Resolution of the Country Roads Board declaring Road on Site taken for a Deviation of a Developmental Road fit for use.

BY-LAW NO. 173.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under the provisions of Section 652 of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (6 George V., No. 2686), and numbered 173, for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in the Children's Playground in "Raisbeck Reserve."

WHEREAS by section 652 of the *Local Government Act* 1915 power is given to the Council of the City of Melbourne, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make By-laws or Regulations (*inter alia*) for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in such grounds or places as have been purchased or otherwise provided by the Council for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation. And whereas the said Council has provided the land known as "Raisbeck Reserve," being part of the land comprised in certificate of title, volume 1844, folio 368720, as a pleasure ground or place of public recreation. Now therefore the mayor, aldermen, councillors, and citizens of the City of Melbourne (hereinafter called the Council), in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby in respect of such part of the said land as is set apart for and hereinafter designated "Children's Playground" make the following By-law:—

1. The Children's Playground shall not be used after sunset.
2. No person above the age of twelve years shall enter the Children's Playground or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon. Provided, however, that parents or other attendants shall be at liberty to enter the playground to watch over children who are in their charge.
3. The swings or other appliances erected in the playground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.
4. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.
5. Cricket or football shall not be played in the Children's Playground.
6. All paper, fruit peel, or other litter shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Council for the purpose.
7. Every person in the Children's Playground shall obey the direction of any officer of the Council in respect of his or her conduct therein.

8. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground.

9. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the Children's Playground, or bring any animal into the same.

10. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Council shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Children's Playground, and such person shall in addition be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided for any such offence.

11. Every person who by act or omission shall contravene any of the foregoing provisions shall be guilty of an offence.

12. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the City of Melbourne the third day of March, 1924, and confirmed at the meeting of the said Council, held the 31st day of March, 1924.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however,

require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular description indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In the event of the tender being accepted for goods of Commonwealth or British manufacture (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.

3. The value of all packages, cases, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, &c. The net quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of this contract, Melbourne will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary for Education or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Condition 8, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. All orders, duly receipted, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account under the Audit Act and Regulations for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time being allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to be made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned.

11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall, as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 12. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. 12. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the

purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted as in Clause 7.

13. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

Horse Driven Vehicles.—When hired by one person or party (and not as an omnibus) and driven within that section of the borough bounded by Francis-street, Tyers-street, and Smith-street to the township boundary on the north following the township boundary on the east and west and the Grange Creek on the south—One shilling for each passenger.

If driven outside the above section of the borough, but within the borough—Two shillings for one passenger; two or more passengers—One shilling each passenger.

Double fares to be charged between the hours of 8 p.m. and 8 a.m.

Fares by Time.—Which (unless by agreement) is only to be for driving within a radius of two miles from the place of hiring; if that radius be exceeded and there be no agreement to the contrary the fare to be charged by distance—

Hiring by the half hour—Three shillings.

Hiring by the hour—Five shillings.

Double fares to be charged between 8 p.m. and 8 a.m.

Hiring by the day (that is for any twelve consecutive hours between 5 o'clock a.m. and 12 p.m.), one or two horses—Two pounds.

Fares by Distance.—To be computed from the place of hiring to the most distant point of the journey therefrom—

For hiring party not fewer than two persons—

Any distance not exceeding two miles, each person, per mile—One shilling.

Every mile beyond two miles—

If the hiring party do not return in the vehicle, three-pence per mile for each person additional as back fare, equalling for the portion of the outward journey beyond two miles, per mile—One shilling and three-pence.

And if the hiring party do return in the vehicle, six-pence per mile additional for each person as back fare, equalling for the portion of the outward journey beyond two miles, per mile—One shilling and six-pence.

Half miles commenced surplus to the last completed mile to be in each case charged for proportionately.

Any person calling or sending for any carriage or cab and not further employing the same shall pay One shilling, or, at the option of the driver, the fare from the stand or place where the carriage or cab may be engaged.

Fares for Detention.—Five minutes' detention to be allowed without charge.

For every subsequent fifteen minutes or part thereof detention—One shilling and six-pence.

No extra charge to be made for luggage not exceeding fifty pounds in weight, or when the carriage is occupied by fewer than the number of persons for which the fare is prescribed, one hundred pounds in weight. For every fifty pounds or part thereof surplus in each case a charge of One shilling may be made.

An addition of one half to the above fares may be charged between midnight and five o'clock in the morning.

Motor Cars or Taxi Cabs.—The minimum charge for use of car or taxi cab any distance up to five miles—Five shillings. Distance to be calculated from and to the Hamilton Post Office, two and a half miles each way.

Motor car owners licensed to ply for hire to be permitted when detained to charge a detention fee after the first five minutes not exceeding One shilling and six-pence, for every subsequent fifteen minutes or part thereof between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m., and a detention fee after the first five minutes not exceeding Two shillings for every subsequent fifteen minutes or part thereof between the hours of 8 p.m. and 8 a.m.
