COLBINABBIN WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES FOR YEAR 1923.

THE Commissioners of the Colbinabbin Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rate for the year 1923 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

On all the properties of £20 and over annual valuation, the sum equivalent to a rate of Three shillings and sixpence in the £1 per annum; all properties under £20 annual valuation shall be rated at Three pounds ten shillings minimum per annum. Vacant lands shall be rated at Thirty shillings per annum.

Such rate is hereby made payable, in equal moieties, on 1st January and 1st July, 1923, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

The charges for water by measure shall be Two shillings and sixpence per one thousand gallons.

KERANG WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1923.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 24, making a Rate for 1923.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or the owners of lands and tenements within the district of the Kerang Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house or tenement of the annual value of over Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling per 1,000 gallons will be charged, except in the cases of special agreement.

For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, if in the absence of a contract, on the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement. Minimum charge, One pound.

The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year, commencing on the first day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1923, and shall be due and payable on the first day of July, 1923. Such person, or persons, as the Commissioners of the Kerang Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the rates and charges hereby made.

MARYSVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Marysville Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1923 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Trust, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement on which a dwelling-house is erected of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.

2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Four pounds or under, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence sterling.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds, a rate of 15 per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds except where a meter is used.

4. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be charged.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.

6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

7. No service pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

8. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance on the thirtieth day of June, 1923.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION, BEING ALLOTMENT 1, SECTION 110A, IN THE PARISH OF BALLAARAT.

WHEREAS by Crown grant in respect of the reserve in the parish of Ballaarat for public recreation it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be at all times maintained and used as, and for a place for, public recreation, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Colony, now State, of Victoria for the time being, with the consent of the Executive Council thereto, and in the meantime, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the trustees for the time being of the said land and premises and for no other purpose whatsoever. And whereas by section 182 of the Land Act 1915 it is enacted that where under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands the Governor in Council has reserved permanently any Crown lands for any public purposes whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of the Land Act 1901, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section 1 of the said section. Now therefore we, Frederick Brawn, Christain Hager, Stephen Seward, William Robert Elsworth, Robert John Cooke, and Evan Jones, the trustees for the time being of the said premises, do hereby make the following regulations in respect of the said reserve in the parish of Ballaarat for public recreation.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is parcelled out into the divisions set forth hereunder, shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, as hereinafter provided:—

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences, gates, or buildings, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, gates or buildings, trees or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles in the reserve.
