5th. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable in one sum on the first day of January, 1924.

For funerals separate prices must be stated for adults, for children above five years under fourteen years of age, and for children under five years of age including still-born—one sum is to be stated for each, including interment, conveyance, railway charges, and all other charges whatsoever, except ministers' fees. For removals separate prices must be stated for adults and children under seven years of age.

Tenderers are advised to attach to their tenders lists of their business branches, specifying telephonic connexions, as accessibility and means of prompt communication will be considered in accepting the tenders.

Tenders must state the prices in words as well as in figures, without alterations or erasures.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board for £5 for burials and £5 for removals (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer withdrawing the tender before notification of acceptance, or, in the event of being successful, failing to complete the security or sign the contract within the prescribed period.

Security will be required, in the sum of £25 for burials, £25 for removals, Melbourne District; and £5 Bourke District, either in cash, Victorian Government debentures, Bank deposit receipt, or Savings Bank deposit book in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenders, indorsed "Tender for Funerals or Removals" (as the case may be), are to be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury; or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and tenders addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, which office they must reach by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The services are to be performed upon an order signed by a member of the Police Force. Under the *Cemeteries Act* 1915 (No. 2626), section 50, cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of poor persons buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased; *but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the deceased buried in private ground, while availing themselves of the Government funeral, they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.*

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.

4. The body shall be taken direct to the Necropolis, or to the New Melbourne Cemetery, as the case may be, by rail. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £10, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount shall be deducted as in clause 16.

5. Coffins for funerals must be waterproof and sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be made of 1-in. white pine timber covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws, and pitched in the seams to prevent leakage. The Contractor shall provide 3 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

6. In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctively offensive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water, or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc-lined coffins, hermetically sealed by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor, of timber 1 inch in thickness.

7. Bodies of deceased persons, with the exception of those provided for under clause 2, must be conveyed to the New Melbourne Cemetery, Fawkner, for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district north of the Yarra, excepting bodies buried from the Morgue, and to the Springvale Necropolis should the death take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra, including burials of bodies from the Morgue.

8. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and Cemetery Regulations.

9. In the event of the Contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the Contractor. Should any circumstance, however, make it necessary in any particular case that an immediate removal to the Morgue be effected, the hiring of another vehicle for the purpose will not be an infringement of the contract.

10. When burials or removals are required to take place on Sunday, or, in the case of any lunatic asylum, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the Necropolis or cemetery authorities in the case of burials will be repaid to the Contractor.

11. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the Contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the Contractor gives the order for interment. The Contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed at the time of the burial, and that he received the fee for so doing. Should the burial service not be performed at the time of the burial no reimbursement will be allowed. The receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

12. Bodies to be removed to the Morgue shall be placed by the Contractor before removal in shell coffins, zinc lined and water-tight, securely closed, and shall be conveyed in suitable covered four-wheeled vehicles. The Contractor shall send two men for the purpose of removing the body to the vehicle, and from the vehicle to the Morgue.

13. Every practicable precaution must be taken in order to prevent offensiveness from decomposition, but in no case of removal must any disinfectant be used without the authority of the medical officer performing the post-mortem examination.

14. Under no circumstances will the Contractor be permitted to use any undue or improper influence with the friends or relatives of, or any other person connected or associated with, the deceased person for the purpose of obtaining any concession or privilege whatsoever in regard to the funeral of such person. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, on report of the Tender Board, to the immediate cancellation of his contract. The decision of the Board as to whether any breach of the condition has taken place to be final and conclusive.

15. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

16. A refusal to execute orders, impropriety, neglect, or delay in conducting the funerals or removals will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, impropriety, neglect, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

17. Under no circumstances will a Contractor be permitted, to abandon his contract. In the event of the Contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and, in addition, the Contractor may be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

BY-LAW No. 68.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham, numbered sixty-eight, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (as amended by the *Local Government Act 1921*, No. 3167), for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole of such residential areas the erection, adaption for use of any building for the purpose of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. By-laws Nos. 55 and 65 are hereby repealed.

2. The areas within the municipal district herein specified shall be and are hereby prescribed as residential areas, that is to say:—All properties situate in the City of Sandringham having frontages to the roads and streets other than as set out hereunder:—

Hampton Ward.—Hampton-street, Linacre-road to South-road, Beach-road, Small-street, Railway-place, Small-street to the railway line, and Bluff-road.

Sandringham Ward.—Melrose-street, Station-street, Bay-road to Abbott-street, Abbott-street, Waltham-street to the railway line, Sandringham-road from the railway line to Trentham-street, Bay-road, Beach-road (excluding from Bamfield-street to Melrose-street), Harston-street, and Bluff-road.

Black Rock Ward.—Beach-road, Bluff-road, Balcombe-road, all streets abutting on the Black Rock to Beaumaris tramway route.

3. The erection (including the adaption for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements, within such residential areas shall be and is hereby prohibited.

Nothing contained herein shall extend to the business of dressmaker, milliner, or teacher, employing not more than three hands, or a single worker who carries on business in a private dwelling, and whose advertising on the property so occupied is restricted to an approved plate affixed to the front of the dwelling so occupied.

4. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involve the use of the adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council at its meeting held on the 28th day of February, 1924, and confirmed on the 8th day of May, 1924.

Health Act 1919.

SHIRE OF BET BET.

BY-LAW No. 9.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Bet Bet, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law numbered 9, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Shire of Bet Bet.

4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service. The orifice in the closet seat must be at least 34 inches behind the riser or casing more or less surrounding the pan; the space under the seat must not allow for a larger interval than 1½ inches between the pan and the seat, and it must be so fitted with guides and stops that the pan may easily be introduced into its proper position. The floor of the whole closet must be of approved material, such as asphalt, or concrete, or flagstone, having its surface impervious, horizontal

beneath the seat, but sloped forward from the riser to the front wall ½ inch per foot and nowhere less than 3 inches above the surrounding ground level. Access to the pan for the purpose of removal shall be from the exterior of the closet building. The space beneath the seat shall be provided with a fly-proof air grating situated in the lowermost part of the external wall and having a clear airway of at least 24 square inches, and an upcast outlet ventilator 5 inches in diameter extending from beneath the soffit of the seat to above the roof. The orifice in the closet seat shall be provided with a hinged door or cover.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the daytime, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by steam and tar-painted inside or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power in lieu of making a rate to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil, and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. The Council may exempt any premises within the Shire of Bet Bet from the operation of this By-law.

12. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 19th day of March, 1924, and confirmed on the 23rd day of April, 1924.

SHIRE OF BERWICK.

Health Act 1919.

BY-LAW No. 6.

A By-law of the Shire of Berwick made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered 6, for regulating the removal and disposal of night soil and closet pans.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Berwick make the following By-law:—

1. This By-law shall come into force on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. This By-law shall apply to and operate within the area of the Townships of Cockatoo, Gembrook, Nar-nar-noon, and Tynong, in the Shire of Berwick, as may be defined by the Council from time to time.
3. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health and the Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the boundaries aforesaid from the operation of this By-law.
4. Every closet shall be furnished by the Shire Council with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be and remain the property of the Council.
5. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Council may from time to time direct, the pan in use shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between such hours as the Council may direct, in a suitable cart.
6. An annual charge for emptying and cleaning of cess-pans shall be made by a resolution of the Council, under the provisions of section 54 of the *Health Act 1919*, such charge to be paid by the occupier of any tenement, and to be payable yearly in advance. Failure to pay the said yearly charge shall constitute a breach of this By-law.
7. A pan cleansed and disinfected by efficient means approved of by the Council shall be left in place of the one removed.
8. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth closet which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor of which is at no point less than 3 inches above the surrounding ground surface, and shall have requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, licensed public-house, hotel, factory, workroom or common lodging-house shall be paved or flagged with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination from the rise of the seat towards the back of the building of half an inch to the foot. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.
9. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on any street or lane.
10. The night soil removed shall be either rendered inoffensive or treated in a destructor, desiccator, or incinerator provided by the Council, or be trenched or ploughed into the ground in such locality as may be provided by the Council.
11. No occupier or person shall use a closet pan for depositing any house or yard rubbish or any other material in (except for deodorizing), other than night soil or shall damage such pans or lids.
12. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, charcoal or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night soil, and shall cause all night soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of such pan.
13. Every occupier or person shall not employ any other person save those authorized by the Council, for the removal of night soil, and no other person save those authorized by the Council shall remove any night soil except in cases of exemption.

14. Stringent supervision shall be exercised by the Council over all premises, which premises may be inspected by the Council or its officers from time to time, or any other person duly authorized by the Council.

15. Every such occupier or person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds sterling for breach thereof, or not exceeding Five pounds sterling for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom such penalties are sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

16. That all By-laws hitherto in force within the Shire of Berwick made under this Act, so far as they relate to any or all of the several things contained in this By-law are hereby repealed.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 24th day of November, 1923, and confirmed the 29th day of December, 1923.

SHIRE OF CHARLTON.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PARK AND RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF CHARLTON.

THE Council of the Shire of Charlton, being the duly appointed Trustees of the land reserved by three Orders in Council made respectively on the 6th day of November, 1876, on the 9th day of October, 1894, and the 14th day of December, 1914, as site for Public Park in the Township of Charlton, and being the holders of a licence issued under section 732 of the *Local Government Act 1915* for the river frontage abutting on the two latter of the three portions named above, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the whole area thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*.

Regulations.

- (1) The Reserve, which is parcelled out into the following divisions, viz.:—The Cricket Ground (10 acres) reserved on 6th November, 1876, and 2nd, the rest of the land reserved by Orders in Council, and that held under licence, shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge except on such days (not exceeding 30 in any one year) as the Cricket Ground may be set apart for cricket, or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the said Cricket Ground shall be such a sum as the Trustees may determine, provided same does not exceed Five shillings.
- (2) No person shall break, open any door or gate, or climb over any fence, door, or gate, or enter the Reserve in any way whatever, except through the doors and gates provided for that purpose.
- (3) No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- (4) No person shall damage, remove, or cut any of the trees, shrubs, flowers, flower-beds, tree-guards, seats, buildings, or other property in the Reserve, nor carry firearms, nor disturb wildfowl or game therein.
- (5) No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horse, sheep, or goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained, provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- (6) No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or a cord, without permission, in writing, from the Trustees first obtained.
- (7) No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, tent, booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

(8) No person shall conduct any sports' meeting, or carry out any business, or game in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

(9) No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sports within the Reserve on Sundays.

(10) No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or in or on any structure in the Reserve.

(11) No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein, which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

(12) Persons, renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit a sum, which the Trustees may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee, that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, or enclosure, and the Trustees in their absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Trustees.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any member of the Police Force, or any officer of the Trustees duly authorized on their behalf, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such police constable, or officer of the Trustees, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW NO. 17.

A By-law of the Shire of Korumburra (formerly the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho), hereinafter referred to as the "Municipality," made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and the provisions of Part 5 of the 13th Schedule to the said Act, and numbered 17, for the amendment of By-law No. 16 of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Korumburra do order as follows:—

1. That this By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and the day after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply only to that part of the Municipality described in Schedule 1 of By-law No. 16.

PART 1.

Erection and Renewal of Buildings.

1. For section 18 of By-law No. 16, there shall be substituted the following section:—

18. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Council or the Building Surveyor, build or cause or permit to be built any building or any addition to any building save and except as is now hereinafter provided:—

(a) In the area described in Schedule 3 hereto unless such building or such addition including the original building if otherwise in compliance with this By-law covers an area of at least 700 superficial feet in the case of residences and 300 superficial feet in the case of buildings used as offices and shops solely exclusive of all detached buildings, outhouses, &c., or where two or more buildings are built attached, unless each component and separate part covers an area of at least 600 superficial feet in the case of dwellings and 250 superficial feet in the case of buildings used solely as offices and shops exclusive of all detached buildings.

(b) In the area described in Schedule 1 but outside the area described in Schedule 3 hereto, unless such building or such addition including the original building if otherwise in compliance with this By-law covers an area of at least 400 superficial feet in the case of residences and 300 superficial feet in the case of buildings used as offices and shops, solely exclusive of all detached buildings, outhouses, &c., or where two or more buildings are built attached unless each component and separate part covers an area of at least 350 superficial feet in the case of dwellings and 200 superficial feet in the case of buildings used solely as offices and shops, exclusive of all detached outbuildings.

2. In sub-section (a) of section 19 of By-law No. 16, for the figures "6,000" there shall be substituted the figures "5,200."

3. In section 20 of By-law No. 16 for the figures "165" there shall be substituted the figures "150."

4. In section 25 of By-law No. 16 for the word "eight" there shall be substituted the word "six."

5. In section 60 of By-law No. 16, for the figures "10" where first occurring there shall be substituted the figures "25" and after the word "equivalent" there shall be inserted the following paragraph:—"Nothing in this clause shall prevent the erection of a privy, closet, or urinal on the building-line of any right-of-way not exceeding 33 links in width provided that such privy, closet, or urinal is more than 25 feet from the door or window of any dwelling-house, shop or office."

6. In Schedule No. 2 of By-law No. 16, for the word "North-western" there shall be substituted the word "South-eastern," and for the word "South-eastern" there shall be substituted the word "North-western."

7. At the end of Schedule No. 2 of By-law No. 16 there shall be inserted the following Schedule:—

SCHEDULE NO. 3.

Such portions of the Municipality within the Township of Korumburra as are included in the area described hereunder, namely:—Commencing from the intersection of Jumbunna-road and George-street with Guy's-road; thence along Guy's-road on both sides to the Jumbunna railway; thence along the railway line to Bridge-road; thence along Bridge-road to Gordon-street; thence along Gordon-street on both sides to Wills-street; thence along Wills-street to Station-street; thence along Station-street on both sides to the Korumburra-Warragul-road; thence by the Korumburra-Warragul road and Elizabeth-street to King-street; thence by King-street to George-street; thence by George-street to the point of commencement.

N.B.—Where both sides of a street are mentioned, it shall be taken that this schedule shall apply to any buildings built on both frontages of such street.

The Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the said Shire of Korumburra on the sixteenth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and was confirmed by the said Council on the twenty-first day of May One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.
