Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE TENTMAKERS BOARD.

NOTE .- On the 11th day of November, 1923, the powers of the Tentmakers Board were extended to enable it to fix "the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of a maker of Horse rugs;

Horse rugs;
Cow rugs;
Water bags;
Outside blinds (except Venetian blinds);
Canvas or duck filters;
Canvas or duck mail bags."
This Determination, on the 4th October, 1924, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of a maker of tents, tarpaulins, sails, or flags," has made the following Determination, namely:—
(1) That on the 4th October, 1924, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

One female apprentice to every three or fraction of three fomale workers receiving not less than 46s per week of 45

Improvers.

One male improver to each male worker receiving not less than 85s. per week of 48 hours.

One female improver to each female worker receiving not less than 46s. per week of 45 hours.

Provided that one female improver in lieu of one male

improver may be employed.

(5) Time Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of

fifty per centum.
(6. SPECIAL RATES.

(6. SPECIAL RATES.—That double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, New Years Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, 21st April, Eight Hours Day), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(7) PIROE-WORK.—The Board determines, under the provisions of Section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person or persons or classes of persons employed at any work for which the Board has fixed the minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages that are fixed by the Board for such work.
