ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Leo Finn Bernard Cussen, K.B., Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million two hundred and sixty-four thousand two hundred and forty-three pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five."

GOD-SAVE THE KING!

ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, in a Despatch bearing date the 24th July, 1924, has intimated to the officer administering the Government of Victoria that His Majesty will not be advised to exercise his power of disallowance with respect to the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 14th and 15th years of His Majesty's reign, the numbers and titles of which are hereto subjoined, viz:—

No. 3338, entitled "An Act to provide for the Winding Up of Matters outstanding in connexion with the Administration of the Wheat Marketing Acts and the *Wheat Marketing and Transportation Act 1920* and for other purposes."

No. 3339, entitled "An Act to amend Section Thirteen of the *Railways Standing Committee Act 1915*."

No. 3340, entitled "An Act to provide for the Permanent Reservation as a Site for a Cricket Ground and for purposes of Public Recreation of certain Land in the Parish of Ballan and for the Sale by Auction of certain Crown Land in the said Parish temporarily reserved as a Site for a Cricket Ground and for purposes of Public Recreation and for other purposes."

No. 3341, entitled "An Act to amend the Law relating to the Trust Funds and the Temporary Application of Moneys out of 'The Public Account' and for other purposes."

UPPER YARRA YARRA RIVER.

HENLEY-ON-YARRA.

Notice to Boatmen, Etc.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that permission has been granted to the Melbourne Amateur Regatta Association, in connexion with the Annual Regatta, to row races on the Henley Course on the Upper Yarra on the 25th October, 1924, and that motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day must observe the following Regulations, viz. :—

Boat races must not be obstructed, nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand, and carry a bucket for fire extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit to be exposed.

All non-competing boats must keep off the course during the racing programme.

No boats (except racing boats) are allowed to land or take up passengers at the boat stagings (south bank), or from the bank along the Henley Reserve except at the landing stage.

Any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark its passengers.

No boat deemed by the River Officer or his Deputy to be too large or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

The direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

All boats (except racing boats) must move up stream along the right hand (south) bank, and must move down stream along the opposite (north) bank.

No boat will be permitted to show any advertisement or objectionable device.

No fireworks or firearms are allowed to be discharged from any boat, except such as have permission of the River Officer or his Deputy.

All motor boats shall hold a permit from the River Officer to enter or remain on that part of the River Yarra between Prince's-bridge and the Punt-road bridge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

No motor or other boats will be allowed to ply for hire between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road Bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

All motor boats shall be moored in the positions allotted to them by 12.30 p.m., and shall remain moored until the finish of the racing programme.

Applicant for permit must apply at the office of the River Officer, 110 Spencer-street, Melbourne, and furnish the name and dimensions of the boat for which a permit is required; also the name and address of the owner, and of the person taking charge of the boat on Henley Day. If the boat is unnamed, some identification number must be affixed to each bow of the boat.

No permit shall be given to a motor boat exceeding a length of 35 feet from stem to stern, or with a beam exceeding 9 feet overall, unless the River Officer shall see fit to do so. It is recommended that row boats shall be in attendance on large motor boats for transporting passengers, also that a gangway be provided for each motor boat to enable passengers to reach the bank.

No permit shall be given for boats burning, other than liquid fuel.

Permit shall not be transferable by holder or in respect of motor boats.

Acceptance of permit shall be a guarantee that its holder and the boat it is issued for will observe the regulations, whether general or special.

A limited number of moorings will be available along Henley Reserve, and early application to the River Officer for same is invited. Applicant must give name and dimensions of boat, and must provide his own mooring ropes. Pegs will be supplied.

Motor boats not moored along the Henley Reserve must use the mooring pegs provided on the north or south side of the river, and must moor at post bearing same number as shown on permit.

Mooring or holding on to the booms or buoys is strictly forbidden.

After sunset on Henley Day motor boats shall exhibit a red light, and go slow in the centre of the river only. Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

On Henley Day the length of oars used by any boat, other than racing boats, between Punt-road bridge and Prince's-bridge, shall not exceed 8 feet.

The use of paddles as a means of propulsion for rowing boats is preferred.

Boats over 25 feet in length or boats with jibbooms or other objectionable projections, will not be permitted on the Yarra between Prince's-bridge and Punt-road bridge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 midnight on Henley Day.

Rowing boats and canoes shall exhibit a white light after sunset on Henley Day.

All boats must give way to racing boats going up stream to the start of the course.

*Health Act 1919.***SEPTIC TANK REGULATIONS 1924.***At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the first day of September, 1924.*

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Septic Tank Regulations 1924, Title. and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Act” means the *Health Act 1919*.

“Alteration” includes alteration addition or extension, and “to alter” has a corresponding interpretation. Interpretation.
“Act.”
“Alteration.”

“Approved” means approved in writing by the Commission or by the Council (as the case may be); “Approve” and “Approval” have corresponding interpretations. “Approved.”

“Installation” includes erection re-erection building rebuilding and removal and re-erection on another site; and “to install” has a corresponding interpretation. “Installation.”

“Owner” includes owner his attorney or agent or other person acting for him and also includes tenant or lessee or sub-tenant or sub-lessee or attorney or agent or other person acting for such persons aforesaid respectively. “Owner.”

“Septic tank” includes every fixed or stationary receptacle whether placed above or below or partly above ground and in which nightsoil or matter mixed therewith household or industrial waste waters or any combination or mixture of the same whether or not containing decomposed or decomposable organic matter in solid liquid or colloidal state is detained or temporarily held up for sedimentation precipitation disintegration digestion liquefaction gasification or oxidization whether with or without the aid of chemicals and every tank basin circulating or other chamber tower lagoon weir pond trough tray distributor carrier channel drain or under-drain duct pipe sewer bed filter pit well appliance or land whether prepared or not used for the treatment of sewage or sewage effluent scum or sludge. “Septic tank.”

“The Council” means the Council of the Municipality within the boundaries of which the subject-matter arises or the work concerned is situate. In every case in which a Council proposes to install or is the owner of a septic tank system these Regulations shall be read and construed as though “person” means and includes “the Council” and for “the Council” is substituted “the Commission” and generally in such case a Council shall stand in the same relation of responsibility towards the Commission as does a person by virtue of the provisions of section 58 of the Act towards a Council and these Regulations shall be interpreted accordingly. “The Council.”

3. No person shall install or alter or use or suffer or permit to be used any septic tank system without the approval with or without modifications or conditions of the Council. Nor shall any person so do after such approval shall have been withdrawn or cancelled by the Council. Unauthorized
installation or
use of septic
tank system
forbidden.

Every application for such approval shall be in the form prescribed for that purpose in the Schedule A hereto shall be submitted by the owner to the Council and shall be accompanied by plans and specifications and particulars in duplicate of the proposed works of each of which documents as approved with or without modifications or conditions by the Council a copy shall be retained by the Council and preserved for purposes of reference and record. No septic tanks in places where public sewerage system is available.

4. No septic tank shall be installed or used in any place where a public sewerage system is available. Provided that such prohibition shall not extend to any case in which in the opinion of the Commission the construction and use of a septic tank system is in the interests of public health advisable as a means of purifying or otherwise preparing or treating any sewage to the Commission's satisfaction before discharge thereof into a public sewerage system.

Discharge of contents of septic tank system on to surface of ground or into any open drain or into any watercourse forbidden.

No person shall construct or have or use or cause permit or allow to be used any septic tank system which shall have connected therewith or attached thereto any pipe or other appliance capable of being utilized for the discharge of the contents or any portion of the contents of such system upon the surface of the ground or into or upon any street tramway channel tunnel footway lane or into any open drain or any stream watercourse (tidal or otherwise) reservoir of water supply well (including abandoned well) or other source of water supply nor shall any person construct have or use or cause or permit or allow to be used any portion of any septic tank system the situation of which is over or partly over any open drain stream watercourse (tidal or otherwise) or reservoir of water supply well (including abandoned well) or other source of water supply in such manner that any of the contents of such system can pass thereinto.

Discharge of contents of septic tank into sea.

Provided that in any case the Council may approve of the discharge from a septic tank system of a sewage effluent into a street or road or other drainage channel within its jurisdiction if such effluent at the time of every such discharge contains no offensive or putrescible matter or organisms dangerous to health. The responsibility of proving in any given case that such effluent does not contain offensive or putrescible matter or organisms dangerous to health shall lie with the owner of such system.

No person shall spill cast throw put down or cause permit or suffer to be spilt cast thrown or put down any contents of a septic tank system into or upon the waters of the sea within the State of Victoria.

Provided that in any case the Commission may approve with or without modifications or conditions of the discharge into the sea for dilution of such contents after the same have been so purified as to comply to the Commission's satisfaction with the standards of purification prescribed herein and may in default of compliance with such conditions or standards or any of them revoke or cancel its approval in its absolute discretion. Provided also that in no case shall such approval be given where in the opinion of the Commission the outfall proposed to be used would not have its discharge under Low Water Mark or would be improperly adjacent to any seaside resort or watering place or bathing ground or shell-fish bed or where there does not exist an off-shore current adequate to prevent offensive or putrescible matter in such sewage from being cast upon the shore.

Standards for effluents intended to be discharged into any river, &c.

5. In any case where the effluent from a septic tank system is intended or proposed by any person to be discharged into any river creek stream channel lake lagoon swamp or waterhole notice of such intention or proposal shall be given in writing by such person to the Commission which may or may not approve of such intention or proposal with or without the imposition of such modifications or conditions as in its absolute discretion it thinks fit and whose decision shall be final. Provided that in no case will approval be given unless there be attached thereto the following conditions that is to say—

The effluent discharged into any river creek stream channel lake lagoon swamp or waterhole shall not contain as discharged more than 3 parts per 100,000 of suspended matter and with its suspended matters included shall not take up at a temperature of 65° Fahrenheit more than 2 parts per 100,000 of dissolved oxygen in 5 days.

Disinfection and deodorization of effluents.

Provided further than in any case whatsoever the Commission may if it thinks fit direct provision satisfactory to it to be made for the disinfection or deodorization or both of the effluent of any septic tank system after the discharge of such effluent from such systems.

Control.

6. No person shall use or cause permit or suffer—

Exclusion from septic tank systems of drainage of certain descriptions.

(a) any stormwater or surface or subsoil drainage or any rainwater from the surface of the ground or paving or roofs or any overflow water from rainwater storage tanks or from flushing cisterns of water-closets or urinals or other relatively clean water or any waste liquids or refuse products of any manufacturing process nor any hot liquids or steam at a temperature higher than 100° Fahrenheit to enter any septic tank system except with the previously obtained written permission with or without qualification of the Council;

Exclusion of foreign matter from septic tank systems.

(b) any inflammable or explosive material that will not readily mix with water or any other material or materials which separately or in conjunction or in combination with water or sewage or other materials are liable to form explosive compounds or to interfere with the treatment of the sewage or any insoluble

matter or articles dead animals or rubbish whatsoever to be spilt cast thrown put down or deposited in any septic tank system or into any water-closet urinal slop or other sink trough or other fitting whatsoever connected with or appurtenant to such system;

- (c) any portion of a septic tank system to be connected with any water-closet slop-hopper urinal or with any other fitting or appliance whatsoever except with the approval of the Council; Unauthorized connexion of fittings forbidden.

In case of any breach of this clause it shall be lawful for the Council to call upon the responsible person by notice in writing to completely disconnect and remove within a time to be specified in such notice any such fitting or appliance and all drains and parts of drains used exclusively in connexion with such fitting or appliance. Any person failing to comply with such notice within the time specified shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

- (d) any portion of the contents of a septic tank system to be removed therefrom except with the written permission with or without qualification of the Council; Unauthorized removal of contents of septic tank system forbidden.

- (e) any portion of the contents of any septic tank system to remain in such system after a period determined in every case by the Council. Unauthorized retention of contents of such system forbidden.

Provided that the Council may require or permit a portion of such contents to be retained in or returned to such system for the purpose of bacteriologically re-seeding or for other purpose or purposes.

7. Every person being the owner of a septic tank system shall cause:— Construction and materials.

- (a) the tank thereof to be properly and substantially constructed of bricks laid in Portland cement mortar or of Portland cement concrete reinforced concrete or masonry smoothly faced with Portland cement mortar or of approved metal coated with firmly adherent and incorrodible enamel or other approved hard impervious coating protecting the metal against the action of air water earth or sewage and to be watertight and its sides and bottom impermeable to moisture;

- (b) the tank of such system intended or adapted for reception of domestic sewage or industrial waste liquids for the sedimentation or other treatment thereof to contain at least one compartment of dimensions bearing proper relation to such purpose and to the volume and strength of the said sewage or liquids to be passed thereinto; Dimensions.

- (c) all man-holes inspection-openings cleaning-eyes screens and gratings as far as practicable to be exposed to view and readily accessible for purposes of inspection cleaning or effecting repairs or renewals; Fittings to be accessible.

- (d) all pipes traps or other fittings in actual contact with the sewage except where required by the Council to be unglazed agricultural drain-pipes to be formed of sound salt-glazed or vitrified stoneware and connected where necessary with joints formed of gasket and Portland cement mortar or other material approved by the Council. Provided that in the case of grease-traps or grease-interceptors the Council may allow these to be formed of galvanized sheet iron or other efficient heat conductor of approved gauge; Fittings in contact with sewage to be made of resistant material.

- (e) whenever required by the Council the working faces of any gear for operating penstocks flaps or other valves in a septic tank system to be formed of non-corrodible material. Provided that in the case of localities where in the opinion of the Council the procuring of any class of suitable material or articles or of skilled workmen for utilization of such materials or articles would be attended with extreme difficulty the Council may approve of the utilization of other class or classes of materials. Council may require use of non-corrodible material for certain parts.

8. When the volume-rate-of-flow of sewage to a septic tank system is or is in the opinion of the Council likely to be subject to such variation as require provision of means whether in the form of a regulating diaphragm (orifice) or otherwise for equalizing such volume-rate-of-flow as far as practicable such means shall be provided by the owner to the satisfaction of the Council. Provided that in any case the Council may require the tank capacity of a septic tank system to be divided between two or more tank subdivisions or units so designed and arranged and equipped as to admit of the separate or combined use of any number of such units. Equalization of flow.

9. Provision whether in the form of weirs submerged pipes of sufficient number and size and suitably placed and scum-boards or other device for preventing sewage from entering or leaving a tank with a velocity or a momentum calculated to unduly interfere with the process of sedimentation or with the proper separation retention or other treatment of matter in suspension or solution or of sludge and scum shall be made by the owner to the satisfaction of the Council. Scum-boards.

- Grease-traps. 10. Whenever required by the Council adequate provision shall be made by the owner—
- (a) for the interception and retention of grease conveyed in sewage before the admission of the latter to a septic tank system and for removal as frequently as may be necessary of the grease so intercepted and for the proper disposal thereof;
 - Covering of tanks. (b) for covering in the tanks or other receptacles or conduits of a septic tank system. Provided that in every such case the gas space in such tanks or other receptacles or conduits shall be adequately ventilated to the outer air and proper manholes and manhole covers and inspection openings shall be supplied;
 - Pressure test. (c) for subjecting the whole or any part of any septic tank system to a pressure or other test for disclosing the water-tightness or otherwise of such system;
 - Sludge sump. (d) in the shape of a sump or well in any sedimentation or other treatment tank of such system to facilitate collection and removal of sludge from time to time; and
 - Inspection openings. (e) of means suitable for the purpose of facilitating the inspection and withdrawal of samples of sewage or sewage scum sludge or effluent from any part of a septic tank system for the purposes of examination of such samples.
- Arrangements for removal of sludge. 11. Whenever it is intended to effect the removal of sludge or other filth from any tank well pit or other receptacle in any septic tank system by gravity flow there shall be provided for the conduct therefrom of such sludge or other filth a drain curvilinear in cross-section and having its internal surface smooth and impervious and such drain shall be laid to a proper gradient or gradients and be furnished with an approved valve for control of the discharge of sludge or other filth thereinto.
- Sludge drain. The lifting of sludge or other filth in bulk from any tank well pit or other receptacle in a septic tank system shall be effected by means of a chain-pump of suitable capacity and in good working order or by such other means as may be approved by the Council.
- Chain pump. Provided that where in the opinion of the Council the removal of any of the contents of a septic tank system which is so located as to necessitate exercise of special precaution for preventing nuisance danger to health or offensiveness arising in consequence of such removal the Council may require that such removal shall be effected by the passage of such contents in a closed pipe or other conduit into a vacuum receiver in which the air shall have been sufficiently rarified to admit of such passage taking place and the Council may further require the interposition of an apparatus between the exhaust outlet of the receiver and the general atmosphere for effecting the deodorization of foul vapours arising from the contents of the said receiver by passing such vapors through fire or by other approved means and such removal shall be effected accordingly or by such other means and at such time or times as the Council shall under the particular circumstances of the case direct or approve.
- Vacuum receiver. 12. No person shall cause or allow or permit the sewage contents or any portion of the sewage contents of any septic tank system to be discharged on to or into or under any land unless under conditions first approved by the Council nor shall approval of such mode of disposal be given unless and until the Council has received from its authorized officer a certificate declaring that the locality the superficial area of the land the depth character and condition especially with reference to facilities for draining of the soil and subsoil (whether such soil be natural or artificial) are such as to render the land reasonably suitable for the proper purification of the sewage or sewage effluent and for the nitrification of the organic matter of the sewage or sewage effluent intended to be applied to such land at specified intervals of time and at specified volume and time rates of flow per unit of area of such land.
- Deodorization. 13. In every case in which disposal of sewage or sewage effluent by means of subsoil absorption is adopted measures satisfactory to the Council shall be taken by the owner for the automatic and intermittent application of such sewage or sewage effluent in such manner in such volume and at such intervals of time as in the opinion of the Council will secure adequate distribution of such effluent throughout the absorption area and as will prevent the interstices in the soil of such area from becoming unduly clogged with solid matter or inadequately aerated or drained or the land from becoming sewage-sick.
- Operation of subsoil absorption systems to be efficient. 14. In no case shall soakaway-pits leaching wells or leaching cesspools or similar devices be used for dispersal of sewage or sewage effluent if the site of such devices be within 300 feet of any "source of water supply" within the meaning of the Act including any abandoned well or within 100 feet of any underground water storage tank or water storage cistern or any house nor unless under conditions first approved by the Council upon receipt from its authorized officer of a certificate declaring the site to be in conformity with the provisions of this clause.
- Soakaway pits and similar devices to be at safe distances from "sources of water supply."

15. Notwithstanding anything elsewhere herein contained no person shall place deposit or spread or cause permit or suffer to be placed or spread any sludge scum or other filth or removed from a septic tank system and exposed for a greater or less period of time to the general atmosphere in under or on any land situated within 100 feet of any dwelling-house children's playground camp public building or public place or within the distances prescribed in any regulations in force relating to sanitary conveniences and removal and disposal of nightsoil as being those within which nightsoil shall not be buried in relation to any "source of water supply."

16. In every case in which the number of septic tank installations in use in a village hamlet township borough or town exceeds twenty (20) the Council shall cause the sludge or scum or other solid or partially solid contents of such installations to be disposed of at dépôts or disposal grounds provided by it and located as far as practicable in a well drained sunlit and exposed situation well removed from public ways and at least half-a-mile from the nearest inhabited or habitable building and to the lee of such building in relation to the prevailing wind. The site selected for every such dépôt or disposal ground shall be subject to the approval of the Commission and shall be securely fenced against access of milch cattle thereto.

17. Every person having occasion to remove or cause the removal of sewage sludge scum or other contents of any septic tank system shall take all reasonable precaution against such removal being effected with unnecessary agitation of the remaining contents of such system and in every case where such removal is or is likely in the opinion of the Council to be attended with the emission to the general atmosphere of offensive odors from such sludge scum or other contents of such system such person shall make adequate provision for the deodorization or neutralization of such odors by application to the surfaces giving off such odors of a sufficient quantity of fresh chlorinated lime (i.e., fresh bleaching powder or so-called chloride of lime) or by other means approved by the Council. Every such person when so required to do by the Council shall to its satisfaction apply an effective fly-repellent to such surfaces.

Every person engaged in the act of removing or disposing of sewage sludge scum or other offensive contents of any septic tank system shall take all necessary care and do all necessary things to prevent as far as practicable such contents from coming into contact with his own or any other person's body or clothes and shall cause all wearing apparel used by him whilst engaged in such act or in operations incidental or appurtenant thereto to be properly cleansed by soaking and washing of the same in clean water to which one part of Izal or five parts of Formalin to 100 parts of water or other approved disinfectant in approved proportions has been added and the resultant waste water to be disposed of without causing nuisance injury to health or offensiveness.

18. Unless otherwise approved or directed by the Council the sludge or scum removed from a septic tank system shall be promptly placed in a shallow V-shaped trench or trenches having the bottom thereof well loosened with the pick and formed in soil favorable in character and in a suitable state for effecting nitrification of the organic solids in such sludge or scum and overlying a subsoil suitable or capable of being made suitable for the drainage of such sludge or scum and shall within 24 hours in Spring or Winter and within 12 hours in Summer or Autumn be thoroughly covered with a layer not less than 6 inches in depth of soil as aforesaid well broken up and so placed in position as to prevent flies from obtaining access to such sludge or scum. The land containing such trench or trenches shall be securely fenced against access of milch cattle thereto.

No such trench shall exceed 18 inches in depth nor 24 inches in width and the aggregate depth of such sludge or scum placed within such trench shall not exceed 9 inches. Before the permission hereinbefore in Regulation 3 provided for to use a septic tank system or any part thereof is issued the Council shall cause at least one inspection of the actually or nominally finished work of the system to be made by an authorized officer who shall duly report in writing to the Council whether the necessary works and equipment and provision for the proper operation thereof have been constructed provided and made and are in all respects in accordance with the intents of the plans and specification declarations description information and particulars submitted to and approved with or without modifications or conditions by the Council as hereinbefore provided for and in case of default the Council may refuse to issue such permission unless and until the matters in default have been remedied to its satisfaction.

20. After use of any septic tank system has begun the Council shall cause such system to be inspected by an authorized officer at least once in every year so long as such use continues and such officer shall as soon as practicable after each inspection by him of such system make to the Council a report in writing as to whether or not the use of such system is or appears to be attended with any and if so what conditions causing nuisance injury to health or offensiveness in which case the Council shall if satisfied of the existence of nuisance injury to health or offensiveness or of the likelihood of recurrence of any such conditions issue to the owner notice in writing of the existence of such conditions and shall require him to remedy the conditions to the satisfaction of the Council within a period to be specified in such notice. When such notice has been served on the owner and has not been complied with within such time as the Council has allowed the Council may in its uncontrolled discretion order use of such system or of any part thereof to be discontinued after a date to be determined by the Council and if in its opinion the circumstances of the case so require the works to be dismantled and removed and the ground forming the site thereof to be purified to its satisfaction.

21. No person shall damage remove wholly or in part any works or equipment of any septic tank system nor alter or change the approved mode of operating such system without first obtaining the written permission of the Council so to do.

Every owner of a septic tank system is hereby required to maintain in proper order and condition the works and equipment of such system to adopt a proper mode or modes of operating the same and a method or method preparatory and final of treating and disposing of the contents of such system in conformity with the plans specifications and other documents as approved with or without modification or conditions by the Council and every such owner is also hereby required in the event of the escape from such system of offensive vapours or gases or leakage or escape of liquids or other matter therefrom or of occurrence of injury to or derangement of such system wholly or in part to forthwith in writing notify the Council of the occurrence of each such event.

22. Every person being the proprietor of a septic tank system shall cause every occupier or owner for the time being of the premises on or in connexion with which such system is wholly or in part provided for use by such occupier or owner to be informed in writing of the conditions attaching to the use and care of such system and every such occupier or owner is hereby required to make himself acquainted with the purport of and to fulfil or cause to be fulfilled such conditions.

23. Samples of sewage or sewage effluent so drawn from any part of a septic tank system as to be in the opinion of the Council reasonably representative of the volume-rate-of-flow character condition and strength of the sewage or sewage effluent as the case may be may at any reasonable time be taken by any authorized officer of the Council for the purpose or purposes of physical chemical microscopical or bacteriological examination thereof.

In the event of the results of any such examination showing that any condition attached or modification required by the Council in its approval of the construction or use of the works of such system is not being fulfilled or has not been effected respectively the expense entailed in the procuring of such samples and of making such examination thereof shall be recoverable from the owner of such system but not otherwise.

24. Every Council architect civil engineer builder plumber carpenter mason bricklayer contractor sub-contractor foreman employee or other person whatsoever who by doing anything forbidden or who by not doing anything directed herein to be done shall violate or assist in the violation of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and upon conviction shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

IV. All utensils, receptacles, and vehicles used for removing, carting, carrying, or conveying of any night-soil or offensive matter or liquid shall be properly constructed and covered so as to prevent any leakage therefrom, or the escape of any such matter, or the escape of any offensive effluvia.

V. If any night-soil or offensive or noxious matter or liquid shall, whilst being removed, carted, carried, or conveyed, or any part of the same, shall be dropped or spilt from any cause whatever, the person removing, carting, carrying, or conveying the same shall immediately cleanse the place whereon such night-soil, matter, or liquid has been dropped or spilt in such removal or carriage.

VI. Every person found guilty of an offence against this By-law, or of committing any breach thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence or breach, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than £5.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE AGRICULTURAL IMPLEMENTS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 13th September, 1924, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chiltwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; and such portion of the shire of Braybrook as is not included in the Metropolitan District.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of—

- (a) agricultural machinery or implements;
- (b) parts of agricultural machinery or implements; or
- (c) bag-filling machinery, bone-crushers, butter-making machinery, chaff-cutters, corn-crushing machinery, cream separators, hay presses, horse works, iron feeding troughs, lawn mowers, machinery for treating flax or hemp, maize shellers, windmills."

has made the following Determination, namely:—

On 21st December, 1910, this Board was given power to fix rates for persons "employed in assembling or putting together any parts of machinery or implements of classes or kinds (whether the same have been made inside or outside the State) same or similar to those for which the said Board has power to fix prices or rates."

(1) That on the 13th September, 1924, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

Juvenile Workers—

Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) employed—

- (a) Finning, pointing, heating, and cutting off.
- (b) Screwing and tapping bolts in any department.
- (c) Holding up.
- (d) Striking for apprentices to blacksmithing.
- (e) Working ungeared drilling machines, drilling holes up to and inclusive of $\frac{7}{16}$ -in. diameter.

Assembler—

Any adult person employed in putting together any of the classes or kinds of machinery or implements affected by the Determination, and which have been previously fitted or so standardized as to require no fitting; but shall not include any adult person employed in cutting or shaping the material of which such machinery or implements are composed.

(3) **OVERTIME.**—Any employee who works in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such work at the rate of time and a half.

(4) **SPECIAL RATES.**—Time and three-quarters shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Eight Hours Day (21st April), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for the day so substituted.

(5) **PIECE-WORK.**—The Board determines under the provisions of Section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act* 1915 that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.

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DEFINITION.—Juvenile Workers.—Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) who, if females, are employed as wrappers, or, if males, are employed in (a) chipping or casting; (b) wrapping, packing, or moving material; or (c) cleaning, heating, or closing tubes, angle or bar-iron.

(3) *Overtime.*—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

(4) *Special Rates.*—That double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(5) *Piece-work.*—The Board determines, under the provisions of section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employers shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates fixed by the Board for such work.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates of payment which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than moulders employed in moulding metal bedsteads) employed in the process, trade, or business of an ironmoulder," has made the following Determination, namely:—

NOTE.—Section 163 of the *Factories Act* 1915, No. 2650, extends the powers of this Board to "steel moulding."

(3) OVERTIME.—Any time worked in excess of 48 hours per week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(4) SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day (26th January), Eight Hours Day (21st April, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(5) DAY AND HOUR FOR PAYMENT OF WAGES.—All payments of wages shall be made within a quarter of an hour from the time of the worker ending work on each pay day.

(6) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Four hours' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

(7) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines under the provisions of Section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work in the process, trade, or business of an ironmoulder, provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages that are fixed by the Board for such work.
