## Land Surveyors Acts.

## REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.
- (b) An examination fee of £3 3s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

## Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a

plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

## SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

*Mathematics.*

- (a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

*Computation.*

- (b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

*Principles and Practice of Surveying.*

- (c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

*Engineering Surveys.*

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

*Use of Instruments.*

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

*Drawing.*

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

*Miscellaneous.*

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(e), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

## CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to

character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £3 3s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visu voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £3 3s.

**REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.**

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. 16. No candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

## REGULATION OF THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

## No. 74.

**T**HE Victorian Railways Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as "the Commissioners," in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the *Railways Act* 1915, do hereby make the following Regulation in regard to the qualifications, selection, and examination of candidates for employment, and do hereby repeal all previous regulations relating thereto.

1. Every person desiring to become a candidate for employment in any position specified in the public notice relating to the particular examination must prepare, in his own handwriting, an application on the form prescribed, stating that he is an applicant for appointment to one of the vacancies specified in such public notice.

2. Every candidate shall be restricted to one application for employment; but, if so prescribed in the public notice, will be allowed to specify two of the positions, or, in the case of an apprentice, two of the trades named therein as his first and second preference respectively, and shall enclose such application in an envelope, which must be properly addressed, duly stamped and posted so that it will reach the Secretary for Railways (hereinafter referred to as the "Secretary"), Spencer-street, Melbourne, not later than the time fixed by the Commissioners for opening and dealing with such applications.

3. The age of each candidate shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioners for the opening of the applications, and shall be not less than the minimum, nor more than the maximum, age specified in the public notice for the particular grade.

4. Every candidate shall furnish with his application evidence of his age in accordance with the conditions specified in the public notice.

5. The height of every candidate shall not be less than the minimum height prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade.

6. The salary or wage of every successful candidate in appointment and thereafter shall be subject to the conditions specified in the public notice relating to the particular examination.

7. Every successful candidate for employment in junior grade who, owing to the requirements of the Department, may be obliged to reside away from his home, shall, in addition to his salary or wage, be granted an allowance towards his board and lodging expenses, if so entitled, subject to the conditions specified in the public notice relating to the particular examination and class of employment.

8. Every candidate who has at any time been employed in any capacity in the Railway Department or in the Public Service, whether as a permanent or

supernumerary employee, shall furnish with his application particulars as to the period of such employment.

9. Any person who has been dismissed from the Railway Department, or the Public Service, or whose employment has been terminated for disciplinary causes under the provisions of the Railways or Public Service Acts, or who has been convicted of a felony or misdemeanour, whether before or after selection or examination, shall not be eligible for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

10. The Secretary shall on the day and at the hour named in the public notice proceed to open the applications, and shall cause the name and address of the writer of each of such applications to be then and there registered in a book provided for that purpose, hereinafter called the "Register," and a consecutive number, commencing with the number one, shall be placed in the Register opposite the name of each candidate.

11. The candidates in any grade, if not more than twice the number to be employed, shall thereupon be subject to the course of procedure, and the conditions, defined in Clauses 16 to 25 inclusive of this Regulation.

12. The candidates in any grade, if more than twice the number to be employed, shall be reduced by a Board of Selectors (which shall be appointed within seven days prior to the date fixed for the selection) to a number not exceeding twice the number to be employed.

13. The members of the Board of Selectors shall not be informed of, nor acquaint themselves with, the names of the applicants, or any of them; and any candidate who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself, or in favour of or against any other candidate, shall be for ever disqualified for employment in the service of the Commissioners.

14. Every candidate shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of the place and time at which he shall present himself to the Board of Selectors.

15. Every candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, shall be furnished by the Secretary with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he shall be known to the Board of Selectors.

16. Every candidate selected by the Board of Selectors and every candidate for employment in any grade for which the number of applicants is not more than twice the number to be employed, shall be required to undergo an examination by the Railways Medical Officer, and for such examination shall pay a fee of 5s.

17. Every such candidate, if certified as free from any physical infirmity, and as up to the standard prescribed in respect of height, vision, colour-sense, and hearing, shall, if required so to do, present himself for an examination by the Educational Examiners duly appointed for that purpose at such time and place as may be notified to him by the Secretary.

18. Every such candidate who has been so notified shall be required by the Examiners appointed for that purpose to pass the educational examination prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade.

19. Every such candidate and every candidate for employment in a position for which no educational test is prescribed by the public notice, who has passed the prescribed physical and vision and hearing examinations, shall produce to the Educational Examiners satisfactory written testimony that he is of respectable character, as well as certificates, indentures, or other satisfactory evidence that he possesses the requisite qualifications prescribed in the public notice for the particular grade, and shall furnish satisfactory testimony of his employment with any persons or firms with whom he may have been employed during the preceding two years; and every such candidate who has had previous employment in the Public Service or in the service of the Commissioners shall produce a statement of such service and a certificate of competency and good conduct.

20. The Educational Examiners shall, immediately after the completion of the examination, forward to the Secretary the examination papers of every candidate so examined, indorsed with their certificate as to the fitness or otherwise of the candidate for the position applied for, and shall also certify whether the candidates for employment in a position for which no educational test is prescribed in the public notice possess the qualifications specified in such public notice for the particular position, and have also complied with all other conditions relating thereto.

21. After examination by the Educational Examiners the successful candidates in any grade, if not in excess of the number required, will be employed forthwith, and their relative seniority for future promotion, &c. (all other things being equal), shall be determined by a ballot conducted by the Secretary.

22. The successful candidates in any grade, if in excess of the number required, shall be called together at a place and time of which due notice shall be sent them in writing, and shall then and there in the presence of the Secretary draw lots to determine the order of procedure in which their names shall be recorded for appointment; and in the event of two or more such candidates being appointed on the same day such drawing shall, all other things being equal, determine the relative seniority of each candidate for future promotion, &c.

23. Every successful candidate in any grade, if in excess of the number required by the Commissioners, shall, in the order so decided, be eligible for appointment to any vacancy in the particular grade for which he is a candidate during the twelve months next ensuing from the date of the ballot without further or other examination.

24. Every appointment shall be on probation for a period of six months, during which the probationer shall be required to attend such instructional classes as may be prescribed by the Commissioners for the particular grade; and at the expiration of that period the appointment may be confirmed by the

Commissioners, provided that the probationer whilst in the service of the Commissioners has demonstrated his fitness for permanent appointment by good conduct, industry, and capacity as ascertained by the results of such examinations and practical tests that may be imposed. No probationer, however, shall have his appointment confirmed until he has effected in one of the prescribed Life Assurance Companies an assurance of his life in accordance with the regulations of the Commissioners.

25. Every appointment shall be made on the distinct understanding that the services of the employee shall without previous notice be liable to be dispensed with either during or after the period of probation, or, in the case of an Engineering or Architectural Pupil undergoing a course of study at the Melbourne University, or of an Apprentice, either during or after the period of pupilage or apprenticeship, as the case may be, and without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners if at any time his services be so dispensed with.

26. Before any person is appointed as a Pupil Engineer or Pupil Architect (hereinafter referred to as the "pupil") pursuant to this regulation he, together with an approved surety, will be required to execute an agreement, in a form to be fixed by the Commissioners, wherein it will be provided *inter alia* that:—

- (a) Subject to this regulation the pupil will, if required so to do, continue in the service of the Commissioners until he shall have been admitted to the degree of Bachelor of Civil Engineering in the University of Melbourne (hereinafter referred to as the "University") or have been granted the Diploma of Architecture of the said University, as the case may require.
- (b) The pupil upon being appointed, pursuant to this regulation, as an Engineering Assistant or as an Architectural Assistant, shall, if required by the Commissioners so to do, continue in the service of the Commissioners for a period of at least three years from the date of such appointment.
- (c) In the event of the pupil leaving or being dismissed from the service of the Commissioners during his pupilage, or within the period of three years next after his appointment as an Engineering Assistant or an Architectural Assistant pursuant to this regulation the Commissioners shall, in either case, be entitled to recover from the pupil or his surety as liquidated damages such sum as the Commissioners' Chief Accountant certifies is equal to the amount of the salary paid by the Commissioners to the pupil in respect of time spent by the pupil in attendance at the lectures, demonstrations, excursions and examinations prescribed by the Statutes of the University of Melbourne in respect of the particular course of study entered upon by the pupil.

27. Every pupil shall, immediately after his appointment in the service of the Commissioners, enrol himself on the books of the University and undertake the course of study prescribed by the regulations of the University for the Degree or Diploma for which he is a candidate, and shall pay all fees in respect of such course, as well as provide the necessary books, drawing instruments, &c., at his own expense.

28. Every such pupil will be allowed the requisite leave of absence from his duties in the service of the Commissioners for the purpose of attending the lectures, examinations, demonstrations, and excursions prescribed by the regulations of the University for the particular course of study, and will be granted full pay at the rate of salary applicable to the particular year of his pupilage in respect of such leave of absence subject to the conditions of this regulation.

29. The salary of every pupil on appointment shall be at the rate specified in the public notice, and thereafter, subject to good conduct, capacity, and industry in the service of the Commissioners, regular attendance at the lectures, examinations, demonstrations, and excursions of the University, will be at the rate specified in the public notice for the particular year of his pupilage, subject, however, to any amendments as may be legally prescribed from time to time; and thereafter shall be such rates as may be legally prescribed for Engineering Assistants and Architectural Assistants.

No pupil, however, who fails to pass an annual examination at the University, will be entitled to have his salary increased during the year immediately following such annual examination.

30. Not more than two years will be allowed any pupil for the passing of the course prescribed by the regulations of the University for each year; and failure to pass any year's course within such period of two years, or to complete the full course of study within a period of five years in the case of pupil Architects, or six years in the case of pupil Engineers, will render the pupil concerned liable to the immediate determination of his service with the Commissioners without his having any claim whatsoever against the Commissioners if at any time his service be so determined.

31. Every pupil who obtains the Diploma of Architecture of the University will be required to pass the Associateship examination of the Royal Victorian Institute of Architects prior to his appointment as an Architectural Assistant in the service of the Commissioners.

32. The time of every pupil when not in attendance at the prescribed lectures, examinations, demonstrations, and excursions of the University, and also during the vacation periods of the University, shall be at the disposal of the Commissioners.

33. Any pupil who is adjudged guilty of frequent or repeated misconduct at the University or in the service of the Commissioners, or to have neglected to have made a proper effort in his studies or work will render himself liable to the immediate determination of his service, and the Commissioners will be entitled to recover from the pupil or his surety the liquidated damages defined in Clause 26, sub-clause (c) of this regulation if at any time his service be so determined.

34. Every Apprentice, unless specifically excepted, shall, immediately after appointment, attend such Departmental or other instructional classes as the Commissioners may direct at such hours of the day and night as may be prescribed during the complete course of training, which shall extend over the period prescribed in Clauses 37 and 38.

35. Every Apprentice shall provide the books, drawing instruments, &c., required at the classes of instruction at his own expense, but the Commissioners will either provide instruction free of charge or pay any necessary fees, as well as the wages of the Apprentice for such portion of the ordinary hours of duty as he may be required to be in attendance at the classes of instruction.

36. Every Apprentice shall present himself for such examinations as may be prescribed for the particular trade, and shall pass in proper sequence the examinations for each year of such course, and, in addition, shall do satisfactory work and be of good conduct in the service of the Commissioners.

37. Every such Apprentice will be allowed a maximum period of three years in which to complete the course of instruction prescribed for the first and second years of apprenticeship; but no Apprentice will be eligible to undergo the third-year course unless he has satisfactorily completed the first and second year courses within the period covered by the first three years of his apprenticeship.

38. Any Apprentice who, after having undergone the third-year course of instruction, fails to pass the prescribed qualifying examination for that year will not be allowed to repeat such course either at the expense of the Department or in his ordinary hours of duty, nor will he be eligible to compete for the Scholarship referred to in Clause 42.

39. Any Apprentice who fails to make satisfactory progress at the classes of instruction may be called upon to attend, at his own expense and in his own time, such additional night classes as may be deemed necessary by the Commissioners.

40. Any Apprentice who is adjudged guilty of frequent or repeated misconduct at the classes of instruction or to have neglected to have made a proper effort to qualify in his work as an Apprentice will render himself liable to the immediate determination of his service, and shall not have any claim if at any time his service be so determined.

41. Subject to good conduct, regular attendance, zeal, and industry in the service of the Commissioners, the Apprentices who each year of the period of tuition may be adjudged highest in order of merit and as possessing the highest qualifications amongst all Apprentices who are pursuing for the first time the course applicable to the particular year, shall be awarded the prizes applicable to their particular trades if so entitled, as specified in the public notice, provided that they obtain not less than 75 per cent. of the possible marks.

42. The three Apprentices who, at the end of the third year of tuition, are adjudged highest in order of merit amongst all Apprentices eligible under the conditions specified in the public notice, shall be nominated as students in either Electrical or Mechanical Engineering (as may be determined by the Commissioners), and afforded facilities to attend for three years the full day course at either the Working Men's College or other such Institution as may be determined by the Commissioners, and any such Apprentice who passes the prescribed examination and gains a diploma of the College or other such Institution, as the case may be, in respect thereof, shall thereafter be employed by the Commissioners as an Engineering Assistant. During such course of three years the fees of the College or other such Institution will be paid by the Commissioners, and in lieu of wages the Apprentice shall be paid an annual salary in accordance with the provisions of any Regulation in operation for the time being; and every such Apprentice who is appointed as an Engineering Assistant will be required to agree in writing to remain thereafter in the service of the Commissioners (provided his services are required) for a period of at least three years, or alternatively, in the event of his earlier resignation to refund all fees paid and expense incurred by the Commissioners for the purpose of his tuition.

43. The term of apprenticeship shall extend over the period of years specified in the public notice for the particular trade, and each year thereof shall be deemed to mean three hundred and thirteen (313) working days, and shall be inclusive of any proclaimed holidays on which the Workshops may be closed, and any annual recreation leave of absence, as well as any other leave of absence which may be allowed for any cause whatsoever, provided that such other leave of absence does not during the prescribed term of apprenticeship, exceed the aggregate of thirteen (13) working days per annum for each year of such prescribed term of apprenticeship.

In the event, however, of such other leave of absence to any apprentice exceeding such aggregate of 13 days per annum for each year of the prescribed term of apprenticeship, the term of his apprenticeship shall be extended for a period equivalent to the period of such excess leave of absence.

**BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.**

**RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1923.**

THE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust do hereby make the following By-law, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts:—

1. That the water rate for the year 1923 on all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the borough of Horsham for the year 1922-23, with a minimum of One (1) pound upon all lands and tenements valued at or under £13 6s. 8d. (Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence), except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 237 of the above-mentioned Acts.

2. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall be the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Trust by measure, in excess of such aforesaid quantity, shall be charged at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons.

3. For the water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of Ninepence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), and for water supplied for railway purposes, which shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than the amount payable under the assessed rate as specified in clause 1 hereof.

4. All rates and charges shall be due and payable in advance on the first day of March, 1923, at the office of the Trust, Wilson-street, Horsham, where payments will be received during office hours.

5. Such officers as the Trust may, from time to time, appoint for the purpose, are hereby authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

This By-law shall apply to all rateable property comprised within the boundaries of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, exclusive of that portion thereof proclaimed an Urban District on 23rd day of June, 1890, and the 30th day of September, 1895, and the 7th day of July, 1899, that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 5th day of December, 1900, that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of September, 1901, that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 25th day of February, 1905, and also that portion proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of November, 1914.

2. A rate of Twopence in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property situated within the parishes of Katunga, Baulkamaugh, Drumanure, Muntoona, Kaarimba, Waain, and Barwo, a rate of One penny in the pound sterling on the rateable property situated in the parishes of Stratherton, Ulupna, Yalca, and Yielima, according to the municipal valuation for the time being, is hereby made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1923, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1923.

3. Such rate is hereby made payable in one instalment and shall be due on the 1st day of January, 1923.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

5. The foregoing By-law was made by the Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust on the 12th day of December, 1922.

**SHIRE OF NUMURKAH WATERWORKS TRUST.**

**RATING BY-LAW FOR 1923.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law:—

*By-law No. 144.*

1. This By-law shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah, as such district is proclaimed and defined by Orders in Council bearing date 23rd June, 1890, the 30th September, 1895, the 17th July, 1899, and 23rd November, 1914.

2. The rates hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said Urban District shall pay in respect of the year 1923 in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes.

3. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Sixteen pounds or under according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings; on every house or tenement above the annual value of Sixteen pounds, and on vacant allotments, a rate of Fifteenpence in the pound sterling on the amount of the municipal valuation for the time being.

4. Such rate shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1923, and the 1st day of July, 1923.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

4. Such rate shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January, 1923, and 1st day of July, 1923.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

#### SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates for 1923 which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

(1) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be paid.

(2) For every house or tenement of more than Thirteen pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

(3) For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds and not exceeding Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound fifteen shillings shall be paid.

(4) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, and not exceeding Thirty-seven pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound seventeen shillings and sixpence shall be paid.

(5) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Thirty-seven pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

(6) The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be:—Under Seven pounds—Seven shillings

and sixpence, over Seven pounds the rate shall be One shilling in the pound per annum for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

(7) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from the stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

(8) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other purposes shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 54,000 gallons.

(9) The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st of July, 1923.

(10) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

##### \*AMENDMENTS.

Reg. 49b. The words "or such other qualification as the Commission may approve" to be added, and such regulations to then read:—

"For forester—Persons having not less than three years' efficient service in the rank of assistant forester, or such other qualification as the Commission may approve."

Reg. 49c. The words "or such other qualification as the Commission may approve" to be added, and such regulation to then read:—

"For assistant forester—Persons having not less than one year's efficient service as cadets or three years' efficient service as a forest foreman, or such other qualification as the Commission may approve."

After Reg. 49 (d) there shall be inserted the following additional regulation:—

Reg. 49 (e) The examinations shall be in two parts:—

- (a) practical;  
(b) theoretical.

Candidates will not be admitted to the written examination in part (b) until they have obtained a certificate of fitness in respect of part (a). Such certificate shall be awarded by the Commission on the actual work and record of the candidate in the performance of his departmental duties, and may be cancelled for subsequent misconduct or reduced standard of efficiency.

Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board constructing an electric tramway in Park-street, Mary-street, and Beaconsfield-parade, St. Kilda.

**ROUTE.**

TOWN OF GEELONG WEST.

By-LAW No. 43.

Residential Areas.

A By-law of the town of Geelong West, numbered 43, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, as amended by the *Local Government Act 1921* (No. 3167), for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting or regulating within the whole of such residential areas the erection, adaptation for use, or use of any building for the purposes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Geelong West, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. The areas within the municipal district herein specified shall be and are hereby prescribed as residential areas, that is to say, all properties situate in or having frontages to the following streets:—
