GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 49.

A By-law for Making and Levying the Rates for the Year commencing the 1st day of July, 1924.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called the "Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the Water Acts and of any other powers and authorities in anywise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works, or any extension of such works:—

1. The following rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area, and supplied with water for domestic purposes other than by measure:—

- (1) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £16.—Twenty shillings per annum.

- (2) On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £16.—Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

- (3) On lands on which there is no building.—Six pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1924, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1925, and shall be payable in two equal instalments, on the 25th day of September, 1924, and the 1st day of January, 1925.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized, to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust on the fourth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and the common seal of the said Trust hereunto affixed in the presence of—

## PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ALTERATION TO PORT RULES.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Leo Finn Bernard Cussen, K.B., Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**I** THE Administrator of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, under the powers in that behalf contained in Part II. of the *Marine Act 1915* (6. Geo. V. No. 2688), hereby repeal Regulation 56 for Ports in Victoria having reference to the discharging of rubbish, ballast, &c., into any port, river, or anchorage, which Regulation was made by Proclamation dated the 21st day of June, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 29th June, 1921, page 2540, and do substitute the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

56. No ballast, rubbish, gravel, earth, stone, wreck, filth, refuse, explosives, live shells, oil, water ballast mixed or impregnated with oil, tar or any compound thereof, or any other material whatsoever (except ashes from the fires of steamships plying within the Port of Port Phillip, which may be discharged in a depth of not less than 11 fathoms of water), shall be thrown or discharged by any person into the waters of any port, river or anchorage, or be placed, landed or shipped in any port except at the places and in the manner pointed out by the Port Officer, and all such ballast, rubbish, gravel, earth, stone, wreck, filth, refuse, explosives, live shells, oil, water ballast mixed or impregnated with oil, tar, or any compound thereof or other material shall be removed at such times and to such places as the Port Officer may direct.

##### REGULATIONS.

**HIS** Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 8th day of September, 1924, approved, pursuant to the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act 1915*, of the following Regulations, viz.:—

##### CITY OF MELBOURNE.

Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of a certain Reserve for Park, Gardens, and Children's Playground, known as "Powlett Reserve," in the City of Melbourne, and the preservation of good order and decency therein.

**WHEREAS** by the Crown grant entered in the Register Book, Volume 4505, Folio 900983, the surface and down to a depth of 50 feet below the surface of all that piece of land in the State of Victoria, being section 26, at East Melbourne in the said City, was granted to the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Melbourne, to provide a site for Park Gardens and Children's Playground. And whereas by section 182 of the *Land Act 1915* power is given to the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Melbourne (as Trustees of the said land), with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for the care, protection and management of such land, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein. Now therefore the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne (hereinafter called the Council), in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby in respect of such part of the said land as is set apart for and hereinafter designated "Children's Playground" make the regulations following:—

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The Children's Playground shall not be used after sunset.
2. No person above the age of twelve years shall enter the Children's Playground, or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon. Provided, however, that parents or others in charge of children shall be at liberty to enter the playground to watch over children who are in their charge.
3. The swings or other appliances erected in the playground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.
4. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.
5. Cricket or football shall not be played in the Children's Playground.
6. All paper, fruit peel, or other litter shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Council for the purpose.
7. Every person in the Children's Playground shall obey the directions of any officer of the Council in respect of his or her conduct therein.
8. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground.
9. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the Children's Playground, or bring any animal into the same.



10. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Council shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who commits a breach of any of these Regulations, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Children's Playground, and such person shall in addition be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided for any such offence.

11. Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 182 of the Land Act 1915, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each such offence, and every person who so offends, and who after he has been warned by any Bailiff or Crown Lands Officer or Officer or servant of the Council, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff, Officer, or servant or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

#### BY-LAW No. 94.

A By-law of the City of Richmond, made under Part VII., Div. 1, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 94, for providing for the erection, construction, and maintenance of verandahs and other matters in connexion therewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Council of the City of Richmond orders as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—
  - "Verandah" includes every sun-blind, screen, awning, portico, porch, shed, shade, covering, or other erection upon, over, or across any public footway for the purpose of shade or shelter, together with the supports other than the building to or against which it is attached.
  - "City" means the City of Richmond.
  - "Council" means the Council of the City.
  - "Surveyor" means the Building Surveyor of the City.
2. Clause 2 of regulation No. 18 is hereby altered by inserting the following words after the words "verandahs or awnings": "in all streets other than Bridge-road, Swan-street, Victoria-street, and Church-street, unless it is desired to erect a verandah of a cantilever type."
3. No verandah or portico shall be erected or caused or permitted to be placed over the footway of any street without the consent of the Council first had and obtained, and such portico or verandah shall be of the form, dimensions, and materials approved by the Council.
4. All verandahs and porticoes, when practicable, in Bridge-road, Swan-street, Victoria-street, and Church-street, shall be of cantilever form, and unless otherwise permitted by the Council the fascia shall finish flush with the face of the kerb and the following requirements must be complied with:—
  - (a) All girders, rafters, purlins, and other framing shall be of steel or iron. Girders shall be encased and the underside of verandahs shall be lined with approved stamped metal lining.
  - (b) Two-inch by one-inch redwood battens may be used for the encasing of girders and the attaching of the metal linings. The battens shall be secured to girders, rafters, and purlins by clip bolts, and no timber framing shall be used to support battens.
  - (c) The cantilever and fascia girders shall not exceed 12 inches in depth for verandahs over 12 feet in width, and 8 inches in depth for verandahs less than 12 feet in width.
  - (d) The roofs shall have a pitch of  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch per foot towards the building, and shall be covered with No. 24-gauge galvanized corrugated-iron secured to purlins with galvanized iron bolts or clips and washers at the top of corrugation. The iron shall be lapped two corrugations at sides and not less than 9 inches at ends of sheets, and shall be riveted every 12 inches at sides and at every third corrugation at ends.
  - (e) Box gutters shall be formed at or near the building line and shall be made out of No. 22-gauge galvanized iron well lapped, riveted, and soldered at ends of each sheet, and be supported on metal straps.
  - (f) Downpipes shall be of sufficient capacity to efficiently discharge rainwater falling on roofs. Pipes shall be wrought or cast iron chased into walls or piers or set back so as not to project beyond face of building, and shall discharge under footway into street, channel or be connected up to underground storm-water drain.
5. Skylights may be provided in verandahs over 12 feet in width. Glass shall be wire-rolled plate glass in single lengths set in approved glazing bars.
6. Applications for permission to construct a verandah shall be made by or on behalf of the owner of the building to which the verandah is to be attached and be in writing in a form to be prescribed by the Council, and there shall be deposited with the application a plan and specification of the verandah proposed to be erected.
7. If the application is approved of by the Council permission to erect a verandah may be obtained on payment of a fee of One pound, subject, however, to such terms and conditions as the Council may think proper to prescribe.
8. Pillar verandahs, when permitted, shall be in strict accordance with the plan and specification adopted by the Council and referred to in regulation No. 18.
9. If at any time the width of any footpath is altered the Council may by order direct that within such time as it thinks reasonable any verandah on or over the footway be removed or be altered or re-built in such a way as the Council thinks necessary and if within the time specified in the said order, the owner or occupier of the building against or in front of which the verandah is placed does not remove or does not alter or rebuild the verandah in the way prescribed by the order the Council may at the cost and expense of the owner or occupier cause the verandah to be removed, altered, or re-built, and in addition to such cost the owner or occupier shall forfeit and



pay a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every day during which such default continues, but not exceeding in all the sum of Twenty pounds.

10. No person shall climb any verandah post or shall sit or be upon any verandah except for the purpose of cleaning, renovating, or repairing the same. Any person who offends against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings.

11. If the Surveyor certifies in writing to the Council that any verandah, whether erected before or after the passing of this By-law, renders dangerous or less commodious the passage along any footway or street, or is in such a state of disrepair as to be objectionable or dangerous to the public, the Council, notwithstanding that such verandah was erected in accordance with the By-laws for the time being in force, may by order direct that the verandah be removed or be altered or re-built in such way as it thinks necessary and within such time as it thinks reasonable, and if within the time specified in the said order the owner or occupier for the time being of the building against or in front of which the verandah is placed does not remove or does not alter or rebuild the said verandah in the way prescribed by the order the Council may at the cost and expense of such owner or occupier cause the verandah to be removed, altered, or re-built and in addition to such cost the owner or occupier shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every day during which such default continues but not exceeding in all the sum of Twenty pounds.

12. Service of the order to be made under clause 9 hereof, and of the notice to be given under clause 11 hereof, and of the order to be made under clause 11 hereof, may be made on the owner or occupier personally or by leaving a copy with some person apparently engaged in the altering or re-building of the verandah or by affixing a copy on some conspicuous part of the front of the building against or in front of which the verandah is placed.

13. Sun-blinds, &c.—No person shall place or maintain in position over any footway any sun-blind, screen, or awning less than 7 ft. 6 in. above the footway.

14. Penalties.—Any person committing any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, except where the penalty is otherwise specially provided, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

## SHIRE OF COLAC.

## BY-LAW No. 98.

The President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, by virtue of the provisions of sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and Part V. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act, sections 8 to 20 of the *Local Government Act 1918*, section 10 of the *Local Government Act 1921*, and of all other powers thereto enabling, with the approval of the Governor in Council, hereby make the following By-law, number 98, of the said shire for carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in the said sections and part, namely:—

- Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road.
- Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road.
- Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings, or fences erected or construed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, hoardings, or fences, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council of the municipality for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.
- Prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke vents, or stove pipes.
- Regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.
- Regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, and materials for and the mode of enclosing the same.
- Regulating the erection of tents.
- Appointing referees as provided by and exercising all the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1918*.
- Exercising all, any, and every of the powers of the said Council under the *Local Government Act 1915* and of the 13th Schedule, Part V., thereto, or otherwise it enabling in connexion with the foregoing.
- For prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting or regulating within the whole of such residential areas the erection, adaptation for use, or use of any building for the purposes of trades, industries, manufactures, business, or public amusement.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and Part V. of the 13th Schedule thereto, and the *Local Government Act 1918*, and of the *Local Government Act 1921*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac order as follows:—

## PART I.

## Definitions.

In this By-law and the Schedules thereto, save where the context is inconsistent therewith—

- “Alteration” means any change in the construction or plan of a building or erection, or any change in the purpose for which any building or erection or any part thereof shall be used.
- “Approved” means approved in writing by the Council, its engineer, health inspector, or other authorized officer, as the case may require.
- “Building” shall mean and include erection, hoarding, and every structure of whatever kind, and every part of such structure and any addition or alteration thereto.
- “Building line” shall be the line which the engineer shall certify to be the true boundary line between a street or road, and private land abutting thereon.
- “Colac Riding” means the Colac Riding of the Shire of Colac.
- “Council” means the Council of the Shire of Colac.
- “Dwelling-house” means a building used or adapted to be used, or, in the opinion of the Council or the engineer, intended or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.
- “Engineer” means the engineer or acting engineer for the time being of the municipality, or other officer having for the time being the administration of this By-law.
- “Health inspector” means the health inspector or acting health inspector of the Shire of Colac.
- “Lane and right-of-way” mean a street or road less than 33 feet wide.

"Main rooms" shall be deemed to mean and include all rooms used or which, in the opinion of the Council or the engineer, shall be intended or adapted to be used as bedrooms, dining rooms, or ordinary living rooms, including kitchen.

"Municipality" means the municipal district of the Shire of Colac.

"New buildings" includes—

- (a) Any building erected or commenced to be erected after the date of this By-law coming into force.
- (b) Any building which for more than half its cubical contents has been taken down or has been destroyed by fire, tempest, or otherwise, and is re-erected or commenced to be re-erected after the date of this By-law coming into force.
- (c) Any space between walls and/or buildings, which is roofed or commenced to be roofed after the date of this By-law coming into force.

"Person" includes firm and corporation.

"Public building" includes theatres, churches, chapels, assembly halls, museums, libraries, schools, hospitals, lecture-rooms, and other like buildings, and all buildings adapted or intended, in the opinion of the Council or its engineer, to accommodate an assemblage of persons.

"Shop" means a building in which goods are usually and/or regularly offered or exposed for sale, or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payment, and also includes the saloons or shops of barbers and hairdressers and offices of agents and auctioneers, and other businesses or trades. A bona fide private boarding-house shall not be included in this definition by reason only of the fact that meals or refreshments are occasionally supplied for payment to persons other than boarders.

"Square" applied to the measurements of any area means the space of 100 square feet.

"Street or road" means and includes "street" and "road" and "private street" and "private road" as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1915*, section 3.

#### PART 2.

##### *Residential Area.*

1. The areas within the municipal district specified in the First Schedule hereto shall be and are hereby prescribed residential areas.

2. The erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building for the purpose of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements within such residential areas shall be and is hereby prohibited.

3. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, re-building, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, re-building, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law was in the same ownership.

4. Any person who shall offend against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building other than in brick, stone, concrete, or other approved material, within the areas mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, or added to such schedule by resolution of the Council.

#### PART 3.

##### *Frontages, &c.*

6. No building which is intended to be used, or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, and no addition to any such building, shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of 15 feet measured horizontally from the building line of the street or road the building is intended to or shall front.

7. No building which is intended to be used, or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, and no addition to any building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of 6 feet (measured horizontally) of any boundary other than the frontage.

8. Stables, coach-houses, garages, and outbuildings shall be subject to the like conditions as are imposed in regard to dwelling-houses by the last two preceding clauses, except that clause 7 shall not apply to them as far as it relates to distance from any boundary other than the frontage. Provided that garages shall be erected at the rear of any dwelling-house on same allotment, and if erected within a distance of 6 feet of any boundary such garages shall be separated therefrom by an external wall either of concrete at least 4½ inches in thickness or of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness, projecting in all cases at least 1 inch beyond any woodwork, and at least 1 foot through the roof covering. Manure pits of approved design must be constructed of brick or stone, with an impervious floor of brick, concrete, tar, or other approved material, and must be erected in conjunction with any stable to be erected.

9. (a) No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building or erection which

shall or may, in the opinion of the Council or the engineer, be intended to be used as a dwelling-house unless the site or curtilage of such building has a superficial area of at least 6,000 square feet.

(b) Minimum Frontage after Adoption of By-law.—After the adoption of this By-law all subdivisions or re-subdivisions must be such as to have a frontage to the avenues or streets or roads of not less than 55 feet, and a depth of not less than 100 feet.

(c) Every dwelling-house shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers an area of open land not less than 2,000 square feet.

(d) The dwelling-house and other buildings to be erected, built, or constructed upon any site or curtilage shall, except in the cases of corner sites, cover not more than one-fourth of the superficial area of such site or curtilage.

(e) The dwelling-house and other buildings to be erected, built, or constructed upon any corner site or curtilage frontage to two streets or roads shall cover not more than one-third of the superficial area of such site or curtilage.

10. No shop be built except on land having a frontage of not less than 16 ft. 6 in. to a street or road, and an average depth of not less than 130 feet, back access from a right-of-way 10 feet in width at the least, and a total area of not less than 2,145 square feet. Provided that in every case where dwelling-rooms are attached to a shop there shall be an open space or yard free from all buildings of not less than 600 square feet for the exclusive use of the occupiers of such shop or dwelling-room. Provided further than when any allotment of land smaller in area than that hereinbefore described was, in the opinion of the Council, owned by any person prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and not part of an allotment of which a portion has since been alienated or excised, and, in the opinion of the Council, further land cannot be obtained to increase the area of such land or such allotment, and the same is shown on any plan of subdivision heretofore approved by the Council, the Council, on application in writing, may, by resolution carried by a majority of the members of the Council at a meeting of which due notice has been given, permit a shop, which shall comply with the building regulations of the shire, to be erected upon such land.

11. From and after the coming into force of this By-law no building which is intended to be used, or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, shall be built or erected on any allotment of land unless the same has a frontage to a street or road of not less than 55 feet, with a superficial area of not less than 6,000 feet, and in no case shall the depth of such allotment be less than 100 feet. Provided that in any case where land has been subdivided into allotments prior to this By-law coming into force, and there remains between two building allotments belonging to other owners, or between an allotment already built on and any adjoining allotment belonging to another owner, or between any building allotment and the corner of a street or road in existence at the time this By-law came into force, an allotment of land which does not comply with the foregoing provisions, the Council may, on application being made in writing by the owner, exempt such allotment from the provisions of this clause of the By-law.

12. No land upon which any dwelling-house has been erected shall thereafter be reduced in area below the minimum area prescribed by clause 9 of this By-law. Providing always that, notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided to the contrary, the Council may, on application in writing setting forth the grounds of application, under special circumstances, and for special causes, and at a meeting of which due notice has been given to each councillor, declare that the provisions of this By-law, either in whole or in part, shall not apply to any particular area of land.

13. No building shall be erected in such a position that it shall lie between another building or any part thereof and a street, unless such other building has a direct and unobstructed access to some other street.

14. (a) No person shall erect, or cause or permit to be erected, any portico or verandah over the footway of any street without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing, and such portico or verandah shall be of the shape, figure, dimensions, and materials as set forth on the plan and specifications for the time adopted by resolution of the Council, but the lowest part of such portico or verandah shall be in no case less than 8 ft. 6 in. above the level of the outer edge of the footway.

(b) No openings shall be made in the roof of such verandah for the purpose of affording light, unless such openings be properly framed and glazed with approved glass protected underneath with fine-mesh wire netting or armoured glass to the satisfaction of the Council.

(c) All doors and openings giving access to cellars must be on the owner's property.

(d) Terraces or two houses or dwellings separated by a brick wall or otherwise erected on one block of land belonging to the same owner will not be allowed on any residential area.

(e) No public footway may be paved, flagged, tiled, asphalted, concreted, or covered with an approved impervious material without the consent of the Council being first obtained in writing. Such permission will not be granted unless the proper building line and levels are strictly adhered to, and that a fall of at least one-fourth of an inch per foot from building line to edge of kerbing has been provided for.

(f) No footpath shall be paved, flagged, tiled, asphalted, concreted, or covered with approved impervious materials to a lesser width than (16) sixteen feet measured from building line to outer edge of said material, unless with the written consent of the Council.

15. (a) No fowl-houses or dog-kennels, or buildings used or designed for the use of poultry, shall be erected at a lesser distance than 25 feet from any building used as a dwelling, whether on the allotment or otherwise. No building of the description referred to in this clause shall be erected except to the rear of any dwelling-house on the same allotment.

(b) No stables, cow-sheds, or other similar buildings shall be erected within 15 feet of any street without the consent in writing of the Council first obtained. No such building shall be erected except to the rear of any dwelling-house on the same allotment.

16. Privies, Closets, &c.—Privies, closets, &c., shall be erected in accordance with the design adopted by the Council, and not less than 20 feet from any dwelling. The side of privies or closets shall not be closer than 2 feet measured horizontally of land not in the same possession. They shall be built of brick, stone, wood, iron, or other approved material, and be provided with proper pan, doors, and fastenings, as shall be in accord with the Council's requirements. Urinals.—Where required, urinals shall be erected to a design approved by the Council. The floor thereof shall be constructed of approved impervious material.

17. (a) No dwelling-house shall consist of less than three main rooms of a total of not less than 400 square feet, and no building or rooms thereof shall be occupied for living purposes until at least three (3) main rooms shall have been completed according to the plans and specifications submitted to and approved by the Council, and in reticulated areas together with a bathroom at least 6 feet by 8 feet, and bath with water laid on.

(b) The Council may in special cases grant permission for the erection of a dwelling-house containing not less than two (2) rooms.

18. For the purpose of computing distances from any building, the furthest outside edge of the verandah, spouting, or any other projection shall be taken as the point from which measurements are to be taken.

#### PART 4.

##### Notice of Intention to Build, &c.

19. (a) No person shall commence or cause to be commenced any building or erection of any alteration or addition to any building or erection, or remove or cause to be removed any building or erection, or erect or cause to be erected any tent, without first having paid to the Council the necessary fees in accordance with the scale set out in the Third Schedule hereto.

(b) The decision of the engineer as to the area of a new building or the value of an addition shall be final and conclusive.

20. No person shall erect, build, construct, remove, or make any alteration or addition to, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed or removed or made, any alteration or addition to any building or erection or tent, without first obtaining written permission from the Council so to do.

21. No person shall erect, build, construct, remove, or make any alteration or addition to, or cause to be erected, built, constructed, or removed or made, any alteration or addition to any building or erection or tent, without first submitting to the Council or its engineer—

- (a) the plans and specifications of the proposed building, tent, or erection, alteration, or addition; and
- (b) a statement in writing of the purpose for which it is intended to be used; and
- (c) such further particulars in writing regarding the same as shall be necessary to enable the Council or its engineer to determine if all the provisions of this By-law applicable thereto are being complied with;
- (d) a plan showing ground plan of building boundaries of the land and position of buildings thereon; and
- (e) a copy or tracing of such last-mentioned plan, which shall be left with the Council permanently for its own use.

22. All plans and specifications approved by the Council shall be kept at the building or erection or tent therein referred to, and shall be available for inspection by the engineer or the authorized officer of the Council at all reasonable times on demand during the construction or erection, or alteration or addition, as the case may be, and for fourteen days after the completion thereof.

23. A permit obtained pursuant to this By-law shall lapse and be deemed of no effect at the expiration of six months from its grant unless extended by the engineer, or unless the works covered by such permission shall have been duly completed.

24. The engineer at all reasonable times during the progress and after the completion of any building or addition or alteration to any building affected by this By-law may, and he is hereby authorized to enter and inspect such building or addition or alteration.

25. The engineer may at all times stop the progress of any building, and withdraw or suspend any permission given by the Council under this By-law in the event of his not being satisfied that all the provisions of this By-law are being complied

with, and any person who continues, or builds or erects, or works on the site after notice from the engineer to desist, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

#### PART 5.

##### Materials and Construction, Demolition, Ventilation, Lighting, and Drainage.

26. (a) The interiors of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used, or shall or may be used as a dwelling-house, shall be constructed of lath and plaster, wood, or other approved materials.

(b) The foundation or footings of buildings other than wood shall not be less in width than eight (8) inches wider than the wall standing thereon.

(c) Bricks used in any building shall be good, hard, and well burnt, and if old or second-hand shall be thoroughly cleansed and approved of by the engineer in writing before being so used.

(d) All brick or stone chimneys shall be constructed of ample flue, to be well plastered or pargetted inside for the full height, and no timber of any description will be allowed to be built inside the works. The Council may give authority to erect iron chimneys outside the bricks area; but in the erection they shall be laid on either stone or concrete base and free from all woodwork.

(e) Hearths of stone, concrete, brick, or iron of approved dimensions shall be placed in front of all fireplaces.

(f) All timbers used in any buildings shall be of good sound material, free from rot, free from loose and large knots, and free from shakes, and free from imperfections whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired.

(g) The following conditions shall apply as to spacings and scantlings of timber:—

(1) The timber stumps shall be tarred to six (6) inches above ground level, and be not less than (5) five inches by (5) five inches redgum, jarrah, or other approved timber, spaced to (4) four feet centres, and fixed on (6) six inches by (6) six inches and (1½) one and one-half inch sole plates.

(2) Studs and ceiling joists shall not be less than (4) four inches by (1½) one and one-half inches, spaced not more than (18) eighteen inches apart centre, and properly secured.

(3) Rafters shall be not less than (4) four inches by (1½) one and one-half inches, spaced (3) three feet centre to centre, in the case of iron roofs, and (18) eighteen inches centre to centre in the case of slate, tile, or other roofs similar, securely braced with purlins and collar ties.

(4) Floor joists shall be not less than (4) four inches by (2) two inches, spaced (18) eighteen inches apart centre to centre on (4) four inch by (3) three inch bearers, spaced (6) six feet apart.

(h) Floors shall be fixed level, and in all dwellings shall be in no part less than (12) twelve inches above the surface of the ground.

(i) The space under the ground floor of every building shall have a sufficiency of openings through all walls under the floor to thoroughly ventilate the same.

(j) Vermin plates shall be provided to all walls other than brick.

(k) Every wall of brick or stone or concrete shall have an approved damp-proof course of two courses of asphalt or other approved impervious materials above the surface of the ground below the lowest floor, and in cases where it is not desirable to place the same throughout the building at one uniform level, then the same damp-proof course must be laid in horizontal layers connected at the end by a vertical course of the same material.

(l) The engineer shall have power to condemn and to order the removal of, or to remove at the expense of the owner, any materials which in his opinion are not suitable for use for the purpose for which he may consider it is intended to use same, and no person shall use such material so condemned for any building, erection, tent, alteration, or addition.

27. No person shall build or erect, or cause or permit to be built or erected, any building, erection, tent, or addition to any buildings, erections, tents, on any land unless and until such building, erection, tent, or addition, and the site and curtilage thereof, can be properly drained, and the Council may refuse permission to build or erect any building, erection, or tent or addition unless and until it is satisfied that the proposed building, erection, or tent or addition, and the site and curtilage thereof, can be properly drained, and must comply with the Health Act and any amendments thereto.

28. Proper provision shall be made and maintained for effectively removing water and sanitary and other drainage away from every building. The materials and construction of such drains shall be such as shall be approved by the Council or its engineer.

29. Every building or verandah abutting on to or overhanging the building line of any road or street must be provided with adequate guttering, which must be kept clear of obstruction. Water intercepted in such guttering must be carried through down-pipe to the footpath level, and thence by a pipe or other covered drain to the water table of such road or street.

30. (a) If any building is destroyed or partly destroyed by fire, storm, or tempest, or is in a condition unfit for human habitation or occupation, or is in a condition prejudicial to the

property in or the inhabitants of the neighbourhood of such building, the Council may, if the engineer or health inspector give to the Council a certificate in writing of such condition as aforesaid in respect of any building, order the owner to pull down, re-build, alter, or repair such building, or any part thereof, or otherwise to put the same, or any part thereof, into a state of good repair and condition, to the satisfaction of the Council, within a reasonable time to be fixed by the order.

(b) If the order is not obeyed the Council may with all convenient speed enter upon the building and the ground upon which it stands and execute the order.

(c) Where the order directs the taking down of a building, or any part thereof, the Council if executing the order may remove the materials to a convenient place and (unless the expenses of Council under this clause in relation to such building are paid to them within fourteen days after the account for such removal has been rendered to the owner) sell the same, if and as they in their discretion think fit.

(d) All expenses incurred by the Council in relation to any such building as aforesaid may be deducted by the Council out of the proceeds of sale, and the surplus (if any) shall be paid by the Council on demand to the owner of the building; and if such building, or any part thereof, is not taken down and/or such materials are not sold by the Council, or if the proceeds of sale are insufficient to defray the said expenses, the Council may recover such expenses or the deficiency from the owner of the building, together with all costs in respect thereof, in a summary manner in any court of competent jurisdiction, but without prejudice to the owner's right to recover the same from any lessee or other person liable to the expenses of repairs.

#### PART 6.

##### *Removed Buildings.*

31. No building or erection shall be removed into and erected or re-erected, or removed from any one part of the municipality to and erected or re-erected in the Colac Riding thereof, unless the owner or the person carrying out the removal first obtains written permission from the Council so to do. Before such permission shall be granted not less than (6) six clear days' notice in writing shall be given to the Council or the engineer of the desire to remove and erect or re-erect such building or erection. Such notice shall contain or be accompanied by the following:—

- (a) Particulars of the situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.
- (b) Particulars of the situation and a plan of the land upon which it is proposed to erect or re-erect or place such building, showing the proposed position thereon, and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.
- (c) A specification giving particulars of the construction of the existing building, and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is erected or re-erected.
- (d) A plan giving the dimensions of the building and any proposed alterations or additions thereto, and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.
- (e) Evidence satisfactory to the Council that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation, and a certificate from the health officer of the municipality from which the building is proposed to be removed that within six (6) months prior to date of removal no case of disease of an infectious or contagious nature has occurred therein.
- (f) Such particulars, further, in writing, regarding the same as shall be sufficient to enable the Council or its engineer to determine if all the provisions of any Act of Parliament, By-law, or Regulation applicable thereto are or will be complied with.

32. No written permission shall be given unless such removed building when erected or re-erected shall comply with the provisions of this By-law as applicable to new buildings.

33. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation shall be removed into or re-erected within the municipality.

34. No building or erection in which any case of infection or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding six (6) months shall be removed into and/or re-erected within the municipality.

35. No removed building shall be occupied until the engineer shall have certified in writing that all the provisions of this By-law have been observed and complied with in respect of such building.

36. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands, provided that in its altered position it shall comply in all respects with this By-law.

#### PART 7.

##### *Tents, Hoardings, Fences, and Houses, Connexions to Water Mains.*

37. No tent shall be erected within twenty (20) feet from any street or road, nor within (10) ten feet of any adjoining allotment.

38. No tent shall be erected or used, unless it is proved to the satisfaction of the engineer or other officer authorized by the Council—

That there are proper, permanent, and sufficient sanitary conveniences for the use of prospective occupiers of the tent, and all other occupiers of the property.

39. The proprietors or representatives of all circuses, merry-go-rounds, and other travelling shows shall give at least twenty-four hours' notice of their intention to erect a tent or other structure, and also comply with the following:—

- (a) Furnish the engineer or health inspector with the approval of the owner of the land upon which they intend erecting same.
- (b) Satisfy the engineer or health inspector that satisfactory arrangements have been made for living and sanitary purposes during the period of their stay.
- (c) Give guarantees, accompanied with a deposit of £1, that the land will be properly cleansed before they leave the same.
- (d) Satisfy the engineer or other officer appointed by the Council that the seating, lighting, and construction is safe to the public.

Subject to the compliance with the foregoing provisions, the Council may grant a permit for a stipulated time; at the same time the Council retains the right to cancel the permit if any breach of the Council's regulations is made.

40. Before the erection of any hoarding, a plan of position and construction thereof shall be submitted to the Council for approval. In the event of any hoarding being erected without the authority of the Council, and not complying with the requirements of the Council, the owner shall, within one day of receiving notice in writing from the Council, remove same.

41. No person shall deposit any building materials on any roadway without the consent in writing of the shire engineer being first obtained.

42. The frontage to streets, roads, lanes, and rights-of-way of all vacant lands within the Colac Riding of the Shire of Colac, which is hereby declared to be a populous area, must be fenced in a manner to be approved by the shire engineer; within such area the fence may consist of approved pickets, palings, corrugated iron, brick, art metal, or concrete. Any person before erecting a fence shall notify the shire engineer in writing, submitting in duplicate a sketch and description of the fence proposed to be built. Such application shall be accompanied by a fee of 5s. Such fence shall not be erected without the approval in writing of the engineer. If any land is not fenced as hereinbefore provided, it shall be lawful for the Council (after one month's notice in writing to erect the fence and specifying the type of fence being served upon the owner, or sent by registered post to his last known address) to enter on the said land and erect the fence according to the description specified in the said notice. The cost of same shall be payable by the owner, and be recoverable in a court of petty sessions or other court of competent jurisdiction. If any fence on any land is allowed to get into a state of disrepair, the Council shall serve one month's notice in writing upon the owner, or send same by registered post to his last known address, requiring him to place the fence in a proper and reasonable state of repair. In the event of the owner failing to effect the said repairs within the time specified by the said notice, it shall be lawful for the said Council to enter on the land and repair same at the cost of the owner, and recover the amount in a court of petty sessions or other court of competent jurisdiction.

43. (a) No person shall make or cause to be made a house connexion to a water main in or under any road or right-of-way without first giving the engineer twenty-four hours' notice in writing. The depth to which the pipe must be buried will then be fixed by the engineer, and the pipe must be laid in strict conformity therewith, and the road surface made good.

(b) The fees payable on deposit for three months for opening streets, roads, paths, or walks, or until such time as the work is completed to the satisfaction of the engineer, are as follow:—

#### PART 8.

##### *Referees.*

44. The Council shall appoint a referee as provided by the *Local Government Act 1918*, to act with a referee appointed by the Governor in Council, and exercise the powers as provided in the said Act.

45. If any doubt, difference, or dissatisfaction in respect of any matter as to which provision is made by or under this By-law arises between any parties concerned, or between any party and the engineer for the municipality as to—

- (a) any act done or to be done in pursuance of this By-law;
- (b) the effect of the provisions of this By-law in any case;
- (c) the mode in which the provisions and directions of this By-law are or ought to be carried into effect;

- (d) whether the requirements implied in terms of qualification applied to sites, to soils, to materials, or to workmanship or otherwise, and denoting good, sound, fire-proof, fit, proper, or sufficient are fulfilled in certain cases;
  - (e) the expenses to be borne by the respective owners of premises parted by the same party walls, or the proportion thereof;
  - (f) the proportions of the expense to be borne by the occupier or by the owner of premises in respect of any works executed; or
  - (g) any other matter whatever;
- any party concerned may require the referees on appeal to determine such matter upon a requisition by notice in writing to the shire secretary, setting forth, either generally or otherwise, the matters in respect of which the determination of the referees is required, and the referees shall, subject to the *Local Government Act 1918*, hear and determine the same.

PART 9.

Enforcement and Penalties.

46. No person (whether as owner, builder, contractor, agent, or otherwise) shall erect, build, or construct, remove, or make any alteration or addition to, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, removed, or made, any alteration or addition to any building or erection, or tent, contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

47. Except where a different intention is expressed herein or by resolution of the Council, this By-law shall apply to and have operation in and throughout the whole of the Colac Riding of the Shire of Colac.

48. Any matter or thing arising under this By-law may be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by special resolution, either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case.

49. Any building which shall be re-erected or commenced to be re-erected, wholly or partially, shall be subject to this By-law to the same extent as if it were a new building.

50. From and after the date of this By-law coming into operation, By-laws 76 and 80 are hereby repealed so far as the provisions thereof are inconsistent with this By-law.

51. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, or shall fail to duly comply with any notice thereunder, shall (notwithstanding any requisition under Part 8) be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than One pound and not exceeding Twenty pounds; and if such offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty not exceeding One pound per day for each day such offence is continued.

52. The provisions of Part V. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915* are hereby adopted.

53. If any building, erection, or tent shall be wholly or partly built, or erected, added to, or altered contrary to or not in conformity with the provisions of this By-law, the Council or any officer thereof may give to the owner, occupier, or builder, or leave upon the site of such building, erection, or tent, notice in writing to bring such building, erection, or tent into conformity with the said provisions, or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building, erection, or tent within such time as is limited in such notice, and such owner, occupier, or builder shall comply with such notice within the time therein limited.

54. If default shall be made in complying with any notice mentioned in the last preceding clause, then, notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council or its engineer or other officer thereof to enter upon any building, erection, or tent, and on the site thereof, with a sufficient number of workmen and for that purpose, to break down any fence surrounding the land on which such building, erection, or tent is situate, and to demolish and pull down the said building, erection, or tent, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit, to sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit, and all expenses incurred by the Council, its engineer, or other officer in demolishing and pulling down the said building, erection, or tent, or any part thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same, and in doing other acts as aforesaid, and all fees and penalties due by the owner, occupier, or builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Council shall restore the surplus (if any) arising from such sale to such owner, occupier, or builder, or other person legally entitled thereto, on demand, and any deficiency shall be made good and paid by the owner, occupier, or builder to the Council on demand.

55.
