1. The following areas within the municipal district of the city of Coburg are hereby declared to be populous and residential areas:—

All that area within the following boundaries: Commencing at a point being the centre of the intersection of Moreland-road and Nicholson-street; thence proceeding northerly along the centre of Nicholson-street to the intersection of Bell and Nicholson streets; thence westerly along the centre of Bell-street to the intersection of Drummond-street; thence northerly along Drummond-street to Urquhart-street; thence westerly along Urquhart-street to Sydney-road; thence northerly along the eastern building line of Sydney-road and Champ-street to Gaffney-street; thence westerly along the centre of Gaffney-street to Kerford-street; thence southerly along the centre of Kerford-street to O'Hea-street; thence easterly along the centre of O'Hea-street to High-street; thence southerly along the centre of High-street to Bell-street; thence westerly along Bell-street to Kelson-street; thence southerly along the centre of Kelson-street to Munro-street; thence easterly along Munro-street to western boundary of allotment No. 1, Anketell Estate; thence southerly to right-of-way forming western boundary of the Anketell Estate; thence further southerly along the centre of this right-of-way to Berry-street; thence easterly along the centre of Berry-street to Denkin-street; thence southerly along the centre of Denkin-street to Reynard-street; thence westerly along the centre of Reynard-street to Donne-street; thence southerly along Donne-street to Moreland-road; thence easterly along the centre of Moreland-road to the commencing point.

All that area within the following boundaries: Commencing at Boundary-road at its intersection by the Coburg-Fawcner Railway; thence proceeding westerly along Boundary-road to intersection of Boundary-road and Galeka-street; thence southerly along Galeka-street to Short's-road; thence westerly along Short's-road to Pallett-street; thence southerly along Pallett-street to the southern boundary of lots 1 and 2, Short's-street; thence easterly along that boundary to the railway line; thence north-westerly along the railway line to the commencing point.

2. The temporary herding of cattle within the areas described in the preceding clause is hereby prohibited, and no persons being the owners or having the care, custody or control of any cattle shall permit, suffer or cause such cattle to be temporarily herded within the areas referred to.

3. Any persons who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding £20 or less than 20s. for each such breach.

4. Provided that nothing contained in this By-law shall prevent cattle being driven along or over Short's-road, North Coburg, for the purpose of transferring such stock from any portion of an area not hereby declared to be a populous area to any other portion of an area not hereby declared to be a populous area.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout those portions of the municipal district of the city of Coburg referred to in clause 1 hereof.
