## AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS RELATING TO PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1915*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of the said State, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations shall form portion of "The Pilot Regulations 1911," made by the Board on the fifteenth day of September, 1911, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the twenty-seventh day of September, 1911 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations) and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall take effect on and from the date of their publication in the *Government Gazette*, on which date paragraphs 97 and 98 of the principal Regulations shall be repealed.

2. For paragraph 97 of the principal Regulations, there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

97. *Probationary Service.*—Before an applicant nominated by the Board shall become eligible for a licence as a harbor and river pilot such applicant, subsequently to being passed as physically, mentally, and visually fit, shall serve under and regularly proceed with a duly licensed harbor and river pilot in the performance of the latter's daily duty for a period of not less than three calendar months.

3. For paragraph 98 of the principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

98. *Issuing Licence.*—Subject to such nominee having observed the requirements aforesaid and producing and lodging in due course with the Secretary to the Marine Board certificates from the masters of the vessels or duly licensed pilots under whom he claims to have served of the facts in support of such service, the Marine Board may grant to such nominee a licence to be held subject to the rules and regulations which for the time being may be in force, to act as a harbor and river pilot (within the limits of the port in which the vacancy for a pilot exists) of vessels having a draft of water not exceeding 25 ft. 6 in., or a length not exceeding 450 feet between perpendiculars, and at the expiration of a period of not less than three calendar months from the date of such last-mentioned licence, the same being then unrevoked, or unsuspended, may grant to him a licence to act as a Harbor and River Pilot of any vessel without restriction to the draft of water, or length of vessel, within the limits of the port for which he was originally granted a licence.

The foregoing amended Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this eighth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three.

## UNITED SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

RATING BY-LAW NO. 35. FOR 1922-23, MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES, FIXING A SCALE OF CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE, AND REGULATING THE TIMES OF PAYMENT.

THE Council of the United Shire of Beechworth doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following rates and charges upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Beechworth, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

On every house and tenement of the annual value of (£15) Fifteen pounds and under, a rate of £1 per annum.

On every house and tenement above the annual value of (£15) Fifteen pounds, a rate of £6 13s. 4d. per centum per annum on the amount of such valuation (annual).

On every vacant allotment, or allotments enclosed by one fence, under the annual value of £15, a minimum charge of 10s. per annum where no connexion to main and £1 per annum where connected to main, will be made.

The rate shall be paid in advance, by equal half-yearly payments, on the first day of October, 1922, and on the first day of April, 1923.

Water supplied by measure to any owner or occupier of any land or tenement or to any other person (except in cases of special agreement with the Council) shall be supplied, charged, and paid for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 100 gallons.

The minimum of water to be charged and paid for in such case where water is supplied by measure shall be 500 gallons.

Water supplied by measure shall be paid for quarterly, on the first day of October, the first day of January, the first day of April, and the first day of July.

This By-law shall be deemed to have come into operation and shall take effect from the first day of October, 1922.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

## BY-LAW NO. 1274.—FLOOD PROTECTION CHARGE.—CARDINIA FLOOD PROTECTION DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following Flood Protection Charge is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Cardinia Flood Protection District:—

For the service rendered to such district by the flood protection works constructed for such service—

(1) Of all lands in the first division, as shown coloured red on a plan signed and sealed by the Commission, and lodged at the office of such Commission at Melbourne, and authenticated copies of which are also lodged at the office of the Commission at Pakenham and Kooweerup, the office of the municipality of Cranbourne at Cranbourne; the office of the municipality of Berwick at Pakenham, and at the Post Office at Cora Lynn—a charge of Thirty-six pence for each acre of such lands.

(2) Of all lands in the second division, as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan—a charge of Eighteen-pence for each acre of such lands.

(3) Of all lands in the third division, as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan—a charge of Ninepence for each acre of such lands.

2. Such charge is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1922, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1923, and shall be payable on the twenty-third day of March, 1923, at the office of the said Commission at Pakenham.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charge.

1. The following Flood Protection Charge is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Lower Kooweerup Flood Protection District:—

For the service rendered to such district by the flood protection works constructed for such service—

(1) Of all lands in the first division, as shown coloured red on a plan signed and sealed by the Commission, and lodged at the office of such Commission at Melbourne, and authenticated copies of which are also lodged at the offices of the Commissioner at Pakenham and Kooweerup, the office of the municipality of Cranbourne at Cranbourne; the office of the municipality of Berwick at Pakenham, the office of the municipality of Buln Buln at Drouin, and at the Post Office at Cora Lynn—a charge of Twenty-four pence for each acre of such lands.

**RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.—By-Law No. 1276.—BERWICK URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE MORNINGTON PENINSULA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.**

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same, respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Berwick Urban District within the Mornington Peninsula Waterworks District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twelvepence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of fifteen shillings for the period hereinafter set out.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twelvepence in the pound of the valuation of such lands. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such lands shall not be less than the sum of Three shillings and ninepence for the period hereinafter set out.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof—one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

3. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the first day of January, 1923, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1923, and shall be payable on the twenty-third day of March, 1923, at the office of the said Commission at Pakenham.

4. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

5. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Twelvepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Twelvepence per 1,000 gallons.

6. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

  - (3) the ventilation and lighting of buildings,

"If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the Council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and other charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of such cattle, may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper, shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of such sale are not sufficient, after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs have been adjudged after the release or sale of such cattle, the same or so much as remains unpaid, shall and may be recovered from the owner of such cattle, in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by Justices are by law to be recovered, and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as may be necessary to give the adjudicating Justice jurisdiction, shall apply."

This By-law shall apply to and have the force of law within the undermentioned area of the township of Rosedale, and to such area only:—Commencing at the western junction of Queen and Latrobe streets; thence to the southern side of Cansick-street; thence along Cansick-street to the eastern side of Lyon-street; thence along Lyon-street to the northern side of Queen-street; and thence along Queen-street to the point of commencement, thus covering the area between Queen-street and Cansick-street, and between Latrobe-street and Lyon-street inclusive.

- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council of the Municipality for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.
- (e) Prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction alteration repair or renewal of buildings roofs or chimneys flues smoke vents or stove pipes.
- (f) Regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.
