LAWLOIT WATERWORKS TRUST.

GENERAL BY-LAW No 1 FOR THE URBAN DISTRICT OF KANIVA.

THE Commissioners of the Lawloit Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following General By-law for the Urban District of Kaniva:—

1. *Notice to Install Meter within Seven Days.*—The Trust may by notice intimate to the occupier or owner of any premises within its Waterworks District using water for domestic and other than domestic purposes that the water supply is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within seven days from the date of such notice, and thereupon such occupier or owner shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide such a meter, and if any person neglects to comply with such notice, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 sterling. The Trust may, in the event of failure to comply with such notice, cut off the supply of water to such house or premises, either by cutting off the pipes by or through which the supply is taken from the main or otherwise and may discontinue the supply so long as such notice is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trust or its officers, and neither such cutting off of pipes nor the cessation of such water supply as aforesaid shall relieve any person of his liability to pay water rates during such period of cessation.

2. *Meters to be Tested and Approved.*—The Trust may cause a meter to be affixed in any case where it considers necessary, such meter to be provided by the consumer and fixed at his expense. No meter shall be affixed unless approved of by the Trust, nor unless it shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

3. *Syphons.*—Syphon pipes will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

4. *Where Meter Ceases Registering, &c., Average may be Charged.*—If the meter shall cease registering the Trust shall, during the time it is out of order or undergoing repairs, estimate and charge the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

5. *Unlicensed Person Not to Interfere with Pipes or Services.*—Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. *Licences to Plumbers to be during Pleasure of the Trust.*—Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and pay the annual sum of Five shillings as a fee for such licence. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

7. *Notice of Work Proposed to be Given.*—Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. *Notice to Lay Services, &c., to be Given.*—No service-pipe shall be laid for the purpose of connecting with pipes of the Trust unless two (2) days' prior notice thereof be given to the Trust, and no service-pipe shall be laid at a depth, of less than 12 inches below the surface of the ground in streets. The day for connecting private services to the Trust's pipes shall be Monday in each week.

Special Size Service.—No service of a larger pipe than half (½) inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the Trust.

9. *Service-pipes to be Repaired by Owner or Occupier—Penalty for Refusal or Neglect to Repair Service.*—If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the said Trust may deem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the occupier or owner of the tenement supplied by such service-pipes the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

10. *Waste of Water.*—Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds per day for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

11. *Special Provision for Steam Boilers.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

12. *Overflow to Baths.*—Overflow pipes to baths or basins will not be permitted.

13. *Sale of Meter.*—The Trust will upon the application of an intending consumer supply to him a meter at cost price for cash on delivery.

14. *Meter Reading.*—The meter reading shall be *prima facie* evidence of the quantity of water consumed.

15. *Testing Meters—Owner or Occupier to Give Notice of Removal from Premises.*—In the event of the owner or occupier being dissatisfied with the registering of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and together with such notice shall forward the sum of One pound which if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced or another meter will be placed instead of it at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the owner or occupier shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

16. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or neglectfully allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise; and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

17. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

18. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away from any drinking tap, trough, or public or private service-pipe any water shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

19. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

20. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

21. If any person bathe in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, which, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, has been required to be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply, or in any other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash, or throw or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, he shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. If any person throw or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome thing into any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any clothes or other thing, he shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meter laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said Regulations, and not otherwise.

24. The Trust may, by resolution at any ordinary meeting, from time to time limit the quantity of water to be supplied and may define certain hours during which water may be supplied and/or used. The foregoing to apply to the whole of the township of Kaniva, or any part or parts thereof as may be set out in the above resolution.

25. In the construction of the Regulations, the word person shall extend to and be deemed to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word Trust shall mean the Lawloit Waterworks Trust.

BY-LAW UNDER THE WATER ACTS.

ACTING under the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ararat hereby make the following By-law for the purpose of levying a water rate within the Water Supply District of Ararat as duly defined.

By-law No. 17.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling is hereby made for the year ending 30th September, 1923, on the valuation of each tenement built upon or to which water is laid on within the said Water Supply District of Ararat, with a minimum of One pound ten shillings sterling. On vacant allotments in streets where the Council's mains are laid, the rate shall be five per cent. on the municipal valuation of such allotments.

2. The foregoing rates shall be due and payable on the 15th day of February, 1923.

3. Such person or persons as the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ararat may appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

SHIRE OF CHILTERN.

BY-LAW No. 33.

THE Council of the Shire of Chiltern doth hereby, pursuant to and in the execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts Nos. 2747 and 2852, make the following rates upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Chiltern, such rates to come into operation for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1923, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1923. And the said rate shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance, viz., on the first day of January, 1923, and the first day of July, 1923.

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes:—

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of £10 and under—Ten per centum per annum on the amount of the 1915 valuation.

2. On every house and tenement of the annual value of £10, and not exceeding £20—One pound per annum.

3. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £20 and not exceeding £30—One pound five shillings per annum.

4. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £30 and not exceeding £40—One pound ten shillings per annum.

5. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £40, and not exceeding £50—One pound fifteen shillings per annum.

6. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £50, and not exceeding £60—Two pounds per annum.

7. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £60, and not exceeding £80—Two pounds ten shillings per annum.

8. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £80, and not exceeding £100—Three pounds per annum.

9. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £100, and not exceeding £150—Four pounds per annum.

10. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £150, and not exceeding £250—Five pounds per annum.

11. On every house and tenement above the annual value of £250—Six pounds per annum.

12. Water from the stand-pipe and public taps will be supplied to licensed persons only at the following rates:—

A licence to cart water for sale (with horse and dray) from the stand-pipes—One pound per annum.

A licence to cart water (with horse and dray) for use of licensee only—Ten shillings per annum.

A licence to carry away water from the public taps other than by horse and dray—Five shillings per annum.

13. Water for steam boilers will be supplied by measure or by special agreement.

14. Water troughs—Five shillings per annum.

15. Livery stables—Ten shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

16. Hotel, with stabling (not being a livery stable)—Four shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

LANCIEFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1923.

A By-law of the Lancelfield Waterworks Trust made under the Water Acts.

THE Commissioners of the Lancelfield Waterworks Trust hereby make the following By-law:—

A rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Lancelfield Waterworks Trust according to the valuation for the time being of all the lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Lancelfield Riding of the shire of Roumsey in which such lands and tenements are situated for one year commencing on the first day of January, 1923, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1923.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two portions or instalments, and the first portion or instalment of One shilling shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1923, and the second portion or instalment of One shilling shall be due and payable on the 1st day of July, 1923.

LAWLOIT WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1923 IN THE URBAN DISTRICT OF KANIVA.
 THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Lawloit Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1923 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Kaniva, as such District has been proclaimed and defined:—

- (1) **Minimum.**—Every vacant allotment of land whether occupied or otherwise and being on the pipe line, 15s. per annum.

Every vacant allotment of land within the Waterworks District and not being on the pipe line, 5s. per annum.

For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than fourteen pounds sterling annual value, the sum of Three pounds sterling per annum.

- (3) **On Valuation Above Minimum.**—For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile whether occupied or otherwise of Fourteen pounds sterling or more than Fourteen pounds annual value, an amount equal to 4s. 6d. in the pound on the amount of the valuation.

- (4) **Special Rates.**—For all tenements whether occupied or otherwise in the said District situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down and which tenements whether occupied or otherwise are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements whether occupied or otherwise are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, one fourth of the above-mentioned rate.

- (5) **Minimum Meter Charge.—Excess Meter Charge.**—Such owners as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of Three shillings and fourpence per one thousand gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment and at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per one thousand gallons for anything over that quantity.

- (6) **Public Institutions and Others.**—Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable or other institutions and religious denominations, shall be by measure at Three shillings and fourpence per one thousand gallons, or by special agreement.

- (7) **Irrigation.**—Water supplied exclusively for irrigation purposes to be paid for by measure in accordance with the charges fixed by this By-law.

- (8) **Water Rate Outside Trust's Area.**—Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of Three shillings and fourpence per one thousand gallons.

- (9) **Water Troughs.**—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 5,000 gallons per annum at Two shillings per thousand gallons.

- (10) **Interpretation Clause.**—In the construction of this By-law the word "Trust" shall mean the Kaniva Waterworks Trust, and "he", shall also mean "she."

- (11) **Excess Payments.**—Where water meters are affixed the excess payment shall be made at the end of each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Period of Rate.—That the above-mentioned rate is made for one year commencing on the first day of January, 1923, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1923, and shall be payable in one moiety due and payable on the tenth day of January, 1923.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1923.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

- The rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling (£24) and upwards (except in cases of meters and special arrangements with the Trust) situated within the Waterworks District of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1923.
- Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds sterling (£17) and not more than Twenty-four pounds sterling (£24) a rate of One pound fifteen shillings (35s.) per annum shall be payable.
- Upon properties valued at Thirteen pounds (£13) to Sixteen pounds sterling (£16) a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable according to the municipal value of such properties, and on properties valued under Thirteen pounds sterling (£13) municipal value per annum a uniform rate of Twenty-five shillings sterling (25s.) shall be payable.
- On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling (£10) per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.
- For any public water trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged unless supplied by measurement.
- For any steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangements with the Trust) the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse power of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also in case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.
- Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust for domestic and garden purposes will be charged for at One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per thousand gallons up to the amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises and at the rate of Ninepence (9d.) per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid.
- For water supplied for other than domestic purposes a rate not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons may be charged by the Trust or the Trust may make special arrangements as required.
- Ratepayers supplied with meters by the Trust shall pay an annual rental for such meters at Nine shillings (9s.) per annum.
- Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, show grounds, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be made by special arrangement with the Trust.
- For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant for each load of 200 gallons or under the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* on the above scale.
- For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs or additions, Twenty shillings per centum of the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or in the absence of a contract of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, according to clause 9 of this By-law.
- A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings shall be chargeable to persons using water for ornamental garden, or other like purposes, and any owner or occupier using more water than in the opinion of the Trust or its officers they are entitled to, the Trust may compel such owner or occupier to put on a meter, or may cut off the water supply from such premises. No water shall be used for any purpose whatever other than purely domestic use except between the hours of Seven o'clock and Nine o'clock p.m. or such other times as the Trust may by resolution determine.
- For each spray supplied with water by the Trust for the purpose of cooling houses or other like purpose the sum of Ten shillings per annum shall be chargeable in addition to the charges under any previous clause of this By-law provided such spray shall only be used between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m.

15. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5).
16. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1923 and are payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on 1st day of January and 1st day of July in the year or in one payment in full on or before 1st day of July, excepting those by measure and special arrangements which shall be paid quarterly or as the Trust may direct.
17. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

Railways (Board of Discipline) Act 1922.
REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day of January, 1923.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in the exercise of the powers conferred in that behalf by the *Railways (Board of Discipline) Act 1922*, make the regulations following (that is to say):—

PART I.—INTERPRETATION.

1. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Act” means the *Railways (Board of Discipline) Act 1922*.

“Commissioners” means The Victorian Railways Commissioners constituted as provided in the Railways Acts.

“Deputy” means a deputy of that member of the Board of Discipline, constituted as provided in the Act, who is nominated, pursuant to the Act, by the officers and employees in the railway service to be their representative on the said Board.

“Election” means an election for the nomination of a member or a deputy, or of two deputies, as the case may require.

“Elector” means any person who, upon the date fixed for the closing of the poll at any election, would, pursuant to the provisions of the Act, be entitled to vote at such election.

“Employee” shall have the meaning assigned to it in sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Act.

“Member” means the member of the Board of Discipline, constituted as provided in the Act, who is nominated, pursuant to the Act, by the officers and employees in the railway service to be their representative on the said Board.

“Minister” means the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Railways Acts.

“Officer” shall have the meaning assigned to it in sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Act.

“Railway Service” means service under the Commissioners.

“Weekly Notice” means the Weekly Notice published by the Commissioners for the information of officers and employees in the railway service.

PART II.—APPOINTMENT OF RETURNING OFFICERS AND NOTIFICATION OF VACANCIES.

2. Whenever it is necessary to hold an election to fill a vacancy in the office of a member, or a deputy, the Governor in Council shall appoint a returning officer, and such a number of deputy returning officers as he deems fit.

3. No person shall be capable of being appointed a returning officer, or a deputy returning officer, unless he is either an officer or employee in the railway service.

4. It shall be the duty of the returning officer to receive the nominations of candidates, to conduct the election, and to return the result thereof to the Minister.

5. Each deputy returning officer shall be under the control of the returning officer, and shall assist him at such places and times and in such manner as he directs.

6. As soon as may be after the said appointments have been made:—

(a) The names of the persons appointed;

(b) Their respective official addresses;

(c) A notice by the Minister in the form set out in Schedule A

shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and in the Weekly Notice.

7. Every such notice shall set out:—

(a) The date and hour fixed for the closing of nominations;

(b) The place of nomination;

(c) The date and hour fixed for the closing of the poll;

(d) The latest date upon which the return of the result of the election shall be made by the returning officer to the Minister.

8. The date fixed for the closing of nominations shall not be more than fourteen days from the date of the publication of the said notice in the Weekly Notice.

9. The date fixed for the closing of the poll shall not be more than twenty-eight days from the date fixed for the closing of nominations.

The date fixed for the return of the result of the election shall not be more than seven days from the date fixed for the closing of the poll.

NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES.

10. No person shall be capable of being elected as a member or a deputy unless qualified under the Act to act as such, and unless duly nominated in accordance with these regulations.

When an election for a member is held concurrently with an election for a deputy or for two deputies no person shall be capable of being nominated as a candidate at both elections.

11. No nomination shall be valid unless:—

(a) The wording and arrangement of the nomination-paper substantially agree with the wording and arrangement of the specimen nomination-paper set out in Schedule B;

(b) It names the candidate, his rank, position or grade in the railway service, and his official address;

(c) The person nominated consents to act, if elected, and signs, in the presence of a witness who must attest such signature, the form of consent at the foot of the nomination-paper;

(d) The nomination-paper is signed by at least ten electors each of whom states thereon his rank, position or grade in the railway service, and his official address;

(e) The nomination-paper is received by the returning officer at the place of nomination after the publication in the Weekly Notice of the notice specified in clause 7, and before the hour fixed for the closing of nominations.

12. A nomination shall not be rejected by reason of any formal error or defect therein if the returning officer is satisfied that the provisions of these regulations have been substantially complied with.

13. At the hour fixed for the closing of nominations the returning officer shall attend at the place of nomination, and shall publicly produce all valid nomination-papers duly received by him, and declare the name, the rank, position or grade in the railway service and the official address of each candidate nominated.

14. The returning officer shall declare the candidates duly elected if no greater number of candidates than the number required to be elected is nominated; but otherwise the proceedings shall stand adjourned until the polling.

15. If, after the nominations have been declared, but before the hour fixed for the closing of the poll, any candidate dies, or becomes incapable of becoming a member or a deputy, and the number of candidates remaining is not greater than the number required to be elected the remaining candidates shall forthwith be declared elected.

PART III.—THE POLLING.

16. If the proceedings on the day of nomination stand adjourned to the polling the returning officer shall immediately make all arrangements necessary for taking the poll.

17. In particular he shall—

(a) compile a list setting out the name, the rank, position or grade in the railway service, and the official address of every person who, on the date fixed for the closing of the poll, will be entitled to vote at an election for a member or deputy;

(b) assign to each elector a number, beginning with the number one, which shall be assigned to the elector whose name appears first on the said list, and continuing thence in arithmetical progression to the person whose name appears last thereon;

(c) provide a sufficient number of ballot-papers;

(d) provide a sufficient number of envelopes having his name and official address printed on the face thereof, and so constructed that they may be effectually sealed;

(e) forward a ballot-paper and one of the said envelopes to each elector at his official address appearing in the list mentioned in sub-clause (a) of this clause;

(f) make all arrangements necessary for the despatch to electors of the ballot-papers and envelopes aforesaid, and for the return of completed ballot-papers from electors to him at his official address.

18. Each elector shall be responsible for doing all things necessary to enable him to obtain delivery of the ballot-paper forwarded to him, and, if any elector does not receive a ballot-paper upon a date to be fixed by the returning officer and to be published by him in the Weekly Notice, such elector shall be bound to make application in writing, in the manner prescribed, to the returning officer for the issue to him of a duplicate ballot-paper.

19. Upon the receipt of such an application the returning officer may, if he is satisfied that the applicant has not in fact received a ballot-paper, issue a duplicate ballot-paper to him.

20. If, after making an application for the issue of a duplicate ballot-paper, an elector should receive the ballot-paper originally forwarded to him, he shall, upon the receipt of the duplicate ballot-paper, forthwith return the same to the returning officer; but if the original ballot-paper is not received by the elector until after the receipt by him of the duplicate ballot-paper, then the original ballot-paper shall be returned to the returning officer, and the elector shall use the duplicate ballot-paper to record his vote at the election.

21. Ballot-papers shall be in such one of the forms set out in Schedules C, D, or E, as is applicable to the facts of the particular case.

22. In printing the ballot-papers—

- (a) the names of all candidates shall be printed thereon in the alphabetical order of their surnames;
- (b) if there are two or more candidates of the same surname, their names shall be printed according to the alphabetical order of their christian names, or, if their christian names are the same, in the alphabetical order of their rank, position, or grade in the railway service;
- (c) where any similarity or identity in the name of two or more candidates is likely to cause confusion, the returning officer shall cause the name of each candidate concerned to be printed, with such addition thereto as will distinctly identify the candidate to which it refers;
- (d) A square shall be printed opposite the name of each candidate.

23. The despatch of ballot-papers to the electors shall be arranged so as to insure that each elector shall, by exercising reasonable diligence, be enabled to receive a ballot-paper in sufficient time to permit of his recording his vote and returning the ballot-paper to the returning officer before the hour fixed for the closing of the poll.

24. No ballot-paper shall be forwarded to an elector until it has been authenticated by being initialed on the face thereof by the returning officer or a deputy returning officer.

25. The returning officer shall keep an exact account of all ballot-papers so initialed.

26. To record his vote a voter shall—

- (a) in case one candidate only is required to be elected, make a cross in the square opposite to the name of the candidate for whom he votes;
- (b) in case two candidates are required to be elected, make a cross in the square opposite to the name of each of the two candidates for whom he votes;
- (c) forthwith sign the ballot-paper with his personal signature, which is to be written in the place provided at the foot of the ballot-paper.
- (d) enclose the ballot-paper in the addressed envelope forwarded therewith to him, and securely seal the said envelope;
- (e) hand the said envelope, with the ballot-paper enclosed therein, to his supervising officer for transmission to the returning officer.

27. The Commissioners shall assist the returning officer with the compilation of the list referred to in sub-clause (a) of clause 10, and with the despatch, carriage, delivery, and return of ballot-papers, and in particular shall afford him every facility for ascertaining the latest official address of, and effecting delivery of a ballot-paper to, any elector whose official address has been changed after the compilation of the list above mentioned, and before the hour fixed for the closing of the poll.

PART IV.—THE SCRUTINY.

28. The result of the polling shall be ascertained by scrutiny.

29. Each candidate may appoint one scrutineer to represent him at the scrutiny, but no person who is not either an officer or employee in the railway service shall be capable of being appointed a scrutineer.

30. The scrutiny shall be conducted as follows:—

- (a) It shall commence as soon as may be after the closing of the poll.
- (b) no cross appears thereon in any of the squares returning officers, and the duly appointed scrutineers shall be present thereat without leave from the returning officer.
- (c) All of the proceedings thereat shall be subject to inspection by such of the scrutineers as are present.
- (d) It shall be conducted by the returning officer, who shall decide which of the ballot-papers are in the proper form and which of them are informal.
- (e) Any scrutineer may object that a ballot-paper is in proper form or is informal, as the case may be. Thereupon the returning officer shall decide the objection and mark the ballot-paper "Admitted" or "Rejected" according to his decision, which shall be final, subject only to reversal by the Minister as hereinafter provided.
- (f) The votes recorded on all ballot-papers which the returning officer decided are in proper form shall be counted, and the number of votes given to each of the candidates, and the total number of votes cast shall be recorded by the returning officer, who shall then seal up the said ballot-papers in one parcel and retain the same.
- (g) All ballot-papers which the returning officer decided are informal shall be rejected by the returning officer, who shall record the number thereof, and then seal up the said ballot-papers in one parcel and retain the same.

31. A ballot-paper shall be informal if—

- (a) it does not bear on its face the initials of the returning officer, or of a deputy returning officer;
- (b) No cross appears thereon in any of the squares printed opposite to the names of the candidates;
- (c) crosses appear thereon in a greater or less number of the squares printed opposite to the names of candidates than the number of candidates required to be elected;
- (d) it is not signed by the voter with his personal signature.

32. (1) In the following cases, namely:—

- (a) at an election where only one candidate is required to be elected, and two or more candidates obtain an equality of votes; and
- (b) at an election where two candidates are required to be elected, and two candidates obtain an equality of votes,

the returning officer shall cast a vote for one candidate of those who obtain an equality of votes, and his vote shall decide in the case specified in paragraph (a) the result of the election, and in the case mentioned in paragraph (b) which of the candidates shall obtain the greatest number of votes at the election.

(2) In the following case, namely, at an election where two candidates are required to be elected and three or more candidates obtain an equality of votes:—

- (a) The returning officer shall cast a vote for two candidates of those candidates who obtain an equality of votes, and that vote shall decide the election.
- (b) A deputy returning officer shall cast a vote for one of the candidates elected pursuant to paragraph (a), and that vote shall decide which of the candidates at the election shall obtain the greatest number of votes.

33. No person engaged at the scrutiny, or who may be present thereat, shall, unless legally compelled so to do, disclose any knowledge acquired by him touching the vote of any elector.

PART V.—THE RETURN OF THE RESULT OF THE ELECTIONS TO THE MINISTER.

34. The returning officer shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the result of the election has been ascertained, but before the return date fixed by the Minister, and specified in the notice referred to in clause 8, return the result of the election to the Minister.

35. Every such return shall be in the form specified in Schedule F, and shall be signed by the returning officer and by each deputy returning officer.

36. The Minister shall, as soon as may be after the receipt by him of the return of the result of an election, report the same to the Governor in Council, and cause to be published in the *Government Gazette* and in the *Weekly Notice* a notice setting out the said result.

PART VI.—DISPUTED RETURNS.

37. The validity of any election or return may be disputed by any candidate at such election by petition addressed to the Minister, and not otherwise.

38. Every petition shall—

- (a) set out the facts relied upon by the petitioner to invalidate the election or return;
- (b) specify the relief the petitioner claims he is entitled to;
- (c) be signed by the petitioner, whose signature thereto must be attested by a witness, who shall in such attestation state his address and occupation;
- (d) be lodged with the Minister within fourteen days of the publication in the *Weekly Notice* of the result of the election or return the validity of which is disputed.

39. The Minister shall have authority to inquire into the prayer of any such petition, and may dismiss or uphold the petition in whole or in part, or make such order therein as he deems fit, and his decision shall be final and conclusive without appeal, and shall not be questioned in any way.

40. All ballot-papers used for voting shall be preserved by the returning officer until the election can be no longer questioned, when they shall be destroyed by the returning officer.
