5. Each licence shall be for the period ending on the 31st

5. Each licence shall be for the period ending on the 31st December next ensuing after the date of the issue thereof, but may be renewed by the Trust at its discretion from time to time in each case to the following 31st December. The Trust shall have power at any time to cancel a licence in the event of the holder thereof performing his work in an unsatisfactory manner, or committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law, and in such matters the Trust shall be sole judge. For each original licence the licensee shall pay to the Trust a fee of One pound, and for each renewal the sum of One pound.

6. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust.

Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the Regulations of the Trust, and with the sections of the Water Acts affecting his work; but the Trust may, if it so sees fit, refuse to grant his licence.

7. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening the ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, or who shall in

any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Trusty, woulds. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust. If any person shall neglect to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise as to the said Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service pipes from the main being the property of the owners or the occupiers of the tenement supplied by such pipes, the occupier (if any) and, if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall permit or suffer the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the

No person shall use or permit to be used on any premises any water for other than domestic purposes, manufacturing, or fire extinguishing purposes, between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m., nor shall he permit, except for the above purposes, any water to be used on any premises whilst the same is required for fire extinguishing purposes. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty of One pound.

 14. The maximum tapping that will be allowed (except by special permit from the Trust) for each size of main is as follows:—

18. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service pipes, either in the interior or on

the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of canoella-tion of the licence of the plumber, who by himself or his workmen, shall break these regulations.

19. A high-pressure screwdown stop-cock, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap, shall be fixed on each water service not more than three feet inside the building

No person shall fix of use any service pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with the basin or trap, or otherwise than with the cistern of a urinal or water closet. Urinals shall be provided with a two-gallon and closets with two-gallon cisterns.

23. All baths, sinks, lavatory and other basins, closets, and urinals served from the Trust mains must be of approved sanitary construction, and mounted to the satisfaction of the Trust.

24. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.

25. Each licensed plumber must report to the Trust secre-tary the completion of any new work, extensions, or repairs in connexion with any service within twenty-four hours of

in connexion with any service within twenty-four nours of effecting same:

26. The water supply of all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Trust, and any person not duly authorized who shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with the water supply, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding. PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES.

Regulations in connexion with the vote of Three thousand pounds (£3,000) for fencing and improving Public Parks, Gardens, and other Reserves, under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

A SUM of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows:—

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any Public Park, Garden, or other Reserve, having a claim on the vote, for every One pound (£1) expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such Park, Garden, or other Reserve, between 1st January, 1922, and 31st December, 1922, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for

Lands on or before the 1st day of May, 1923. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made on Form "A" and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form "B".

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and in-

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any Public Park, Garden, or other Reserve, from its own funds, for the fencing and planting of such Park, Garden, or other Reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January, 1922, and 31st December, 1922; but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the abovementioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by the Government at any period prior to 1st January, 1922. Government at any period prior to 1st January, 1922.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any Public Park, Garden, or other Reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1922 (vide Form "A"), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) they shall be reduced pro rath.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. The foregoing shall not apply to Parks, Gardens, and other Reserves within the limits of the City of Melbourne (except the Royal Park), or to the Albert Park, South Melbourne, and St. Kilda.

Whereas under the provisions of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, number 2339, entitled the Varram Lands Act 1911, the land described in the First Schedule to the said Act (of which the land hereinafter described forms a part) became vested in the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Alberton to be used for pleasure grounds or a place of public resort or recreation: And whereas the Council of the said shire has agreed to allow the Yarram Bowling Club to enter on and to use the land more particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written on and subject to the conditions hereinafter appearing.

1. In the construction of this By-law the expression "the said land" means and includes the land described in the said Schedule. The expression "the Club" shall mean the Yarram Bowling Club and the members for the time being of such club. The expression "the Council" shall mean the Council of the shire of Alberton.
