I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to revoke the Temporary Reservation of certain Lands situate at North Carlton for Public Educational Purposes to close a certain Right-of-way and portion of certain streets and to provide for the Grant to the Commonwealth of Australia for Defence Purposes of certain lands in pursuance of an Arrangement with the Commonwealth for the Exchange of certain Lands to amend the *North Carlton Lands Act 1920* and for other purposes.”

“An Act to amend the *Milk Supply Act 1922*.”

YACKANDANDAH WATERWORKS TRUST RATING BY LAW FOR THE YEAR 1925.

THE Commissioners of the Yackandandah Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:—

1. *General Rate.*—A rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling is hereby made for the year 1925 upon all property liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Trust. And such rate shall be based on the municipal valuation of such property by the Shire of Yackandandah, in existence on the first day of January, 1925.

2. *Minimum Rate.*—The minimum rate payable on any property on which is erected any dwelling house, shop, office, factory, stable or other building shall be Forty-two shillings and sixpence. The minimum rate on any other rateable property whatsoever shall be Forty-two shillings and sixpence.

3. *Sale of Water by Agreement.*—The Trust may in case where deemed necessary supply water by special agreement upon such terms and conditions as it may determine.

4. *When Payable.*—The foregoing rates shall be due and payable in half-yearly moieties, in advance, that is to say, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1925. M. CLUNE, or such person or persons as may from time to time be employed by the Trust for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the rates hereby made.

CORRYONG WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Corryong Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-laws:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, hydrant, or any public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose; and any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

4. Any person who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, or other work the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any) and if none the owner shall upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing immediately proceed to repair the same and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after the receipt of such notice; and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the Trust may deem fit until the necessary repairs have been effected.

6. No person shall apply a hose or pipe to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering, nor shall any such person water by means of such hose or pipe the ground, trees, plants, or shrubs, or wash any house, walls, or carriage, or use such hose or pipe for any similar purpose unless the water is charged for by meter; and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach. To be enforced in case of shortage of water after notice is given by advertisement in the local press.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work; the cost of such licence being £1 per year or part thereof during which such licence is issued; and before any person so licensed under this By-law shall break up any road or footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of £5 and in case he shall not proceed with the laying on of such water, or shall not immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said road or footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of £5 shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said road or footpath, or otherwise as the Trust may deem best. The days on which water will be turned off will be on Mondays from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. in which time plumbers will be obliged to make tappings or attach fittings to the mains for service or other connexions. Plumbers will be charged a fee of 10s. 6d. for inspection of service connexions by Trust's officer, which sum shall be deposited with the notice required to be served as mentioned in clause 4.

8. Before any such licence is granted by the Trust the person applying shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

9. The quality of material required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

- (1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (excepting those connecting the service-pipes and mains), bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.
- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.
- (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

(4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet in height.

(5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes to mains to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(6) No service-pipes shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than twelve inches on public property and six inches on private property.

(7) A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed to each service immediately outside the property served, properly secured and covered with an approved cap and also immediately against the main.

(8) The size of service-pipe shall not exceed $\frac{3}{4}$ inch without special permission of the Trust in which case the Trust reserves the right to insist on an approved meter being installed.

10. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust; each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

12. In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the Trust before doing any act, or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice in writing addressed to the secretary of the Trust and delivered at his office within such time as may be mentioned in the Water Acts, or in this Regulation, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act, or commencement of such work, and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the Trust's consent in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the secretary, who shall be competent to give the Trust's consent and on behalf of the Trust to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto, and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the Trust with a view to report thereof for confirmation.

13. No person shall, without written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of a hydrant and hose attached to fire plugs. Any person offending against this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. The fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

15. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied for the providing and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust, to within 200 feet of the boundaries of such lands, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

16. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. Any person wilfully or carelessly breaking, injuring, or opening any lock, valve, pipe, or other work belonging to the Trust, or turning any tap, or carelessly or wilfully doing any other act whereby the water of the Trust may be wasted, or who carelessly or wilfully does any of the aforementioned acts with intent that the water of the Trust may be wasted, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

18. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all times between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and four in the afternoon to enter any house, building, or land through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed or preventing waste, and to inspect or examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the Trust, and if any person hinders such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

19. The water supply in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with this By-law, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with this By-law and not otherwise.

20. In the construction of these By-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole. The word "officer" shall be deemed and taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean Corryong Waterworks Trust.

21. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. The Trust may contract or enter into an agreement for the supply of water to premises other than specified in its rating By-laws and such agreement will be subject to these or any other Regulations covering the supply of water.

23. Any person who, having been served with a notice to provide a meter, shall refuse or neglect to supply such meter within one month of receiving such notice, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.

24. Any person who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break open or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe-work, weir, channel, reservoir, or injure the property of the Trust, and who shall wilfully trespass on the Trust's works or property, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £5.

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Merbein Urban District within the Merbein Waterworks District:—

- (1) Of any tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-five pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-five pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1924, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1925, and shall be payable on the 24th day of October, 1924, at the office of the said Commission, at Merbein.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a Police Magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Twenty-four pence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Twenty-four pence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of

Thirty pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.

- (2) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Thirty pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1924, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1925, and shall be payable on the 24th day of October, 1924, at the office of the said Commission, at Nyah.

3. For making and levying such rates, the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes of such rates be determined by a Police Magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency the Governor in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described from the Shire of Yea, and annex such area to the Shire of Healesville.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE IN THE CITY OF BENDIGO, PARISH OF SANDHURST.

WE, Samuel Lazarus, John Henry Goudge, Walter Alfred Reynell, John Taylor, John Francis Gleeson, and Daniel Barnett Lazarus, being the majority of the members of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course in the City of Bendigo and Parish of Sandhurst, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrances fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The divisions into which the Reserve, with the buildings, fences and other erections thereon, is parcelled out are as follow :—

- (1) The lawn, the grand stand and conveniences, the tea rooms, the luncheon rooms, the cloak rooms, the telegraph office, and carriage paddock and approaches.
- (2) The weighing yard, the stewards' room, the committee rooms and offices, the members' stand and enclosure, the stewards' stand, the jockeys' room, the casualty room, the judge's box and approaches.
- (3) The enclosure called "the Birdcage" and approaches.
- (4) The flat and approaches.
- (5) The training ground, sheds and approaches.
- (6) The course proper and approaches.
- (7) The enclosures called the reserved paddocks and approaches.

2. Subject to the provisions of the eighth Regulation, all persons who shall have duly paid for admission to the fifth of the said divisions for the purpose of training or exercising horses shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted thereto with their horses for the period for which such tickets are issued, subject, however, to such orders or directions as the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or those authorized by such Committee of Management or the committee of the Bendigo Jockey Club for the time being may from time to time give, as and whenever there may be occasion with reference to such division.

3. No person except the judge and timekeeper, or any person the judge may call to his assistance, shall enter the judge's box or the approach thereto. No person shall enter the stewards' stand or the stewards' room or approaches thereto, except the stewards of the Bendigo Jockey Club, and such persons as they may invite to do so.

4. No person shall enter the weighing stand or the weighing yard, or the approaches thereto, except the Committee of Management of the Reserve and the stewards and committee of the Bendigo Jockey Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, stewards, or committee, the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses whose jockeys are being or about to be weighed.

5. No person shall enter the committee stand, the committee rooms and offices, or the several approaches thereto, except the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee and stewards of the Bendigo Jockey Club or their respective officers, and such other persons as the Committee of Management and committee or stewards of the Bendigo Jockey Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards may invite to do so.

6. No person, unless otherwise permitted under these Regulations, or by the Committee of Management or the committee of the Bendigo Jockey Club, shall enter upon the Reserve, or any division or part thereof, unless such person shall have a ticket duly authorizing him in that behalf.

7. No person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Bendigo Jockey Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonest, corrupt, fraudulent or improper practices on the turf, or dishonorable action or conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, to be a defaulter, shall enter upon the Reserve or any division or part thereof, or remain upon the Reserve or any division or part thereof, and may be expelled therefrom after having been warned off by or on behalf of the Committee of Management, committee, or stewards or by any person appointed by them for that purpose.

8. Every member of the Bendigo Jockey Club, and every person paying for admission to the first, third, fourth, and fifth divisions shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce, or (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee, or stewards of the Bendigo Jockey Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, to demand the production or surrender of the same.

9. No person shall remain in the Reserve or in any division or part thereof, except the fifth division, for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run.

10. Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting or other purpose, the grand stand, or any portion thereof, or any booth, building, or enclosure upon the Reserve, shall abide by any order or direction given by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Bendigo Jockey Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards in reference to the Reserve, and the buildings and other erections thereon.

11. No person shall bring any dog into the Reserve, or any division or part thereof, or into any building thereon.

12. No person shall in any way damage or deface any fence, gate, building, or erection on the Reserve.

13. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee of Management, or those duly authorized by such Committee of Management, light any fire on any part of the Reserve, or in any building, shed, or premises thereon.

14. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers growing or being on the Reserve or on any part thereof.

15. No person who has been convicted in a Court of law of larceny or of an attempt to commit a felony or larceny, or of obtaining money by false pretences, or of an attempt to obtain money by false pretences, or who is a reputed thief, pickpocket, balancer, welsher, whisperer, ticktacker, or prostitute shall enter or remain on any part of the said Reserve.

16. Any person committing in the Reserve, or any division or part thereof, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences may be expelled or removed from the Reserve, or any part thereof, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission :—

- (1) Assaulting any other person.
- (2) Being drunk.
- (3) Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course, or any part of it, unless authorized, during a race meeting, or when the horses are preparing or prepared to start, or are running for any race.
- (4) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (5) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (6) Behaving improperly or riotously, or in an insulting or disorderly manner.
- (7) Being found in the first, third, fourth, or fifth of the said divisions, and not producing upon demand, or (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or of the committee or stewards of the Bendigo Jockey Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee or stewards to demand production or surrender of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to such division, unless the person so found shall forthwith satisfy the said Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him, and that his ticket has been lost or surrendered.

 For the admission of each person to the third division, 3s.
 For the admission of each person to the fourth division, 2s.
 For the admission to the fifth division for training or exercising each horse, for every half-year, 20s.
 For admission through the outer boundary gates to the Reserve of every person with a truck or barrow (for each entry), 2s. 6d.
 For admission through the outer boundary gates of the Reserve of every horse (not being a race-horse in training), for each entry, 2s. 6d.
 For admission through the outer boundary gates of the Reserve of every horse (not being a race-horse in training) with a vehicle, and of every motor vehicle, for each entry, 5s.

Provided that all members of the Bendigo Jockey Club, the officials, officers, and employees of the said club, the officials and members of committee of the Northern District Racing Association, when wearing their official badge, shall be admitted to any part of the Reserve (with the exception of the fifth division) with their horses, carriages and horses, and motor

vehicles, without payment of any of the above tolls and charges for admission. And provided further that ladies holding ladies' tickets shall upon production thereof be admitted to any part of the said Reserve with the exception of the second, fifth, and sixth divisions without payment of any of the above charges for admission. And provided further that the Committee of Management of the Reserve, the committee or stewards of the Bendigo Jockey Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, may exempt any member or official of a racing club wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees, and that the money so received from such tolls, entrance fees, and other charges shall, after deducting necessary expenses, be applied by the said Committee of Management, or committee of the Bendigo Jockey Club for, towards the permanent improvement of the Reserve for racing purposes, or the erection, maintenance, or repair of buildings and fences, or the planting of trees, flowers, or shrubs in the Reserve, and in prizes for any race at any race meeting conducted by, or held under the auspices of the Bendigo Jockey Club, or for the owner of any horse engaged in any such race, or in such other manner in or upon the Reserve as shall be necessary or expedient for the purpose of rendering the same more convenient and useful for racing purposes.

18. No person shall offer for sale or sell goods or articles for consumption upon any part of the Reserve, or carry on any trade, business, or calling whatever on any portion of the Reserve other than upon such portions as may be respectively set apart by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Bendigo Jockey Club, for the sale of such goods or articles or the carrying on of such trades, business, or calling, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent in writing of such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee or stewards for that purpose.

19. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on the portions of the first and fourth divisions respectively set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall comply with the following conditions:—

First.—That he shall first obtain a permit from the committee of the Bendigo Jockey Club so to do.

Second.—That during the time he shall be in or upon the said divisions, carrying on his trade, business, or calling as specified as aforesaid, he shall wear a ticket to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Bendigo Jockey Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee, or stewards, which ticket shall be visible to the public, and shall have clearly and legibly written thereon his name and usual address.

20. No person, unless duly authorized in writing by or on behalf of the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee of the Bendigo Jockey Club, or the secretary thereof, shall distribute or post or stick bills, placards or posters or advertisements of any kind, or assist in distributing, posting, or sticking same on, upon, or within any fence, gate, building, erection, enclosure on or upon the said Reserve or any division or part thereof.

21. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in, upon, or around the Reserve or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, papers, or rubbish, or discharge any firearms nor throw stones or missiles of any kind therein or thereon.

22. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission of the said Committee of Management or committee of the Bendigo Jockey Club or an official thereof first had and obtained.

23. No person shall camp in the Reserve or any part thereof nor erect therein any dwelling, booth, tent, or other structure without the permission in writing of the said Committee of Management, or committee of the Bendigo Jockey Club or an official thereof first obtained.

24. Persons hiring or using for any race meeting the grandstand or any other buildings or erections on the said Reserve, or any of the enclosures thereof, shall abide by, carry out, and fulfil any order or direction given by or on behalf of the said Committee of Management or committee of the Bendigo Jockey Club, or the stewards or any official of such club in reference to the said stand, buildings, erections, and enclosures.

25. The expulsion or removal of any person from the said Reserve or any division thereof, or any building or erection thereon for committing a breach of, or offending against any of these Regulations shall not exempt such person from any penalty to which he would otherwise be liable for such breach or offence.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5); and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of

the Police Force, and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

DIMBOOLA RESERVE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC GARDENS AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF DIMBOOLA.

WE, Arthur Campbell Bennett, David Stewart Anderson, Gustav Franz Wiedermann, Michael Matthew Feary, Edward Kingdon Kent, William Bach, Norman William Aldred, Adler Arthur Fortington, Samuel Leslie Germon, George Frederick Wilhelm Nettelbeck, William Thomas Searle, Ernest William Pritchard, Carl August Mibus, Ernst Wilhelm Sallmann, Thomas George Clements, Theodore Ernest Moller, Walter Gerhard Sallmann, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for Public Gardens and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Town of Dimboola, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 25 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for special purposes, when a fee for admission may be charged and taken as set forth hereunder.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without permission from the Committee of Management first obtained.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and that an account thereto be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

5a. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.

6. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, and when a charge is made at the gate, 10 per cent. on gate takings must be paid to the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

9. Any society or club may be called upon to make good any damage done during the time the Reserve is being used by such club or society.

10. Any club or society wishing to erect permanent buildings on the Reserve must submit plan and specification showing proposed building for approval to the Shire Council and Committee of Management.

11. All clubs and societies using the Reserve must pay 5 per cent. on all members' tickets to the Committee of Management.

12. Any club or society wishing to make any alterations on the Reserve must first obtain the consent of the Committee of Management.

13. The following is the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days as the Committee of Management may approve:—

- At registered race meetings—For adults, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 8s.
- On all other occasions—For adults, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 3s.
- On all occasions—For every vehicle, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding 2s.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 (Five pounds), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10 (Ten pounds).

- (a) stand upon any chair or seat, or stand or sit upon any window-sill, dado, cornice, balcony, railing, or staircase railing; or
- (b) disturb or interrupt any such meeting or gathering; or
- (c) curse or swear, or use any gross, indecent, or abusive language; or
- (d) conduct himself in an insulting or riotous manner; or
- (e) be drunk, or take into such building any intoxicating liquor; or
- (f) take part in any disturbance or disorder; or
- (g) cause any obstruction by standing or otherwise in the approaches to the external doors of such building, or in the corridors, aisles, or passages within the same; or
- (h) smoke in the hall or entrances thereof; or
- (i) expectorate in the hall or in any room or out-house adjacent and belonging thereto.

3. It shall not be lawful for the promoter of any entertainment whatsoever held in such building to prevent, oppose, or cause to prevent or oppose the inspection of the said building by any authorized officer, whether before, during, or after the holding of any entertainment whatsoever, or at any other times. "Authorized officer" means health officer or inspector, or duly authorized municipal officer.

Any person or persons who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings.
