RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE PYALONG PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act* 1915, the Trustees of the Pyalong Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say) :—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription of epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working days before the time fixed for the burial.

7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

8. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a Police Magistrate, or Justice of the Peace that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day; and on payment of the special fee as provided.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the Coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

11. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

REGULATION OF TOBACCONISTS' SHOPS WITHIN A RADIUS OF ONE MILE OF THE-MORNINGTON POST OFFICE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the shire of Mornington, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for the shop of any Tobacconist within a radius of one mile of the Mornington Post Office within the municipal district of the shire of Mornington to be kept open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week until the hour of Eight o'clock.

ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF THE STOREMEN, PACKERS, AND SORTERS BOARD AND OF THE SHOPS BOARD NO. 16 (HARDWARE).

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order adjust the powers of the Storemen, Packers, and Sorters Board and of the Shops Board No. 16 (Hardware) by depriving the said Storemen, Packers, and Sorters Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons who are employed in the business of a seller of hardware—wholesale or retail—in assembling ordered goods (other than goods kept in a bulk store or iron yard) and conferring such power exclusively on the Shops Board No. 16 (Hardware).

REGULATIONS FOR STORAGE OF PETROLEUM, ETC.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventeenth day of April, 1923.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the *Local Government Act 1921 (No. 3167)* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations applicable to the whole of Victoria, or to such municipal districts (including the city of Melbourne and the city of Geelong) as are specified therein for or with respect to regulating the keeping or storage of petroleum or any product of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable fluids and carbide or other combustible substances: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in

pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section of the said Act and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations, and doth provide that the said Regulations shall apply and have application throughout the whole of the municipal districts of the cities of Brighton, Brunswick, Caulfield, Coburg, Collingwood, Essendon, Footscray, Malvern, Northcote, Prahran, Warrnambool, and Williamstown, the town of Preston, the boroughs of Carrum, Sale, and Wangaratta, and the shires of Moorabbin, Towong, Upper Yarra, and Walpeup; and furthermore that such Regulations shall be deemed to be in substitution of any By-law or By-laws made by any of the said Councils of the said municipalities for the purposes for which these Regulations are now made, and shall take effect from the 1st day of May, 1923, except in the case of the borough of Wangaratta, when such Regulations shall take effect from the 1st day of September, 1923:—

REGULATIONS.

Storage of More than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or More than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

1. Every person who shall keep store or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises more than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all buildings shall be first approved of by the Council.
- (2) The buildings shall be constructed with walls of brick, concrete, iron or other non-inflammable material except that in the case of a galvanized-iron structure the lower portion of the walls must be in brick.
- (3) The floor of such buildings shall be made of earth, concrete or brick. The roof of such buildings shall be constructed of incombustible material.
- (4) To prevent outflow the lower portion of all walls to be without break or opening, the capacity of such enclosed space to be at least 25 per cent. of the total volume of volatile fluids kept, stored or retained in any such buildings.

Storage of Less than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or Less than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

2. Every person who shall keep store or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises less than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or less than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) In quantities not exceeding 50 gallons in the aggregate of any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto if such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of metal or other approved material including winchesters, so securely closed that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom and if all due precautions are taken to prevent accident by fire or explosion and to prevent the escape of any such volatile fluids into a sewer or drain, and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits stairways or adjoining premises except that a reasonable quantity not exceeding 12 gallons in the aggregate of the said volatile fluids may be kept in separate glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint so securely closed or stopped that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits or stairways.
- (2) In quantities not exceeding 250 gallons of petroleum or any product of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test provided such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of glass earthenware or metal and are suitably closed or stopped, and the position of storage will not menace exits, stairways or adjoining premises.

Precaution to be Taken when Volatile Fluids are Stored in Bulk Containers.

3. Every tank or other container used for the purpose of the storage or keeping of any volatile fluids shall when not in use be kept tightly closed to prevent the escape of such fluids or any vapour or gas emitted therefrom.

Precautions to be Observed in Buildings.

4. Whenever any person shall have in or upon or about any building or premises more than 50 gallons (or more than 12 gallons if kept in glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint) of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum turpentine or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test he shall observe the following precautions against fire:—

- (1) One 2-gallon carbon tetra-chloride or other approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be kept in such a position as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire and to be under the supervision of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade or the Country Fire Brigade where practicable.
- (2) At least two iron buckets or other suitable containers each having a capacity of not less than a quarter of a cubic foot, filled with dry sand shall be kept in position in different parts of the building so as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.
- (3) Dry sand shall be used for absorbing all volatile fluids spilt or thrown upon the floor and shall after being so used be forthwith removed from the premises.
- (4) The use of sawdust for absorbing the said volatile fluids is prohibited.

Containers to be Labelled for Retail Sale.

5. Any person who for retail sale fills into small containers on premises any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall have the fire fighting appliances as mentioned in the preceding section and shall clearly label such small containers with the name of the contents and with the following words:—"Highly inflammable. Beware of the vapours. Keep fire away."

Regulations not to Apply to Storage of Alcoholic Spirits.

6. Nothing herein contained shall apply to the storing of alcoholic (other than methylated) spirits.

Conditions to be Observed in the Construction of Tanks.

7. Every person who shall erect or construct any storage tank for the storage of more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine or other volatile fluids shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all storage tanks other than underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be first approved by the Council for that purpose.
- (2) Underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be constructed of galvanized steel plate not less than 14 gauge, and be placed not less than 2 feet below the surface of the ground or the lowest floor of any building. Sand shall be filled in over the tank to the level of the ground or floor as the case may require. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices to the satisfaction of the engineer. Filling pipes may be placed where the engineer approves, but so as not to cause any obstruction to the traffic when the tanks are being filled.
- (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete, or an earthen dam of approved construction; such wall or dam shall be in no case of less height than 2 feet higher than the level to which the oil would rise should it escape from the tanks. An opening may be made in the enclosing wall to permit access to the tank but such opening shall contain a liquid tight door either sliding or opening inward, made of incombustible material, and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear on such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall.

Power to Enter and Inspect.

8. Any officer authorized by the Council may for the purpose of securing the due observance of and compliance with the provisions of these Regulations enter and inspect any building or erection at all reasonable times and do therein all such acts and things as are reasonably necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and any persons who shall in any manner interfere with such officer in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence.

Offence.

9. Every person who shall contravene or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty.

10. Every person guilty of an offence under these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each succeeding day after a written notice of the offence from the Council.

Definitions.

11. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context, "approved" means approved in writing by the engineer for the time being of the said cities of Brighton, Brunswick, Caulfield, Coburg, Collingwood, Essendon, Footscray, Malvern, Northcote, Prahran, Warrnambool, and Williamstown, the town of Preston, the boroughs of Carrum, Sale, and Wangaratta, and the shires of Moorabbin, Towong, Upper Yarra, and Walpeup, or any deputy appointed by any of the said Councils of the said municipalities to act for him. "Council" means the Council of any of the said municipalities. "Person" includes firm, corporation, or company; and "volatile fluid" includes any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and also includes petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids mentioned in these Regulations that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test if such are stored in immediate contiguity with the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

Methylated spirits, benzine, petrol, naphtha, or any other products of petroleum or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour below a temperature of 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test.

DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS 1922.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Poisons Act 1920* (11 Geo. V. No. 3113), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following, which have been recommended by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1923, and shall be read and construed as one with the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1922, and shall come into force when published in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Regulation 17 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1922 shall be amended by inserting at the end the words:—

“Nor to any sale or delivery of any dangerous drug by a registered pharmaceutical chemist on the certificate or written authority signed by a duly qualified medical practitioner stating that any such drug is required for a person suffering from an incurable or malignant disease provided that such certificate or authority is dated and is delivered to the registered pharmaceutical chemist prior to the first sale or delivery of such drug and is retained by him and is attached by him to the prescription book opposite the entry required to be made by him under the regulations made under the *Pharmaceutical Chemists Act 1920* and provided that all such sales or deliveries are made within six months from the date of the said certificate or authority.”

3. Regulation 22 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1922 shall be amended by inserting at the end the following proviso, namely:—

“Provided that this regulation shall not apply to any potent drug dispensed or delivered by a registered pharmaceutical chemist on the written prescription of a duly qualified medical practitioner.”

4. Regulation 24 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1922 shall be amended by inserting at the end the words:—

“Nor to the preparations specified in the Schedule hereto when dispensed or supplied by a registered pharmaceutical chemist under the conditions set out in the said Schedule.”

THE SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

(1) Preparations for the eyes ears nose or throat containing not more than one per centum of cocaine or cocaine hydrochloride when prescribed by a duly qualified medical practitioner and when denatured by the addition of aqua formol or any solutions of adrenalin salts of zinc copper or mercury so as to render such preparation unsuitable for continued internal or hypodermic use.

(2) Eye drops containing not more than two per centum of cocaine for the purpose of first aid in any factory or workshop registered under the Factories Acts supplied on the written order of the proprietor or manager of such factory or workshop.

(3) Ointments containing not more than four per centum of cocaine or cocaine hydrochloride when prescribed by a duly qualified medical practitioner.

(4) Preparations containing not more than five per centum of chloral hydrate.

The foregoing Regulations were recommended by resolution of the Board at its meeting held on the 14th day of February, 1923.

I THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation vary the Proclamation made the 11th day of September, 1917, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the 19th September, 1917, re Prohibition of Fishing in Devil's Creek, &c., by substituting for paragraph 3 of the said Proclamation the following paragraph:—

3. The waters of the Moorabool Reservoir at Bolwarrah north of an imaginary line running in an easterly direction from a post situated on the northern shore of the estuary of the Devil's River approximately 23 chains easterly from its mouth to a post on the opposite shore.
