Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE FURNITURE BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 29th January, 1924, applied to the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the town of Geelong West; the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

Naccordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices, or rates which may be paid to any person employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of furniture or in repairing any new or secondhand article of furniture, usually made or partly prepared by cabinetmakers, chair and couch makers, upholsterers, wood carvers, frenchpolashers, and wood turners," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 29th January, 1924, the last previous Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
