ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million two hundred and seventy-five thousand and fifty-one pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five."

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Five hundred and eighty-two thousand two hundred and sixty pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four."

"An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Country Roads and for Irrigation Works and Water Supply and for the purposes of Works and Undertakings of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria."

6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any watercourse, or so as to obstruct any road or track.

7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, a valid reason.

8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.

9. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt., in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.

10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.

12. No live trees, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.

13. The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Forests Commission shall have power to absolutely forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown, and to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of avoidance. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Chairman being made known.

CITY OF ESSENDON.

BY-LAW No. 50.

A By-law of the City of Essendon made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915* and section 10 of the *Local Government Act 1921*, and numbered 50, for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole of such residential areas the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of such trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements as are specified in this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 46 of the City of Essendon is hereby repealed, provided that such repeal shall not prejudice or affect any prosecution for any act or omission in contravention of such By-law prior to the commencement of this By-law.

2. In this By-law, and in the definitions and schedules thereto, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

Alignment means the line where a public or private street or road joins land which is not part of a public or private street or road.

Depth means the distance from the alignment of a public or private street or road measured where any part of such alignment is straight at right angles thereto, and where any part of such alignment be curved at right angles to the tangent of such curve, and so measured on the side of such alignment further from such street or road.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural, and the plural the singular, unless the contrary as to gender or number is expressly provided.

3. All areas in the municipal district of the City of Essendon, except the areas set forth in Schedule A hereto, shall be and are hereby prescribed as residential areas.

4. The erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of any of the classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements as are specified in Schedule B hereto within the whole of the said residential areas shall be and is hereby prohibited. Provided, however, that the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purposes of the business of horse trainer or horse training within the areas set forth in Schedule C hereto are excepted from the prohibition imposed hereby.

5. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Essendon.

CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

By-LAW No. 72.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham, made under Part 7, Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, numbered 72, for regulating traffic in all streets of the said city wherein tramway services are in operation.

"Vehicle" in this By-law means any vehicle propelled by steam, gas, oil, electricity, or other mechanical power and used or intended for use on any public highway, and includes motor cycle, also any horse-drawn vehicle, bicycle, and the such like.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the afore-mentioned Act, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham order as follows:—

1. No person shall allow any vehicle or part thereof, or any animal attached to any such vehicle, to be or pass between the nearest kerb line of any street and any stationary tramcar while passengers are alighting or boarding such tramcar.

This By-law shall have operation in all streets of the City of Sandringham where tramway services are in operation, and shall come into force on and after publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20 (Twenty pounds).
