Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 9 (DRAPERS AND MEN'S CLOTHING).

NOTE.—1. On the 9th March, 1921, this Board was appointed in lieu of the Drapers Board and the Men's Clothing Board.

2. This Determination applied on the 3rd January, 1924, to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Sandringham, and Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the business of a seller of—

(a) any article of men's or boys' clothing, mercery, or wearing apparel, including underclothing, hats, and caps;

(b) goods usually sold by drapers or haberdashers, including mantles, costumes, millinery, gloves, stockings, and underclothing," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 3rd January, 1924, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) OVERTIME.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 47 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

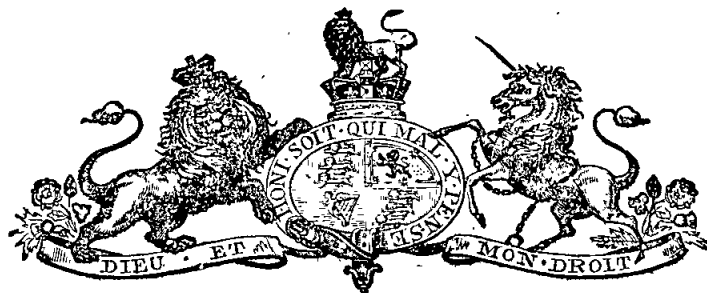
(4) TIME RATE.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 23½ hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum.

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, and time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

*Marine Act 1915.*

**AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PORT PHILLIP PILOT SICK AND SUPERANNUATION FUND.**

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1915*, the Pilot Superannuation Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. *Short Title.*—These Regulations may be cited as "The Pilot Superannuation Regulations 1923."

2. *Commencement.*—These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with "The Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund Regulations 1909," made by the Board on the 25th day of October, 1909, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of November, 1909, hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations," and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1923.

3. *Lump Sum in Lieu of Pension.*—Paragraph 8 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

"8. *Lump Sum in Lieu of Pension.*—Where any pilot shall have become entitled to a pension, and he is desirous of accepting a lump sum in lieu thereof, he shall be entitled to be paid a sum calculated at the rate of £40 for the first year of completed service, £41 for the second year of such service, £42 for the third year of such service, and so on, increasing One pound for each additional year of completed service up to thirty-five years, provided that such pilot grants a release to the Board from all future claims against the fund on behalf of himself and of his wife and of his children (if any), and provided further that no payment shall be made for a greater length of service than thirty-five years."

4. *Provision for Children of Pilots.*—Paragraph 10 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

"10. *Provision for Children of Pilots.*—If a pilot shall die leaving a widow and child or children him surviving, a capitation allowance shall be made in favour of each child at the rate of £10 per annum until such child shall have attained the age of fifteen years. On the death of any widow, she leaving any child or children under the age of fifteen years her surviving, the capitation allowance, if there be but one child, shall be increased to a sum of £20 per annum. In the case of more than one child, the pension payable to the widow shall be divided into as many equal portions as there are children, and each such portion shall be continued as a yearly allowance in addition to the capitation allowance payable as aforesaid to each such child, to be continued until the age of fifteen is attained,

but without benefit of survivorship between the children, and subject to the further proviso that no child shall, in any case, receive a larger allowance (capitation money included) than £20 per annum.

In the event of a pilot dying leaving a child or children under fifteen years of age, but no widow him surviving, the allowance to each child is to be calculated as if the pilot had died leaving a widow surviving him for a period of 24 hours."

5. *Pensions for Pilots.*—Schedule I. to the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

AWARD No. 6.

Salaries and Wages.

(1) In determining the margin to be observed between the wage of a leading hand tradesman and that of the tradesman under his control, any increase for merit granted by the Commissioners to the latter employees shall not be taken into consideration.

(2) The duties performed by the employee engaged on the leather moulding machine at the Newport Workshops are those of a minor machinist.

(3) The following work performed at the Jolimont Workshops, viz:—

- Cleaning and oiling pantographs;
- Oiling and packing suspension bearings of traction motors;
- Oiling and greasing armature bearings;
- Oiling and packing axle boxes;
- Oiling dynamos and compressors;
- Blowing out traction motors by compressed air;
- Assisting equipment examiners in the yard;

shall be regarded as that of a pitman within the meaning of Award No. 6.

AWARD No. 8.

Division 5.—Interval for Rest between Shifts.

In the case of Car Cleaner J. C. Alexander, the failure to provide an interval of twelve hours at his home station on the completion of his ordinary shift at 5 p.m. on Friday, 2nd August, 1923, was not a case of unavoidable necessity.

Division 9.—Sunday Duty.

(1) The provisions of clause 4 shall apply to the Sunday shift, viz., from 9.15 a.m. to 1.15 p.m. at Mentone, and from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. at Cheltenham, worked by Signaller S. J. Barber.

## SHIRE OF CHILTERN.

## BY-LAW NO. 31.

*A By-law Making Rates and Charges for Water Supplied within the Water Supply District of the Shire of Chiltern.*

THE Council of the shire of Chiltern, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, Nos. 2747 and 2852, do hereby make the following rates upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Chiltern, for the year ending 31st December, 1924, and to come into operation on the 1st January, and to be due and payable half-yearly in advance on 1st January, 1924, and 1st July, 1924.

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes:—

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds and under, 10 per cent. per annum on the amount of the 1915 valuation.

2. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds, One pound per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds but not exceeding Thirty, One pound five shillings per annum.

4. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Thirty pounds but not exceeding Forty, One pound ten shillings per annum.

5. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Forty pounds but not exceeding Fifty, One pound fifteen shillings per annum.

6. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Fifty pounds but not exceeding Sixty, Two pounds per annum.

7. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Sixty pounds but not exceeding Eighty, Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

8. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Eighty pounds but not exceeding One hundred, Three pounds per annum.

9. On every house and tenement above the annual value of One hundred pounds but not exceeding One hundred and fifty, Four pounds per annum.

10. On every house and tenement above the annual value of One hundred and fifty pounds but not exceeding Two hundred and fifty, Five pounds per annum.

11. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Two hundred and fifty pounds, Six pounds per annum.

12. Water from the stand-pipes and public taps will be supplied to licensed persons only at the following rates:—

Licence to cart water for sale (with horse and dray) from the stand-pipes, One pound per annum.

Licence to cart water (with horse and dray) for use of licensee only, Ten shillings per annum.

Licence to cart away water from the public taps other than by horse and dray, Five shillings per annum.

13. Water for steam boilers will be supplied by measure or by special agreement.

14. Water troughs, Five shillings per annum (providing ball regulating taps are used).

15. Livery stables, Ten shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

16. Hotel with stabling, not being a livery stable, Four shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

## BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, viz:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1924. Such rates and charges shall be deemed to be due and payable, in advance on the first day of January, 1924, but the Trust may accept payment of the same by four quarterly instalments, payable on

the first January, first April, first July, and first October, of the said year, without prejudice to its right to recover the whole year's rate. That is to say:—

2. On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Two shillings and one penny in the pound on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Thirty-five shillings.

3. On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum under this clause to be Thirty-five shillings.

4. On every livery stable, saw-mill, cordial or aerated water factory, or other factory using water in connexion with its machinery or treatment, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings, and on every flour mill, a sum of Fifteen pounds.

5. On every steam-engine (not including any steam-engine in a factory or mill rated under clause 4), a sum of One pound.

6. On every horse trough a sum of Ten shillings.

7. The area of land allowed for each house or tenement paying the ordinary rate herein imposed shall not exceed one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Ten shillings shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood. Only one service-pipe connexion with the Trust's mains will be allowed to each house or tenement rated herein, and such service-pipe shall not exceed three-quarters of an inch in diameter.

8. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings and/or additions and/or alteration to existing buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for concrete, stonework, brickwork, and plastering shall be made; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value or on amount charged or paid for concrete, stonework, brickwork, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention so to do.

*Cases where Water is not laid on.*

9. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Fifteen shillings.

10. On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any above-mentioned tenement, and facing a street or land in which a water main is laid contiguous thereto, the sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Ten shillings. If water be laid on such land described in this clause the minimum charge shall be Thirty shillings.

11. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided in clause 9, must give notice, in writing, to the Trust's secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current quarterly period. No allowance in the rate will be made unless the water is turned off for a full quarter, nor in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

*Water Supplied by Measure.*

12. The charge for water supplied to nurseries and market and other gardens over one-quarter of an acre in area, and to all lucerne, sorghum, and other fodder crops whatsoever, shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and such supply shall be in every case by or through a meter which shall be provided and affixed by the customer after being approved by the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be (30,000) thirty thousand gallons. The service-pipe for the supply of such water shall not exceed 1 inch in diameter.

13. No person shall irrigate from the Trust water mains or service pipes any nurseries or market or other gardens over one-quarter of an acre in area, or any lucerne, sorghum, or other fodder crops whatsoever without the permission of the Trust, and save through or by an approved meter provided and affixed by the customer as provided by clause 12 hereof. Any person committing or suffering a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

14. The charge for water supplied to any "bowling club" shall be £10 per annum and to "grass tennis courts" £20 per annum, such supply to be by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the consumer in each case after being approved by the Trust.

15. The Trust may require a meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any house or tenement in any case where it deem the same necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 12 shall apply to such house or tenement.

16. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under the provisions of clauses 12, 13, or 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

17. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each (100) one hundred gallons.

18. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

19. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the above-mentioned rates and charges.

20. In the construction of this By-law the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force on the 1st January, 1924, the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust; and the word "tenement" as used herein shall be deemed to include the whole of the land held or used by or on behalf of one person, as one contiguous property, whether divided into two or more parts by fences or not.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

A By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1924 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust, also dealing with the Sale of Water by measure from the works of the Trust.

(1) A rate of Two shillings in the £1 sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all property fronting streets in which a main pipe has been laid according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Melvor but no rate in any case shall be less than Two pounds.

(2) A rate of Ten shillings shall be charged on all unoccupied lands facing the mains.

(3) Tenements not fronting a street within which a main pipe is laid but are situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged half the amount of the assessed rate.

(4) Tenements exceeding one-quarter but not exceeding one-half a mile shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

(5) For water supplied by measure a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust may deem necessary.

(6) Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate in respect to the premises supplied.

(7) The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first of January and the first of July, 1924.

(8) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

The following rates are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1924 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundary of the Trust district, that is to say, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling, payable in two equal instalments, on the 1st January and 1st July, shall be imposed and levied on all rateable properties in the Trust District, according to the municipal valuation on such properties.

The minimum rate to be paid shall be Thirty shillings (30s.) on all tenements, vacant land where the main passes the property, Twenty-five shillings (25s.), within 100 yards of main, Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.), and stand-pipe rate, Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.). All water supplied by the Trust for other than domestic purposes shall be by meter, and charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, surplus water, Threepence per 1,000 gallons to Railway Department for engine purposes. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

#### MORWELL WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1924.

**A** BY-LAW for making a rate for the year 1924 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Morwell Waterworks Trust which district has for the purposes of the Water Acts been proclaimed an Urban District; also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound shall be made on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Morwell, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

2. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, the municipal value of which does not exceed Seven pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings (7s.). When such value is over Seven pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.

3. For every public water trough, the sum of One pound (£1).

4. For every livery, coach, and carriers' stables the sum of Five shillings per annum for the first stall, and Five shillings per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds and for stabling, each six feet is to be considered one stall.

5. When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at the price named would equal the rate payable in respect of such property if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during each year ending on the 31st December shall be 15,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.

7. The Trust may by notice in writing intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

8. In all cases not herein provided for the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of January, 1924.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

#### NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within its Waterworks District, that is to say:—

1. *Minimum.*—Every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Seven pounds sterling annual value, the sum of Three shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. *Minimum.*—For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Seven pounds sterling annual value, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.

3. *On Valuation above Minimum.*—For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, or allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of Seven pounds sterling, of more than Seven pounds annual value, an amount equal to Three shillings in the pound on the amount of the valuation.

4. *Special Rates.*—For all tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any standpipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such standpipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

5. *Minimum Meter Charge—Excess Meter Charge.*—Such owners as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

6. *Public Institutions and Others.*—Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable or other public institutions, and religious denominations, shall be by measure at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, or by special agreement.

7. *Irrigation.*—Water supplied exclusively for irrigation purposes to be paid for by measure in accordance with the charges fixed by this By-law.

8. *Water Rate Outside Trust's Area.*—Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. *Water Troughs.*—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 8,000 gallons per annum at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

10. *Interpretation Clause.*—In the construction of this By-law the word "Trust" shall mean the Nhill Waterworks Trust, and "he" shall also mean "she."

11. *Excess Payments.*—Where water meters are affixed the excess payments shall be made at the end of each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

*Period of Rate.*—That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1924, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1924, and shall be payable in one moiety, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1924.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates.

#### ORBOST WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1924, No. 5.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Orbost Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rating By-law, viz.:—

A By-law for determining the rate which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1924 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements, if not in such streets, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Twenty-six pounds (£26) sterling.

2. A minimum rate of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Twenty-six pounds (£26).

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling on the net annual value of such rateable property valued over Ten pounds (£10), provided that no such allotment shall pay less than One pound (£1) sterling.

4. For every water trough a charge of Thirty shillings (30s.) per annum, maximum amount of water for each trough 30,000 gallons.

5. For every steam boiler, a charge of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) sterling per annum for every horse power of such boiler.

6. For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for every load of two hundred (200) gallons or under, a charge of Two shillings (2s.) to be paid on delivery.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling (1s.) for every thousand (1,000) gallons.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be—If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

9. Such before-mentioned rates and charges shall be based on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Orbost for the time being, and (except for stand-pipe and hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1924.

10. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Orbost Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

## By-law No. 17.

1. General Rate.—A general rate of One shilling and tenpence in the pound sterling is hereby made for the year 1924 upon the annual value of all properties liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Trust, and such rate shall be based on the municipal valuation of such property by the Council of the shire of Towong for the year 1923-1924.

2. Minimum Rate.—The minimum rate payable on any property on which is erected any dwelling, house, shop, office, stable, or other building where, in the opinion of the Trust, water is likely to be required, shall be Two pounds. The minimum rate on any other rateable property whatsoever shall be Ten shillings.

3. For all house properties built during the year 1924, a proportion of such general rate or minimum rate shall be paid from the beginning of the month after commencement of the building to the end of December.

4. For water supplied from the works of the Trust by measure, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, and the minimum quantity charged for shall be 27,000 gallons per annum.

5. The said rate and charges shall be payable in two equal portions, the first on the first day of January and the second on the first day of July, 1924.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint shall be authorized to receive and demand the rate.

## WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law for the year 1924.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land or tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. For every house or tenement of Eleven pounds or under, municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Eleven pounds per annum, the sum of One shilling and ninepence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any main or stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such main or stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth the before-mentioned rate.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate paid on such lands and tenements. All excess water supplied by measure by the Trust shall be charged at the rate of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

6. Such owners or occupiers of lands or tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam engines, or stock who are supplied by the Trust with water shall, if the Commissioners think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which

they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such owners or occupiers are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using, such owners or occupiers to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1924. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

## RUSHWORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924.

THE Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to, and in exercise of, the powers conferred by the said Acts, hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of such lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1924 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the Trust:—

(1) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Forty shillings.

(2) For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Ten pounds a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound sterling, the minimum rate shall in no case be less than Forty shillings.

(3) For every unoccupied allotment of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Fifteen shillings be charged.

(4) For all the lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one quarter of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half a mile from such stand pipe, one-eighth of the full rate shall be paid.

(5) For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust there shall be paid the sum of £5 sterling; and all water used in excess of 95,000 gallons shall be paid for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(6) All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be at the following rates:—30,000 for the first Forty shillings of the assessed water rate, and for each additional Twenty shillings of assessed rate or portion thereof at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. All excess water shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 7,000 gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessments.

(7) Water supplied to the Government Department, religious denominations, public parks, bowling greens, and persons outside the Trust District and those being supplied off rising main shall be by measurement or special agreement.

(8) The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1924. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied, except water taken from High-street stand pipe when a charge of 1s. per load will be made and payable to person in charge thereof.

(9) Such person or persons as the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

(10) No meter shall be affixed until it has been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works, or other authorized person, be produced for inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being, that such meter is in proper order.

(11) No person without having previously affixed a water meter to his service pipe, shall use for other than domestic purposes, water supplied by the Trust. Domestic purposes shall not extend to the supply of water for horses or cows.

(12) Any person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice in writing to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

(13) Every meter shall be fixed truly level with connexions above the ground, approved by the Trusts supervising officer, which must wherever practicable, be level with the ground, and within three feet of the building line of the property. Two wrought-iron bends must be affixed on each side of the meter or lead connexion used; the use of elbows will not be permitted.

(14) The Trust will, on application, supply a meter at cost price for cash on delivery or on time payment, on the following terms:—Ten shillings cash deposit, and balance bearing interest of 8 per centum per annum by annual payments of Ten shillings.

**U**NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Acts*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

- (1) declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in connexion with a sand pit at labouring work, excavating sand, handling sand, or removing sand for trade or sale, but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Carters Board;
- (2) order that a Wages Board, consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in connexion with a sand pit at labouring work, excavating sand, handling sand, or removing sand for trade or sale, but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Carters Board.

Also that such Wages Board may in any Regulation, Determination, Order, Instrument, or Legal Proceeding be described for all purposes as the Sand Pit Board; and the area or locality within which the Determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

**RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF HEALESVILLE.**

**U**NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Acts*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the Township of Healesville, within the municipal district of the Shire of Healesville, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the sixth day of January, 1915, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1912*, as amended by the *Factories and Shops Acts Amendment Act 1914*) shall be exempted from the Saturday half-holiday and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE TOWN OF PORTSEA, PARISH OF NEPEAN, KNOWN AS THE PORTSEA FORESHORE RESERVE.

WE, William Henry Brown, John McGrath, William Herman Schroeder, William James Watson, William Henry Goss, the duly appointed Committee of Management of portion of the reserve for public purposes in the Parish of Nepean, at Portsea, known as the "Portsea Foreshore Reserve" (hereinafter called the reserve), having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the power conferred by section 181 of the *Lands Act 1915*.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements.
2. No person shall enter or leave the reserve except by means of the ramps or other openings provided, and no person shall climb the cliffs in the reserve.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency in regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. The Committee of Management may provide and build such fireplaces on the reserve as the Committee think necessary. Any person lighting or using fires or causing or permitting fires to be used on the reserve, save in such fireplaces, except by special leave or direction of the Committee of Management, shall be guilty of an offence under these regulations.

5. No person shall damage in any way the trees, grass, or other vegetation in the reserve.

6. No person shall climb or jump over any fences in or around the reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names in the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, destroy, or remove the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, or any survey pegs, or permanent marks therein.

7. No horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, save as hereinafter provided, are allowed in the reserve, and the owner of any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals so wandering shall be liable to prosecution, and, in addition, such horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals may be impounded.

8. Certain portions of the reserve have been set apart by the Committee of Management for the accommodation of vehicles and horses in custody, and care of those using the same, provided that the owner or user for the time being of any horse found wandering without restraint on any portions of the reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

9. No person shall tether, or cause to be tethered, on any part of the reserve, except as otherwise herein provided, any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals.

10. Motor cars are allowed on the reserve only in the place set apart for the purpose.

11. No person shall commit a nuisance on any part of the reserve, or in any public or private bathing-box, boatshed, or other buildings upon the reserve.

12. No person shall use the closets or urinals, or any portion of such closets or urinals, for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed, and shall then only use such portions of such closets and urinals as are specially constructed for such purposes.

13. Certain portion of the reserve has been set apart by the Committee of Management for the use of persons desirous of swimming or bathing horses in Port Phillip Bay under such conditions as the Committee may from time to time determine, and then only before 8 a.m. and after 6 p.m.

14. No person except workmen employed by the Committee of Management in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs, or grass.

15. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the reserve except in the receptacles provided for that purpose.

16. No person shall camp on any portion of the reserve except those specially set apart for the purpose, and then only after obtaining a permit, subject to such fees and conditions as the Committee may determine.

17. No person shall erect any booth or other structure, or offer for sale any article in the reserve, without the permission of the Committee of Management in writing.

18. No person shall throw any stone or other hard substance, nor play cricket or any other game with a hard ball, within the reserve.

19. No person shall break glass of any kind in the reserve, or leave therein on the beach anything which would injure bathers.

20. No person shall discharge any firearms or air guns in any part of the reserve.

21. No person shall erect any bathing-box or boatshed in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such fees, terms, and conditions as may be imposed by the Committee of Management.

22. No person shall bathe from the reserve unless decently attired from neck to knee, and no person shall leave or enter the reserve in bathing costume only, and no person shall loiter on the beach in bathing costume only.

23. No person shall use, or cause to be used, any bathing-box or boatshed for residential purposes.

24. No person shall conduct or take part in any public meetings or entertainments in any part of the reserve or foreshore without the previous written permission of the Committee of Management.

25. No entry to the beach by vehicles will be permitted except on the road set apart for that purpose.

26. No sand or other material shall be removed.

Every person offending against any of these regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 18 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than £5; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be

forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF WOORI YALLOCK.

WE, John McAleese, Rason James Frazier Roxburgh, Edward McAleese, Andrew Birkett, Charles Douthie, Percy James Worsley Payne, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for public recreation in the Parish of Woori Yallock, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein and thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set aside for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements and shows, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall camp in the reserve, nor erect thereon any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the reserve.

9. No person shall publicly bet in any part of the reserve, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and reserve.

10. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the reserve on Sundays.

11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements and shows may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff, of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
