A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under the provisions of Section 652 of the Local Government Act 1915 (6 George V., No. 2686), and numbered 173, for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in the Children's Playground in "Raisbeck Reserve."

ground in "Raisbeck Reserve."

W HEREAS by section 652 of the Local Government Act
1915 power is given to the Council of the City of
Melbaurne, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to
make By-laws or Regulations (inter alia) for regulating the
conduct of persons using or being upon or in such grounds or
places as have been purchased or otherwise provided by the
Council for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of
public resort or public recreation. And whereas the said
Council has provided the land known as "Raisbeck Reserve,"
being part of the land comprised in certificate of title, volume
1844, folio 368720, as a pleasure ground or place of public
recreation. Now therefore the mayor, aldermen, councillors,
and citizens of the City of Melbourne (hereinafter called the
Council), in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid,
doth hereby in respect of such part of the said land as is set
apart for and hereinafter designated "Children's Playground"
make the following By-law: make the following By-law:-

1. The Children's Playground shall not be used after sunset.
2. No person above the age of twelve years shall enter the Children's Playground or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon. Provided, however, that parents or other attendants shall be at liberty to enter the playground to watch over children who are in their charge.

3. The swings or other appliances erected in the playground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.

4. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.

5. Cricket or football shall not be played in the Children's Playground. 1. The Children's Playground shall not be used after sunset.

b. Cricket or lowest shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Council for the purpose.

7. Every person in the Children's Playground shall obey the direction of any officer of the Council in respect of his or her conduct therein.

8. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident

8. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground.

9. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the Children's Playground, or bring any animal into the same.

10. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Council shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who committee breach of the council shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Children's Playground, and such person shall in addition be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided for any such offence.

11. Every person who by act or omission shall contravene any of the foregoing provisions shall be guilty of an offence.

12. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10.

- 10. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned.
- 11. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 12. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 17 of these conditions. Such mulct may be deducted as in Clause 7.
