PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act relating to the Acquisition of Rights of Access of Air."

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million two hundred and seventy-four thousand two hundred and eleven pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and in the fifteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

APPOINTMENT OF BOARD OF INQUIRY.

WHEREAS a difference of opinion has arisen between the Melbourne Harbour Trust Commissioners, the Victorian Railways Commissioners, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board, the Corporation of the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne and the Corporation of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, as to the extent to which, in all the circumstances of the case, they are respectively responsible for the construction (along the route delineated and coloured yellow, green, and purple on a map lodged in the office of the Victorian Railways Commissioners), of a new road which it is proposed shall be constructed from the Napier-street bridge over the Maribyrnong River at Footscray to Dudley-street, at West Melbourne; and thence to the Flinders-street Extension in the City of Melbourne: And as to the amounts which they should respectively contribute towards the cost of the construction of the said proposed road: And whereas they have agreed that the matters in difference between them shall be submitted to and determined by a Board to be appointed as hereinafter provided: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved that:—

I, Thomas Ramsden Ashworth, of 325 Collins-street, Melbourne, architect; George Kermode, of the Public Offices, Treasury Gardens, Spring-street, Melbourne, Chief Engineer of Public Works; and William Thomas Bartholomew McCormack, of the Titles Office, Queen-street, Melbourne, a member of the Country Roads Board, be appointed a Board to inquire into and determine:—

1. The extent to which each of the bodies aforesaid is, in all the circumstances of the case, responsible for the construction of the said proposed new road; and
2. The amount of the contribution which each of the said bodies should make towards the cost of the construction of the said proposed new road.

11. That the said Thomas Ramsden Ashworth shall be the chairman of the said Board.

FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

A PPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nomination during 1925 for Free Places in a course for any degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne.

SUNBURY WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1925.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, in the Waterworks District of Sunbury, which has been proclaimed an Urban District under the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1925 on all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Sunbury Waterworks Trust, and also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust:—

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the £1 sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property fronting streets on which a main pipe has been laid, according to the valuation for the time being on all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Bulla, the minimum amount to be paid in respect to any tenement to be not less than Twenty-five shillings.

2. For all unoccupied allotments a minimum sum of Ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For water supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons shall be paid, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which would be equal to the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied, and where the water is used for other than domestic purposes solely the charge shall be One shilling per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 40,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust shall deem necessary.

4. For any public water trough supplied by the Trust the sum of Twenty shillings shall be charged, unless supplied by meter.

5. For water supplied from the stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of One shilling, and for each load in excess of 200 gallons *pro rata* on the above scale.

The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of April, 1925, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1925.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 22nd day of October, 1924, been pleased to approve of the following Regulations, made under the provisions of the *Police Pensions Act 1923*, viz. :—

The *Police Pensions Act 1923*.

REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Police Pensions Regulations 1924*, and shall come into force on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.

2. These Regulations are divided into parts as follows :—

Part I.—Applications for Pensions, Gratuities, and Allowances. Regulations 4 to 18.

Part II.—Probationary Service. Regulations 19 to 24.

Part III.—Approved Service and Deductions from Service for Sickness, Misconduct, and Neglect of Duty. Regulations 25 to 30.

Part IV.—Payment of Pensions, Gratuities, and Allowances. Regulations 31 to 37.

Part V.—Appeals against Acts of Superior Officers which prevent the reckoning of any period as Approved Service. Regulations 38 to 47.

Part VI.—Appeals against Opinions of the Medical Board. Regulations 48 to 57.

3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“The Act” means the *Police Pensions Act 1923*.

“The Schedule” means the schedule to these Regulations.

“Pensioner” means a person to whom a pension has been granted under the provisions of the Act.

“Retired member of the Force” shall include a member of the Force who is permitted under the provisions of Regulation 5 to make an application for a pension or gratuity prior to his retirement.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females and the singular to include the plural and the plural the singular, unless the contrary as to gender or number is expressly provided.

PART I.

Applications for Pensions, Gratuities, and Allowances.

4. An application for a pension, gratuity, or allowance shall be signed by the applicant, and shall be made in the form of a statutory declaration under the provisions of Division 4 of Part IV. of the *Evidence Act 1915*. Such application shall be made to the Chief Commissioner of Police.

5. A member of the Force who has been informed that he is about to be retired may, not more than two calendar months before the date on which it is intended to retire him, make an application for a pension or gratuity notwithstanding that he is still a member of the Force.

6. An application by a retired member of the Force for a pension or gratuity shall be made in accordance with Form 1 in the schedule.

7. An application by a widow of a former member of the Force for a pension or gratuity shall be made in accordance with Form 2 in the schedule.

8. An application by a mother or guardian of the children of a former member of the Force for an allowance or gratuity shall be made in accordance with Form 3 in the schedule.

9. An application by a dependant of a former member of the Force for a gratuity shall be made in accordance with Form 4 in the schedule.

10. On receipt of an application for a pension, gratuity, or allowance, the Chief Commissioner shall examine such application. If it appear to him that on any material point the evidence is insufficient for the just determination of the application he shall cause to be made such further investigations as appear to him desirable, and may for the purposes of such investigations examine the applicant or any other person on oath.

11. For the purposes of the investigation of any such application a certificate under the hand of the secretary to the Police Department relating to—

- the age of any member of the Force,
- the date of his appointment to the Force,
- the number of years he has actually served,
- the rate of salary paid to him,
- the reason of his retirement, or
- any other matter relating to his service in the Force, and stating that the information contained in such certificate has been obtained from the records of the Police Department, shall be prima facie evidence of the correctness of the statements contained therein. Such certificate shall be in accordance with Form 5 of the schedule.

12. When an application is made for a special pension the Chief Commissioner shall fully investigate the circumstances in which the injury was received.

13. If the application be made under the provisions of section 7 of the Act, and if the Chief Commissioner considers that a further medical examination is desirable, he shall notify the applicant in accordance with Form 6 in the schedule to appear

before the Medical Board at a time and place to be stated in such notice in order to be medically examined. The Medical Board shall medically examine such applicant at such time and place or at such other time or place as the Board shall then determine, and shall forthwith after such examination forward a medical certificate to the Chief Commissioner.

14. Forthwith on the receipt of any medical certificate the Chief Commissioner shall send a copy thereof to the applicant.

15. On the completion of such investigations as appear to him desirable the Chief Commissioner shall forward such application to the Police Superannuation Board, together with—

- all the documents relating to his investigations;
- the medical certificate (if any);
- the medical certificate given by the Independent Board appointed under section 12, sub-section (8) of the Act (if any);
- the certificate of approved service required by section 11, sub-section (2), of the Act (if so required); and
- his report on the application.

16. When any recommendation of the Police Superannuation Board is approved by the Governor in Council, the Honorable the Chief Secretary shall cause notice thereof to be given to the Chief Commissioner, and the Chief Commissioner shall forthwith send to the applicant notice in writing in accordance with Form 7 in the schedule, informing him of the result of his application.

17. At any time after the receipt of any application under the Act the Police Superannuation Board may require the Chief Commissioner to make any further investigation on any matter relating to such application.

18. When a pension is granted on the ground of incapacity for the performance of duty the Police Superannuation Board may at any time call upon the pensioner to appear before the Medical Board in order to be medically examined.

PART II.

Probationary Service.

19. Every first appointment to the Force shall be made on probation for a period of six calendar months, and such period together with any extension thereof as hereinafter provided shall be deemed to be a period of probationary service.

20. On the expiration of such period of six calendar months and upon the expiration of any extension thereof, the officer in charge of any Police District to which any member of the Force has during such period or extension been appointed, shall report in writing to the Chief Commissioner upon the service, conduct, and efficiency of such member, provided that any adverse report by any officer under this Regulation shall be deemed to be an act of a superior officer appealable under section 11, sub-section (3), of the Act.

21. Where during such period of six calendar months or extension thereof any member of the Force has been appointed to the Police Dépôt or to the Criminal Investigation Branch, the expression “officer in charge of any Police District” in Regulation 20 shall be deemed to include the officer in charge of the Police Dépôt and the officer in charge of the Criminal Investigation Branch respectively.

22. Upon the receipt of such report or reports (as the case may be) the Chief Commissioner may, in his discretion—

- confirm such member of the Force in his appointment;
- extend the period of six calendar months above mentioned for any further period or periods, provided that the total probationary service of any member of the Force shall not exceed in the aggregate a period of twelve calendar months; or
- discharge him from the Force.

23. Nothing in this Part shall prejudice any existing right of suspending, reducing, discharging, or dismissing a member of the Force.

24. In Regulation 1587 under the *Police Regulation Act 1915*, as amended by Order in Council dated the 13th day of December, 1923, the words “unless probation extended” are hereby repealed.

PART III.

Approved Service and Deductions from Service for Sickness, Misconduct, and Neglect of Duty.

25. Any deduction from service which may be made under the provisions of section 11 of the Act shall be made by the Chief Commissioner.

26. In ascertaining what is the approved service of a member of the Force for the purposes of section 11 of the Act, the Chief Commissioner may deduct from the actual service of such member such period as to him may seem just in respect of—

- sickness, where such sickness is feigned or simulated, or which arises from carelessness, recklessness, improper or vicious conduct, excessive indulgence in alcohol, improper, illegal, or immoral practices;
- misconduct (for the purposes of this sub-regulation misconduct shall be deemed to include the acts of misconduct set out in Paragraph 508 of the Police Code, or of any amendment or addition thereto, and any other act declared to be an act of misconduct by the Police Regulation Acts, or any rules or regulations thereunder); or
- neglect of duty.

Provided that such deduction shall not exceed the period (including any period during which such member of the Force is suspended from duty) during which such member is absent from duty on account of such sickness, misconduct, or neglect of duty.

Provided further that no such deduction shall be made in respect of any sickness, misconduct, or neglect of duty as aforesaid unless such member of the Force has been duly found guilty thereof by the Chief Commissioner, an officer, Board, or Court empowered by law to hear and determine such matter.

27. When a member of the Force is found guilty of any sickness, misconduct, or neglect of duty as aforesaid by an officer, Board, or Court empowered by law to hear and determine such matter, the officer in charge of the Police Dépôt, the officer in charge of the Criminal Investigation Branch, or the officer in charge of the Police District in whose charge such member is, shall send to the Chief Commissioner (in the case of a determination by an officer or Board) the depositions and all other papers relating to the proceedings, and (in the case of a determination by a Court) a certified extract or certificate of the decision of such Court, together with a full report of the circumstances of the case; and the Chief Commissioner, upon the receipt thereof, may, subject to the Act, make such deduction from the service of such member as in his discretion he may think just.

28. The notice of deduction required to be given by section 11, sub-section (3), of the Act may be given in accordance with Form 8 in the schedule, and shall give particulars of such deduction and of the grounds thereof, and shall state the name of the superior officer (if any) whose act prevents the reckoning of any period as approved service and of the nature of such act.

29. The certificate of approved service required by section 11, sub-section (2), of the Act may be given by the Chief Commissioner in accordance with Form 9 in the schedule.

30. For the purposes of any application under these Regulations the production to the Police Superannuation Board of a certificate under the hand of the secretary to the Police Department relating to the period or periods deducted from the service of any particular member of the Force shall be prima facie evidence to the Board of the correctness of the particulars supplied.

PART IV.

Payment of Pensions, Gratuities, and Allowances.

31. A pensioner or a person to whom children's allowances have been ordered to be paid shall render an account for such pension or allowances monthly, not before the 15th day of the month for which such pension or allowances are claimed, to the member of the Force in charge of the police station nearest to the place where such pensioner or person resides.

32. A pensioner shall render his account in accordance with Form 10 in the schedule.

33. A person to whom children's allowances have been ordered to be paid shall render his account in accordance with Form 11 in the schedule.

34. A person to whom a gratuity has been granted shall render his account in accordance with Form 12 in the schedule to the Chief Commissioner of Police.

35. Every person rendering an account under the provisions of this Part shall sign the declaration set out on the particular form of account applicable to his case.

36. When an account is rendered to a member of the Force in accordance with Regulation 31 such member shall forthwith sign the certificate on such account, if correct, and send such account to the Superintendent of Police in charge of the District, who shall forthwith certify such account, and forward it to the Chief Commissioner.

37. Subject to these Regulations the General Regulations respecting public accounts under the *Audit Act 1915* shall apply to the payment of accounts for pensions, gratuities, and allowances, and for the return of rateable deductions under the Act.

PART V.

Appeals Against Acts of Superior Officers which Prevent the Reckoning of any Period as Approved Service.

38. Where an act of a superior officer, not being the Chief Commissioner, prevents any member of the Force from reckoning any period of actual service as approved service, he may, subject to these Regulations, appeal to the Chief Commissioner against such act.

39. The appellant shall within fourteen days after notice of deduction has been given to him send to the Chief Commissioner notice in writing, in accordance with Form 13 in the schedule, of his intention to appeal and of the grounds of such appeal.

40. On receipt of such notice of appeal the Chief Commissioner shall appoint a time and place, being not more than 28 days from the date of such receipt, for the hearing of the appeal, and shall send to the appellant, to the person laying the charge (if any), and to the superior officer whose act is questioned, notice thereof in writing, in accordance with Form 14 in the schedule, so as to reach them at least seven days before the time so appointed.

41. At such time and place, or at such other time or place to which he may then adjourn the hearing of the appeal, the Chief Commissioner shall hear and determine such appeal, and

shall forthwith, after such determination, notify his decision in writing to the appellant, to the person laying the charge (if any), and to the superior officer.

42. The Chief Commissioner shall inquire into the matter of the appeal without regard to legal forms and solemnities, and shall be directed by the best evidence procurable, whether the same is such evidence as the law requires or admits in other cases or not, and it shall be lawful for the Chief Commissioner to receive or reject as he deems fit any evidence that may be tendered.

43. The appellant, the person laying the charge (if any), and the superior officer whose act is questioned may, on the hearing of such appeal, call such material witnesses as they may desire, and the appellant may be represented by counsel. Provided that no costs of employing counsel shall be allowed on any appeal.

44. If, in the opinion of the Chief Commissioner, such appeal has been made vexatiously and without any reasonable probability of success, he may order the appellant to pay such costs as in his discretion he may fix, but not exceeding the actual costs of the person laying the charge (if any) and his witnesses, and of the superior officer and his witnesses on such appeal.

45. No order for costs shall be made against the person laying the charge (if any) or against the superior officer. Provided that if the Chief Commissioner is satisfied that the person laying the charge (if any) or the superior officer acted maliciously and without reasonable and probable cause, he may direct him to pay the appellant such costs as in his discretion he may fix.

46. In any case the Chief Commissioner may direct that the costs of any witness called on any appeal be paid by the Police Department on the same scale as is paid to witnesses in criminal cases heard before Courts of Petty Sessions.

47. When any costs are ordered to be paid under this Part by a member of the Force, such costs may be deducted from any salary, pension, gratuity, or rateable deduction which may be due to him.

PART VI.

Appeals against Opinions of the Medical Board.

48. When any person is dissatisfied with the opinion of the Medical Board on any medical question arising under the provisions of section 12 of the Act, he may, subject to these Regulations, appeal to an Independent Board as provided by the Act.

49. The Medical Board shall forthwith after the completion of any medical examination send its medical certificate to the Chief Commissioner, who shall forthwith forward such certificate to the Police Superannuation Board. The Medical Board may, by addendum to such certificate, make any recommendation to the Police Superannuation Board as to the future medical examination of such person.

50. Where for the purposes of section 12 of the Act any person is medically examined by the Medical Board, the Chief Commissioner shall forthwith, on receipt of the medical certificate, send a copy thereof to such person.

51. The appellant shall, within fourteen days after he has received such copy of the medical certificate, send to the Chief Commissioner notice in writing, in accordance with Form 15 in the schedule, of his intention to appeal and of the grounds of such appeal. The Chief Commissioner shall forthwith send such notice of appeal to the Hon. the Chief Secretary.

52. Within twenty-eight days after receipt by him of such notice, the Hon. the Chief Secretary shall duly appoint an Independent Board of three legally qualified medical practitioners in accordance with section 12, sub-section (8) of the Act, and shall notify the Chief Commissioner of such appointment.

53. The Chief Commissioner shall send to the appellant notice of the time and place appointed (being not more than twenty-eight days after the appointment of such Independent Board) for his further medical examination. Such notice shall be in accordance with Form 16 in the schedule.

54. At such time and place, or at any other time or place to which such Independent Board shall then adjourn the examination, such Independent Board shall medically examine the appellant and give its decision thereon in the form of a medical certificate, and shall forthwith send such medical certificate to the Chief Commissioner.

55. It shall be the duty of the appellant to attend at the time and place appointed, and, if he is a serving member of the Force, he shall be given such leave as may be necessary to enable him to attend. He shall submit himself to any medical examination which the Independent Board may desire to make or may direct to be made.

56. The Chief Commissioner shall forthwith send a copy of such medical certificate to the appellant, and shall forward such medical certificate to the Police Superannuation Board.

57. Where the Independent Medical Board certifies in its certificate that an appeal made to it under these Regulations is made vexatiously and without any reasonable probability of success, and that such lack of reasonable probability of success must, in its opinion, have been known to the appellant, the Chief Commissioner may order the appellant to pay such reasonable costs of the Independent Medical Board as in his discretion he may fix, and such costs may be deducted from any salary, pension, gratuity, or rateable deduction which may be due to the appellant.

Education Act 1915.

REGULATION RESCINDED.—REGULATION SUBSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of October, 1924.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of section 18 of the *Education Act* 1915, doth hereby rescind Regulation XVIII. of the regulations under the aforesaid Act, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION XVIII.—HOLIDAYS.

1. The holidays observed in State Elementary Schools, exclusive of Saturdays, shall be as follow, except in cases in which a different arrangement may be specially sanctioned by the Director:—

- Five weeks at midsummer. This vacation shall begin on the Monday preceding Christmas Day and end on the Friday five weeks later.
 - Good Friday, Easter Monday, and the following Tuesday.
 - One week in May, commencing on the twenty-first Monday of each year.
 - One week in the last full week in September.
 - The public holidays not included in the above, viz. Foundation Day, Eight Hours' Day, King's Birthday, and such other days as may be gazetted as public holidays, except those proclaimed in connexion with races, provided that no school shall observe more than one public holiday proclaimed for agricultural shows in each calendar year.
- NOTE.—In accordance with section 187 of Act No. 2713, when the 26th January, 21st April, or 3rd June falls on any day other than a Monday, the next following Monday shall be observed as a holiday in lieu of such day.
- One holiday in each calendar year may be observed with the approval of the School Committee for the purpose of a school celebration or local festivity.
 - Schools in remote districts may with the approval of the Director be granted one day in addition to the vacations (a), (b), (c), (d) above.
 - With the approval of the Director, schools may be closed for an additional week in conjunction with the holidays in (a), (c), or (d) above, in order that teachers may attend a two weeks' course of instruction in educational subjects under the direction of the Department.

2. No other holidays than those specified above shall be given without the express sanction of the Minister, except days on which the school building may be required for election purposes.

3. Whenever a school is to be closed on days other than those specified in clause 1, the head teacher shall notify the same, with full particulars, to the School Committee and the District Inspector.

4. Whenever a school is to be closed on a day proclaimed as a local public holiday, or for any other special reason, or when a holiday has been granted by the School Committee under 1 above, the head teacher shall give ample notice to the District Inspector, and shall make a special report to the Department in his monthly return. In the case of a holiday granted by the School Committee, the written consent of the committee must be forwarded with the report.

5. In the absence of such special report and written consent, or in the event of any other days than those specified in clause 1 being observed as holidays, and no satisfactory explanation thereof being furnished in the monthly return, pay will be deducted, and no appeal against such deduction will be entertained.

6. Arbor Day shall be celebrated in each school each year. Arbor Day is not a school holiday, and the attendance of teachers and pupils must be recorded as on any other school day. In addition to tree-planting and other horticultural work proper to Arbor Day, teachers shall draw up and carry out a programme, as outlined from time to time in the *Education Gazette*, including songs, recitations, addresses, &c., upon trees and flowers. If, from any cause, outdoor work cannot be carried on, this programme should still be given. When it is not advisable to plant trees in the school reserve, Arbor Day may be celebrated by the planting of trees in public reserves, streets, &c.

And the Honorable John Lemmon, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Subject to these conditions the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without the authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the *Land Act 1915* the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognized.

10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

11. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling or other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all noxious weeds on the land, and on the half-width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of noxious weeds under the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922* in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

19. The licensee shall not interfere in any way with any survey marks on the land hereby licensed.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

1. The period of occupation will, except where otherwise specified, be for (10) ten months from 1st December, 1924, to 30th September, 1925.

2. The fee for the full period—for which the licence will be issued, and the fee for licence—must accompany the tender, otherwise the offer of the next highest tenderer who complies with this condition may be accepted.

3. Separate tenders must be lodged for each block.

4. Tenders to be addressed to the Secretary for Lands, (Tender-box), Melbourne.

5. The highest or any tender not necessarily accepted.

6. Tenderers must give their full name, occupation, and ordinary postal address.

BY-LAW No. 92.

A By-law of the City of Geelong made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (as amended by the *Local Government Act* 1921), for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole of such residential areas, the erection, adaptation for use, or use of any building for the purposes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusement.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Geelong order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 90 of the City of Geelong is hereby repealed provided that such repeal shall not prejudice or affect any prosecution for any act or omission in contravention of such By-law prior to the commencement of this By-law.

2. The areas herein specified within the municipal district shall be and are hereby prescribed as residential areas, namely:—

A. All that portion of the said city bounded on the north by Victoria-parade, on the east by Garden-street, on the south by Ryrie-street, and on the west by Swanston-street.

B. All that portion of the said city within the following boundaries:—Commencing at a point on the west building line of Gheringhap-street 100 feet southerly from the south-west building line of Victoria-terrace; thence north-westerly by a line 100 feet south-westerly from and parallel to the south-western building line of Victoria-terrace to the eastern building line of Latrobe-terrace; thence northerly by the east building line of Latrobe-terrace to the south-western building line of Victoria-terrace; thence south-easterly by the south-western building line of Victoria-terrace to the west building line of Gheringhap-street; thence southerly by the west building line of Gheringhap-street to the commencing point.

C. All that portion of the said city within the following boundaries:—Commencing at a point on the eastern building line of Yarra-street 100 feet southerly from the southern building line of Corio-terrace; thence easterly by a line 100 feet south from the southern building line of Corio-terrace and Victoria-parade and parallel thereto to the western building line of Swanston-street; thence northerly by the western building line of Swanston-street to the southern building line of Victoria-parade; thence westerly by the southern building line of Victoria-parade and Corio-terrace to the eastern building line of Yarra-street; thence southerly by the eastern building line of Yarra-street to the commencing point.

3. The erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building within such residential area for the purpose of the classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements specified in the schedule hereto shall be and is hereby prohibited.

4. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, re-building or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, re-building, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of the By-law was in the same ownership or for such other purpose as the Council thinks reasonable in the circumstances.

5. Any person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
