ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

REGULATIONS—LUNACY DEPARTMENT.

THE Inspector-General of the Insane, pursuant to the provisions of the Public Service Acts 1915 and 1920 and the Lunacy Act 1915, hereby makes the following Regulations, to take effect from the 1st August, 1924, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council.

CHAPTER III.—CLASSIFICATION OF THE GENERAL DIVISION.

Overtime.

Officers of the Nursing Staff who may be required to perform duty beyond 48 hours per week shall be paid overtime at the undermentioned rates :—

	Per Hour.
Officers whose salaries are not more than £150 a year	1s. 2d.
Officers whose salaries are more than £150 a year and not more than £200 a year	1s. 7d.
Officers whose salaries are more than £200 a year and not more than £230 a year	1s. 10d.
Officers whose salaries are more than £230 a year and not more than £270 a year	2s. 2d.

In this Regulation, "salaries" shall mean the salaries authorized under the Salaries Revision Scheme, which came into force on the 4th November, 1923.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS—CLASSIFICATION OF PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.

Chapter I.

THE Inspector-General of the Insane, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby amends the Regulations made on the 15th February, 1921, as shown hereunder, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council, such amendment to take effect from 1st July, 1924.

Electricity Commissioners Act 1918, Sections 18 and 19, and State Electricity Commission Act 1922 (No. 3265), Section 5.

IT is recommended that, pursuant to the provisions of section 5 of the *State Electricity Commission Act 1922* (No. 3265) and of other the provisions of the *State Electricity Commission Acts*, and to the authority thereby conferred for the making of regulations for or with respect to the protection of any works or electric lines of the Commission and the prevention of any interference therewith, and generally for or with respect to the safety of persons and property, Sir L. F. Cussen, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, makes the following regulations, that is to say:—

1. In these regulations the words "the Commission" mean the State Electricity Commission of Victoria.

2. These regulations shall apply to and in respect of all land and property occupied by the Commission or owned by the Commission, and not occupied by a person pursuant to a lease or agreement for a lease in writing, which land in either case is situate within a radius of two miles of the administrative offices of the Commission, situate at or near Yallourn, and to and in respect of all property and works of the Commission on such land, and to and in respect of all roads and streets constructed or laid out by the Commission within that area, whether or not such road or street be now or hereafter dedicated to the public, and to and in respect of all property, works, bridges, culverts, drains, sewers of the Commission or by the Commission built, constructed, laid or done on or upon any such road or street, and shall operate within that area.

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of August, 1924.

4. The penalty, pecuniary or other, set out—
(a) at the foot of any clause of these regulations, or
(b) at the foot of any sub-clause or any clause of these regulations, but not at the foot of the clause,

shall indicate that any contravention of the clause or of the sub-clause (as the case is), whether by act or omission, shall be an offence against these regulations, punishable upon conviction by a penalty not exceeding the penalty mentioned.

Provided that where the penalty is expressed to apply to a part only of the clause or sub-clause, it shall apply to that part only.

Fences and Gates Not to be Damaged or Destroyed.

5. No person shall wilfully remove, damage, or destroy any fence or barrier guarding or protecting any work or property of the Commission, or any gate in any such fence, or open or wilfully and negligently leave open any such gate. Penalty: Ten pounds.

Stretchers and Fittings Not to be Removed.

6. No person shall without permission of the Commission remove from any cubicle, tent, or other place any stretcher, fitting, or other material the property of the Commission. Penalty: One pound.

Writing on or Posting Notices on Walls Prohibited.

7. No person shall write on, damage, or disfigure, or without permission of the Commission post or cause to be posted any notice or advertisement on the wall or walls of any buildings or on any other place. Penalty: One pound.

Fire-pots in Cubicles Prohibited.

8. No person shall light any fire in any cubicle or tent, or place any fire-pot therein. Penalty: Twelve pounds.

Material Not to be Removed from Works.

9. No person shall without permission in writing of the Commission take, remove, or carry away any box, case, or other material or thing the property of the Commission from the works of the Commission, or any part thereof. Penalty: Ten pounds.

Electric or Other Appliances Not to be Interfered With.

10. No person shall damage, interfere, or tamper with any electric fittings or appliances, or with water taps, valves, fire or other appliances. Penalty: Twenty pounds.

Firearms Not to be Carried or Discharged.

11. No firearms shall be carried or discharged on the property of the Commission. Penalty: Five pounds.

No Person to be about Working Places Without Permit.

12. No person shall be or remain in or about any working place or electric machinery unless he is either engaged in the work there being carried out or has written permission of the proper officer of the Commission to be or remain there. Penalty: Two pounds.

Cubicles, Tents, or Other Buildings Not to be Occupied Without Permission.

13. No person having any cubicle, tent, or other accommodation or site for accommodation allotted to him, shall occupy any other cubicle, tent, or accommodation or site for accommodation without the written consent of the camp foreman first being obtained. Penalty: Ten shillings.

No Tent or Building to be Erected Outside Prescribed Areas.

14. No person will erect or occupy any tent, building, or other structure upon any portion of the property of the Commission outside the areas set apart for such purpose, or erect any tent or other structure within those areas so set apart, unless he has first obtained the written permission of the General Superintendent to do so. Penalty: Ten pounds.

Liability of Persons Erecting Tents and Buildings to Remove on Demand.

15. All persons not being lessees of the Commission and erecting or occupying tents, buildings, or other structures upon any land to or in respect of which these regulations apply, whether lawfully or otherwise, shall remove same at their own expense when ordered to do so by an officer of the Commission, within twenty-four hours of such order. Such order may be given personally or to any apparent occupant of the tent, building, or other structure, or may be left affixed to the same in a conspicuous position. Penalty: Ten pounds.

Cubicles, Tents, and Camps to be Kept Clean.

16. Any person or persons occupying cubicles, tents, huts, or other buildings in the areas set apart for the purposes of accommodation shall keep such quarters in a clean and sanitary condition, and no person shall deposit any rubbish or refuse in any other place than the receptacles provided, or use or permit to be used such cubicle, tent, hut, or building for any other purpose than a dwelling. Penalty: Five pounds.

Flowers or Shrubs in Gardens or Parks Not to be Pulled or Destroyed.

17. No person shall pluck any of the flowers or walk on any of the beds or borders in any park, road, or cultivated area of the Commission, or damage or destroy any plant or thing therein. Penalty: Two pounds.

Trees or Plants Not to be Removed or Destroyed.

18. No tree, plant, shrub, ferns, or other vegetation in the property of the Commission shall be cut down or removed without permission. Penalty: Two pounds.

Bathing in Conduits, Reservoirs, or Other Places Not Allowed.

19. No person shall bathe in any channel, reservoir, conduit, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Commission or under the management or control of the Commission, or wash, cleanse, or cause to be thrown therein any animal, whether dead or alive, or any rubbish, filthy stuff, or thing of any kind whatsoever, or suffer to be run or brought therein the water of any sink, sewer, drain, or other filthy or impure water, or do anything whereby the water supply of the Commission may be polluted, obstructed, or damaged. Penalty: Twenty pounds.

Water Not to be Wasted.

20. No person having access to or taking water from the waterworks of the Commission shall negligently suffer any water to run to waste from any pipe, tap, or conduit. Penalty: Five pounds.

Streams or Drains Not to be Diverted or Obstructed.

21. No person shall without the consent of the Commission in writing construct any dam or embankment in or across any river, creek, or natural watercourse, or otherwise obstruct in any way any river, creek, or natural watercourse, or otherwise divert any water from any reservoir, conduit, tank, or pipe. Penalty: Twenty pounds.

Drains and Culverts Not to be Obstructed or Damaged.

22. No person shall obstruct or damage any culvert, sewer, or drain. Penalty: Ten pounds.

Riding or Driving on or over Footpaths Prohibited.

23. No person shall wilfully and without lawful excuse ride, drive, or lead any horse or other animal, or drive or wheel any carriage, cart, bicycle, motor car, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway or water channel or gutter, save in each case upon and by or at some proper crossing which shall be provided for such purpose. Penalty: Two pounds.

Vehicles to Carry Lights between Sunset and Sunrise.

24. All vehicles and bicycles travelling or being driven or ridden after sunset and before sunrise shall be provided with proper lights, and the driver or rider of such vehicle or bicycle shall keep the same properly lighted while such vehicle is being used. Penalty: Five pounds.

25. Any person having charge of any vehicle proceeding across, along, or upon any street or road shall ensure that such vehicle proceeds only along the left side of the street or road, and passes other vehicles proceeding in the same direction on the right side of such vehicles. Penalty: Five pounds.

26. No motor or other vehicle shall be driven or ridden, or caused or permitted by the person in charge thereof to proceed along any street or road at such a speed or in such a manner as to prejudice the convenient use and enjoyment by the Commission of its roads and streets, or as to be dangerous to the public. Penalty: Fifteen pounds.

Permits for Motor or Other Vehicles.

27. No motor or other vehicle, and no person in charge of any such vehicle, shall ply for hire without written permission of the Commission. Penalty: Ten pounds.

28. No person shall displace, take up, or make any alteration in the soil, pavement, flags, sods, or other material of any street or road, or any fence on such street or road, or remove any scrapings thereof or sand thereon, without the consent in writing of the General Superintendent of the Commission. Penalty: Five pounds.

29. No person shall place any obstruction across or in any street or road. Penalty: Five pounds.

Negligently Suffering Chimney to be on Fire.

30. No person shall wilfully or negligently set or permit to be set on fire any chimney, flue, smoke vent, or stove pipe in any premises occupied by him. Penalty: Two pounds.

Burning-off and Bonfires.

31. No person shall, unless he has given the General Superintendent of the Commission twenty-four hours' notice in writing of his intention so to do, burn off any rubbish or grass.

No bonfire, tar barrel, or fireworks shall be lit or burned within 60 yards of any street or building. Penalty: Twelve pounds.

No Fire to be Lighted Outside Certain Area.

32. No fire shall be lighted outside the areas set apart for accommodation or residential purposes. Penalty: Twelve pounds.

No Smoking in Prescribed Areas.

33. No person shall smoke, or shall have, bring, make, or use any unprotected light or any fire in or in the vicinity of any store, magazine, stable, timber stack, coal or firewood dump, or in any other place where anything of an inflammable nature may be or may be stored, or in or anywhere within 100 yards of any part of the briquetting works buildings or stores, or of any part of the screen house. Penalty: Twelve pounds.

*Land Surveyors Acts.***REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.**

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £3 3s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____, or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of _____ years (_____ of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

(Signed) _____ A.B.

(Date.) _____

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

- (d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments:

- (e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

- (f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

- (g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

- (h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(e), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £3 3s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *viva voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. No candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which

shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
(b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1915*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the Riding) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each Riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
- (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
- (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
- (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
- (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.

(4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—

- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole Riding the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

- (12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—
- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
 - (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

Deposit Moneys.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the Shire of Newham and Woodend of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim—

That as on and from the first day of July, 1924, that portion of the Tyntynder Waterworks District included within the boundaries set out and described in the Schedule hereto shall be and become an "Urban District" for the purposes of the said Acts, and shall be known as Piangil Urban District.

OFFERS endorsed—"Offer for Wattle Bark, lot—," and addressed to the Secretary, Forests Commission, Melbourne, will be received at this office, up to Twelve noon, on Tuesday, 2nd September, 1924, for the right to strip and remove wattle bark on and from the following areas. The general conditions hereunder will apply in every case where not expressly stated to the contrary, and special conditions will also apply where provided. GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.
2. The deposit mentioned in each case must accompany each offer.
3. Offers must be AT A PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge, and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.
4. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by 3rd December, 1924, and the second payment covering all bark stripped by 28th February, 1925, by which latter date all work must cease, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.
5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree, specially marked by him to remain standing, shall be felled or stripped, wherever situated.
6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any watercourse, or so as to obstruct any road or track.
7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, a valid reason.
8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.
9. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt., in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.
10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.
11. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.

12. No live tree, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.

13. SHIRE OF WARRAGUL.

BY-LAW No. 29.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919* and of any other powers thereto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Warragul, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purposes of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law No. 29, that is to say:—

1. That all former By-laws, made by the Council of the Shire of Warragul, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed, with the exception of the parts concerning the Nilma Township.

2. This By-law shall come into full force on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Central Riding of the Shire of Warragul.

4. The owner or occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy, shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan system hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The owner or occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto an appliance or apparatus, which, when closed, effectually covers the seat of such closet or privy, whereby disinfectant and deodorizing fluid is automatically discharged into the pan in such closet or privy.

7. The owner or occupier aforesaid or the person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in such appliance or apparatus a supply of disinfecting and deodorizing fluid efficient for disinfecting and deodorizing the contents of such pan.

8. The owner or occupier aforesaid or the person having the control or management of the premises shall from time to time after the said closet or privy has been used, close or cause to be closed the said appliance or apparatus and keep such appliance or apparatus closed on the seat of such closet or privy.

9. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with the lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

10. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause same to be properly cleansed and tar painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

11. The owner or occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

12. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each owner or occupier for the pans and the apparatus supplied and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

13. If any person or the Council or its contractor commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
