#### BY-LAW No. 265.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith :-

#### (A) GOODS RATES.



REGULATION XL.—TRANSIT ALLOWANCE TO PUPILS ATTENDING CERTAIN SCHOOLS.

- 1. The Minister of Public Instruction may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, allow a pupil attending a district high school, a higher elementary school, a central school, central classes, a school of domestic arts, a technical school, or a special educational center such as a cookery or a sewing or a woodwork center, such sum (not exceeding £5 per annum) as will cover the cost of transit to and from school, provided that...

(a) the pupil shows special aptitude and promise;
(b) the place of residence of the pupil shall be not less than 4 miles from the school or educational center which he is attending;
(c) the school or educational center which the pupil is attending shall be the nearest school or educational center of its kind to his place of residence; and (d) the total amount, as evidenced by a statutory declaration on a prescribed form, of the net profits, income, and emoluments received by the parents or guardians of the pupil during the preceding year shall not exceed £200 or a quota of £50 for each member of the family, including such parents or guardians and excluding children earning Ten shillings or more weekly.

excluding children earning Ten shillings or more weekly.

2. Payments of the allowance granted under clause 1 above will be made at the end of each quarter.

3. Where arrangements are made for the transit of pupils in numbers to a district high school, a higher elementary school, a central school, central classes, a school of domestic arts, a technical school, or a special educational center such as a cookery or a sewing or a woodwork center, the Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, grant an allowance on the £1 for £1 basis, up to a limit to be fixed, towards the cost of such transit.

4. Payments of the allowance granted under this Regulation shall be conditional on moneys being placed by the Legislature at the Minister's disposal.

The orifice in the closet seat must be at least 3½ inches behind the riser or casing more or less surrounding the pan; the space under the seat must not allow for a larger interval than 1½ inches between the pan and the seat, and it must be so fitted with guides and stops that the pan may be casily introduced into its proper position. The floor of the whole closet must be of approved material, such as asphalt, or concrete, or flagstones, having its surface impervious, horizontal beneath the seat, but sloped forward from the riser to the front wall ½ inch per foot, and nowhere less than 3 inches above the surrounding ground level. Access to the pan for the purpose of removal shall be from the exterior of the closet building. The space beneath the seat shall be provided with a fly-proof air grating situated in the lowermost part of an external wall, and having a clear air-way of at least 24 square inches, and an upcast outlet ventilator 5 inches, in diameter extending from beneath the soffit of the seat to above the roof. The orifice in the closet seat shall be provided with a hinged lid or cover.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be osupplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of nightsoil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be k

to thoroughly and effectuary decorrize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the daytime, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by steam and tar painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

(1) Outside the times of beginning and ending work:-(i) On Saturdays-

Double time. Between 8.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. Later than 9.30 a.m. or earlier than 6.30 a.m. .. (ii) On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays-Between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. ... Later than 6 p.m. or earlier than 6.30 a.m. Double time. Treble time. (iii) On Fridays-Double time. Between 4.30 p.m. and 5.30 p.m.

Later than 5.30 p.m. or earlier than 6.30 a.m. (2) Within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work in excess of 44 hours

in any week

(B) In any other place :-

In excess of 44 hours in any week ...

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Treble time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Now Year's Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) DAY AND LATEST HOURS FOR PAYMENT OF WAGES.—The day and latest hour when payment of wages is to be made shall be Friday at 4.30 p.m.

(7) TIME WAGES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 22 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of forty-two per centum.
