A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII., Division 1, of the Local Government Act 1915, and also as Rules and Regulations under section 6 of the Police Offences Act 1915, and numbered 170, to amend and add to certain clauses in By-law No. 142.

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend and add to certain clauses in By-law No. 142, now therefore the Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2708) and by section 6 of the Police Offences Act 1915 (No. 2708) and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf order and direct that the following By-law Rules and Regulations shall be observed and enforced within the said city:—

- 1. This By-law shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construed as one with By-law No. 142 intituled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne inade under Part VII. Division 1 of the Local Government Act 1915 and numbered 142 to repeal the Regulations made on the eleventh day of December One thousand nine hundred and sixteen and to amend and add to certain clauses in By-law No. 134."
- 2. In this By-law the expression "safety zone" shall unless such meaning be inconsistent with the context mean a place of refuge for pedestrians established by the Council in accordance with this By-law.
- 3. The Council may by notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Lord Mayor or in his absence of the Town Clerk establish one or more safety zones in any street.
- 4. Clause 3 of By-law No. 142 shall be amended by inserting immediately following sub-clause (6) thereof the following new sub-clauses that is to say:—
 - (6) (a) When drawing up at any street intersection to await the signal of the police officer or officer of the Council directing the traffic to proceed, if desirous of turning to the left into an intersecting street, stand as near as practicable to the kerb.
 - street, stand as near as practicable to the kerb.

 (6) (b) Not stop opposite a safety zone on the same side of the street upon which the same is established nor within a distance of thirty feet thereof except in obedience to the direction of any member of the police force or officer of the Council provided however that this provision shall not apply to drivers stopping for the purpose of loading or unloading goods only on week days before halfpast four o'clock in the afternoon and before halfpast eleven o'clock in the morning on Saturdays, provided further that this clause shall not apply to the stands appointed for licensed hackney carriages and motor vehicles situate in Swanstonstreet south of Flinders-street.

 (6) (c) Not stop on the east side of that section of
 - street south of Flinders-street.

 (6) (c) Not stop on the east side of that section of Swanston-street lying between Collins-street and Batman-avenue between the hours of half-past four o'clock and half-past six o'clock in the afternoon on week days and between half-past eleven o'clock in the morning and half-past one o'clock in the afternoon on Saturdays except for the purpose of putting down or taking up passengers or in obedience to the direction of such member of the police force or officer of the Council as aforesaid.
 - (6) (d) Not load or unload or permit to be loaded or unloaded from his vehicle goods for delivery on the east side of that section of Swanston-street lying between Collins-street and Batman-avenue after half-past four in the afternoon on week days and after half-past eleven o'clock in the morning on Saturdays.
- 5. Immediately after clause II. of By-law No. 142 the following new clause shall be inserted, that is to say:---
 - 11. (a) No pedestrian shall cross any street except at right angles to the kerb line and every such pedestrian shall on leaving the footway proceed by the shortest line from the point on the kerb line from which he left the footway to a point on the other kerb line of the street immediately opposite the first-mentioned point.
