THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW NO. 27 FOR MAKING AND LEVYING RATES.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements within The Ballarat Water Supply District:—

- (a) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) of the net annual value of £20 and under situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (b) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) above the net annual value of £20 and not exceeding £300 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
- (c) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 10s. per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
- (d) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
- (e) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (f) Of any warehouse or wholesale store used exclusively for such purposes situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £3 10s. per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such warehouse or wholesale store as aforesaid.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning on the first day of January, 1924, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1924, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1924, at the office of The Water Commissioners at Ballarat.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipalities in which such lands and tenements are situate in The Ballarat Water Supply District shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively.

4. For water supplied by the Commissioners for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Commissioners in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such persons as The Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

On every store or business place where two or more horses are kept, on all butchers' premises, and all bank premises, Two pounds sterling.

On all hotels, including attached stables and dwellings, Two pounds ten shillings sterling.

On all Government buildings, including quarters, Three pounds sterling.

In all the above cases water shall be for domestic purposes only.

For every boiler used to generate steam for milling or other industrial purposes, a charge of Ten pounds shall be made, the Council reserving the right to discontinue the supply when necessary to conserve a domestic supply for householders.

No person shall attach a hose to any tap or pipe for the purpose of watering gardens. Any person so using water without written permission from the Council will be liable to be prosecuted.

The above rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January, 1924, and such person as the Bet-Bet Shire Council may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the above said rates.

6. Steam-boilers, used only in the manufacture of sausage meat, at the rate of £1 10s. per annum.

7. Water from the stand-pipe, for every load of 400 gallons or less, 3d. per load.

8. Victorian railways, requiring water, a charge of 1s. per 1,000 gallons supplied by meter.

9. On all tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, a charge of 5s. per annum.

10. The rate shall be payable half-yearly in advance, namely, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1924, and the charges for the supply of water shall also be payable in like manner, or as may be demanded in the case of the service being by meter.

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers and owners of land and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District and liable to be rated,

shall pay for the year 1924, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates to be paid half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1924:—

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of Seventeen pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Thirty shillings.

2. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Seventeen pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of such valuation.

3. On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land, the sum of Ten shillings.

4. The following shall be the charge payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling for every 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case so supplied shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For a stand-pipe or hydrant water for each load of 250 gallons or under, One shilling.

(3) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Five shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the event of there not being any contract, Five shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

(4) All accounts for water supplied by measure or under special agreement shall be paid as agreed upon.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

III. For every house or tenement of Twenty-nine pounds and upwards annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound upon the annual municipal value of such property.

IV. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of Five shillings per thousand gallons shall be paid.

That the above rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance—first payment on the first day of January, 1924, and the second payment on the first day of July, 1924.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 25.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the Water Acts, and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District, make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1924 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Three shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be One pound sixteen shillings.
- (b) Occupied or unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be Five shillings.
- (c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (d) Occupied or unoccupied land where water is supplied from a stand-pipe shall be charged Sixpence for every 100 gallons.
- (e) For steam boilers, the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power for each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (f) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and preliminary payment must be made before a supply can be taken or used.
- (g) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or to make a special rate.
- (h) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourpence per 100 gallons equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land supplied, otherwise than by measure.
- (i) The rate hereby made shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1924.
- (j) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate and charges.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924.

By-law No. 20.

THE Commissioners of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law determining the rate payable for the year 1924 for water within the boundaries of the Cobram Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Fifteen pounds (£15) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Cobram Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1924.
2. The minimum rates for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Fifteen pounds (£15) sterling on the municipal value upon which are houses or tenements used wholly or partly as dwellings, shall be Thirty shillings (30s.).
3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land fronting Station-street; Queen-street, from Station-street to High-street; Main-street, from Station-street to High-street; Pont-road, from Station-street to High-street; Bank-street, from Pont-road to High-street; and High-street, from Queen-street to Pine-street—a minimum rate of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged.
4. On all other unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District, and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged.

5. On all unoccupied allotments or pieces of land not served with a water main, situated within half-a-mile of the Trust's stand-pipe, a minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) shall be charged.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made, payable yearly, in advance, on the first day of January, 1924.

7. Where, in the opinion of the Trust, it is necessary that a meter be affixed to the water pipe supplying any allotment, house, or tenement, the same may, in the discretion of the Commissioners, be supplied by the Trust, and the cost of same shall be repaid by the owner of such allotment, house, or tenement, but the Trust may submit such repayment to be made at the rate of Thirty-two shillings (32s.) yearly, payable by quarterly instalments, with interest added.

8. The Trust may require an approved meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any allotment, house, or tenement, in any case where it may deem necessary.

9. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.

10. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

11. For water supplied to bowling greens or other public or semi-public grounds the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

12. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Colac Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following By-law, viz:—

BY-LAW No. 16.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1924 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of £15 annual municipal value and under, the sum of £1 2s. 6d. (One pound two shillings and sixpence).
2. For every house and tenement of £16 annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 upon the annual municipal value of such property.
3. Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months commencing on the first day of January or the first day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Six pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Ten shillings sterling.
5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Seven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of One shilling and sixpence in the pound upon the annual municipal value of such property.
6. Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of 20s. per annum where the valuation of the property on which such trough is situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of 20s. will mean to include the rate of valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20 the trough to be exempt from rating purposes except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.
7. Water supplied to cricket, bowling, or tennis clubs and to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, show grounds, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement at 6d. (Sixpence) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 45,000 gallons per annum.
8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge for every 200 gallons or under of the sum of One shilling.
9. For a supply during the erection of new buildings, there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

10. Except hereinbefore otherwise provided, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and for water in excess of such minimum there shall be a charge of 9d. per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

11. Water supplied to market gardeners shall be charged for by measurement only.

12. For water supplied to botanic gardens, the charge shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through the meter.

13. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be £1; renewals, 5s.

14. Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipe of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supply so as to cover their outlay.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable yearly on the fourteenth day of July, 1924.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Colac Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Colac Waterworks Trust.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1924, No. 30.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon them by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law, viz.:-

A By-law for determining the rates which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the said Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements, if not in such streets, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes:-

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Twenty pounds (£20).

2. A minimum rate of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Twenty pounds (£20).

3. On each unoccupied or vacant allotment or piece of land, a rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound on the net annual value of such rateable property, provided that no such allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.).

4. Water to be supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for watering gardens, or for distribution otherwise on or about such premises shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the water rate assessment of such land or premises for the time being, provided that the said assessment shall be the minimum charge for the year 1924, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such amount aforesaid.

5. For all lands and tenements in the said Urban District situated otherwise than on streets on which the pipes of the water supply are laid and which lands and tenements are not supplied with water by the reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such lands and tenements are over a quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of a mile and within half ($\frac{1}{2}$) a mile thereof, a quarter of the before-mentioned rates. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Donald for the time being.

Such rates are hereby made for the year 1924, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1924, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1924, and shall be due and payable in advance on the 1st day of January, 1924.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

- (d) On market gardens supplied with water, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal annual valuation, with a minimum of Two pounds, or by measure, or by special agreement.
- (e) For water supplied by measure, the sum of One shilling per thousand gallons of water consumed—30,000 gallons to be the minimum quantity to be charged for under this section.

2. The rate hereby made shall be due and payable on the 10th day of December, 1923, at the Shire Office, Wedderburn.

3. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for and recover the said rates and charges.

4. Waste of water.—Any person supplied with water by the Council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

- (1) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement, being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement does not exceed the sum of Two hundred pounds, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement shall be paid. Provided that the said rate shall not in any case be less than the sum of Fifteen shillings per annum.
- (2) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement exceeds the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling, a rate of Eightpence in the pound

sterling for the first Two hundred pounds and Fourpence in the pound sterling for any amount over and above the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement, shall be paid.

- (3) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment, or vacant lot, the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings be charged.
- (4) For every township allotment on which there is a stock trough or any other facility for watering stock, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be paid.
- (5) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The foregoing rate for the year ending the 31st day of December, 1924, shall be due and payable in two equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1924.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rate.

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1924 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Kaniva, as such district has been proclaimed and defined.

(1) *Minimum*.—Every vacant allotment of land whether occupied or otherwise and being on the pipe line, 15s. per annum. Every vacant allotment of land within the Waterworks District and not being on the pipe line, 5s. per annum. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Fourteen pounds sterling annual value, the sum of Three pounds sterling per annum.

(2) *On Valuation above Minimum*.—For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile whether occupied or otherwise of Fourteen pounds sterling or more than Fourteen pounds annual value, an amount equal to 4s. 6d. in the pound on the amount of the valuation.

(3) *Special Rates*.—For all tenements whether occupied or otherwise in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down and which tenements whether occupied or otherwise are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements whether occupied or otherwise are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rate.

(4) *Minimum Meter Charge—Excess Meter Charge*.—Such owners as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of Three shillings and fourpence per One thousand gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment and at the rate of Three shillings per One thousand gallons for anything over that quantity.

(5) *Public Institutions and Others*.—Water, supplied to the Government Departments, charitable or other institutions and religious denominations, shall be by measure at Three shillings and fourpence per One thousand gallons, or by special agreement.

(6) *Irrigation*.—Water supplied exclusively for irrigation purposes to be paid for by measure in accordance with the charges fixed by this By-law.

(7) *Water Rate outside Trust's Area*.—Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of Three shillings and fourpence per One thousand gallons.

(9) *Water Troughs*.—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 4,000 gallons per annum at Two shillings and sixpence for Thousand gallons.

(10) *Interpretation Clause*.—In the construction of this By-law the word "Trust" shall mean the Lawloit Waterworks Trust—Urban District of Kaniwa, and "He" shall also mean "She."

(11) *Excess Payments*.—Where water meters are affixed the excess payment shall be made at the end of each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Period of Rate.—That the above-mentioned rate is made for one year commencing on the first day of January, 1924, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1924, and shall be payable in one moiety due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1924.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

(1). For every house and tenement of up to Eight (8) pounds annual municipal value, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.

(2). For every house and tenement of Eight (8) pounds and over annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound sterling.

(3). For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound sterling shall be paid up to One pound maximum.

(4). For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be

equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

(5). The Trust reserve the right of putting on a meter and supplying water by measure.

(6). For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain, such right not to be exercised between the hours of Nine p.m. and Six a.m. Any person who transgresses this provision or wastes or misuses the water of the Trust, or who shall permit or suffer water supplied by the Trust to run to waste, or interferes with any property vested in or controlled by the Trust, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

(7). For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

(8). For every water trough, a charge of Twenty (20) shillings shall be made; but on unoccupied lands, if the owner or occupier desires a trough, his rate of payment shall be reckoned part of that One pound (£1).

(9). For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

(10). For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge of Five (5) shillings per each stall shall be made.

(11). The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

(12). Provided that where persons within the Waterworks Trust District desire to have the service-pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extensions, the Trust shall have the power to make special arrangement with them regarding the payment for water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

(13). The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1924, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance or as may be agreed upon.

(14). Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

PYRAMID HILL WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make the following By-law :—

By-law determining the rate payable for the year 1924 for Water supplied within the boundaries of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust District.

1. A rate of Three shillings (3s.) in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property situated within the Waterworks District of the Pyramid Hill Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1924.

2. The minimum rate on any tenement used as a domicile shall be Two pounds five shillings (£2 5s.).

3. On all unoccupied allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be charged.

4. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains lucerne, sorghum, or other fodder crop without a permit from the Secretary of the Trust who shall, subject to the approval of the Trust, issue the same; the fee for such permit shall be Fifty shillings (£2 10s.) for each one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) or part of one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) of an acre to be irrigated. The service-pipe for the supplying of such water shall not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ inch in diameter. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

5. A minimum rate of Five shillings (5s.) and a maximum rate of Two pounds (£2) sterling shall be charged any person, as the Commissioners may determine, for using water for garden watering during the year in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such water is used.

6. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply, nor will allow any water to be taken under clauses 5 and 6, until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

7. Any person supplied with water by this Trust, who shall permit, or suffer the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds (£2) for each day after notice of offence from the Trust.

8. No person will be allowed to water lawns or gardens after eight o'clock p.m. on any day during the months of November, December, January, February, and March. Any person found infringing, or permitting taps to run, will be prosecuted in accordance with clause 7.

9. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable on the first day of March, 1924.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

3. For every house or tenement of annual municipal valuation of One hundred and sixty pounds and over, a rate of Twenty pounds.

4. For every unoccupied allotment of land and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value of such allotment.

5. For every water trough, a charge of One pound.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of Two shillings and sixpence for every thousand gallons.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be:—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge is Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

8. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe and hydrant water) shall be payable in one sum yearly in advance, on the first day of January, 1924.

9. Such persons or person as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.
