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and water supplied to show grounds, old cricket ground, and bowling green shall be charged for by measurement at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; any quantity supplied in excess of the full measure of a unit of a 1,000 gallons shall be charged for as 1,000 gallons. All water so supplied must be through a meter and paid for half-yearly.

8. The charge for water supplied from any stand-pipe, or hydrant shall be Sixpence for any quantity up to 200 gallons, and Sixpence for each additional 200 gallons or portion of 200 gallons.

9. For the supply of water during the erection of a new building or alterations to or additions to existing buildings the charge shall be, for a stone or brick building, Five shillings per centum, on the cost of the stone or brick building, including plastering, or the same shall be fixed by agreement with the Trust. For the supply of water for the erection of a wooden building with plastered walls, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence for each room or passage, and Five shillings for each chimney. For a supply of water for wooden buildings where no plaster is used, the charge shall be Five shillings for each chimney in such building. All payments shall be made in advance. No person shall take or use any water for or in connexion with the erection of any new buildings or alterations to or additions to existing buildings till he has obtained the receipt of the Trust's officer for payment of the amount payable for the use of such water or the consent in writing of the Trust or its officer. Any persons offending against the provisions thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence. All charges shall be additional to all rates or other charges payable by the owner or occupier of the premises upon which the building is being erected, and shall in the first instance be payable by the builder or contractor, and if unpaid by the builder or contractor shall be charged to and paid by the owner of the premises whereon such building is being erected, but such charge to the owner shall not prejudice the right of the Trust to proceed at its option against either the builder or contractor or the owner or occupier for the amount payable.

10. The occupier of two or more tenements liable to be rated, one of which is supplied with water by measure, shall be entitled, on the payments of the rates of such tenements respectively, to use without further charge such a quantity of water by meter as shall not exceed at the current charge for water supplied for domestic purposes by measure to amount of such rates; provided that the tenement or tenements, if not supplied by measure, shall not be connected with the pipes of the Trust. The occupier of two or more tenements, each of which is supplied with water by measure, shall be entitled to use without further charge such a quantity of water at either or both such tenements as shall not exceed at the current charge for water supplied for domestic purposes by measure (the amount of such rates) the total amount at which such tenements, if not supplied by measure, would be rated.

11. The water used or supplied for gas engines, oil engines, and steam boilers, the charge shall be by measure; the minimum amount to be charged and paid shall be Twenty shillings, to be paid and payable in advance in each case. No water shall be supplied to any such engine or boiler until a meter shall have been affixed to the supply pipe of such engine or boiler to the satisfaction of the Engineer of the Trust, and no water will be supplied to any engine unless such engine is fitted with mechanical appliances to circulate and re-use the water to the satisfaction of the Trust's officer.

12. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly in each case where water is supplied by measure other than domestic purposes shall (except where otherwise provided or implied in this By-law) may be 10,000 gallons, and such water shall (where it is not otherwise provided herein in this By-law or otherwise specially agreed by the Trust) be charged at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

13. Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein are to be paid for at such charges as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payments appointed by the Trust on account of such charge shall be made at the office of the Trust before a supply shall be taken or used.

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Hamilton Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the rates and charges aforesaid and each of them.

15. In construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Hamilton Waterworks Trust."

4. Such before-mentioned rates and charges shall be based on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Glenlyon for the time being, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1924.

5. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Highburn Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

When the water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charges shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during the year ending the 31st of December shall be 10,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand of the Trust.

The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

In all cases not herein provided for the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

The service pipes from the main, being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service pipes, the owner or occupier shall, in every instance in which damage is caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be guilty of an offence.

If any person neglect to repair any such service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from the proper officer of the Trust that such service pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise, as the Trust may see fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected.

The Trust may, at any time, when found necessary, repair or renew any pipes and stop-cocks laid for conveying a supply of water to any tenement, and may charge the owner thereof with the cost or expense of providing and laying, repairing, or renewing the same, and such cost and expense shall be a debt due by such owner to the Trust, and shall be recovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of March, 1924.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

Water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes during January, February, March, November, and December shall be charged for by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), and the minimum quantity to be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons shall be the quantity which would be equal to the amount of assessed rate payable for such premises so supplied. Water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged for at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS by section 31, sub-section (a) of the Dairy Supervision Act 1915, the Governor in Council is empowered, on the application of the Council of any municipal district, whether wholly or partly within a Milk Area or not, if approved by the Minister, to prohibit any person keeping, grazing, or milking cows on any part or parts, or in any part, of such area or district: And whereas the Council of the municipal district of the City of Coburg has made application to prohibit any person keeping, grazing, or milking cows on certain specified areas: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Order prohibit the keeping, grazing, or milking of cows on any part of the area of the said municipal district specified hereunder:—

(a) All that land included within the area commencing at the intersection of Moreland-road and Nicholson-street; thence proceeding northerly along the centre of Nicholson-street to the intersection of Bell and Nicholson streets; thence proceeding westerly along the centre of Bell-street to Drummond-street; thence northerly along Drummond-street to Urquhart-street; thence westerly along Urquhart-street to Sydney-road; thence northerly along the eastern building line of Sydney-road and Champ-street to Gaffney-street; thence westerly along the centre of Gaffney-street to Kerford-street; thence southerly along the centre of Kerford-street to O'Hea-street; thence easterly along the centre of O'Hea-street to High-street; thence southerly along the centre of High-street to Bell-street; thence westerly along the centre of Bell-street to Kelson-street; thence southerly along the centre of Kelson-street to Munro-street; thence easterly along Munro-street to the western boundary of allotment No. 1, Anketell Estate; thence southerly to right-of-way forming western boundary of the Anketell Estate; thence further southerly along this right-of-way to Berry-street; thence easterly along the centre of Berry-street to Deakin-street; thence southerly along the centre of Deakin-street to Reynard-street; thence westerly along the centre of Reynard-street to Donne-street; thence southerly along the centre of Donne-street to Moreland-road; thence easterly along the centre of Moreland-road to the commencing point.

Factories and Shops Acts,

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 12 (FUEL AND FODDER).

NOTE.—This Determination on the 15th December, 1923, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong-West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

On the 10th September, 1913, this Board was deprived of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in any business or occupation connected with the sale or distribution of coal or coke by any—

- (a) coal importer,
- (b) coal mine owner,
- (c) gas company;

and such power was conferred exclusively on the Coal and Coke Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (a) employed in the business of a hay, corn, or chaff dealer;
- (b) employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with the business of a hay, corn, or chaff dealer;
- (c) employed in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of wood, coal, or coke,"

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 15th day of December, 1923, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
