Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE BEDSTEADMAKERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination, on the 29th day of June, 1923, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts: the cities of Bailarat, Bondigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warraambool; the town of Geelong West; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (including the moulders of bedsteads and excluding the moulders of fenders) employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of motal bedsteads or fenders, or parts thereof," has made the following Intermination, namely:—

(1) That on the 29th day of June, 1923, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

DETERMINE.—Juvenile Workers.—Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) who, if females, are employed as wrappers, or, if males, are employed in (a) chipping or easting; (b) wrapping, packing, or moving material; or (c) cleaning, heating, or closing tubes, angle or bar-iron.

- (3) Overtime.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.
- (4) Special Rates.—That double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, Good Friday, Eight Hours Day (21st 'April), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, but if any other day oe by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
- (5) Time Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours of an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one half the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and a third per centum.
- (6) Piece-work.—The Board determines, under the provisions of section 144 of the Factories and Shop's Act 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates fixed by the Board for such work.
