CORRYONG WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the application of the Councillors of the Shire of Upper Murray for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust and for a loan, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, to carry out works for the supply of the township of Corryong with water, and doth order and appoint as follows:—

1. The construction of the said waterworks.
2. That the Councillors for the Corryong Riding of the municipal district of the Shire of Upper Murray for the time being and three other persons shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.
3. That the amount of the loan hereby granted to such Trust shall be Eleven thousand pounds (£11,000).
4. That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

PORTION 1.

Reticulation Area.

Commencing at the most westerly angle of the township of Corryong; thence north-easterly along the western boundary of the said township to the most northerly angle of the Race-course and Recreation Reserve; thence north-easterly across a road to the most westerly angle of allotment 2a, section O, parish of Towong; thence north-easterly along the western boundary of the said allotment 2a to its most northerly angle; thence north-easterly across allotment 1b, section O, and across a road to the most westerly angle of allotment 2b, section N; thence north-easterly along the western boundary of allotments 2a and 1a of section N to the most northerly angle of the said allotment 1a; thence north-easterly across a road to the most westerly angle of allotment 6b, section M; thence north-easterly along the western boundary of the said allotment 6b to its most northerly angle; thence north-westerly along the southern boundary of allotment 5, section M, to its most westerly angle; thence north-easterly along the western boundary of the said allotment 5 to its most northerly angle; thence south-easterly across a road to the most northerly angle of allotment 1, section P; thence south-easterly along the northern boundary of the said allotment 1 to its most easterly angle; thence south-westerly along the eastern boundary of the said allotment 1 to its most southerly angle; thence south-westerly across a road to the most easterly angle of allotment 4, section S; thence south-westerly along the eastern boundaries of allotments 4 and 1b of section S to the most southerly angle of the said allotment 1b; thence south-westerly across a road to the most easterly angle of allotment 1a, section T; thence south-westerly along the eastern boundaries of allotments 1a and 1b, section T, to the most southerly angle of the said allotment 1b; thence north-westerly along the southern boundary of the said allotment 1b to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of the township of Corryong; thence south-westerly across a road to the most easterly angle of the said township of Corryong; thence south-westerly and north-westerly along the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of the said township of Corryong to the point of commencement.

PORTION 2.

Pipe Track.

Commencing at the north-west corner of Crown allotment 2, section Z, parish of Colac Colac, being a point on the southern boundary of the township of Corryong; thence by a strip of land 33 feet in width south-westerly through the aforementioned Crown allotment 2 across a

road and through Crown allotments 1 and 2, section Y, parish of Colac Colac, to the Service Basin situated in allotments 2 and 3 of the aforementioned parish; thence by a strip of land 33 feet in width south-westerly through Crown allotment 3, section Y, across a road through Crown allotment 3, section W, across a road through Crown allotment 3, section U, across a road through Crown allotment 7, section E; thence southerly across a road through Crown allotment 8, section IV., and through Crown lands; thence south-westerly and south-easterly through Crown allotments 1, 53 and 54, section IV.; thence crossing the Corryong Creek; thence south-easterly through Crown allotment 1, section VII., across a road and through Crown allotment 4, section VIII.; thence crossing Corryong Creek and south-easterly through Crown allotments 7 and 8, section VIII., across a road and south-easterly and south-westerly through Crown allotment 1, section XII., all in the parish of Colac Colac, to the offtake works on the Corryong Creek near the northern boundary of Crown allotment 5a, section XI., parish of Colac Colac.

PORTION 3.

Service Basin Site.

A strip of land 4 chains in width and 4 chains in length at the junction of the pipe track with service basin and comprising the site of the latter and situated in allotments 2 and 3, section Y, parish of Colac Colac.

ADDITIONAL LOAN OF £5,000.

**Workers' Compensation Acts.
REGULATIONS.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Workers' Compensation Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the "Workers' Compensation Amendment Regulations 1923," and shall be read and construed as one with the "Workers' Compensation Regulations 1915," hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. After clause 73 of the Principal Regulations there shall be inserted the following clause:—

"73. When heretofore or hereafter an agreement of the kind in the last preceding clause referred to has been or is entered into between an employer and a worker in which agreement the maximum amount named as payable when death results from the injury and the worker leaves any dependants or the amounts specified as payable weekly during the incapacity of the worker have been fixed because of the requirements in that behalf of the law in force at the date when the particular agreement was entered into forbidding that the maximum should be less than the given amount repeated in the agreement which law then controlling is afterwards amended by fixing a higher minimum amount or higher weekly payments it shall not be necessary for any fresh agreement to be entered into between the parties but the agreement then subsisting shall be read and construed as amended as from the date when the legislative enactment took effect by substituting for the maximum amount of payments therein expressed to be payable such increased amount or payments as Parliament by the amendment referred to may have named as the amount or payments in respect of which the maximum fixed in an agreement shall not be less."

3. The Third Schedule to the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by substituting for the figures "£50" occurring in two places in paragraph 2 of the form of agreement the figures "£100," and by substituting for the words "Five shillings" in the same paragraph occurring the words "Twenty shillings."

4. Part II. of the Principal Regulations is hereby rescinded and the following substituted in place thereof:—

**PART II.—CONDITIONS ON WHICH APPROVAL TO CARRY ON
ACCIDENT INSURANCE BUSINESS WILL BE GRANTED.**

Interpretation.

21. "Insurer" means the Insurance Commissioner or any company approved by the Governor in Council as an insurer for the purposes of the Act.

*Compliance with Regulations a Condition of Governor's
Approval.*

22. For the purposes of section 37 of the *Workers' Compensation Act 1915*, it shall be obligatory for an insurer who desires to obtain the approval of the Governor in Council to comply with the conditions contained in these regulations.

*Governor's Approval to be Obtained and Deposit Made
Before Commencing Business.*

23. No insurer shall accept any premiums or carry on any new insurance business against liability in relation to workers' compensation to which employers are subject under the Act without having first obtained the approval of the Governor in Council and deposited in cash the sum as hereinafter provided with the Treasurer of Victoria.

Amount of Deposit Increased under Certain Circumstances.

24. Notwithstanding the provisions hereinafter contained fixing specific sums by way of deposit the Governor in Council reserves to himself the right (in the case of any insurer who is found under-cutting the rates of premium to be charged in connexion with accident insurance for the time being fixed under the Act for the State Accident Insurance Office or who pays commission above the ruling rates or allows excessive bonuses or discount on premiums or claims ratio (see paragraph 19) as a condition to his granting or continuing his approval of the insurer under section 37 of the Act to require such insurer to provide or increase the amount of his or its deposit commensurate with what the Governor in Council may consider necessary to safeguard the interests of policyholders against the contingency of the funds of the insurer being found insufficient by reason of the insurer losing or expending income in connexion with such under-cutting or paying commission or the allowance of such excessive bonuses or discounts.

Amount of Deposit by Insurer.

25. The amount to be deposited by an insurer shall be as follows:—

1. In the case of those insurers who have been transacting insurance business in this State for a period of at least five years and who satisfy the Governor in Council

that their paid-up capital or reserve fund (either alone or together), after providing for a reserve equal to £40 per cent. of premiums for unexpired risks, is not less than £25,000, the sum of of £6,000, provided that—

- (a) in the case of an acquired company, that is to say one whose business has been acquired by an approved company, whether the former is continued in existence or not; or
- (b) in the case of a company in which an approved company holds the majority of the shares or has become in any way able to control or influence the policy of the management,

the deposit required shall be £3,000 and no more, provided further that no company which has been carrying on direct business within the Commonwealth and which has been reformed or re-registered under the same or any other name, with or without additional powers (such company being one that actually or virtually replaces the old or constitutes a continuance of the old company), shall for the purposes of the concession be deemed an acquired company.

2. In the case of insurers who do not comply with the foregoing conditions, an applicant for the Governor in Council's approval shall submit with the application his or its last balance-sheet or statement of accounts and report together with any other information that the Minister administering the Act may in his discretion require. The approval of such insurer will be contingent upon the insurer's financial position being deemed satisfactory and on the insurer lodging with the Treasurer such sum as the Governor in Council may require which sum shall not be less than £6,000.

Investment of Deposit and Interest.

26. (a) Deposits which must be lodged in cash shall be invested in Victorian Government Stock for a period of seven years in the name of the Treasurer of Victoria in trust for the insurer. All deposits made on or before the 1st July, 1922, shall carry interest from the date of the deposit at the rate of £4½ per cent. per annum.

(b) The interest on all deposits lodged shall be paid to the depositor.

(c) The investment and redemption shall be at par.

Approval Operative for Twelve Months Only.

27. Any approval granted by the Governor in Council shall only be operative for a period not exceeding twelve months from the date thereof and shall on application be renewed annually should the Governor in Council so direct regard being had to the commitments and financial position of the applicant.

Deposit Primarily Charged with Claims under Act.

28. Any deposit made by an insurer under these Regulations shall be primarily charged with the payment or satisfaction of claims made under the Act which are not otherwise satisfied.

*After Seven Years Deposit of Certain Insurers may be
Returned.*

29. The deposit of any insurer incorporated under the law of any part of the King's Dominions may be returned to it after a period of seven years has elapsed from the date of the lodgment thereof at the discretion of the Governor in Council provided nevertheless that where any deposit has been so returned the Governor in Council may require it to be re-deposited if and when he deems it advisable.

*In event of Value of Securities Falling Short of Prescribed
Amount Additional Deposit may be Required.*

30. Should the Governor in Council be at any time satisfied that the value of the securities upon which any deposit is invested fall short of the prescribed amount owing to portion thereof having been applied for the purpose of discharging claims admitted or for which judgment has been obtained under the Act which are not otherwise satisfied an order may be made upon the insurer to restore the deposit to the correct amount. Should the insurer fail to make good the shortage such failure shall be a ground for the Governor in Council cancelling the approval of the insurer.

*Deposit to be Returned on Insurer Ceasing to Carry on
Business in Victoria.*

31. In the event of an insurer ceasing to carry on business in Victoria either by reason of the Governor in Council refusing to renew his or its approval or the insurer abandoning his or its accident insurance business in Victoria such insurer on satisfying the Treasurer that all outstanding claims and liabilities in respect of accident insurance business in Victoria have been discharged shall be entitled at the expiration of twelve months after the last policy has lapsed to have transferred to him or it any securities for the time being held by the Treasurer on his or its account under these Regulations.

And the Honorable Matthew Baird, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Factories and Shops Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR REMOVAL OF DUST FROM GRINDING, POLISHING, OR BUFFING WHEELS OR POLISHING BELTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of June, 1923.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations for the purposes therein mentioned and generally for the better carrying out of the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order, under the provisions of the said Acts, make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

The following requirements regarding the removal of dust shall be observed by the occupiers of all factories in which grinding, polishing, or buffing wheels or polishing belts are used. Provided that any exhaust system installed and in use prior to the 1st day of June, 1923, may be accepted as a compliance with these Regulations as long as the Secretary for Labour is of opinion that such system sufficiently carries off the dust.

GRINDING, POLISHING, OR BUFFING WHEELS.

Hoods.

1. Every grinding, polishing, or buffing wheel at which dust is generated shall be provided with a hood connected by means of a pipe to an exhaust fan, in such manner as to carry away the dust thrown off by such wheel either to some receptacle, in which the dust shall be collected and confined, or to the outer air; in the latter case the exhaust pipe shall end at a point not less than 6 feet from the nearest ventilator or opening leading into the factory, but if in any case that be not practicable, it may end at some point fixed by the Secretary for Labour.

Provided that an emery wheel on which material is ground intermittently shall not be required to be equipped with such hood.

Every such hood shall be made of metal or other suitable material and be so shaped and located in relation to the grinding surface of the wheel that the dust will be thrown into it and drawn off by the suction pipe attached.

Every such hood shall be constructed so as to expose the smallest portion of the wheel, consistent with efficient operation. Where work is being done which does not permit of the hood being kept close up to the wheel, then the hood shall be adjustable and the workman shall keep the hood as close to the wheel as possible.

Branch Pipes.

2. The minimum sizes of the branch pipes attached to hoods shall be as follows:—

Size of Main Pipes, Fan, Inlets, and Outlets.

3. The area of the main suction pipe at any point throughout its entire length shall be not less than the combined areas of all the branch pipes which have entered such main pipe up to that particular point. The inlet and outlet of the fan casing and the discharge pipe throughout its entire length shall be at least equal in area to the main pipe at the fan inlet, provided that smaller discharge pipes may be used if the permission of the Secretary for Labour has been obtained.

The main suction pipe should preferably receive only one (1) branch pipe in a section of uniform area, and in no case shall it receive more than two (2) branches in such section.

Arrangement and Construction of Pipes.

4. Every branch pipe shall enter the main pipe from the top or side, and at an angle not exceeding thirty-five (35) degrees; it shall incline in the direction of the air flow at the junction with the main. Branch pipes shall not project into the main.

Every branch pipe shall lead out of the hood as nearly as possible at the point where the dust will be thrown into it by the wheel.

The main suction and discharge pipes shall be made as short and with as few bends as possible. They shall not be within six (6) inches of the floor or ceiling at any point, unless such ceiling or floor is constructed of fireproof material, or insulated with fireproof material from the piping system at points of contact.

Every joint in the piping shall have the spigot end leading in the direction of the air flow and every increase in the size of a pipe shall be made on a taper and not by an abrupt change.

Every bend, turn, or elbow shall be made with a radius in the throat at least equal to one and one-half (1½) times the diameter of the pipe.

All pipes shall be constructed of not less than the following gauge metal:—

Size of pipe.	Gauge of metal.
8 inches or less in diameter	... No. 24
9 inches to 20 inches in diameter	... No. 22
21 inches to 30 inches in diameter	... No. 20
30 inches and over in diameter	... No. 18

Every pipe shall be kept open throughout its length and no fixed screen shall be placed in it.

A trap may be placed at the junction of the branch pipe and the hood.

No air outlet from a dust collector shall discharge into any workroom.

Suction.

5. Sufficient static suction shall be maintained in every branch pipe within one (1) foot of the hood to create a difference in level of at least two (2) inches of water between the two (2) sides of a U-shaped water gauge.

The occupier of the factory, by a test made with all branches open and unobstructed, shall demonstrate, in the presence of an inspector of factories, that such static suction exists.

No system shall be deemed to be satisfactory until such test has been made.

Clean-out Doors.

6. Every main pipe, whether suction or discharge, shall be provided with suitable clean-out doors so spaced as to allow the pipe to be thoroughly cleaned; the tail end of the suction main shall be blanked off with a removable cap.

POLISHING BELTS.

7. Every belt used for grinding, polishing, or buffing shall be equipped, as far as practicable, with an exhaust system so designed and attached that it will catch the dust at its point of origin.

The provisions of clauses 3, 4, 5, and 6 shall also apply to polishing belts.

PLANS.

8. Duplicate plans or drawings to scale, or showing full dimensions, and specifications showing location and size of all hoods, main and branch pipes, belts, wheels, fans, and dust separators, and the kind of work which is to be done, may be lodged with the Secretary for Labour for examination and approval as to design, whenever an exhaust system is to be installed, extended, or altered.

NOTIFICATION.

9. The occupier of the factory, upon completion of any installation, extension, or alteration, shall notify the Secretary for Labour.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BY-LAW NO. 214.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under the Local Government Act, and numbered 214, for the purpose of fixing fees for persons using and the management of the tennis courts provided by the Council in Albert Park.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne order as follows:—

1. The tennis courts in Albert Park shall be open for play daily, except Sundays, from sunrise to sunset throughout the year.
2. The charges for playing on the courts are as follows:—
Monthly tickets for males, 2s. 6d.; for females, 2s.
For casual players, per set, singles, 3d.; doubles, 6d.
3. The lessee of the kiosk in Albert Park is authorized to issue tickets and collect payment from all persons using the courts.
4. The players using the courts must exhibit their tickets at any time when requested to do so by the lessee or by any officer or employee of the Council or Albert Park committee, and players unable to produce such tickets must pay the fee prescribed for casual players.
5. All players using the courts shall have equal rights in regard to playing thereon.
6. Players upon arrival must register their names upon the notice boards at the Courts.
7. The right to play shall be in the order of registration on the board.
8. Should other players be waiting to play on the courts in their turn, the players then using the courts must make way for them at the conclusion of the set, then being played.

9. Tennis shoes must be worn by all persons using the courts.

10. Onlookers must not trespass on the courts nor interfere with persons playing on the courts.

Every person offending against this By-law will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 5.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1919 and of any other powers thereunto enabling them in that behalf the Council of the Borough of Carrum in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the said borough for the purposes of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction made the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws made by the Council of the Shire of Dandenong (from which the part of such shire now known as the Borough of Carrum severed) so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the said Borough of Carrum.

4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto an appliance or apparatus, which when closed effectually covers the seat of such closet or privy, whereby disinfectant and deodorizing fluid is automatically discharged into the pan in such closet or privy.

7. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in such appliance or apparatus a supply of disinfecting and deodorizing fluid efficient for disinfecting and deodorizing the contents of such pan.

8. The occupier aforesaid or the person having the control or management of the premises shall from time to time after the said closet or privy has been used close or cause to be closed the said appliance or apparatus and keep such appliance or apparatus closed on the seat of such closet or privy.

9. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

10. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be properly cleansed and tar painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

11. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

12. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

13. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty, of not more than Five pounds.

DETERMINATION OF THE SEWER BUILDERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination, on the 21st June, 1923, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed as Labourers in connexion with the construction of sewers" has made the following Determination, namely:—

- (b) On all work distant from the centre over five miles and up to twelve miles, 9d. per day or portion of a day.
- (c) On all work distant from the centre over twelve miles and up to twenty miles, 1s. per day or portion of a day.

“Centre” shall be taken to mean the Melbourne General Post Office for the metropolitan district, or the employee’s residence, whichever is nearer to the work, and shall in all other cases mean the chief post office of the city, town, borough, or shire.

(4) Shifts.—That—

(a) The hour of beginning and the hour of ending each shift shall be as follows:—

(b) The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by any employee before or after his shift shall be time and a half for the first two hours, and thereafter double time.

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year’s Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (1st April), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

DETERMINATION OF THE OVENMAKERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination, on the 20th June, 1923, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to “determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than moulders) employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of ovens, stoves, or ranges, or parts thereof,” has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 20th day of June, 1923, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

PROPORTION (IN ANY PLACE).

Apprentices.

One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 36s. per week of 48 hours.

Improvers.

One improver to every two or fraction of two workers receiving not less than 93s. per week of 48 hours.

An indenture of apprenticeship has been prescribed by the Board.

(3) OVERTIME.—Any male employee over the age of sixteen years who works for any time in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

(4) TIME WAGES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 24 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and a third per centum.

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines, under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 144 of the Factories and Shops Acts, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of ovens, stoves, or ranges, or parts thereof, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.
