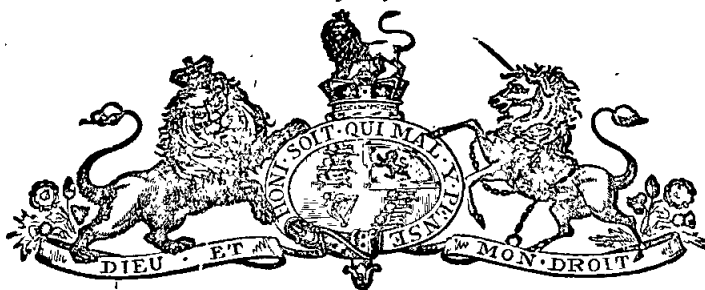

LEVEE.

Each gentleman should provide himself with a card with his name legibly written thereon, to be handed to the Private Secretary, who will announce his name to His Excellency.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Mitiamo Urban District within the Loddon United Waterworks Trust District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands in which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1924, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1924, and shall be payable on the 30th day of May, 1924, at the office of the Commission, at Pyramid Hill.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

- (3) Of all lands in the Third Division, as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Twopence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1924, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1924, and shall be payable on the 30th day of May, 1924, at the office of the said Commission, at Pyramid Hill.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. THE (ROYAL) ZOOLOGICAL AND ACCLIMATIZATION SOCIETY OF VICTORIA.

PROPOSED alterations of regulations adopted by a majority of the whole of the Council of the (Royal) Zoological and Acclimatization Society of Victoria at a meeting held at Melbourne on the eleventh day of February One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four in exercise of and pursuant to the powers conferred upon the said Council by section 8 of the *Zoological and Acclimatization Society Incorporation Act* 1884.

Regulation 1.—That the same be repealed and the following regulation be substituted therefor, namely:—

“*Membership.*—A subscriber of One guinea shall be entitled to a family ticket to admit himself and family to the gardens, for the financial year of the Society ending 31st December. But should he become a subscriber after the 30th June in any year he shall be allowed a rebate of one-half the subscription which would otherwise be payable by him for that year. A contributor of Ten guineas or upwards in one sum shall be a life member of the Society, and shall have the same privileges as the holder of a family ticket. Any person who has rendered special services to the Society may be elected an honorary member by the Council, and shall have the same privileges as the holder of a family ticket until such time as the Council otherwise determine, but shall not have the right to vote at any meeting of the Society.”

Regulation 2.—That the same be repealed and the following regulation be substituted therefor, namely:—

“*Election of Council.*—At the annual meeting to be held in the month of February in each year, three members of the Council (namely, those who have attended the fewest meetings of the Council since their appointment) shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election, subject to Regulation No. 10.”

Regulation 4.—That the same be repealed and the following regulation be substituted therefor, namely:—

“*Council to fill up Vacancies.*—In case of a vacancy occurring by the death or resignation of the president, vice-president, or honorary treasurer, or on the passing of the resolution referred to in Regulation No. 5, the Council may appoint from amongst themselves a person to fill the vacancy so occurring, and the person elected shall hold office only until the next annual meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election for the subsequent year: Provided that such vacancy shall not be filled up unless seven days' notice, in writing, shall have been sent to each member of the Council, stating the vacancies which it is proposed to fill up.”

That after Regulation 4 the following new regulation be inserted, and that the same be numbered 5, namely:—

“*Resignation of Office Bearers.*—A majority of the whole Council for the time being assembled at any meeting (of which at least seven days' notice shall have been given to each member of the Council specifying the intention to move such resolution) may pass a resolution to the effect that (in the interests of the Society) it is desirable that the president, or either of the vice-presidents or the honorary treasurer should be called upon to resign his office, and if thereupon such resignation shall be received then the Council may forthwith proceed to fill such vacancy as and in manner provided by Regulation 4 aforesaid; but if such officer shall not send in his resignation, in writing, within fourteen days from the date of the passing of such resolution, then the Council at a subsequent meeting duly convened (and of which, seven days' notice shall have been given to each member of the Council specifying the intention to propose such resolution), may pass a resolution declaring such office vacant, and may proceed forthwith at such meeting to fill such vacancy as if such vacancy had been caused by the death or resignation of the officer as referred to in Regulation 4 aforesaid.”

Regulation 5.—That the same be repealed and the following regulation be substituted therefor, and be numbered 6, namely:—

“*Eligibility of Members of Council.*—No person shall be eligible as an elected member of Council unless he be a subscriber to the funds of the Society of at least One guinea per annum, and any elected member of Council whose subscription shall be in arrear for three months after his subscription is payable shall cease to be a member of Council: Provided that this rule shall not apply to life members of the Society; and provided also that a month's notice, in writing, shall be sent to the member so in arrear before his place can be filled up.”

Regulation 8.—That the same be repealed and the following regulation be substituted therefor, and be numbered 9, namely:—

“*Moneys to be Paid to Treasurer or Secretary.*—All subscriptions and other moneys received on account of the Society shall be paid to the treasurer or secretary, who shall place the same in a bank, to be named by the Council, to the credit of the Society; and no sum shall be paid on account of the Society until the same shall have been ordered by the Council, and such order be duly entered in the book of the proceedings of the Council, and all cheques shall be signed by the treasurer as such, and be countersigned by the president or one of the vice-presidents, and by the director or secretary.”

Regulation 9.—That the same be repealed and the following regulation be substituted therefor, and be numbered 10, namely:—

“*Annual Meeting.*—An annual meeting of members shall be held in the month of February in each year, and the Council shall report their proceedings during the past year, and shall produce their accounts duly audited for publication; and the meeting shall elect by ballot the office-bearers for the ensuing year, and fill up any vacancy which may exist in the Council. Nominations for election of members of the Council other than existing members eligible for re-election shall be delivered, in writing, to the secretary not less than fourteen days prior to the date of the annual meeting.”

Regulation 11.—That the same be repealed, and the following regulation be substituted therefor, and be numbered 12, namely:—

“*Time of Gardens Opening and Closing.*—The gardens are open during such hours as the Council shall from time to time determine.”

Regulation 17 (Smoking Prohibited).—That the same be repealed.

Victorian Government Stock Act 1896 (No. 1468).

REGULATIONS.

IT is recommended to His Excellency the Governor in Council that all regulations hitherto made under the provisions of the *Victorian Government Stock Act 1896* (No. 1468), be rescinded as from the 1st day of July, 1923, and that the following regulations be made in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

1. In these regulations the word "attorney" shall mean an attorney appointed under the provisions of the *Victorian Government Stock Act 1896* (No. 1468).

2. Stock may be inscribed in the name of one person or in the names of any number of persons not exceeding four.

3. Stock may be inscribed in the name of a corporation if the Treasurer of Victoria is furnished with a certificate of incorporation or special Act of Parliament under which the corporation is established, together with a certified specimen of the seal of the corporation and a duly authenticated copy of any regulations governing the mode of affixing the seal.

4. Stock shall not be inscribed in the name of a minor unless jointly with one or more persons not exceeding three, who are of full age. When stock is so inscribed it shall not be transferred until the coming of age or the decease of the minor.

5. All powers of attorney shall be deposited in and all probates or letters of administration must be produced at the State Treasury, Melbourne, at least two clear days before they will be acted upon.

6. On the maturity or redemption of Victorian Government Stock the principal moneys may be paid at or from the State Treasury, Melbourne, or, if requested, at a Country Revenue and Pay Office—

(a) to any holder in the case of joint holders on the written request of the whole of the holders or their attorneys.

(b) to an agent on the production of an order signed by the holder or his attorney.

(c) to the credit of any specified account at a bank upon the receipt of a written request signed by the holder or his attorney.

(d) to a duly authorized agent of a corporation or to the credit of a corporation's account at a bank upon the receipt of a written request from the corporation under seal.

7. Payments of principal moneys may also be made through the post to any person authorized by these regulations to collect such principal moneys, on the receipt from him of a written application to that effect.

(c) putting up preserved meat or food products prepared from animal fat,

and all places in which these businesses are carried on in the said metropolitan district shall be closed for the whole of that day in each year.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BY-LAW No. 34.

A By-law of the City of Bendigo, made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act* as amended by section 10 of the *Local Government Act 1921*, and numbered 34, for requiring the erection and maintaining of proper fences upon all vacant land within the City of Bendigo.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo order as follows:—

PART 1.

Introductory.

1. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the whole municipality, which is hereby declared to be a populous and residential area within the meaning of section 10 of the *Local Government Act 1921*, and shall come into operation immediately after its publication in the *Victorian Government Gazette*.

PART 2.

General Provisions.

1. All vacant land shall be wholly enclosed by a substantial fence to the satisfaction of the City Surveyor, hereinafter called the Surveyor.

2. The Surveyor may serve or cause to be served upon the owner of any vacant land a notice in writing requiring him, before a date therein specified, not being less than fourteen (14) days from the date of such notice, to enclose whether wholly or in part only as specified therein, such vacant land with a substantial fence, constructed of such material and in such manner as is prescribed in clause 4 hereof.

3. Such notice shall be signed by the Surveyor, and service thereof shall be effected by delivering the same to the owner personally or by posting the same to him at his last-known place of residence by properly prepaid registered letter.

4. Such fence required to be erected shall be as follows:—

A substantial paling or picket fence at least five feet in height, with no greater distance between the palings or pickets than two inches, with good sound posts and rails.

5. The owner on being so served with such notice shall commence and carry out such fencing as may be required thereby within the time specified.

6. Such vacant land shall, after the completion of such fence, be kept enclosed with a substantial fence constructed of the said material and in the manner hereinbefore provided.

7. Provided that in default of compliance with such notice by the said owner within the time thereby limited the Council shall have power whether proceedings have been taken to enforce the penalty hereinbefore mentioned or not to enter without any further notice upon the said land and erect such fence, and may upon the completion thereof recover the cost thereof from such owner in any Court of competent jurisdiction and the same shall become a charge on the said land until paid.

8. Any such owner who has been duly served with a notice as above mentioned who refuses or wilfully neglects to comply with each and every requirement hereof shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Twenty shillings for each and every day subsequent to the day named in such notice during which such refusal or neglect shall continue.

BOROUGH OF CARRUM.

BY-LAW No. 9.

A By-law of the Borough of Carrum made under Parts 7 to 31 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 9, for imposing, collecting, and receiving charges or entrance fees from clubs, associations, or persons using or entering in or upon the Council's Reserve, known as the Regents Park Recreation Reserve, and also for regulating the conduct of persons whilst using or being in or upon such Reserve.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, and of all other powers thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Carrum order as follows:—

1. In the construction and for the purpose of this By-law "the Reserve" shall mean all that piece of land containing 9 acres 3 roods and 38 perches or thereabouts, being part of Crown allotment 139, Parish of Lyndhurst, County of Mornington, and situate between Edithvale and Aspendale, in the Borough of Carrum.

"Council" shall mean the Council of the Borough of Carrum.

2. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, or such other times as the Council may from time to time determine, except on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 1s. in addition to the amount of any tax imposed by law may be charged and taken for the admission to the Reserve of every person.

3. No person shall remove the soil under or about any tree, shrub, fern, or other plant or interfere with, cut, destroy, damage, or remove any earth, tree, shrub, plant, flower, fern, or other property of the Council.

4. No person who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall remain in the Reserve.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut or in any way damage or disfigure the buildings, fences, gates, or seats, or earth, or throw stones, or other missiles, or commit any nuisance in the Reserve, or leave therein any bottles, papers, cast-off clothing, or any litter or rubbish, or write or draw upon any buildings, fences, or seats.

6. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve without permission in writing of the Council.

7. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed, or laid out for plantation of trees, flowers, or shrubs.

8. No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation shall engage in or play upon, occupy, or use the said Reserve, or any part thereof, without the permission in writing of the Council.

9. No person shall engage in cricket, football, lacrosse, baseball, tennis, or any other like games in the Reserve or any part thereof without permission in writing of the Council unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play therein.

10. No person shall kill, pursue, worry, ill-treat or take any bird or animal in any part of the Reserve, or wilfully displace, disturb, injure or take any bird's nest or eggs, nor shall any person enter the Reserve with or use, spread or set therein any snare, net, engine, instrument or other means of taking or destroying any bird or animal.

11. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall lead or drive any horse or any carriage, cart, or other vehicle through the Reserve without the permission of the Council, and no person shall ride any bicycle in the Reserve except on any track set apart for cycling.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless securely held by a chain or cord and effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from pursuing, worrying, or disturbing any animal therein, and all dogs found in the Reserve not so held and restrained may be destroyed.

13. No person shall without the consent of the Council carry, use, or discharge any firearms in the Reserve.

14. No person shall sell, offer, or expose for sale any article or thing within the Reserve without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

15. No person shall in any part of the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult any Reserve keeper or other servant of the Council.

16. No person using any water tap in the Reserve shall neglect to turn off the same in a proper manner.

17. Any person behaving in a disorderly or indecent manner or using obscene language or creating a disturbance in the Reserve shall be liable to be summarily removed therefrom and to be prosecuted for such misbehaviour notwithstanding that such person may have paid for admission to the Reserve.

18. No person in a state of intoxication or not decorously dressed shall enter or remain within the Reserve.

19. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, seats, or any structure or erection within the Reserve.

20. No person shall within the Reserve, whether on his own behalf or for any other person, wager or bet or offer to wager or bet or promise to pay any wager or bet.

21. No person shall play any unlawful game within the Reserve.

24. No assemblage for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind or meetings of a like character shall take place in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Council first obtained.

25. No booth or tent or other structure shall be erected within the Reserve without consent of the Council.

26. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, regattas, or holiday amusements except on production of a ticket issued by the Council or any club, association, or person authorized by the Council to issue such ticket for admission—or by any club, association, or person renting the Reserve or any part thereof for the time being—duly authorizing the admission of such person, but no such ticket for admission shall be of any avail except on the date or dates printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated plot within the Reserve; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized to collect same.

27. Upon application to the Council any club, association, society, or person may be granted exclusive use of the Reserve or any well defined part thereof for the holding of cricket, lacrosse, or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, regattas, bicycle races or other amusements and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of this By-law, and shall pay to the Council or its authorized officer such charges as the Council may from time to time fix. The Council, however, reserves to itself the right to refuse any such application.

28. Upon application to the Council any person may be granted the right to use any part of the Reserve for grazing purposes, and shall pay to the Council or its authorized officer such charges as the Council may from time to time fix. The Council, however, reserves to itself the right to refuse any such application.

29. No person shall carry on the trade, business, calling or occupation of a bookmaker in the Reserve, and every club, association, or person renting the Reserve or any part thereof for cricket or football matches, sports, fêtes, regattas, or
