Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE WHOLESALE GROCERS BOARD.

Notz.—(a) On the 23rd December, 1912, the powers of the Wholesale Grocers Board were extended to enable it to fix rates for persons employed in the business of a wine and spirit merchant.

(b) This Determination on the 17t. May, 1923, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1915 the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the business of a wholesale grocer, including a seller of tea, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 17th May, 1923, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

On Saturday, or the day on which the weekly half-holiday is observed. On the other working days of the week.

5.30 p.m. (4) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done:—

Outside the times of beginning and ending work ...

Within the times of beginning and ending work, in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed as a week's work in any week

(5) Time Rate.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 24 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum.

(6) Special Rates.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, then the special rate shall be payable only for the day so substituted.
