PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the thirteenth year of the reign of His present Majesty King George V., entitled the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1922* (No. 3260), it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on such day as the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* proclaim: Now therefore, I the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation proclaim the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, as the date on which the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1922* (No. 3260), shall come into operation in the said State of Victoria.

BY-LAW NO. 1279.—RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.—MITIAMO URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE LODDON UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Mitiamo Urban District within the Loddon United Waterworks Trust District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1923, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1923, and shall be payable on the first day of June, 1923, at the office of the Commission, at Pyramid Hill.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686), sections 16 and 35, and acting on a petition signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are on the municipal roll of the shire of Traralgon (notice of which was published in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th April, 1923), doth hereby re-subdivide the said shire into three (3) separate Ridings, to be named the

Central Riding,
Town Riding, and
East Riding,

the several proposed boundaries of which are herein set forth and described, that is to say:—

CENTRAL RIDING.

Commencing at the north-west angle of the East Riding; thence south by the western boundary of that Riding to the southern boundary of the shire; thence by the shire boundary westerly, northerly, easterly, and south-easterly to the commencing point, excepting that portion of the municipal district contained within the boundaries of the Town Riding.

TOWN RIDING.

Commencing at the north-east corner of the township of Traralgon; thence west by a road along the north boundary of the said township to the Traralgon Creek; thence northerly and westerly by that creek to the north boundary of lot 29, section 1, of lodged plan 4847, being part of Crown allotment 22, parish of Traralgon; thence west by the north boundary of lots 29, 22, 21, and 16 on the aforesaid plan to the north-west angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence south by a road being the west boundaries of lots 16 and 17 to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence easterly by a road 8 chains; thence south by a direct line to the Melbourne-road and further south across that road and by Lafayette-street to the Gippsland railway; thence by a direct line south-easterly across that railway to Mates-street; thence south by that street to Leila-street; thence east by that street to the Government road forming the east boundary of Crown allotment 49; thence south by that road to the road forming the south boundary of the township of Traralgon (known as Rose-street); thence east by that road to the Traralgon Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the road forming the north boundary of Crown allotment 83; thence east by that road to the road forming the east boundary of the township; and thence north by that road to the commencing point.

Whenever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether it is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

And the Honorable Samuel Barnes, for and on behalf of His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

DIVISION 14 OF PART V. WITH REGARD TO COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING MADE APPLICABLE TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS OF COUNCILLORS OF THE SHIRE OF DANDENONG UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 148 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1915 (No. 2686) AS AMENDED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1918 (No. 2981).

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-third day of May, 1923.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the shire of Dandenong, doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the riding) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
- (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
- (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
- (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
- (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides; and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.

(4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—

- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole riding the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

(12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
- (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-boxes or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

Deposit Moneys.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the shire of Dandenong of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

HARRYS CREEK-ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF VIOLET TOWN.

All that piece of land in allotment 57, parish of Boho, the boundaries of which are as follow:—Commencing at an angle in the south-western boundary of the said allotment formed by the intersection of lines bearing 298 deg. 56 min. and 317 deg. 16 min.; thence by lines bearing respectively 317 deg. 16 min. 796 links, 112 deg. 43 min. 403.4 links, 126 deg. 38 min. 437.4 links, 121 deg. 15 min. 475.2 links, 144 deg. 14 min. 490 links, and 298 deg. 56 min. 1,047 links to the point of commencement— which said piece of land is particularly delineated and shown coloured red on survey plan No. 1363 lodged in the office of the Country Roads Board.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Resolution of the Country Roads Board declaring a Road on a Site taken for a Deviation of a Main Road fit for use.

Whereas the land the site of the road the course of which is below set out was taken by the Board under the provisions of the *Country Roads Act 1915* for the purpose of constructing such road deviation which road deviation has now been laid out and formed on the same: And whereas the said Board (being the Country Roads Board incorporated under the said Act) thinks that the road aforesaid is fit to be used as a public highway such Board at a meeting now holden acting under the authority conferred upon it by section 58 of the said Act doth by this present Resolution hereby declare the said road deviation the course of which is described in the First Schedule hereto with the commencing and terminating points thereof respectively specified to be part of a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1915*: And the said Board doth also declare that such deviation shall

REVOCATION OF RE-DEFINITION OF AREA OR LOCALITY WITHIN WHICH THE DETERMINATION OF THE KNITTERS BOARD SHALL BE OPERATIVE.

EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN A RADIUS OF HALF-A-MILE OF THE CLYDE RAILWAY STATION WITHIN THE SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within a radius of half-a-mile of the Clyde Railway Station, within the municipal district of the shire of Cranbourne, of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, tobacconists' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1915) within a radius of half-a-mile of the Clyde Railway Station, within the municipal district of the shire of Cranbourne, shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) Nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
 - (b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday;
 - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT IN THE TOWNSHIP OF BEECHWORTH.

PROTECTION OF NATIVE GAME AT NUMURKAH.

PROCLAMATION

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria hereunder described shall be a locality in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1915*.

PART OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK AND GARDENS IN THE TOWN OF KILMORE AND PARISHES OF BYLANDS AND GLENBURNIE, KNOWN AS "THE KILMORE PARK."

THE Council of the Shire of Kilmore, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserves for Public Park and Gardens in the town of Kilmore and parishes of Bylands and Glenburnie, known as "The Kilmore Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Park, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Park, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Park, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll nor throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Park any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Park any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Park, nor erect therein any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall perform in any band or music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Park without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Park, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Park.

10. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Park, or other persons expressly authorized by the Committee of Management to do so, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees and shrubs.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Park on Sundays.

12. No person shall remove gravel, loam, or other soil, or remove any timber, whether for firewood or other purposes, from the said Park.

13. The scale of charges or fees which may be levied and taken for the agistment of live stock may be fixed from time to time by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed the following:—

For the agistment of horses—One shilling per week.

For the agistment of cattle—Ninepence per week.

For the agistment of calves up to 12 months old—Sixpence per week.

For the agistment of sheep—One penny per head per week.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations; and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not resist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

DETERMINATION OF THE BREAD CARTERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 31st May, 1923, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons whosoever employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in the business of a baker or seller of bread," has made the following Determination, namely:—

- (1) That on the 31st May, 1923, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—That 3s. per hour shall be the rate payable for any delivery on Sunday, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), King's Birthday, Show Day (in localities mentioned in the Royal Agricultural Show Act), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

- (6) DAY AND LATEST HOUR FOR PAYMENT OF WAGES.—Thursday, at 5.30 p.m., shall be the day and latest hour for payment of wages.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE ENGRAVERS BOARD.

NOTE.—(1) This Determination on the 2nd June, 1923, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

(2) The Engravers Board when first constituted had power to fix rates for any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business of a process engraver. This power was taken away by Order in Council dated 26th August, 1913.

(3) On the 2nd October, 1917, the powers of the Engravers Board were extended to enable it to fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of making (but not enamelling) metal badges.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of an engraver or die-sinker," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 2nd day of June, 1923, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
