FIXING PRICE TO BE CHARGED FOR BRICKS SUPPLIED TO THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS AND THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

Explosives Act 1915.

ADDITION TO ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1 OF THE 12TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1909, RELATING TO THE CLASSIFICATION OF EXPLOSIVES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the ninth day of April, 1923.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.
Sir Arthur Robinson | Mr. Pennington.

WHEREAS by the 53rd section of the *Explosives Act 1915* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order define for the purposes of the First Part of the said Act the composition, quality, and character of any explosive, and may classify explosives: Now therefore, in pursuance of the above-mentioned provisions of the said Act, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth order as follows:—

There shall be added to the list of explosives defined and classified in the Order in Council No. 1, made on the 12th day of October, 1909, the following explosives, the composition, quality, and character of which are hereby defined:—

CLASS 3—NITRO-COMPOUND. DIVISION 1.

Blasting Gelatine, consisting of nitro-glycerine thickened with nitro-cotton, with or without castor oil, with or without tri-nitro-toluol, di-nitro-toluol, or di-nitro-benzol, or any mixture of these, with or without carbonate of calcium or of magnesium, and with or without mineral jelly; provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine is not less than 86 per cent.; and the proportions of nitro-body or nitro-body mixture, carbonate of calcium or of magnesium, and mineral jelly do not exceed 3 per cent., 2 per cent., and $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. respectively of the finished explosive.

Provided also that the proportion of nitro-glycerine may be varied to any extent desired on condition that if the proportion is outside the limits above specified, the percentage of nitro-glycerine shall be plainly marked on the outermost package.

Gelatine Dynamite, consisting of nitro-glycerine thickened with nitro-cotton, nitrate of potassium or of sodium, and woodmeal, with or without flour, with or without tri-nitro-toluol, di-nitro-toluol, or di-nitro-benzol, or any mixture of these, with or without mineral jelly, with or without castor oil, and with or without carbonate of calcium or of magnesium; provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine does not amount to less than 70 per cent. or more than 77 per cent. and the proportions of nitro-body or nitro-body mixture, carbonate of calcium or of magnesium, and mineral jelly, do not exceed 3 per cent., 2 per cent., and $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. respectively of the finished explosive.

Provided also that the proportion of nitro-glycerine may be varied to any extent on condition that, if the proportion is outside the limits above specified, the percentage of nitro-glycerine shall be plainly marked on the outermost package.

Gelignite, consisting of nitro-glycerine thickened with nitro-cotton, nitrate of potassium or of sodium, and woodmeal, with or without flour, with or without tri-nitro-toluol, di-nitro-toluol, or di-nitro-benzol, or any mixture of these, with or without mineral jelly, with or without castor oil, and with or without carbonate of calcium or of magnesium; provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine does not amount to less than 56 per cent. or more than 63 per cent. and the proportions of nitro-body or nitro-body mixture, carbonate of calcium or of magnesium, and mineral jelly do not exceed 3 per cent., 2 per cent., and $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. respectively of the finished explosive.

Provided also that the proportion of nitro-glycerine may be varied to any extent on condition that, if the proportion is outside the limits specified above, the percentage of nitro-glycerine shall be plainly marked on the outermost package.

Quarry Monobel, consisting of neutral nitrate of ammonium, nitro-glycerine, and woodmeal, with or without carbonate of magnesium not exceeding 2 per cent.; provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine does not exceed 11 per cent. of the finished explosive. Provided that the explosive is contained in thoroughly waterproof cartridge wrappers or cases.

Samsonite, consisting of nitro-glycerine thickened with nitro-cotton, woodmeal, and nitrate of potassium or nitrate of sodium, with or without oxalate of ammonium, with or without carbonate of calcium or of magnesium not exceeding 2 per cent. of the finished explosive, and with or without chloride of potassium or chloride of sodium, and with or without not more than 1.5 per cent. of tri-nitro-toluol, di-nitro-toluol, or di-nitro-benzol, or any mixture of these; provided that the proportion of nitro-glycerine does not amount to less than 56 per cent. or more than 63 per cent. of the finished explosive.

Provided also that the proportion of nitro-glycerine may be varied to any extent on condition that, if the proportion is outside the limits specified above, the percentage of nitro-glycerine shall be plainly marked on the outermost package.

- (c) The Council is duly empowered by these Regulations to fix by special order charges for the use of shelters, lockers, or other conveniences provided by the Council.
