Provided that the rate for the supply of water is aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
 - (b). Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no bhilding) above the net annual value of £20 and not exceeding £300 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of court towards. of such tenement.
 - (a) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down-a rate of £4 10s. per cent. in the pound of the valua-tion of such tenement.
 - (d) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
 - (e) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
 - (f) Of any warehouse or wholesale store used exclusively for such purposes situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £3 10s. per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such warehouse or wholesale store as aforesaid.
- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year 2. Such rates are made and shall be fevred for the year beginning on the first day of January, 1924, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1924, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1924, at the office of The Water Commis-sioners at Ballarat.
- 3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the nunicipalities in which such lands and tenements are situate in The Ballarat Water Supply District shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively:
- 4. For water supplied by the Commissioners for domestic 4. For water supplied by the Commissioners for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure the niinimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Commissioners in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- 5. Such persons as The Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

(Sixpence) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 45,000 gallons per annum.

(10). For a supply to livery or carriers' stables, a charge Five (5) shillings per each stall shall be made.
