ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is herein-after set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million three hundred and seventy-five thousand two hundred and forty-seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.”

Given under my Hand and the seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this ninth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and in the fifteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1924.

THE Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

Rating By-law for 1924.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1924:—

1. For every vacant piece of land which has a separate annual municipal value of any amount, and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

2. For any shop which has a separate annual municipal value of any amount not supplied with water, and past which any water main is laid, the sum of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

3. For every house or tenement of under Fifteen pounds (£15) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound five shillings (£1 5s.) per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of Fifteen pounds (£15) and under Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.

5. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (£20) and under Twenty-five pounds (£25) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings (£1 15s.) per annum.

6. For every house or tenement of Twenty-five pounds (£25) and under Thirty-five pounds (£35) annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds fifteen shillings (£2 15s.) per annum.

7. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of Three pounds fifteen shillings (£3 15s.) per annum.

8. For every house or tenement of Sixty pounds (£60) and under One hundred pounds (£100) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds five shillings (£4 5s.) per annum.

9. For every house or tenement of One hundred pounds (£100) and over annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds fifteen shillings (£4 15s.) per annum.

10. For water supplied to any house or tenement upon which no annual municipal value is made, the sum of One pound five shillings (£1 5s.) per annum.

11. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.

12. For every public water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.

13. All public water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow; such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.

14. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste pipe from any private bath.

15. The Trust may by notice, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within fourteen days after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.

17. Every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice, in writing, to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

18. If any person who has provided any meter fail to give the notice required of any repairs required for such meter he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

19. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any officer of the Trust so to do, the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.

20. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall permit or suffer water to run to waste, shall be liable to a penalty, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who is in arrears with the payment of his water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or by any other means that are available, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

21. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the Trust for such purpose to request permission from any owner or occupier to make an inspection of the water service to ascertain if the water is being allowed to run to waste, and, if such occupier or owner refuse permission for such inspection, the Trust may, if it think fit, refuse to supply such premises with water; and such refusal on their part will in no way relieve the owner or occupier from payment of any rate or rates as may be levied on such property.

22. If the person appointed for such inspection shall ascertain that any owner or occupier is allowing water to waste by reason of leaky taps or otherwise, he shall be empowered to authorize the repair of such taps or pipes and to notify such owner or occupier that the waste of water must at once cease.

23. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such work, and such permission shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, who may at any time cancel such permission.

24. Any person, whether licensed or permitted as aforesaid or not, who shall require to affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or to make any repairs to pipes under the control of the Trust, shall give notice to the secretary of his intention to do so.

25. All connexions from the Trust mains to property shall be made at the expense of the owner or occupier of the property to be supplied, and all repairs or renewals shall, when necessary, be made by the owner or occupier, and such pipes shall at all times be under the control of the Trust.

26. All connexions, pipes, and fittings shall be of the best quality, and approved by the secretary and chairman of the Trust.

27. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises in any way it may seem fit until such repairs have been effected.

28. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

29. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose except under the direction of an officer of the Trust shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

30. For any breach of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be imposed.

31. The above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1924, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1924, and shall be payable in two instalments; the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1924, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1924. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

THE GLENROWAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-Law No. 13.

THE Commissioners of the Glenrowan Waterworks Trust, constituted under the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the By-law following:—

The following are the rates for 1924, which the occupiers or owners of lands, tenements, or vacant allotments within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect to every such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation and under, a rate of One pound ten shillings sterling shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence on municipal valuation shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land fronting a street in which a main shall have been laid shall be Ten shillings.

4. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water and being within a quarter of a mile of a main, one half of the beforementioned rate and where tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from a main one quarter of the beforementioned rate to be paid.

5. Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and shall be paid for at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1924.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Audit Act 1915.

GENERAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

IT is recommended to His Excellency the Governor in Council that under the provisions of the *Audit Act 1915* (No. 2616) the following alterations be made in the General Regulations respecting Public Accounts which were approved by Order in Council of the 23rd of December, 1915, that is to say :—

Sub-clause (b) of clause 36 and clauses 40, 48, 52, and 53, and Forms L1, L1A, L2, and L3 to be repealed, and the following new clauses and forms substituted in lieu thereof :—

“ 36B. To holders of Form ‘HA’ annexed hereto in connexion with the payment of salaries, wages, and allowances of employees of the Railway Department who are absent on leave or on duty or who have left the service.

“ ADVANCES.

“ 40. Heads of departments and other officers authorized by the Minister of the Department concerned may be supplied by the Treasurer in the manner hereinafter mentioned with funds by way of advances to enable them to defray salaries, allowances, wages, departmental contingencies, and other expenditure which it may be deemed desirable to defray from such funds.

“ From the 1st day of July, 1923, salaries, wages, &c., shall be paid fortnightly. In all departments other than the Department of Railways the day of payment shall, where practicable, be the second Friday in the fortnight, and the period for which payment is to be made shall be inclusive of the following Saturday. In the case of the Railway Department salaries, wages, &c., shall be paid on each alternate Thursday, commencing on Thursday, the 19th day of July, 1923, and the amount of each payment shall be for the period ending on the previous Saturday.

“ Should a public holiday fall on a fixed pay day payment shall be made upon the last preceding day upon which the Government offices are open for business. Payment of salary, &c., may, however, be made to any officer who has been granted leave of absence, on the last day of his attendance on duty prior to commencing his leave, provided that the period of leave shall extend beyond the next pay day.

“ Where wages are payable at a daily or weekly rate, they may be paid either weekly or fortnightly as the head of the department directs on the last working day of the term.

“ As regards pensions, payment shall be made on the last working day other than Saturday of each month.

“ 48. Fortnightly rates of payment other than those of the Railway Department shall be determined by multiplying the annual rate of salary by 14 and dividing the result by 365½, and in broken periods each day's pay shall be one-fourteenth of a fortnight's pay.

“ Daily wages, except where payment is to be made for working days, are to be calculated at per week of seven days.

“ As regards the Railway Department, the fortnightly rates of payment shall be ascertained by multiplying the annual rate of salary by the number of days to be paid for and dividing the result by the number of days (excluding Sundays) in the financial year (i.e., 312, 313, or 314, as the case may be). Wherever it becomes necessary to calculate the daily or hourly rates the daily rate shall be ascertained by dividing the annual salary by the number of week days in the financial year and the hourly rate by dividing twelve times the daily rate by the number of the ordinary hours of duty per fortnight. The first and last days of all periods shall be included.

“ 52. Accounts for salaries, wages, &c., shall be prepared in the following form or forms to the like effect :—

“ For single salaries, &c., on Form L1A annexed hereto.

“ For salaries, &c., of two or more persons, except as hereinafter provided, on Form L1 annexed hereto.

" For salaries, &c., of officers or employees of the Railway Department, on Form L1B or Form L1E annexed hereto.

" For salaries, &c., of employees of the Government Printing Office, Lunacy, and Penal Departments, General Division, on Form L1C or Form L1D annexed hereto.

" For salaries of officers of the Taxation Office, on Form L1F annexed hereto.

" Accounts for contingencies shall be prepared on Form L2 annexed hereto.

" 53. With the view of diminishing the number of accounts, Government officers having claims for salaries and allowances which relate to one and the same department and are due at the same time, may include such claims in one account provided that the items in the accounts are classified in accordance with the terms of appropriation funds or accounts to which the claims are severally chargeable."

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of section 24 (b) of the Education Act 1915 (No. 2644), doth hereby rescind clauses 31, 32 (b), (c), 33 (a), (d), (e), (f), 36 and 42 of Regulation XXI.—Scholarships, of the Regulations under the Education Act 1915, and substitutes in lieu thereof the following clauses, that is to say:—

FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

31: There shall be awarded annually seventy-five free places, or any less number, at the University of Melbourne, of which

(a) Twenty shall be open to applicants in attendance at district high schools, technical schools, or registered secondary schools, and shall be tenable for the full length of a course for a degree, diploma, or licence in agriculture, metallurgy, mining, or veterinary science;

(b) fifty shall be open to applicants in attendance at district high schools, technical schools, or registered secondary schools, and shall be tenable for the full length of a course for any degree, diploma, or licence;

(c) five shall be open to persons (other than teachers in the Education Department) in the employment of the Government of Victoria, and shall be tenable for the full length of a course for any degree, diploma, or licence;

Notwithstanding anything contained in this regulation ten of the free places under sub-clauses (a) and (b) of this clause may be awarded to applicants who are not in attendance at district high schools, technical schools, or registered secondary schools.

32. (b) The free places shall be tenable under the conditions prescribed in clause 10 above provided, also that holders of free places under clause 31 (c) above shall, on the reports of the Permanent Heads of the Departments in which they are employed, perform their official duties satisfactorily;

(c) Every person awarded a free place under clause 31 (c) above shall be granted the necessary leave of absence to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations in the subjects of his course, and will be required to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety that he will remain and continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the period of three years next after the termination of his free place and, if his free place extends over more than three years, an additional year for each year by which the term of his free place exceeds three years.

33. (a) Applications for free places must be made on a prescribed form before the first day of December in each year.

(d) The awards of free places under clause 31 (a) and (b) above shall be based on the age, suitability, and school records of the applicants and on the circumstances of their parents or guardians, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview with selected applicants.

(c) The awards of free places under clause 31 (c) above shall be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants and on the reports and recommendations of the Permanent Heads of the Departments in which they are employed, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview with selected applicants.

36. Except in special cases approved by the Minister, no scholarship under clause 1, 7, 12, 17, 22, or 23 above, and no free place under clause 31 (a) and (b) above shall be awarded to any candidate or applicant who, during the two years immediately preceding the first day of January in the year in which the scholarship or free place is awarded, has not been in continuous and regular attendance at a school in Victoria.

42. (a) On the production of satisfactory evidence, any holder of a scholarship may, on the certificate of the Director, have his scholarship suspended by the Minister for a period up to one year, and, if necessary, for a further period.

- (b) On the production of satisfactory evidence, any holder of a free place may, on the certificate of the Director, have his free place suspended by the Minister for a period up to one year, and, if necessary, for a further period, provided, however, that a suspension shall not be granted during the first year of the free place.

AMENDED REGULATION IN LIEU OF REGULATION No. 8 OF THE REGULATIONS MADE FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ROYAL PARK, IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE.

WE Alexander Bruce Lang, Joseph Martin Reed, James George Membrey, William Tyson Kendall, Alexander Tait, and Augustus Albert Peverill, being a majority of the trustees for the time being of the Reserve for Public Parks together known as "the Royal Park" (hereinafter referred to as "the Park"), in the City of Melbourne, do hereby in exercise of and pursuant to the powers conferred upon us by the Crown grants thereof, and by section 182 of the *Land Act* 1915, make the following Regulation in respect thereof (such Regulation being in lieu of Regulation No. 8 of the Regulations made by the trustees of the said park pursuant to the powers aforesaid on the 11th day of June, 1917, and which said Regulation No. 8 is hereby repealed and annulled).

REGULATION.

No. 8.—No person shall without the authority in writing of the trustees first obtained sell or offer for sale in the park any article of any description and no person shall bring carry or take into the park any fermented or spirituous liquors nor shall any person consume or drink the same in the park nor be found therein having any fermented or spirituous liquors in his possession or under his control.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall in accordance with section 182 of the *Land Act* 1915 for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds and

every person who so offends and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or officer or servant of such trustees or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff officer or servant or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

CITY OF HAWTHORN.

BY-LAW No. 91.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under the *Health Act 1919* and numbered 91 for repealing By-law numbered 43, and for providing that every closet be furnished with a double-pan service or other service approved by the Commission, requiring for each closet the supply of a sufficient number of receptacles for night-soil and prescribing the size and shape of and the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles, the disinfecting deodorizing and cleansing of sanitary conveniences, the removal replacement cleansing and disinfecting of receptacles for night-soil and the use of deodorants or disinfectants in such receptacles or in sanitary conveniences, providing that the utensils receptacles and vehicles used for the removal or carriage through the streets of any night-soil or offensive or noxious matter or liquid whether into or out of or through the municipal district shall be properly constructed and covered so as to prevent any leakage therefrom or the escape of any such matter or of any offensive effluvia, and compelling the cleansing of any place whereon such night-soil matter or liquid has been dropped or spilt in such removal or carriage.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919* and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. The By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under the *Health Act 1890* and section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890* and numbered 43 is hereby repealed.

2. No closet or privy shall be provided with a trap door or opening in the wall thereof for the removal of the pan or receptacle but shall be provided with a properly hinged seat to permit of the pan or receptacles being readily and conveniently removed by the Council's contractor and shall be so constructed that when not in use flies will be effectually prevented from gaining access to the contents of such pan or receptacle. Suitable guides shall be provided to ensure the accurate position of the pan beneath the seat to prevent fouling of the floor. The seat shall be placed at such height above the floor as will provide a space of not more than one inch between the under surface of the seat and the top of the pan, and such seat shall be provided with a close fitting properly hinged lid.

3. (a) The builder or contractor for any buildings or additions to buildings in course of erection in the City of Hawthorn shall when required by the Council provide at his own expense proper closet accommodation for the workmen employed thereon, consisting of a properly sewered closet or other approved system or a pan or receptacle similar to that described in clause 5 (a) of this By-law placed in a moveable box closet of wood or galvanized-iron with a seat or lid constructed and enclosed to the satisfaction of the Council so that when not in use flies will be effectually prevented from gaining access to the contents of such pan, and so fitted that the pan shall remain in accurate position beneath the seat to prevent fouling of the floor upon which such pan rests.

(b) The pan and seat as prescribed shall be placed in a closet or shelter constructed of wood or iron screened from the view of the public and of residents to the satisfaction of the Council.

(c) The closet or shelter and the seat therein shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition.

4. The occupier of every building and the builder or contractor for any buildings or additions to buildings in course of erection within the City of Hawthorn, not connected with the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works sewerage system, shall furnish every closet attached thereto or used in connexion therewith, with a double-pan service, or other approved system.

5. (a) The occupier of every building and the builder or contractor for any building or additions to buildings in course of erection within the City of Hawthorn shall cause to be placed in every such closet a pan constructed of galvanized-iron properly rivetted and soldered so as to be perfectly water-tight and provided with an air-tight lid and of such shape as will admit of its being fitted with such air-tight lid, and of a capacity of not less than two cubic feet and not exceeding two cubic feet, and having handles firmly fixed thereto.

(b) Every such pan shall be of the form of the approved pattern lying at the Council's dépôt.

(c) Every such pan shall be emptied and cleansed by the Council's contractor at least once each week and from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such pan have accumulated therein as to be within a distance of three inches from the top of the pan.

(d) Such occupier builder or contractor shall daily place or cause to be placed in such pan or receptacle in use a quantity of lime, blue oil, kerosene, turpentine oil, or some other effective disinfectant and deodorant sufficient to effectually disinfect and deodorise such pan and the contents thereof.

6. No such occupier builder or contractor shall allow any pan attached to or used in connexion with any building within the City of Hawthorn to have connected therewith or attached thereto any pipe or other appliance capable of being used for the purpose of discharging or removing any of the contents of such pan upon or under the surface of any adjoining land or into any drain or sewer other than the drains or sewers of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works or the drains or sewers provided in connexion with some other approved system.

7. The occupier of any building or the builder or contractor for any building or additions to any buildings in course of erection, at which any pan service is so provided shall pay to the Council for such service such amount as may from time to time be fixed by the Council.

8. No person shall drive conduct have or take through in upon or along any of the roads or streets within the City of Hawthorn anything having upon any external part thereof any night-soil or anything having night-soil upon it.

9. All utensils receptacles and vehicles used for the removal or carriage of any night-soil or offensive or noxious matter or liquid through any street whether into or out of or through the municipal district shall be properly constructed and covered so as to prevent any leakage therefrom or the escape of any such matter or of any offensive effluvia and any place whereon such night-soil matter or liquid has been dropped or spilt in such removal or carriage shall be effectually cleansed by the person having the charge or control of such utensil receptacle and/or vehicle.

10. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Hawthorn.

SHIRE OF METCALFE.

BY-LAW No. 27.

A By-law of the Shire of Metcalfe, made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1915 for preventing damage and obstruction by cattle to the roads and footways of the municipality, and for prohibiting cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon any land not being enclosed with a substantial fence.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Metcalfe order as follows:—

1. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle belonging to him or under his care or control to be at large in any public highway, public or private road or street, or any reserve or public place within the Shire of Metcalfe, or to graze over or upon any public highway, public or private road, street or footway, or any reserve or public place within the said Shire, nor while being driven to or from any paddock or place within the said Shire, to unnecessarily loiter or linger on such public highway, public or private road or street, or reserve or public place.

2. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle belonging to him or under his care or control to graze or wander upon any land within the said Shire not being enclosed by a substantial fence.

3. No person shall lead, ride, or drive any animal over or upon any footway within the said Shire, save at some proper crossing which has been provided by the Council.

4. In the interpretation of this By-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females and the singular to include the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include corporation, and the word "cattle" shall include horses, mares, fillies, fowls, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats and swine.

5. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding £5, nor less than Twenty shillings.
